



<u>Let's Talk Television</u> Antics of Caesar & Coca Found Entertaining, Original

The radio industry has endorsed the creed of the high school wolf—that nobody who is anybody stays home on Saturday night. The unfortunate who does not go out on the town is supposed to go into hiding. If his hiding place has a radio, he must make a drab chocie between dance music and network cast-offs. He's in for a pretty bleak evening unless there's a television set handy.



The television industry, on the other hand, seems to be aaware of the fact that its audience is made up of potential homebodies. Catering only to those who were around the house anyway but to

others who might be lured away from the neighborhood movie if TV's attraction were strong enough, the broadcasters have built up their Saturday shows until that evening is one of TV's best.

Principal disrupters of the pattern of American social life are Sid Caesar and Imogene Coca-for my money the most original and most entertaining comics on the air-and the other stars of Your Show of Shows. The 90-minute show is offered by NBC and WOC-TV as the second half of the Saturday Night Revue, supposedly an entertainment-jacked extravaganza. The first half, the Jack Carter Show is a stock vaudeville thing, complete with dog acts and jokes that don't quite come off. It's worth watching only if you want a standard of comparison for what comes later.

The later show, though, is so good that you might be wise to turn down that canasta invitation and stay home next Saturday. Normally I'd attack the arrogance of a broadcaster who named his program Your Show of Shows. In this case, however, the title is pretty descriptive. Gifted mimics and pantomine artists,

Sid Caesar and Imogene Coca turn out comedy routines that are among the funniest I've ever seen. They portray a typical married couple or strangers who find common interests at a public function or,



speaking in double talk, they present a "foreign movie." Caesar, in solo roles has imitated a Viennese professor just off the plane, a bridegroom on his way down the aisle and a 6months-old baby.

As you might expect, there is good popular music. particularly the numbers by the Billy Williams quartet. But. surprising in a mass appeal comedy show, two of the program's principal attractions are opera and ballet or modern dance.

Operatic scenes, sung in costume by someone like Marguerite Piazza or Robert Merrill—late of the Metropolitan—are high points in the telecast.

Like most televiewers, I've been caught slightly off base by the sudden popularity of ballet and modern dance. (I'm never sure which I'm watching unless the girl is costumed as I know a ballerina should be costumed). Although I miss some of the fine points of the Hamilton Dancers' technique, I —along with most of the audience, I suspect—enjoy their performance immensely.

Comic dance numbers too, by satirists Mata and Hari—an unusually talented couple who frequently appear on the show—and by Miss Coca, whose original goal was ballet, not comedy, sometimes are an added treat for the audience.

I've heard suggestions that the show be cut from 90 minutes to a more standard length. It does take up quite a bit of time, I'll admit. But, as you may have guessed by now, I'm such a fan of Your Show of Shows, that I'd welcome 180 minutes of the same.

TELEVISION THEATRE to MARK 4th ANNIVERSARY

The Kraft Television Theatre, which will celebrate its fourth anniversary on NBS-TV on May 9 in New York, has presented plays written by authors as varied as Groucho Marx and Shakespeare, Isben and A. A. Milne and Emile Zola and Alexander Woollcott.

And the subject matter and types of plays have been as diversified as the names of the authors suggest.

Of the 208 performances given since the premiere, May 7, 1947. 138 different writers, representing 16 different countries either wrote plays especially for this program or had their works adapted for the shows.

The 108 comedies, 63 dramas, 20 mysteries and 17 fantasies have come from the pens of such writers as Somerset Haugham, George S. Kaufman, Channing Pollack, John Van Druten, Robert E. Sherwood, Maxwell Anderson, Philip Barry, Oscar Wilde, Emile Zola and Anatole France. These of course were adaptions. But there have been works from Joe Bates Smith, Eric Hatch, Aimee and Philip Stewart and Nelson Bond, who are among the growing coterie of authors beaming their works directly for TV.

During the first three years most of the Kraft Television Theatre plays were adaptions, but as TV has grown so has the number of authors writing especially for the medium. Kraft has made a practice of buying new material such as this wherever possible. And, although 183 of the 208 performances were adaptations and only 25 originals, 15 of those 25 were submitted during the past year.



Brief ceremonies marked the presentation to Secretary Matthews.





Station WOC-TV will take race fans to Jamaica, Belmont Park and Aqueduct race tracks on Saturday afternoons starting May 5th.

Three electronic cameras and three of the finest sports announcers will call the thoroughbreds during a preliminary and feature race on the full hour program.

The premiere race over the Davenport station will be run at Jamaica track starting at 2 p. m.

Clem McCarthy, dean of racing announcers, will call the actual races, while ex-jockey Sammy Renick, now owner of his own stable, will interview trainers and owners in the paddock before racetime, and the winner in the rose-wreathed circle immediately afterwards.

Ray Barrett, third man on NBC's racing staff, will describe the colorful pageant that customarily surrounds the sport of kings.

Two cameras will be set on the roof of the grandstand, alternating with a third camera in the paddocks to give chairside racing fans a complete view of the exciting events.

After the Jamaica season is over the telecasts will originate at Belmnot Park, then to Aqueduct, before returning to Jamaica on July 21st.

America's great racing classic, the Kentucky Derby, will be broadcast over WHBF-TV, Saturday, May 5, at 7:45 p. m.

The television film of the race will be processed at WHAS-TV, CBS affiliate in Louisville, after which it will be edited in flight to Dayton, O., for broadcast over the CBS interconnected network via WHIO-TV, CBS Dayton affiliate.

Clem McCarthy will call the race for the radio audience, with Mel Allen doing the color commentary and Phil Sutterfield, WHAS sportscaster, conducting the winner's circle interviews. Bryan Field will be the commentator for the television film.




