# On Junior Magazine

# **Talented Youth Perform**

The third of a series of concerts on Junior Magazine Saturday, January 28, will afford another opportunity for young people—and grownups too—to become more familiar with great music, performed by up-and-coming young artists

THIS SEASON CBC-TV's Junior Magazine series is offering young viewers something special every few weeks—a youth concert by two outstanding young artists, one internationally known, one very promising, the newly formed Youth Choir conducted by Elmer Iseler, an orchestra conducted by Mario Bernardi, and Louis Applebaum as host.

The third concert will be presented Saturday, Jan. 28. It will feature 27-year-old Canadian baritone Donald Bell, hailed by critics as one of the greatest singers of our time, and 21-year-old 'cellist Rohan de Saram from England (see profile last issue), who is making his debut on both sides of the border this month.

Bell has sung in every major city in Canada, all over the States, through Europe, for three seasons at the Bayreuth Festival in Germany, and at the Lucerne Festival. He was born in Burnaby, B.C., and began studying music seriously as a boy soprano of nine. At 14 years, he caused a sensation when he won the vocal section for male singers under 21 at the B.C. Music Festival. At 18 he won scholarships from both the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto and the Royal College of Music in London.

He decided to use the London three-year scholarship, and after graduating from high school worked nights in a plywood mill to earn enough money to finance himself overseas.

In London he became known as "the Canadian with the golden voice," and was offered many outstanding engagements, but turned most of them down because he

wanted to devote himself to rigorous study.

It paid off—among the prizes he won was the Arnold Bax Memorial Medal in 1955, as the most outstanding student from the Commonwealth. After leaving the Royal School of Music Bell was invited to join Carl Ebert's private studio at the Berlin State Opera.

He made his Carnegie Hall debut a year ago, followed within a couple of weeks by his debut in London's Albert Hall, both with rave reviews.

The 24-member Youth Choir (12 boys, 12 girls, aged 10 to 19), is composed mostly of high school students. Elmer Iseler auditioned each separately. The choir includes four professional singers, one to lead each vocal section, so the others can benefit from their experience.

Founded in the fall, the choir is open to any young singer, but so far its members are mostly from the North York district of Toronto. They rehearse every Wednesdaybut before a concert it might be four or five times in a week-and for most of the singers it's more fun than work. Iseler hopes to build up the choir's repertoire to include all musical periods. He sets high standards, demanding above all a beautiful tone from his singers. The choir's first two appearances on Junior Magazine and on CBC radio were so successful that already it has been asked to fill public engagements.

Works of art in any medium are not made in a vacuum. Few writers have never read a book and made use of what they read-as Chaucer used Boccaccio for his "Canterbury Tales" or as Shakespeare took "Romeo and Juliet" and "Hamlet" from earlier plays on Romeo and Juliet and Hamlet. And who, after all, is not familiar in music with variation by one composers on themes by another? Some musicians, like Handel for instance. borrowed as freely from other composers as Rubens did from painters. Originality exists, is born miraculously and rarely . . . To count it indispensable to all works of art, as we tend to do nowadays, is to expect miracles to become commonplace,-British artist Michael Ayrton speaking about themes and variations in art.

# Protection from Fallout?

An atomic attack could kill 90 per cent of our population by centering bombs on key target areas. But the use of fallout shelters could reduce casualties by 50 to 80 per cent. The situation will be explored fully on a special one-hour Close-Up program, January 31

WILL RADIO - ACTIVE fallout shelters offer enough protection to the North American population in the event of a nuclear attack?

"In the case of nuclear war, and God forbid that there should be one, the casualties could be reduced by between 50 and 80 per cent by the use of fallout shelters," says Governor Leo Hoegh of Battle Creek, Mich., director of civil defence for the United States.

This is one view on the practicability of fallout shelters. There are others, such as that of Norman Cousins, editor of the Saturday Review, New York, who says:

"My argument is that if you were really concerned about protecting civilian population in the world today, there is only one way to do it and that is through peace. We cannot protect it through fallout shelters. We are concerned here not with just a military problem. We are concerned with our philosophy of life."

These contrasting opinions represent those which will be focussed on CBC-TV's Close-Up program about survival. The hour-long telecast sub-titled Three Feet of Earth, will be seen Tuesday, January 31.

Doug Leiterman, an editor-producer of *Close-Up*, prepared the program and will interview many of the experts who will voice their opinions on the subject of survival and fallout shelters in the event of a nuclear war.

