

FILM DIGEST: NBC Film Division's "Sales Slants" (Vol II, No 2, Jan 27, 1954), presented the following general suggestions on making TV color films, by Stan Parlan, NBC color film consultant: "Use flat lighting with plenty of fill light in the shadow areas. Avoid large dark areas in the scene. Use plenty of close-ups and avoid sustained long shots. The color system (TV) is extremely effective on close-ups. Avoid the use of optical effects as much as possible (Use complementary colors in achieving color harmony and positive color separation between foreground objects and their backgrounds. The color print for broadcast should have a relatively low maximum density to achieve what might be described as a rather "light" or "thin" print." He also suggests that 35mm film be used for network color commercials for superior quality and 16mm be reserved for prints for local station use and also original filming for local stations, if done in a professional manner. Parlan says also that many factors may determine whether an ad agency should make color commercials now, the main ones being the possible life span of the commercial (appropriateness of the message when color really is here) and the practical knowledge that might be gained by the production staff in working with color now.

NEWS AND COMMENT: TV set installations in the U. S. totaled 27,666,000 as of Jan 1, 1954, according to Hugh M. Beville, Jr., NBC director of research and planning. The number of new sets installed during 1953 totaled 6,432,000.....A. C. Nielsen Co announced a comprehensive new research service, taking the company into the local audience measurement field on a large scale. Basic instruments to be used are Audimeters and Audilogs (a diary record) controlle by Recordimeters, each contributing information to the final record. Extension of the service depends on agency and advertiser reaction and support since the pioneer efforts will be expensive......Lambert Wilson, 130 East 37th St., New York 16; MUrray Hill 5-9596; is a new literary agent handling TV scripts.....Station WCBS-TV (NY) has moved to 488 Madison Ave., New York 22; joining CBS-TV Spot Sales which made its move last week.
