ENERAL: CBC could be off the air anytime, after editorial staff voted overwhelmingly to go on strike. The *Canadian* Choice appointed Canadian Cable Television Association Media Guild, the largest union at CBC, says 85.5% of CBC workers walk, CBC would be forced to shut down. If it does, it would be the first time. Exceptions are Quebec and Moncton where staff are repped by other unions. Federal Labour Minister Claudette Bradshaw must order more talks or release both sides from the conciliation process. Seven days after doing that, a strike or lock-out could occur, possibly by about March 15... Shaw Communications has filed with the CRTC to take control (49.96% of class A voting shares and 52% of the class B non-voting shares) of WIC Western International Communications. It's been a year since Shaw acquired the shares, but the company delayed its filing because of a continuing dispute over WIC ownership. Meantime, the shares have been held by a trustee. Because the filing asks to hold

> //FILM: CTV Inc. says it has succeeded in its \$409-million bid for a controlling interest in NetStar Communications, owner of The Sports Network (TSN/RDS and Discovery Channel, plus Dome Productions). While ESPN will continue holding 32% of NetStar, CTV President/CEO Ivan Fecan says the company will remain Canadian-controlled. Meantime pro sports owners say they'll fight the deal. They claim single ownership of Canada's two sports cable operators will eliminate competition and reduce rights fees. Representatives for Major League Baseball and team owners in the National Basketball Association and National Hockey League say with CTV's already owning Sportsnet (a regional service), Canada's only other all-sports specialty channel, that selling into a monopolistic situation won't be good for them. However, not mentioned by pro sports owners is the fact that the mainliners (CTV, Global, CBC and others) are still viable bidders. CTV still needs the okay from the Competition Bureau and the CRTC, approvals that could take upwards of nine months. CTV says it will issue 15 million

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new shares at \$20.50 apiece, to raise \$307.5 million to help pay for the NetStar takeover. A day after that announcement, CTV shares fell 7%... Meantime, the CRTC says CTV N1 cannot compete directly with CBC Newsworld by offering live news -- with certain exceptions. N1, says the commission, must maintain a headline news format, distinctly different from Newsworld. But a loophole does exist: "The live broadcast of special events such as press conferences and speeches is not specifically prohibited as long as other headline-news items are presented in every 15-minute block." That means, as an example, that N1 could offer 13 minutes of live footage and two minutes of news. And, in the case of another Swissair disaster, N1 can present uninterrupted live footage, so long as it's "consistent with a headline-news format"... The CRTC is responding to pressure to review trust arrangements through a call for comments. Trust arrangements are the temporary controls that have put ownership of some broadcast properties in limbo pending sale approval. The trust allows money to change hands, but keeps control out of the hands of the buyer. Taber, Saskatoon, and Chatham, ON. The TV and movie producer/specialty television broadcaster's strategy is to now expand into new off-shore markets to diversify its revenue sources... The CRTC has extended its deadline for comments



on an appropriate licensing framework that will be used in the consideration of applications for new pay and specialty services, from April 9 to May 14.

The stake is expected to fetch around \$12-million... New York-based Salomon Smith Barney Inc. says that with cable stock values at "unprecedented highs" in the US, their Canadian appear ripe for the picking. Rogers counterparts Communications and Le Groupe Videotron Ltee. are the pick of the litter. Even with recent moves off depressed lows, Canadian cable valuations remain 35% below U.S. multiples... **NBC** is said to be secretly negotiating with **Sony** to forge a worldwide relationship. The New Yorker magazine says the deal would allow the US TV network access to Sony's West Coast movie and T-V studios and it would give Sony the broadcast, cable and Internet distribution systems it lacks.

