

- POSSIBILITIES - COMMENT

Although no sponsor is yet committed and contracts haven't been signed, MBC has penciled Sunday Matinee into its once-a-month schedule for late Sunday afterroon, starting Oct 23. This is the Maurice Evans series of eight one and one-half hour dramas, to run thru May, 1956, with Mr. Evans producing all and starring in several of the productions, all in color. Jack Rayel would be producer for NBC on the series, with Mildred Freed Alberg as associate producer and George Schaefer as director. Among the eight dramas would be at least one from Shakespeare and one from Shaw, according to some past hints dropped by Evans.

ABC's Monday Night Fights from Eastern Parkway bow off the net after May 16, with Pabat Brewing's Blue Ribbon Bouts opening on ABC on June 1, from an unannounced origination.....ABC's Disneyland series starts its re-runs tonight (16) until June 22. A new episode from the "Fantasyland" realm will be shown June 29 and the following week will see the start of the third run of this season's programs, until Sept 7. The new Disneyland films will be shown starting September 14; 26 in all, to be repeated in this year's pattern to fill the 52 week schedule. Disney is reported to have said on the coast that he is scheduling 100 one-hour shows immediately for his afternoon Mickey Mouse Club, starting Oct 3, 5-6pm in all time zones, over ABC. of the highlights of the series, according to Dieney, will be a "Mickey Mouse Club Newsreel," highlighting children's news and activities from all over the world. A camera crew has just been sent to England, the first of several to be assigned to other global beats, to begin shooting backgrounds for the newsreel films.

Mr. Citizen, the new live scries replacing The Stu Erwin Show on ABC for Liggett & Myers' L & M Cigarettes, will debut on April 20 at 8:30pm. Ed Byron is producing the C & W package, which will be in the form of weekly dramatizations of heroic, kind or unusual deeds performed by private citizens. At the program's end, the person whose deed has been dramatized will be interviewed by the program's host (not named as yet) and then will be presented with a plaque by a guest of honor, who would be a person prominent in public life. Charles Tate will direct the series, from scripts by free lance writers. The first script in the series has been written by Robert J. Shaw. Production staff, besides Ed Eyron as producer and Tate as director, includes Feter McGovern as story editor, Mary Lee Fletcher as head researcher, Leonard Safir as reporter, Marc Loeb as unit manager, John Gart as music composer-conductor. Gwen Campbell will handle casting at Byron's office (8 East 52nd St., New York. PL 3-6930). The original pilot for the show was produced by Lee Cooley and directed by Matt Harlib.