Before Leiterman joined the Close-Up staff three years ago, he spent four years at the Ottawa correspondent for Southam News Services, dealing specifically with defence problems.

About the survival program, Leiterman says:

"The questions of fallout shelters seems to me to be the most critical facing Canadian citizens.

"Shall he spend \$500 to increase the chances of his family surviving in a desolated world? Does a shelter offer reasonable protection? If everybody built one, would the war which must be prevented be more likely to take place? These are the questions Close-Up is assessing in Three Feet of Earth. We are all too aware that the answers are involved with life and death."

Scientists say that three feet of earth is the amount necessary to save your life if attacked by nuclear weapons, provided you

# **Turnbull Loose** In Musical China Shop

NEWCOMER ANNOUNCER Jack Turnbull hosts 30 minutes of light music from the classics that now is heard on all three CBC stations in the prairies.

Musical Encores, enjoyed for the past 31/2 months by Alberta and Saskatchewan listeners each Wednesday night, now is heard in Manitoba Friday nights as a delayed broadcast. The program is produced by Ben Horch of CBC Winnipeg.

Jack's knowledgeable and downto-earth comments are sparked by what he hears in the music for himself. This generally turns out to be a lively and often erudite flow of musical sophistry, that might remind listeners, says Jack, of a Turnbull loose in a musical china shop.

Born in Moose Jaw in 1932, Jack has called Winnipeg home since the age of one year, with the exception of a period in Kenora, Ont., during which he started his broadcasting career-a career that now spans six years.

He is married and the proud father of a two-year-old fullback who, says Jack, the Blue Bombers can't use for another 18 years or

# Exploring the World's Greatest Minds

THE FATHER of modern psychiatry is a sweet, gentle old man of 85 who likes to spend his evenings playing patience or reading popular thrillers. The only living member of the "big three" of psychiatry, Professor Carl Jung is still working and writing in his charming home beside Switzerland's Lake Zurich, too busy to rest on his laurels or waste time with phoneys.

In an interview just before his last birthday he was asked what he was planning for it: "Why, to keep away from visitors, of course," he said. "Especially the high brows. Most of them haven't the remotest idea what I'm talking about. Trouble is, they don't bother to read my books because they're too high hat. I'm not taken in by intellectuals, you know. After all, I'm one myself."

Canadians will have the rare opportunity of meeting this wise old man in his home setting on Sunday Jan. 22. Prof. Jung will be seen on CBC-TV in the new BBC series Face to Face, which offers informal interviews with famous people. Sitting in an ordinary armchair, leaning on a walking stick, Jung talks about life, death and war in an interview with John Freeman. one of Britain's most popular television personalities, and the editor of The New Statesman. Freeman does most of his talking with his back to the camera, leaving the viewer free to study his subject, and an interesting study it always is, as Freeman's quiet probing reveals personalities, ambitions, motives.

In the interview with Jung, which includes some interesting, Karsh-like close-ups of the domeheaded old man, he recalls his friendship with Freud, from whom he eventually broke away to pursue his own theories. They corresponded, but Jung refuses to allow their letters to be published in his lifetime. The two of them analyzed each other's dreams, "but," says

Jung, "it is rather indiscreet to ask about them. There is such a thing as a professional secret."

Some of the most absorbing passages in the program deal with Jung's childhood (he brags of his roughness and toughness as a boy); his relations with his parents (whom he describes as having belonged to the latter part of the Middle Ages, intellectually an immense expanse of time away from their son's ideas); his education and decision to make psychiatry his subject; and with his conclusions, as a scientist, about death and time and space.

Jung talks about his 19 grand-children, none of whom, he says, is at all afraid of him—even steal his belongings if they happen to want them! Many members of his large family live near him, but not in his house by the lake, which only his secretaries and his English housekeeper share with him.

Does he believe in God? "A difficult question. I know. I don't believe. I know." What is his psychological type? "I am intuitive . . . my relation to reality not particularly brilliant—I was often at variance with the reality of things."

He makes many thought-provoking remarks: "We are not of today or of yesterday. We are of an immense age . . . We need more understanding, because the only real danger that exists is man himself, and we are pitifully unaware of it . . ." "I don't allow myself to believe just for the sake of believing. We are the origin of all coming evil."

Sir Roy Welensky, the controversial, self-educated Prime Minister of Southern Rhodesia, and an ex-boxer, will be seen January 29. John Freeman is known as a wily interviewer, but Welensky gives him a run for his money—accuses Freeman of glib phrases, lectures him on Africa, and gives every potential candidate for a hostile interview a lesson in Oneupmanship.

