



IN THE HEART of the Iowa Corn Belt, a few miles north of the state's capital city of Des Moines, stands a group of red brick buildings representing Iowa State College, the site of the U.S.'s first exclusively educational TV station.

Even with its thirty year background in radio, Iowa State's progressive step was a large undertaking—particularly from the financial standpoint. But with ambition and the necessary ingenuity plus a singleness of purpose, the Ames, Iowa institution has led the fight for proper educational TV coverage.

WOI-TV at Ames, upon which rests these days the envious eyes of educators from other colleges seeking TV permits, is the home of the nation's

first college-owned, non-commercial TV station. As such it is the birthplace of a revolution in the communication of information and ideas.

Although education by television received lip service from all segments of the industry, it got little else untli WOI-TV went on the air with test patterns early in 1950. Iowa State College, whose radio station WOI is one of 120 college-owned stations in the country, started surveying television's economic road in 1945 and was granted the first TV construction permit by the Federal Communications Commission. Then followed a freeze on permits—and WOI-TV found itself the only television station in the Des Moines area.

The net result is somewhat of a paradox. Where educators were normally forced to go to the networks to get education on the air, the networks are now approaching WOI-TV with the hope of airing commercial time in the Des Moines area.


Described as a non-profit, educational operation, the station has temporary NBC, ABC, CBS and DuMont network affiliations. They will continue until the FCC licenses a commercial station for the area.

All funds for the construction and operation of WOI-TV came from the college, a land grant institution supported by the state. Richard Hull, its director, confides that the cost of putting the station on the air was only a fraction of the normal cost of building and equipping a TV station. (Commercial stations run between \$750,000 and \$1,000,000).


The function of an educational TV station varies, of course, with the interests of the community which it serves. The central Iowa region, being primarily agricultural, is beamed many programs along agrarian lines.

Remote control telecasts have become a familiar sight along Iowa's countryside. WOI-TV's big mobile unit, a specially equipped LM-152 Internation Harvester truck, if often present for coverage of local fairs, homemaking and agricultural field demonstrations and the like.

One of the highly successful on-thespot shows the youthful video station has covered was the recent Iowa State

College's annual spring festival. Sixty miles away, farmers left newly-plowed fields and huddled about their television sets to view the same event. It was Iowa at work and play through the magic medium of television.

Employing some of television's great potential, education through TV has begun to make headway by the pioneering intiative of such institutions as Iowa State College.

EW YORK—It's finally official. Singer Dinah Shore, the subject of a heated woman-hunt by NBC for several months, has finally succumbed to the lure of pen and ink, and will tee off an NBC contract for two TV shows a week, probably starting in mid-November. . . Censor boards are bending an eye towards the next appearance on "Toast of the Town." In previous shows, Lena set some sort of record for scanty costumes. . . . There's a rumor that columnist Westbrook Pegler will have his own weekly news show. Left wingers are up in arms over the proposal. . . .

Baritone Andy Roberts is a protege of veteran Morton Downey. Roberts is making September appearances on the Ted Mack Family Hour.... Variety magazine reports that NBC will pay Dave Garroway \$10,000 per week, whether or not Dave's show is sold to a sponsor, goes on a sustaining basis, or is kept in mothballs.... ABC's big plunge into the untouched film market has netted that web 72 old pictures, ten of which, however, have been made since 1942. ABC plans to schedule them on late hour time.... Jane Wilson is reported leaving the Fred Waring show for free lance appearances.

Anna Lee, star of the movies, is the daughter of a vicar. . . . Opera singer Helen Traubel will make two appearances with Jimmy Durante before Christmas. The first will be Oct. 6 . . . Vaughn Monroe tells about the man who was king in his own home—he got crowned every time he opened his mouth. . . . Net work moguls are finding out that late p.m. shows, such as "Broadway Open House," can draw big audiences. However, it's taking the local stations to prove it, by selling the time to sponsors at a fat profit.

Spike Jones has been signed to an exclusive NBC contract. The Caliph of Corn, above all others, realizes that his stuff would wear out with repeated performances, so he'll confine his TV work to occasional shots. . . Dr. Roy K. Marshall will have his first book, "The Nature of Things," published by Henry Holt on Sept. 30. . . . During his recent stay in Britain, Milton Berle refused to do a regular TV show because the salary offered was too low. But then the NBComic turned around and offered to do a charity marathon—for free.

The Goldbergs will move to NBC from CBS, after months of negotiations. Gertrude Berg, the sparkplug of the series, is in a huff over the way CBS sold the time out from under the show.



When Jimmy Appears, Scripts Are Thrown Away

He's a spindly little comic with an outrageously hoarse voice. His clothes are three sizes too big and his mishmash hat is a college boy's dream. In place of a walk, he shuffles along like a penguin with arthritis.

But most incredible of all is the great, swelling pendulum that masquerades as his nose. Despite all this—or probably because of it—Jimmy Durante has become an established American legend.

Durante in show business goes back almost beyond the memory of mortals. The younger generation, seeing him for the first time on TV, have much in common with their elders, because Jimmy Durante throughout the years has remained essentially the same—flapdoodle strut, windmill frenzy and the happiest personality in show business.

The famous Schnozz has rocked every TV show he's been on, whether he's a regular or a guest. The most conservative program achieves a certain joyous pandemonium the instant Durante

appears. Pianos get smashed, opera stars jitterbug and emcees toss away their scripts.

