NEWS AND COMMENT: CBS Radio producer-director Elliott Lewis (currently handling four top CBS Radio series) has been signed as associate producer to work with producer Bretaigne Windust on the new CBS-TV Chrysler series debuting Sept 30. Lewis has supposedly long been opposed to TV because of the pressure, preferring to work in the more relaxing field of radio, with his wife, Cathy Lewis......Bob Banner has been signed to produce and direct the Dinah Shore Show when it returns to NBC in the fall after summer hiatus......Herb Jaffe has been elected a v.p. and member of the board of Official Films. He is director of sales......KING-TV(Seattle) became the first TV station other than a networkowned station west of the Rockies to originate a color program when it telecast colored slides over a regular daily program on July 1. It first transmitted a color test pattern May 18. The station has a GE flying spot scanner and has an Eastman Kodak continuous-motion projector on order from GE to use for transmitting motion pictures.
