In arriving at its decision to broadcast Saturday night NIIL games on CBC-TV, the CBC took into consideration its responsibilities to audiences in different time zones across Canada. It is felt that Saturday evening "prime time" viewing should contain more variety of program subject material than just hockey. Therefore, hockey fans are allotted some 75 minutes of their favourite sport (this allotment has not been decreased recently, as this reader implies) and others, who may not appreciate hockey as much, have other fare presented for their interest.

NIIL hockey still receives more coverage in terms of CBC prime network time than any other sport. However, if the hockey games were not at night, and if the hockey season were not such a long one, we might very well carry full games.

CBC Radio offers more complete coverage, starting 30 minutes earlier than the network telecast.

CBC-TV starts the week in gales of laughter, with Carol Burnett's special Sunday (back cover) and an hour of comic keyboard antics by Victor Borge Monday (front cover).

MILLIONS OF CHILDREN the world over have been enchanted by Serge Prokofieff's orchestral narration of the fairy tale *Peter and the Wolf.* Another fairytale setting in the form of a song by the same composer, *The Ugly Duckling*, will receive its broadcast premiere Sunday, February 24 at 4:45 p.m. on CBC Radio's Song Recital.

Soprano Nona Mari and concert pianist Ada Bronstein will perform the work, originally written for voice and piano in 1914 and revised by the composer in 1932. It was once described by the dean of Russian letters, Maxim Gorki, as a work that "expresses truly human qualities of compassion" in portraying the metamorphosis of a humble feathered member of the barnyard community into a beautiful swan.

The Hans Christian Andersen story was translated from Prokofieff's Russian version by Robert Burness. Ben Horch is producer.

DO YOU THINK high schools should prepare their students for specific jobs rather than give them a general education? This question, and others related to technical and vocational training, form the topic for the second of the Saskatchewan Federation of Home and School panel broadcasts on CBK Regina, 8:00 p.m., Tuesday, February 26.

Taking part in the broadcast are C. R. Ford, director of the Technical and Vocational Training Branch, Federal department of Labour; J. A. Doyle, director of vocational education for Saskatchewan; W. J. J. Walker, superintendent of high schools, Regina, and J. G. Stepan of the National Employment Service, Regina.

Chairman for the series of broadcasts is the Hon. Mr. Justice R. L. Brownridge. Mr. Brownridge, born in Saskatoon in 1914, moved to Moose Jaw at an early age. Graduated from the University of Saskatchewan with a law degree, he articled with the law firm of Prime Minister John Diefenbaker in Prince Albert, then took up practice in Moose Jaw. Made a Q.C. in 1951, he was appointed a judge of the Saskatchewan Court of Queen's Bench in 1959, and was elevated to the Court of Appeals in October, 1961. He now resides in Regina.

# Wagner's Enduring Monument to Love

THE ROMANCE of Tristan and Isolde, a burning saga of a handsome young knight with a quick wit and a facile tongue, who assumes a false name to win a lovely Irish princess and acquire the benefits of her magic healing powers, has been told in many languages and ages, has been dramatized and sung all over the world. Wagner used it as the basis of one of his most popular operas and his most poetic libretto, Tristan und Isolde, which will be broadcast direct from the stage of the Metropolitan Opera on Saturday, February 23, at 1:30 p.m. Hans Hopf and Birgit Nilsson sing the title roles, with lerome Hines as King Marke, Walter Cassel as Kurneval, and Irene Dalis as Brangane. Georg Solti conducts.

In the opera's probing exploration of the wilderness of passion, Wagner made *Tristan und Isolde* an enduring moment to love. "Since I have never known in life the real happiness of love, I have determined to build a monument to this most beautiful of all dreams... I have in mind *Tristan und Isolde*," he wrote to Franz Liszt in 1854, the year Wagner began work on the opera.

Like most of his writing it is a redemption saga. Wagner was preoccupied with the mystery of salvation—not so much as revealed in church doctrines, but more with the symbols and techniques of redemption, with the idea of the majesty of death, of death as the only pathway to fulfilment. Because their love began in the awareness of death, it is always thus oriented. But romantic as the lovers are, they are also practical. They are aware that only in an afterlife can they be truly together, and they take steps accordingly.