# Canada School Telecasts

Ten Minutes with Dr. Charles H. Best, the co-discoverer, (with Dr. Frederick Banting) of insulin. Where History Was Made. "Room of Destiny." first explain the situation in Canada prior to 1867, presenting leading arguments both in favor of Confederation and against it. Then it will show the historic meeting.

# THE GOD THAT FAILED

Four men of letters, co-authors of a book expressing their disillusionment with Communism, a political belief that they once embraced, will be interviewed on this series of programs. The series should give considerable insight into the workings of Communism

ELEVEN YEARS ago a revealing book on Communism was published under the title of *The God That Failed*. It contained personal essays by six distinguished men of letters who had once emotionally and spiritually embraced Communism as man's last hope, and then had experienced bitter desolation when it failed. They were Arthur Koestler, Andre Gide, Ignazio Silone, Louis Fischer, Stephen Spender, and Richard Wright. Since then Gide and Wright have died.

The other four will appear in five important one-hour programs on CBC radio's *Project '61* series to take another look at the nature of Communism in the light of today. They will be interviewed by the editor of the book, Richard H. S. Crossman, British Labour M.P. for Coventry, who will also introduce and summarize the programs.

Excerpts from their writing when under Communist influence will be read, as well as from their essays in *The God That Failed*, in which they describe its original appeal and why they were disillusioned. Then, in a 2,000-word prepared statement, each will reassess the book in today's international environment, and explore general ideological questions. The interviews will be spontaneous and candid, with no prepared statements.

Frank Freedman, editor of the four-part series, says he had hoped to have Richard Wright appear, too, but he died in Paris before he could be interviewed. "However," says Freedman, "he left us a powerful and moving written indictment of the West, which, with an exchange of correspondence with Richard Crossman, provides a deeply emotional revelation of his attitudes."

"Undoubtedly," says Freedman, "in these critical times that have witnessed the intensification and spread of Communism, the perspectives these men can bring to bear are, for our purposes, more valid than most. Through them, and the spiritual desolation they shared with The God That Failed, we are attempting to communicate clear, highly personalized insights, free of partisan propaganda, that may help clarify what is probably the most demanding problem today. In addition, we have secured from the BBC actual recordings, news reports and important political declarations from around the time of the Spanish Civil War and the onset of the Second World War, with particular reference to the Stalin-Hitler pact of 1939, which we will use in the programs. It was during that period that the principals in the series became disenchanted with Communism. These recordings will help listeners to consider the interviews and statements in their proper perspective, to examine the true nature of Communism from inside and out, and to consider the apparent failure of Western democracy that would lead such men to Communism.

"I can't think of a better way of cutting through the excesses of propaganda that seem to obscure real issues and confuse basic understandings, than with the honest, powerfully-charged statements of these men."

# To Interview Arthur Koestler

In part one of *The God That Failed*, five part series on *Project* '61 starting Sunday afternoon, Arthur Koestler will be featured.

Described as "the poet and ideologue of the homeless radical," he was born in Budapest in 1905, the son of a promoter and would-be inventor. After studying at the University of Vienna he spent several months tramping through the Near East, then, with no previous experience, bagged the job of foreign correspondent for a German newspaper chain, and continued in journalism in the Near East. Paris and Berlin.

He joined the Communist Party in 1931, and spent a year in the USSR as an intellectual tourist, where the Russians' unique form of payola made him believe that he had found a literary heaven. Although almost unknown as a writer, he was lionized everywhere and was paid handsome fees for everything he wrote—sight unseen.

In 1936 Koestler covered the Franco revolt as a correspondent for the London *News Chronicle*, was captured by the Fascists, and condemned to death as a spy. But

British protests saved him and he returned to England. At the outbreak of the Second World War he was imprisoned in France as a refugee, was later released and escaped to England to enlist in the British Army.

After his experiences in Spain and the Moscow Trials of 1936 he became disillusioned with revolution as a policy and broke with the

Probably his most outstanding book is Darkness at Noon, which established his reputation as a political novelist. Lately he has said he is finished with novels and has turned to forthright autobiography. He spends most of his time in England.

# Pierre Won't Act His Age

Pierre Monteux is 86 years old, but has the endurance and vitality of a youngster. By all indications, music lovers can look forward to many more thrilling concerts under his baton. such as the special 90-minute CBC Symphony performance to be broadcast Friday, February 3

PIERRE MONTEUX, a little man with twinkling green eyes, a white walrus moustache, and curling black hair brushed straight back, is going on 86 and absolutely refuses to act his age.

