THIS WEEK -- NETWORK DEBUTS & HIGHLIGHTS

Tuesday(30)

NBC- 12:15-12:30pm EST; SPECIAL; International Livestock Exposition; from WNBQ (Chi), stations indefinite. Sponsor- Charles Pfizer & Co (Feed supplements and farm products) thru Leo Burnett Co., Inc(Chi); Acct Superv- Charles Husting; Acct Exec- Ed Thiele. Production information not available at press time. John Cameron Swayze is m.c. for a hog-judging contest, in conjunction with the International Livestock Exposition, the program originating from the Normandy Room of the Conrad Hilton Hotel, Chicago. Films of last year's contest will also be shown. Program pre-empts 12:15-12:30 segment of the Betty White Show this date only. See also next item.

NBC- 3-4pm EST; SPECIAL; International Livestock Exposition; from WNBQ(Chi), no. of stations indefinite. Sponsor- Allis-Chalmers Mfg. Co. (Tractors, Farm Equipment, Road Machinery) thru Bert S. Gittins Advertising(Milwaukee). No account or production information available. NBC farm commentator Everett Mitchell and Mal Hansen, farm service director for WOW & WOW-TV(Omaha) share m.c. duties for the 7th consecutive year for NBC-TV's telecast of the International Livestock Exposition at Chicago's International Amphitheater, with Hansen handling the arena events and Mitchell the studio-originated features. The program will include special reports and integrated films. The program pre-empts for one day only, the Tuesday segments of the following dramatic serials: The Greatest Gift, 3-3:15pm; Golden Windows, 3:15-3:30pm; One Man's Family, 3:30-3:45pm; and Concerning Miss Marlowe, 3:45-4pm.

NBC- 4-4:30pm EST; RETURN & NET CHANGE; Juvenile Jury; from WRCA-TV(NY), to the net. Sustaining. Pkgr- Barry, Enright & Friendly(NY); Prod Superv By- Mike Oppenheimer; Dir- Craig Allen (tentative). Jack Barry, as host, is assisted by a panel of five youngsters, ranging in age from 5 to 10 years, who offer solutions for problems posed by visiting youngsters. Each week's panel is drawn from a pool of eight children, rotated from week to week. The program debuted over NBC-TV on June 19, 1951, and was seen at different periods until it moved to CBS-TV, Oct 11, 1953. Last show on CBS was Sept 14, 1954. In its new NBC spot it replaces Out on the Farm; last show Nov 20. (Beginning Jan 9, 1955, Juvenile Jury will be sponsored by Pharmaceuticals, Inc (Geritol) thru Edward Kletter Associates, Inc(NY); Acct Exec- Edward Kletter; Agcy & Comm Superv- Don Blauhut. Pharmaceuticals, Inc., was sponsor of the show during its CBS run.).

KNXT - Family Fun Time; LIVE & FILM; DEBUT Nov 22; Mon thru Fri, 9-9:30am, 3-3:30pm PST. Participations. Wes Batterssea is m.c.-host for two programs daily, the afternoon session a variation of the morning program. He will interview well-known chefs, give news of interest to the housewife and interview audience guests during the morning show. Diana Brewster joins him for the afternoon segment, presenting fashion features and news for women. Each program will also include a Walter Lantz cartoon short. The morning program replaces California Living, with Mercedes Bates, while the afternoon show replaces Movie Matinee.

PRODUCTION AND PROGRAMMING NEWS

FILM DIGEST: KNXT(LA) has purchased 179 Walter Lantz cartoons for showing on the daily Space Funnies and Wes Batterssea shows. The cartoons, produced for Universal International, include 92 "Oswald the Rabbit" shorts.....KTTV(LA) believes it is marking an innovation in children's programming by presenting the Robert Cummings' My Hero series as part of the Sheriff John show daily, from 5:30-6pm. The series, distributed by Official, has been retitled Mr. Beanblossom. An odd distinction, not too much emphasized by KTTV, is that Cummings is replacing cartoons formerly shown in the time slot. The Cummings films were previously "test run" at 7pm to get a reaction; the six-week test indicated a 50 per cent juvenile audience.

Jack Gage has replaced Sidney Lumet as director of the You Are There film series, being shot at Bedford Park Studios in New York.....Derwin Abbe has replaced Will Price as director of His Honor, Homer Bell, the Hi Brown-Galahad series shooting in Brooklyn for NBC.....Olmsted Sound Studios, 1 East 54th St., New York, opens for business on Dec 2, using film equipment from Princeton Film Center, which has a partly-common ownership. The main sound studio is 40 x 28, and sound and other equipment is custom-designed or latest obtainable.....Hans Tiesler has been elected a v.p. and director of Loucks & Horling Studios, Inc., New York, replacing Wil Marcus, who has resigned as an officer but remains as a consultant.....Joe Dale is musical director for Guild Films' Florian ZaBach Show, shooting in Hollywood.

Ed Beloin's new film series for the Toni Co, starring Cass Daley and Virginia Gibson is now titled So This Is Hollywood.....James Mason's Portland Productions is at the Goldwyn Studios, Hollywood, preparing production on a 15-minute Biblical film starring Portland Mason in a screenplay by her parents, James and Pamela, to be directed by James Mason.....Roland Reed has a new New York office at 1 East 54 St, New York, with Hampton Howard as sales rep for commercials and industrial films.

NEWS & COMMENT: Ted Bergmann, managing director of the DuMont TV Net issued a statement on Nov 19 denying that DuMont has contemplated, "nor have we any intentions of, entering into negotiations" with anyone "which contemplate the disposition or the abandonment of the DuMont Television Network." On Nov 23 Mr. Bergmann made a speech before a group meeting of the 4A's which indicated the extent of DuMont's future problem in competing with three other networks when station clearances are critical. A DuMont survey shows in the top 148 market groups of the country, 14 markets have at least 4 stations, 27 have 3 stations, 55 markets have 2 stations and 39 have 1 station each. DuMont's "best estimate of the future picture" is that a reasonable expectation would be for 24 markets to have 4 or more stations. and an additional 78 will have 3 stations. The DuMont answer is, in a sense, already in operation. Mr. Bergman emphasized that DuMont does not have a "must buy" list of stations such as exists on the other nets. This permits small advertisers to break into net advertising and also permits a regional concept in the solid East. It is, of course, no answer for the big advertiser who wants to clear many stations after he grows to that size, unless the program is a special, such as Bishop Sheen's program. Consensus: DuMont may make a special alliance, but it will still have a network identity no matter what; and it will remain outside of any dog fights over who will be part of the "Big Two," or "Big Three."

PERSONNEL CHANGES: Larry Lazarus named business manager of KNXT(LA) and the Columbia Television Pacific Net, replacing Howard Barnick, resigned.....Duncan Miller appointed publicity and promotion director for WTTG(Wash) as of Nov 23, succeeding George L. Flax who has been named Washington-Baltimore regional editor for "TV Program Week," the new Curtis publication.....Paul G. O'Friel named director of labor relations of the broadcasting division of Allen B. DuMont Laboratories, Inc.....Gayle V. Grubb, v.p. of Storer Broadcasting Co., will head a new Storer West Coast office in San Francisco, leaving his post as managing director of WJBK & WJBK-TV(Det).