One of the most interesting things about the opera is the way Wagner points up the fact that our self-styled maturity in adulthood is really sour grapes. The adolescent, he says, sees things we don't. He is capable of a ruthless analysis of adulthood. The adolescent looks squarely at a problem the rest of us are trying to forget-the question of how love, life, and death hang together - and sees it and all its implications. Freudian and otherwise, much more vividly than he ever will again when he has taken the irrevocable step over the threshold of adulthood. By the end of his opera Wagner makes his audience realize that if to be mature is to be realistic, then the teenager is sometimes more mature than his parents.

# IBSEN: Comedy as Well as Tragedy

IT COMES AS a distinct shock to some theatre-goers to discover how terribly funny Ibsen can be. They, of course, are thinking of him only as the gloomy author of *Ghosts, An Enemy of the People*, and other plays where his biting satire makes short shrift of some of society's shams and conventions. But in *The Wild Duck*, while keeping a caustic tongue handy, he ventures into comedy with bold success.

This brilliant dramatization of the abstract idea that most of us are ill-equipped to bear the fierce blaze of absolute truth, progresses to a deeply moving tragedy at the end, one of the most unforgettable tragedies in all literature. But on the way it offers some highly amusing situations and dialogue that are as inevitable as the tragedy, and just as important and natural an ingredient of the situation which produces them both. Act two is almost pure comedy, so that later, when a tragic situation begins to develop around a conflict of wills, the audience is no more aware of what is bound to happen than the characters are, and thus the final tragedy is all the more poignant.

The Wild Duck is magnificent entertainment, combining fierce satire and a warm understanding of human frailties, with characters who seem too real to be imaginary. They are not remarkable people at all, but they manage to keep their audiences interested in what they are going to do or say next, from the moment the curtain rises. Ibsen insisted that their ideas were their own, that he simply wrote them down for them. He said they followed him around wherever he went, chatting mentally with him – even at parties after he had given them strict instructions to let him have a bit of a breather for a change. No wonder he had a reputation for being terse and absent-minded at social gatherings!

In the 90-minute CBC-TV production of *The Wild Duck* to be seen on *Festival* Monday night, February 25, John Colicos will be seen as Gregers Werle; Peter Donat as Hjalmar Ekdal; Norma Renault as Gina Ekdal; Diane Leblanc as Hedvig Ekdal; and special guest star Everett Sloane as Haakon Werle. Production is by Harvey Hart. The adaptation for television is by Alvin Goldman.



Ibsen's idea in the drama was to illustrate the dreadful effects of the wrong kind of idealism: the idealism of Gregers Werle, who was determined to seek out the truth, no matter what the cost. The sad experiences of the Ekdal family in their quaint, untidy but until then happy household, as Werle proceeds with his quest, are reflected in the experiences of a wild duck which the daughter keeps as a pet.

Technically the play is a marvel of construction, with no loose ends or wasted words anywhere, despite its great length. And so the task of cutting it to fit radio or TV time requirements is always a frustrating task. An interesting thing to remember about this great dramatic masterpiece is that it was written for the people, not just for an élite group with special understanding. So you can imagine the sensation it and other Ibsen dramas made in the settled Victorian theatre, cluttered as it was with beautiful ladies, bold bandits, silly farces, and classical tragedy, when they jolted audiences with the suggestion that they think. And many of the audiences, being unfamiliar with the process, resisted loudly for some time. Fortunately for Ibsen and the development of the theatre, George Bernard Shaw shouted the Norwegian playwright's praises far, wide, and handsomely.

Four young British adventurers are seen on their recent Arctic expedition to learn more about the ill-fated Franklin expedition of 1845.

AMONG THE EARLY explorers who led the way into Canada's Arctic regions, none had a more adventurous or tragic history than Sir John Franklin, who gave his name to the vast district lying along the extreme northern boundary of Canada's mainland.

Franklin was a British naval officer who, after serving his time as a midshipman and junior officer -he took part in the battle of Trafalgar with Nelson-turned to Arctic exploration and spent much of his life making extensive journeys across the north, opening up new areas and broadening the horizons of man's knowledge of the Arctic. Between 1819 and 1827, he explored the northern Canadian coast, following the Coppermine and Mackenzie rivers far inland, and covering territory known previously only to the Eskimos.

His most famous expedition, from which he was destined never to return, was begun in 1845 when he set out with two ships, the Erebus and the Terror, in an attempt to discover the elusive channel that had challenged men's curiosity for generations: the North-West passage to the Orient. As it happened, Franklin virtually discovered the long-sought passage; later investigation revealed that, sailing from the east, he had reached within a few miles of linking up with the farthest point of exploration from the west.