One of the greatest and bestloved conductors on the continent, he keeps radiantly vigorous through a gruelling schedule that would fatigue others a third as old. After every concert, still fresh as a daisy, he gustily demolishes a plateful of ovsters washed down with champagne.

Where does he get all his energy? "I just do what I have to do," he says. "I do not go out, do not socialize at all. For this I am excused because of my age. So I am left to conduct.

"I confess it is strange, as I have been officially retired since 1952. But you know what happens?

Symphony boards, they say to each other: Monteux, we must have him before he dies. So I work.'

"It amuses Pierre," relates his wife, Doris, "to see younger conductors eyeing him appraisingly, as if they would ask: When is that old bozo going to give up? But he insists he'll conduct till he's 90, and die holding a baton."

Friday, February 3 this remarkable old maestro will conduct the CBC Symphony Orchestra in a special 90-minute radio broadcast.

Born in Paris in 1875 Monteux began his career as a violinist, later switched to viola, and made his conducting debut in 1911 when he directed the première of Stravinsky's Petrouchka for the Ballet Russe.

He has had long tenures with the Metropolitan Opera, Boston Symphony, Concertgebouw chestra of Amsterdam, and the San Francisco Symphony and has guest conducted all over the world.

### Teletheatre

According to the great French author Albert Camus: "Spain is a unique country, where a sublime and mysterious destiny seems to unite the love of life and the despair of death.

For "Yerma," damned spouse and ardent mother, death is only as far as the end of the road.

In April, 1931, Alphonse XIII, King of Spain, flees from the revolutionary forces of the new Republic of Spain. It is only the beginning of a vast movement for the emancipation of popular culture in the Iberian peninsula.

Federico Garcia Lorca, who has just returned from a long voyage to the United States and Cuba, is named director of a theatrical troupe called "La Barraca," which plays in the distant, sparsely populated districts of Spain.

Improvisation comes to Lorca as a second nature. Along with a number of better-known plays, by Lope de Vega, Cervantès and Calderon, to which he adroitly adds a good measure of old folk songs, dances and music, Lorca proudly presents a few of his own contributions: "Dona Rosita," "Les Noces de Sang," "Yerma."

In 1935, his principal actress and good friend Margarita Xirgu presents in Madrid a revised version of "Yerma." It is an immediate triumph.

This is the period when in France, Andre Malraux publishes "La condition humaine," when Jean Anhouilh brings to the scene "La Sauvage," and Jean Giraudoux "La Guerre de Troie n'aura pas lieu." It is also a period of inner strife in the country, that of the Ethiopian war and the death of Maxime Gorki. An atrocious civil war is in the beginning. Federico Garcia Lorca will die of a stray bullet (or so it is said) at the ripe old age of 36!

As in all Lorca's other plays, "Yerma," a pastoral in three Acts and six tableau, is set in Andalucia. It is highlighted by a haunting musical theme, endlessly repeated by Yerma, in which she sings her desolation at not being able to bear a child. Of Jean, her husband, she complains that if he is a good provider, he gives her

little comfort, since he does not want any children . . . in order, he maintains, to preserve the prosperity of his private industry. Yerma, who is Fidelity personnified, would not think of another man.

She will continue to yearn for a child, creating in her heart a mythical son, whom she calls by name. "Where were you child, my love?" . . . What do you want? . . . where are you going?" . . . Her hopes are so high that she actually prepares a layette for the baby "who will come."

If "Noces de sang" was a drama of maternity, "Yerma" is by opposition, the drama of sterility.

Its beautiful prose to which the author has subtly added a few verses that sing of the human nature and the beauty of life, seems to gather from the source of life itself.

"Yerma," produced in Montreal by Paul Blouin, stars Monique Miller, as "Yerma," Jean-Louis Roux, Robert Gadous, Jacques Godin, Pascale Perrault, Marthe Thierry, Colette Courtois, Nicole Filion, Monique Mercure, Madeleine Langlois, and Nicole Goyette. # PROTECTION FROM **FALLOUT?**

(Continued from page 3)

escaped the initial blast and fire. Over your head, the earth would protect you from lethal effects of radio-active fallout. This is the main reason for building a shelter under the ground.

Dr. Edward Teller of Oakland, Cal., "father of the H-bomb" and one of the participants on the program, estimates that fallout could kill 90 per cent of the population in Canada and the United States if unprotected by shelters from a nuclear attack of 300 high-yield weapons (H-bombs).