The Jimmy Durante legend started somewhere in New York's lower East side and continued through the Bowery, Coney Island, the vaudeville circuit and the movies. After that came radio, and finally television where the Durante personality burst like shrapnel over millions of grateful viewers.

As a boy, Jimmy taught himself to sing and pound the piano. He quit a job in a Coney Island night club to team up with Lou Clayton (now dead) and Eddie Jackson for vaudeville. Jackson still is with him as manager and business agent. Old timers will remember his smash comedy songs—"So I Ups to Him" and "Inka Dinka Doo."

On a London trip, Jimmy cracked all previous attendance records at the famed Palladium. NBC moguls, who never miss a gold flood if it pours in their laps, grabbed Jimmy for radio and TV where he now cavorts happily and noisily.

Jimmy is a city lover at heart. "Listen," he said, "to dose beautiful noises. Taxis bumping into each other. Cops hollerin at people. Newsboys yell-in lies, What a place."

The Schnozz remembered his country home. "Da foist night I nearly died. Da silence wuz deafening. I couldn't sleep. Nuttin' made any noise. I loosened da blinds on da windows to have 'em make some noise. All night I stay awake and foist ting in da morning I rush down to da bank, get my money back and move into the busiest street I could find."

Jimmy doesn't spend all his time on stage, although figuratively, he never gets off it. Between show business engagements, he goes fishing and golfing. For hobbies, Jimmy collects stamps and reads detective stories. But his major hobby is making people happy.

"Just so's I c'n bang my pianna, tell 'em jokes and sing m' songs and make people laugh. I don't need nothin else. I ain't dreamin of yesterday or tomora. I'm happy t'day."

TV has been called the merging point of a trio of entertainment arts—stage, screen and radio. And Jimmy Durante has scored terrific success in all three. And now, television.



A NCHORAGE, Alaska, during wartime ... severe shortages of clothing ... and Jacqueline James, featured singer with The Wayne King Show (WOC-TV) and then a civilian worker with the Army Air Corps, decided that the time had come to try her hand at designing and making her own clothes. So successful were her initial experiments that Jackie now fashions all of her off-camera wardrobe.

In her Chicago apartment with fashion dummy and sewing machine close at hand, Jackie quiets Pepita and Chiquita, he pet Chihuahuas, and begins to cut and drape the fabric on the mannequin. She favors two piece ensembles for evening wear and coordinates her costtumes in order that she may wear the tops and skirts interchangeably.

- 1. Black velvet, high fashion this season, is worked into a striking cocktail gown, with halter neckline, draped bodice and repeated draping across the hipline. A floating panel accents the back, with an insert of satin under the panel to take the wear and tear of sitting. A small cape completes the costume.
- 2. An aqua rayon fabric is used in a simple summer dress with strapless bodice, outlined in black eyelet. With it she wears a black wide wale corduroy stole.

LET'S TALK TELEVISION by Lucia Carter

Television's other Dagmar — little Robin Morgan who plays the part of the youngest daughter in the Mama series Friday evenings on WHBF-TV—appeals to viewers in less spectacular fashion than her fabulous namesake. She's smaller, for one thing, and more apt to win the hearts of old ladies in the audience. And she too is a television success.

Robin, in the role of Dagmar Hanson,

manages to steal at least a portion of each week's show—no mean trick when Peggy Wood is the star. Here the producers can thank a combination of factors — the natural appeal of any child, Robin's skill as an actress and, of course, the lines she

is given to say. Where many youngsters inject an artificial note into dramatic roles, Robin seems completely natural as she combines charm and deviltry in the role of a very remarkable little girl.

The entire show is somewhat like that-a combination of the natural and the unique. Based on Kathryn Forbes' book, Mama's Bank Account (from which the movie, I Remember Mama, starring Irene Dunne, was also made), the show follows the adventures of the Norwegian-American Hanson family in San Francisco at the turn of the cen-Despite the remoteness of setting, the characters are depicted with such warmth that one feels that they are as close as next-door neighbors. Still, few of our neighbors manage to get into the scrapes the Hansons have to meet every week.

A certain amount of credit must go to the original author for bringing the characters to life in the first place. But the fact that a television show is based upon a successful book and movie canot alone win it a high rating. The Aldrich Family, so help me, resulted from a rather good stage play.

And during the morning hours when many of us, fortunately, are at work, CBS is busy butchering The Egg and I. The TV staff—writer, producer, director and, of course, the cast—will have to take credit here too.

Despite the competition from the child actress, Peggy Wood, who is billed as the show's star, turns in an outstanding performance as Mama Hanson. For my money, her version of the part tops Irene Dunne's movie performance. Mastery of the Norwegian accent the role requires is in itself quite an accomplishment. But she goes beyond the reciting of lines to become the human and likeable, but competent individual who seems more like a real-life housewife and mother than a television character.

Similar praise can be accorded the rest of the cast—Judson Laire as Papa, Dick Van Patten and Rosemary Rice as Nels and Katrin, the family's two teen-agers, and Ruth Gates as Aunt Jenny.

The stories are simple, dealing with the sort of problems that could beset people you know, although they probably don't. Papa has to make a speech, the youngsters think they have troubles or the family is beset by financial difficulties. Mama usually finds a solution.

The setting gives the program a faint nostalgic flavor, even for those of us completely unfamiliar with the background.


