Multiple and across-the-board shows are grouped together after the listing for Friday July 12. Script identifications used are: (0) Original, (A) Adaptation, (SD) Staff-Directed, (SW) Staff-Written. Performers are identified as singer (S), dancer (D), comic (C), musician (M). Actors who appear regularly are listed in the premiere cast, then subsequently referred to as "regulars". Live shows are listed in caps in the left column; filmed shows are in upper and lower case letters, underlined.

NEWS - COMMENT - POSSIBILITIES

The Seven Lively Arts, CBS one-hour Sunday afternoon program series starting this fall, will have an ll-man production staff, including exec producer John Houseman. Robert Herridge will produce up to one-half of the series' programs, which will deal with the entertainment world from every angle. Jud Kinberg, an associate movie producer for Houseman at M-G-M and previously an agency TV film production man, is also a producer of some of the programs. Robert Northshield is exec producer of the project's film unit, which includes writer-director Robert Sharpe, writer Andy Rooney and film editor Peter Poore. Other production associates under Houseman are Jack Mc-Giffert, Charles Schultz, Robert Goldman and Joe Hurley. (CBS insists on emphasizing the ages of the men on the staffs of its new fall public service and public affairs programs. The Seven Lively Arts production people range from Robert Goldman's 25 to Jack McGiffert's 41 years)..... NBC has further revealed, although not yet firmed up, the elements of its new Arlene Francis Show, debuting Aug 12, Monday thru Friday, 10-10:30am EDT. It will be a variety show, with Miss Francis serving as hostess. The program content will revolve about the people, places and things which most interest Miss Francis -- ranging from entertainment personalities to books, from authors to adventurers. Some program elements may also include audience participation. Alan Beaumont will produce, as previously announced, and the program will be directed by 'Ted Nathanson. The Norman Paris Trio will provide the music. Studio set for the show will be 3A in the RCA Bldg..... Max Factor & Co thru Anderson-McConnell Advertising(LA) becomes alternate week sponsor of Masquerade Party, effective tonight (10) and continuing thru Sept 4. Associated Products, Inc., is the alternate sponsor of the NBC program, Wed, 8-8:30pm EDT.

Westinghouse station KYW-TV in Cleveland has been doing a bit of crowing about absence of complaints from the viewing public, following its decision to drop NBC's live <u>Tonight</u>! program from its schedules and present feature films instead. (WBZ-TV in Boston, also a Westinghouse unit, followed the same procedure as KYW, putting thru the change on June 24). KYW-TV reports that after the first week, complaints to the station totaled only 12 letters and several cards. The biggest job of eating crow c ame from local newspaper radio-TV editors, who admitted that they had few protests after anticipating that viewers "would rise up and demand that <u>Tonight</u> be returned." The three newspaper radio-TV editors in Cleveland reported a combined total of five letters and two phone calls of protest against the station's action.

Walt Framer's new five-a-week audience and home participation show for ABC fall afternoon viewing, <u>Lady Luck</u>, will debut on the net Sept 30, Mon thru Fri, 4:30-5pm EDT. Keefe Brasselle will m.c. and star on the program, which will present contestants chosen because of an unusual lucky event in their lives, competing with one another for prizes. ABC, by the way, has no evening quiz or audience participation shows scheduled for its fall line-up.

Hollywood trade writers are boasting that 85 per cent of important TV programming will be produced in Hollywood during the next season, yet the majority also decry the apparent mediocrity of the announced program series in the sameness of their approach. Hollywood critics are also no different than others throughout the country in that they devote more news and critique space to live drame shows, no matter where they originate from, than they do for filmed programs. Few of the newsman-critics, at one time or another, have not wished for the "live" spark in film stories, although they know that any substantial swing back to live production can only hurt the burgeoning Hollywood economy. The biggest question on the TV horizon is: If a large group of Western series flounders next season, what type of programming will rush into the breach? Since TV has almost exhausted possible "trends" it can only revert to previously tested types of programming -- a smattering of anthology series, private eye productions or some newer types of wild-eyed adventure films, such as variations on the old science-fiction series. The current cry from cross-fingered ad agency execs seems to be, show me something new, unique, not-too-expensive but good -- in other words, a happy golden mean for TV.

Dennis O'Keefe will be the host for both the live and film programs on <u>Suspicion</u> over NEC, Mondays, 10-11pm EDT, starting Sept 30......Neil Simon and Irvin Graham have been signed as co-writers for ABC's <u>The Guy Mitchell Show</u>, starting Sept 21, Saturdays, 10-10:30pm EDT.....In case anyone has wondered what the dependable situation comedy writers for TV are doing these days, many of them have been assigned to do scripts for the <u>Eve Arden Show</u> (formerly, <u>It Gives Me Great Pleasure</u>). The CBS film series, starting this fall, Tuesdays, 8:30-9pm NYT, goes into production on July 23 at Desilu, with Edmund Hartmann producing and John Rich as director. The 15 writers who will work on scripts are: Hugh Wedlock, Howard Snyder, Everett Greenbaum, Marty Ragaway, Jack Douglas, Marvin Fisher, Joe Quillan, William Cowley, Peggy Chantler, William Davenport, Jim Fritzell, Sherman Marks, Leo Townsend, Seaman Jacobs and Sy Rose.

In addition to its spreading network sponsorship pattern, Max Factor & Co is adding to its spot schedule with "special situation" sponsorships, the biggest of which is this week's Miss Universe Beauty Pageant in Long Beach, Calif. The company will sponsor KTTV(LA)'s entire live coverage of the event, including nine telecasts on eight different days totalling more than 10 hours. The coverage is scheduled to begin Thursday morning, July 11, at approximately 10am PDT, when the contestants will arrive in Long Beach, airline weather permitting. There will be a one-hour luncheon telecast on Friday, 12:30-1:30pm; opening ceremonies Saturday, 10-11pm; the parade telecast on Sunday, 2:30-4:30pm, and then starting Tuesday, July 16, nightly telecasts of the activities running thru the final night's judging on Friday.

When West Coast movie producers run out of police enforcement agencies for West Coast cities and states (Los Angeles, San Francisco, California Highway Patrol, Cochise County, Nevada State Troopers) and Southern areas (Texas and New Orleans), someone may discover a ready-made pattern that covers the entire East Coast of the U. S. <u>U. S. One</u> runs from the northern tip of Maine to Key West, Florida, and over its vast route it covers every conceivable type of highway and is policed by every type of state and local law enforcement agency. The storied route presents almost any adventure-police angle a producer could want -- and just imagine the joy of an agency able to couple its sponsor's claims with the title of the show -- U. S. Number One.