It is the official policy of the Canadian and American governments to encourage every citizen to build himself a fallout shelter.

In the foreword of a booklet. "Your Basement Fallout Shelter," issued last June by the Canadian government, Prime Minister Diefenbaker says:

"In announcing the policy of the Government concerning shelters for civil defence purposes, I-stated that substantial protection against radio-active fallout could be achieved by family shelters built at home at a modest cost.

"Although Canada will persist in its efforts to avoid war, and to settle international disputes by peaceful means, there still remains some risk of nuclear war. Should a nuclear war occur, the risk of radio-active fallout will be very

widespread, and will endanger many of us in our homes, even though a long way from the bomb explosion. The best and simplest way to safeguard against fallout is by household shelters which will provide protection . . . although not affording protection against the blast of a nuclear explosion or the fires that may result.

"Each householder can and should decide whether or not to have this form of family protection. I recommend it."

In Canada, National Housing Act loans of up to \$500 are available for use in building shelters. The booklet distributed by the government gives detailed plans of building a shelter.

Robert Bryce, secretary of the federal cabinet and in charge of emergency measures, will appear on Three Feet of Earth, his first television appearance.

Bryce thinks the main problem of fallout shelters "has been public (Please turn to page 31)



It is also decided that the long standing requests of the press for permission to accompany one of the lunar expeditions be granted.

where a cheeseburger and bottle of root beer cost 15 cents.

Later that year he was a radio announcer in Atlanta, Georgia, at \$20 a week. In 1941, WORL in Knoxville upped the ante to \$25, a salary he earned until World War II.

He joined the Air Force, and was discharged in 1945. He naturally returned to Bristol. But Ernie and his wife, Betty, decided to head west. Without promise of a job, they bought a 1941 car, and started for California.

He worked briefly in radio stations in San Bernardino and Reno. But the big break for his career came when he signed with station KXLA in Pasadena as a hillbill disc jockey and newscaster. He met Cliffie Stone, veteran performer and star of his own Los Angeles TV show, "Hometown Jamboree." Ernie became a vocalist on Cliffie's show. and in 1948 began recording for Capitol records. In 1950 he started making nightclub appearances. He went on ABC radio network in 1952 as a disc jockey; starred in 1953 on NBC-TV's summer show "The College of Musical Knowledge"; started his own daytime five-a-week show on NBC-TV, and in 1956 premiered his high-rated "The Ford Show."

The LPRT's

A special feature of CBC service is the Low Power Relay Transmitter. inertia—the type of response by the man who says: 'Well, I do not think it will happen'."

Others who will take part in the Close-Up program are:

Major-General A. E. Wrinch, Canadian Army Headquarters officer in charge of survival, Ottawa; Dr. Ed Massey, scientist for the defence research board, Ottawa; Dr. R. Wright, geologist of the British Columbia Research Council; R. B. Currie, head of the Federal Emergency Measures Organization, successor to the Federal Civil Defence Organization; Dr. Linus Pauling of Pasadena, Cal., a Nobel-Prize winning chemist; Dr. Ralph E. Lapp of Washington, D.C., nuclear physicist; Dr. Herman Kahn of Santa Monica, Cal., author of the recently-published book On Thermo Nuclear War and physicist for the Rand Corporation; Ammon Hennacy, a leading American pacifist; Major - General H. H. Worthington, for nine years head of Canada's Civil Defence Organization. Dr. Lapp will talk about ICBM bases and their danger towards the civilian population.

Currie and Dr. Wright will be in a debate on the merits of shelters and they will be questioned by a live audience. Bryce, Major-General Wrinch and Dr. Massey will form part of a group discussion, moderated by Leiterman, who will also interview the other people on the program.

His story pours out with revealing frankness: "My father was an adventurer and was always chasing rainbows . . . Boxing was my first love . . . I suffered with the stigma of being a Jew . . . I was fat as a kid . . . They support you when you win, and if you lost you're in the dressing room on your own . . . the sooner you learn that in this vale of tears the better for you."

son of actor Walter Huston, and the man who hit Errol Flynn so hard that he had to be taken to hospital. Huston appears with no political message, and no grouch against Hollywood. In short, as a model of respectability, in sharp contrast to the flamboyant phoney he is painted as in books like Picture (Lillian Ross) and White Hunter with a Black Heart (Peter Viertel).