But that revelation was made many years later and by other explorers, for no one in Franklin's party ever returned to tell the tale of their Arctic odyssey. After passing through Lancaster Sound and wintering at Beechey Island, the ships were trapped in Victoria Strait in September, 1846. Unable to escape from the imprisoning icefield, the party suffered terrible


hardship from starvation, disease, and bitter cold for almost 20 months. Franklin died in June, 1847.

Almost a year later, in April, 1848, the survivors abandoned the ships and set out along the western shores of King William Island, following a route marked out by an earlier explorer, Thomas Simpson, in 1839. The 105 men, under the command of Captain F. R. M. Crozier, hoped to follow the trail to one of the Hudson's Bay Company outposts. None made it. Beset by scurvy and weakened by lack of food, the men dropped out, one by one, until the entire party was wiped out.

In life, Franklin had made great achievements in Arctic exploration, and even in death he contributed to the cause. The total disappearance of his party was the prime motive in Arctic exploration for the next 20 years. The mysterious disappearance caught the imagination of the world, and many search expeditions were sent out in attempts to solve the puzzle. The attempts were successful; little by little the story was pieced together until the full tragedy was disclosed. Perhaps more important, each successive search expedition gleaned information, not only on Franklin's fate, but on the nature and geography of the Arctic.

Last year another group of searchers went into the north with the aim of discovering the answers to a few questions still remaining about the ill-fated Franklin party. Four young British adventurers -David Gordon-Deane, Russell Polden, Robin Challis, and Robert Cundy - trekked up to Cape Britannia in search of a stone cairn believed to contain log-books or messages left during the Franklin survivors' futile march. The cairn, identified as Beacon Six, was one of seven land-marks erected by Simpson in 1839. It was known that some of Franklin's men had passed the cairn. Did they leave any message there? No one knew, for Beacon Six had not been visited by a white man for more than a century.

What they found at the site will be shown this week on CBC-TV's 20/20, Sunday afternoon, Febru-(Please turn to page 9)



ary 24. The program, entitled Beacon Six, consists of film footage shot by the group during its sevenweek journey, with narration by Robert Cundy. First shown on CBC-TV last month, the program is being repeated due to wide interest among viewers.

Equipped with about 1,500 pounds of gear, the four men began their trip at Montreal, travelled by automobile to Yellowknife, then flew north to Back River, the settlement that the remnants of Franklin's party had vainly attempted to reach a century earlier. From Back River, the group pushed on to the cairn by kayak and on foot.

The young searchers had decided upon the expedition as a result of meeting and talking to Noel Wright, a retired naval officer who for many years conducted research on early Arctic explorers and who has written a book entitled Quest for Franklin.





# Quebec's Winter Carnival


THE QUEBEC Winter Carnival is in full swing and, as the colourful festival begins its third and last week, sportsmen and revellers from all over North America are crowding into the old city on the north bank of the St. Lawrence to partake of the fun, thrills, and pageantry.

CBC-TV viewers will be able to share in some of the excitement of Carnival events on Sunday, February 24, when CBC-TV remote-telecast crews present coverage of two of the Carnival's most colourful events: the traditional torchlight snowshoe procession, and the unique canoe race across the St. Lawrence.

The torchlight parade, videotaped earlier during the Carnival, will be shown in a half-hour program. Immediately following that telecast, one hour's live coverage will be presented of the canoe race, one of the last major events in the Carnival.

In the race across the mile-wide stretch of river between Quebec and the city of Levis on the south shore, the intrepid competitors fight a dangerous battle against strong winds, treacherous currents, and shifting tides, as well as the hulking ice - floes that lie across their path. The five-man crews manhandle the heavy war canoes across moving floes and open water in one of the world's most arduous and spectacular sporting events.

When, wet, weary, and wellnigh frozen, the crews reach Levis, their troubles are only half over; they must turn around and re-cross the ice and water to reach the finish line on the north shore at Quebec. It's no sport for the weak or timid, but the hardy Quebec teams seem to thrive on it, and it should make for some exciting viewing this Sunday afternoon.


