New Listings: New additions to the file this month (including returning programs).

Replace previous cards: These cards replace those of the same name already in the

file. Discard old listings, add new.

Remove cards from file: Programs that are off permanently or for hiatus. These cards

should be held in reserve as a source of information on the defunct programs, but completely separate from the current file to avoid confusion with active listings. When program returns,

new cards will be issued as additions to the file.
