THIS WEEK -- NETWORK DEBUTS & HIGHLIGHTS

MBC- 2-2:30pm EDT; SPECIAL; British Elections, LIVE & FILM; from WRCA-TV(NY), to the net. Sustaining. Pkgr- NEC News & Special Events(NY); Prod & Writer-Reuven Frank; Dirs- John Goetz(NY), Romney Wheeler (London, films). INBC news analyst Bill Henry narrates special films made in London explaining the British election. NBC London correspondent Romney Wheeler will explain how British elections differ from those in the U.S. The program will include interviews with "the man on the street," as well as films of speeches by Eden, Churchill, Atlee and others. Election Day is Thursday, May 26, with results expected to be available Friday morning EDT. MBC normally has no net service at this time.