## The Artist Who Ran Away From Success

AFTER COMPLETING the largest mural ever undertaken in Canada by a Canadian artist-the 100feet-long, 15-feet-high, panoramic story of the arts in the lobby of Toronto's O'Keefe Centre - which brought him several more attractive commissions, York Wilson and his wife closed down their unusual and ultra-modern home in Toronto and took off for Europe. They settled into a studio in Paris which is far from the last word in modernity. The kitchen, which also contains the furnace, is so tiny that it's hard to turn around in it after a heavy meal.

Many were surprised that an artist at the peak of achievement and recognition should leave the scene of his good fortune for foreign parts and far-from-luxurious living. He was not only being acclaimed for the O'Keefe mural and another large one in the Imperial Oil Building in Toronto, considered one of the finest murals on the continent, but for many highly successful one-man shows. Wilson said he wanted the fresh inspiration offered by completely new surroundings-without the distractions of an incessantly-ringing telephone.

It has been a highly productive period for him. The Wilsons have spent two years abroad and expect to stay for another year. Part of the time they have travelled around in a small car stuffed with



# The Good Old Days Of the Big Dancebands

Jo Stafford and Peggy Lee, big names in showbusiness who started with the big bands of another era, come together Thursday on "Playdate Presents the Jo Stafford Show."

ABOUT A GENERATION ago, the popular-music scene in North America was dominated by big dance bands. Ruling over the kingdom of swing were such princes as Glenn Miller, Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey, Harry James, Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw, and an assortment of other nobles, including Duke Ellington, Count Basie, and Earl Hines.


When not ensconced in their castles in New York --Roseland or the Palace Theatre--the rulers were wont to travel the length and breadth of the kingdom they shared, visiting their subjects in large and small cities and towns, stopping at a different place each night.

They took with them large entourages of musicians and singing ladies - in - waiting, some of whom became famous in their own right. Among the latter were Anita O'Day, Helen Forrest, Peggy Lee, Martha Tilton, Connie Boswell, Margaret Whiting, Jo Stafford, Helen O'Connell, and Ginnie Simms.

This week, on *Playdate Presents the Jo Stafford Show* (Thursday, February 28), two of the most successful band vocalists of that era–Jo Stafford and Peggy Lee–both of whom are still top names in showbusiness, reminisce about the good old days of the late 1930s and early '40's, in a program designed to evoke nostalgia for that bygone period in the popular-music business.

The era of the big bands seems, in retrospect, more glamorous than the showbusiness world of today, when one can see and hear top entertainers without even leaving one's home, merely by switching on a television set. Of course, a few of the big bands are still around, but, to quote a Duke Ellington song title: "Things ain't what they used to be." The golden age is past, victim of rapidly changing social patterns that have decimated the large ballroom audiences of former years.

But, while the fans may have seen the life of a dance-band musician or singer as all glitter and gaiety, the performers themselves saw it in a different light. To them, especially when touring on (*Please turn to page* 27)

After the 1940 presidential election, he kept his promise to resign, if Roosevelt, whom he supported in 1932 and 1936 but thereafter opposed, was returned. But he later returned to office.

Lewis was widely criticized for calling miners' strikes in wartime and during postwar reconversion, but retained the miners' support. Under his leadership their wages tripled in 25 years and working conditions were greatly improved.

Georg Solti. Act I. On board a ship. Isolde is bitter as the ship carries her to Cornwall where she is to become the unwilling bride of old King Marke. Tristan is at the helm of the ship and refuses to come to see Isolde. Isolde tells Bran-gane of the past: how Tristan had been brought to her, wounded and ill, and she had tended him; how she had dis-covered that it was he who had killed her betrothed, Morold; how, when she was tempted to slay him with his own sword, he had looked with love into her eyes; and now, a traitor to his vows, he ignores her and bears her a captive to his old kinsman for a marriage she abhors. abhors.

abhors. As they near land, Tristan enters and Isolde invites him to drink from a flask filled with a deadly potion. Brangane seizes an opportunity to substitute a potion of love for that of death. As Tristan drinks from the cup tendered him, Isolde snatches it and drains the dregs. An ecstasy steals over them as they gaze at each other, expecting death. At last they fall into a rapturous embrace as King Marke's welcoming re-tainers come on board.

Act II. In Cornwall, at the castle of King Marke. Garden before Isolde's dwelling. She is intent upon a meeting with Tristan and Brangane warns of Melot, whom she says has played the spy. Brangane goes to the tower to keep watch. Tristan enters, Isolde throws herself into his arms and they abandon themselves to the ranture of the themselves to the rapture of the moment.