/FILM: In the aftermath of the police search of BC Premier Glen Clark`s home, and Vancouver's coverage of the search, former federal NDP leader Ed Broadbent denounced what he called the "cruel tactics" of BCTV. He says it was a clear case of invasion of privacy. Meantime, BCTV ND Steve Wyatt says "... what occurred at the Premier's residence could have been observed easily by anyone in the area at the time. We broadcast no more than that. We were not obtrusive, did not interfere in any way with the police and withdrew well back from the house while at the same time recording events as they unfolded. The issue here is not privacy alone but how it balances against the principle of public scrutiny..." Still, BC's privacy commissioner thinks Premier Clark has a case against BCTV. David Flaherty says the premier and his family suffered an invasion of privacy. Flaherty says a lawsuit might not be successful but he'd like to use the episode as a law-reform exercise... CHUM Television says it will launch **Star!** and **Canadian Learning Television** in

Standards Council (and based in Ottawa), has donated September. Star! is dedicated to the Canadian entertainment CHUM was awaiting the launch of digital-compression technology which would give crowded cable systems more channel space. But since most cablecos haven't reached that standard yet, CHUM will be pushing for room on the upper analogue tiers. Recent *CRTC* decisions include a requirement that country-wide basic cable tier access be given to TVA's French network and to APTN (Aboriginal Peoples Television Network)... Garth Ancier, incoming President of NBC **Programming**, says he wants to attract a younger audience, bringing the average demographic down from 43 to 38... Toronto-based **Nelvana** says its profit climbed 75% last year -\$8.6-million or \$1.21 a share, up from \$4.9-million or 86 cents in 1997 - because of a strategic business shift and a slate of successful programs, including Rolie Polie Olie which was nominated this week for a daytime Emmy Award. Revenue climbed to \$75.1-million from \$56.2-million. Nelvana programs such as Bob and Margaret and RPO have garnered huge ratings in Canada and the US, pushing profits higher. In 1998, Nelvana moved away from producing animation on a third-party basis for other companies and, for the first time, produced only its own programming... With Tuesday's closing date for funding applications to the Canadian Television Fund, word is that the number of applications meets the level of demand anticipated. CTF Chair Richard Stursberg says there are 559 applications requesting about \$325 million in funding. Last year about 500 applicants were vying for \$289 million. Successful applicants should begin to receive word next month, giving broadcasters early enough notice to include promotion in their fall launches.

> **EVOLVING DOOR:** Calgary legend **Ed Whalen**, on his 51st anniversary of broadcasting, announced he is retiring. His last Calgary Flames hockey broadcast will be April 15, but Whalen, 71, will continue his evening Calgary 7 sportscasts until the end of September. He's been with Calgary 7 for 44 years, joining the former CHCT TV in 1955... Ken Regan has returned to CKUA Alberta as GM.

> IGN-OFF: Retired broadcaster Roy Caley has passed away in Sarnia at 79. Caley worked for **CFCO Chatham** and CHOK Sarnia during a career of sports and news coverage, as well as writing newspaper columns. He had also been awarded by the then Central Canada Broadcasters Association (now Ontario Association of Broadcasters) with its Broadcaster of the Year honour.

/FILM: Toronto-based CanWest Entertainment, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CanWest Global Comcast and MediaOne Group have announced a buyout Communications Corp., has formed a new company called CanWest Entertainment International to act as its worldwide distribution arm. The new company will be headquartered in London, England. Greg Phillips, ex of CBS, MTM and Southern Star, is President... CTV is giving ESPN a veto over some operations of NetStar Communications, according to the terms of the CTV-ESPN shareholders' agreement. The prospectus also says CTV has agreed to transfer ownership of its stakes in other sports broadcast properties to NetStar. The shareholders' agreement gives ESPN an effective veto over some matters... The Federal Court of Canada has supported the Copyright Board and its TV Copyright decision. The Court's decision upholds the Copyright Board's initial ruling that all music played on TV can be directly licensed. It gives composers the choice of either managing their rights individually or through their collective. If they opt for individual management, broadcasters will now have the ability to pay performing rights royalties directly to composers. "This outcome is clearly a win-win-win," says Canadian Association of Broadcasters President/CEO Michael McCabe. "The ruling gives individual composers more choice and recognizes the new business reality broadcasters face everyday. It also supports the Copyright Board, which has recently been under attack by SOCAN and others"... Eighty-three CAN PRO awards were handed out at ceremonies in





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Ottawa Monday night at the 26th annual CAN PRO festival gala.