On February 5th viewers will be Face to Face with Lord Birkett. one of Britain's outstanding criminal lawyers and judges, who served as one of the judges at the war crimes trials at Nuremberg.

Stirling Moss appears on February 12th to give a fascinating glimpse into the mind of a professional racing driver. Fear to him, he says, is a lack of understanding of what is happening. To put his foot down hard at the corner for the first time requires a conscious act of courage. He worries more about having driven badly than having won or lost. He isn't afraid of killing himself but of being killed by something out of his control, and he would consider retiring

only "if somebody passed me on a corner in a similar car." He makes it clear that he has paid a high price for the exhileration and the glamour of his life, but that he does not complain of the bargain.

# The Twenty Years of Gershwin

THE PROGRAM we have put together for the CBC Trans-Canada Radio Network broadcast on Friday, January 27, is not designed as a tribute to George Gershwin. There have been many Gershwin tributes before and there will certainly be many more to come, but this time we see the composer through the eyes of the people who knew him best, and we hear him through the rare recordings he made as a pianist.

The person who knew Gershwin best was, perhaps, his brother Ira. He tells of the time when a piano was hoisted through the window of their apartment on the lower east side of New York. The piano was for Ira, a most unwilling student who was immediately relieved to find his younger brother sitting at the instrument the moment it arrived. Ira never had to take the seat.

Hollywood music director Alfred Newman tells of his first meeting with George. Newman's aunt forced Gershwin into hearing her 13-year-old nephew play the piano. A few years later a still very young Newman was the conductor on the first big Gershwin Broadway show The George White Scandals of 1920. The same Alfred Newman was the conductor of The Goldwyn Follies of 1937 and Gershwin died while writing the songs for that picture.

Paul Whiteman recalls the afternoon of February 12, 1924, at New York's Aeolian Hall. It was an experimental concert of American music, for which he had commissioned Gershwin to write a jazz piece for piano and symphony orchestra. Whiteman was so nervous he lost his place in the Rhapsody in Blue, but not George.

"George loved nothing better than playing his own music and he couldn't possibly lose his place —his place was wherever there was a piano and listeners," says Newman. U.S. composer George Gershwin was a remarkable personality as well as a musical genius. The people who knew him best will recall his great moments on this 60-minute special

Fred Astaire knew Gershwin for months before realizing he was a composer. In 1914 Gershwin was a song plugger-piano pounder at Remick's and Astaire was one of hundreds who came to hear the latest tunes. "He was fabulous at the piano and he could make even the poorest tune sound like a concerto.

"He used to kid me that one day he would write a whole show for me. Well, in 1925 he did. It was Lady Be Good. The next year there was another big one—Funny Face, and ten years after that there were a couple of Hollywood pictures, Shall We Dance and Damsel in Distress. If you consider all the wonderful songs in those shows you'll know why I loved George."

Arthur Schwartz is a Broadway composer of considerable quality and taste, and he stands in awe of Gershwin. "If George had never written anything else but songs his contribution to American music would still have been prodigious. He captured the pulse of the people and quickened it because the force of his musical personality was great enough to raise the level of taste that existed before him."

Oscar Levant was a close friend of Gershwin but not an uncritical one. "George, if you had to do it all over again, would you still fall in love with yourself?" he once queried. And on another occasion: "An evening with Gershwin is an evening of Gershwin."

He also added that nobody ever objected. And we don't think anyone will object, either, to 60 minutes with George Gershwin next Friday evening.

# CHILI CON CARNE

1 15 oz. can kidney beans 1 20 oz. can pork and beans 1 lb. minced round steak 1 large onion—chopped 2 tbsp. oil 1 28 oz. can tomatoes 1/2 cup uncooked rice 1 tbsp. salt 1/2 tbsp. chile powder 1/4 tsp. thyme 1/8 tsp. cloves

Saute meat and onion in hot oil. If this is being cooked in oven, add all other ingredients. Cover and cook for at least 1 hour or longer. In pressure cooker, saute meat and onions, add seasoning, tomatoes and rice. Bring pressure up to 15 lb. pressure for 10 minutes. Let pressure come back to normal then add kidney beans and pork and beans and heat.

Lovely served with buttered noodles and a tossed salad.

# BUTTERED NOODLES

1 pkg. broad noodles 1 quart water-boiling 3/4 tbsp. salt 1/3 lb. butter 3 finely ground crackers

Cook noodles for approximately 8 minutes in salted boiling water. Drain. Melt butter and add crumbs. Mix with cooked noodles.