Moment. As dawn approaches Brangane utters a cry of alarm and Kurwenal, Tristan's servant, rushes in in an effort to pro-tect his master. Close behind him are Melot, King Marke and others. The king stands stupefied as Melot boasts of the service he has done him. Marke is over-come with sorrow for he has always loved and trusted Tristan who was to be his sole heir.

Tristan resolves to set out for the dreary land where he was born, and Isolde says she will follow. Melot draws his sword and badly wounds Tristan.

his sword and badly wounds Tristan. Act III. In Brittany, at Tristan's castle. Tristan, attended by Kurwenal, lies un-conscious on a bed under a lime tree. A message has been sent to Isolde in Cornwall but a shepherd, placed as a lookout on a cliff, reports there is no ship in sight. Tristan calls distractedly for Isolde. In his fever, his life passes before his eyes; he sees his unhappy youth, his unlucky voyage to Ireland, and curses the fateful potion.

Suddenly the shepherd signals the approach of a ship. Kurwenal rushes down to meet Isolde at the shore. Tristan staggers to his feet but collapses as Isolde enters, having only the strength to call her name. As Kurwenal stands on the ruined battlements, mute with grief, the shepherd calls out that a second ship has arrived. Kurwenal believes that Marke has come to attack them and calling upon a few old servitors to resist, rushes upon Melot and kills him. He is mortally wounded in the fight and crawls toward the feet of Tristan to die. Suddenly the shepherd signals the ap-

one-night stands, life was a succession of huge dance halls, each one looking exactly like every other. Night after night, the pattern would be repeated-perform until the small hours, then pack into a bus and try to sleep while rolling on to the next destination hundreds of miles distant.

Despite the hardships, Peggy Lee and Jo Stafford look back on those days with fondness — "frantic days, but wonderful days," they call them — and they are grateful they had the chance to learn, the exacting but exciting way, the skills that made them the stars they are today. Peggy was with the Goodman band, while Jo made her name with Tommy Dorsey's orchestra.

Peggy Lee first started singing with the local church choir in her native Jamestown, North Dakota, and later worked as a vocalist with semi-professional college dance bands in the area. Later she launched herself on a radio career in her home town, gradually obtaining more important singing engagements until she established herself in West Coast nightclub, radio, and recording circles. She sang with Goodman for two years, then struck out as a solo singer and in latter years has shown talent as an actress and song-writer as well as a vocalist. She won an Oscar nomination for her supporting role in the 1956 picture, *Pete Kelly's Blues*, and has written songs for such films as *The Lady and the Tramp*, *Johnny Guitar, Tom Thumb*, and *About Mrs. Leslie.* Her most successful song to date is *It's a Good Day*, which she'll sing on the *Jo Stafford Show*.

Jo Stafford started her career as one-third of a female trio billed as The Stafford Sisters, and later joined another vocal group called the Pied Pipers. This led to her first meeting with pianist-conductor Paul Weston, who later became her husband, and to her joining the Tommy Dorsey Orchestra. She stayed with the Dorsey band for three years, then branched out as a solo recording, radio, and stage star.

# HELP WANTED — FEMALE

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES for women of all ages — are they on the increase? A new series on CBC Radio's Trans-Canada Matinee examines the situation, commencing February 27.

PROSPECTS FOR employment for girls and women aged 16 to 60 and up will be explored in *Careering Ahead*, a radio series beginning on *Trans-Canada Matinee* Wednesday afternoon, February 27. It will be heard each Wednesday for two months.

Some of the questions to be looked into on the programs are: How can the older woman set about returning to work? How can the young married woman keep her skills up-to-date so she can return to work if and when she wants to, or if it becomes economically necessary?

Do women really *want* to return to work if it isn't economically necessary? Why are employers wary about employing older women? Are pension funds just an excuse for barring women from jobs?

What are the opportunities for part-time work for women? What are the opportunities for re-training? How can school-leavers be guided into the kinds of work with long - term prospects, into jobs where demand exceeds supply and not the other way around?

What is being done to help young girls make the right choice of employment? How can vocational training be up-graded so that it's not looked on as second-class education compared with university training? Programs in the series will be divided broadly into age groups, starting with the 60-year-olds and up, and working down to teenagers just out of school. Some provocative views will be offered on the questions listed above, and there will be some heartening examples of w o m e n who have achieved success against all sorts of odds. The series will be heard in the first half-hour of *Matinee*.

Featured on the first program is Mrs. Laura Jamieson of Vancouver, a former juvenile court judge, and member of the B.C. Legislature for seven years. Mrs. Jamieson has contributed many reminiscences to *Trans-Canada Matinee*. The program also includes reports on the work of the Age and Opportunity Bureau in Winnipeg.

On another program valuable advice for women over 40 can be expected from Mrs. Frances Bairstow, assistant director of McGill's Industrial Relations Centre, and from representatives of two Montreal firms in which a woman's age is no bar to her employment.

Members of the Scarborough YWCA will offer strong and differing views on employment for the married woman in her 30s. Does she prefer to return to work when her youngest child enters school? Has she kept up her skills? Would she prefer voluntary work

What courses are available for unemployed women? Speakers in Halifax and St. John will answer this question, with additional information from other provinces.

1 lb. ground veal

1/4 lb. ground cured ham

1/2 tsp. salt

2 tbsp. tomato catsup

2 tbsp. green pepper

2 thsp. prepared horseradish-

1/2 cup mushrooms, fresh or canned

1/2 cup bread or cracker crumbs

1 egg beaten

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup milk, evaporated may be used

4 slices of bacon in pan and 4 slices on top of loaf

Mix well and form loaf. Bake 1½ hours at 375 degrees.

#### MUSHROOM SAUCE

1 cup mushroom slices 2 tbsp. butter 1 cup evaporated milk 1 tbsp. butter

1 tbsp. flour

i tosp. nour

Saute mushrooms in 2 tbsp. butter, add milk, heat, add butter which has been creamed with flour, stir until thickened and serve with meat loaf. Salt and pepper to taste.

# 'Doctor Casey' is Health - Watcher

VINCENT EDWARDS is, by his own admission, several kinds of a nut-on sports and food, that is.

"I'm a health nut," says the muscular, 31 - year - old actor who plays the role of *Dr. Ben Casey* every Wednesday night on CBC-TV. "I've always wanted to stay healthy."

He works out in a gym at least twice a week to keep his 6-foot-2inch, 200-pound frame in top shape, and watches his diet carefully, often eating special healthfoods.

"I'm also a nut on aviation," he continues. "I used to fly my own plane, but I've backed away from that now because I have a lot of responsibility on the show."

Edwards, however, hasn't let this sense of responsibility dull his zest for living. "I like excitement," he says, "any kind of excitement fights, baseball, flying, horse racing, water skiing — just anything exciting."

This aspect of his nature seems to be in curious contrast to the role he plays in his TV series—a quiet, dedicated, serious-minded neuro-surgeon in a large hospital.

But there is a less exuberant side to Edward's character. In quieter moments, he reads a great deal and has also tried his hand at writing. One of his works, an unpublished fantasy, deals with fate and how man can change his destiny through determination.

Edwards, the youngest of a family of seven, was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., in 1931. He attended Ohio State University for a time, but at age 19 he quit college to study acting at the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York.

"Everybody was trying to be like Marlon Brando then," recalls Nick Dennis, an old friend who plays an orderly in the Casey series. "Vince went around in a dirty T shirt all the time. It was a fad."

Among Edwards' classmates at the Academy were actresses Grace Kelly and Anne Bancroft, and John Cassavetes, now a prominent film director and producer.

Through the Academy, he obtained a small part in *High Button Shoes*, on Broadway, and a tour with a road company in *Come Back*, *Little Sheba*.

Then he moved into television, first in New York, where he played in about 50 drama programs, and later in Hollywood, where he appeared in *The Untouchables*, *General Electric Theatre* and an Alfred Hitchcock thriller.

His moving portrayal of a frontier doctor in an episode of *The Deputy*, a western TV series, led directly to his being chosen for the title role in *Ben Casey*.

Edwards has appeared in a halfdozen motion pictures, including *City of Fear* and *The Three Faces of Eve.* He has also made a recording, singing a novelty song called *Lollipop.* 

Despite his sudden rise to fame in the highly successful Casey series, Edwards apparently still has his feet on the ground. He lives with his aunt in a modest home in Hollywood. He is unmarried.

In terms of his acting career, how does Vince Edwards feel about Ben Casey?

"It's one more step," he says. "But, of course, it's the biggest one yet."
