

Canada and the CBC

• We have enjoyed many fine CBC programs – Festival, Quest, Inquiry, Explorations, not to mention the radio drama series and Radio International. ON OUR COVER: The Winnipeg Pops Concert starts the new programming quarter on a new day-Sunday at 10:30 p.m. on CBC Radioexpanded in time to 45 minutes. Coinciding with the change, three noted guest conductors will take over the podium during the absence of Eric Wild, who is in Europe. They are Dr. Geoffrey Waddington, Dr. Boyd Neel and Dirk Keetbaas.

Dr. Waddington, director of music for the CBC, is noted throughout the nation for his vast contribution to its musical life. Raised in Lethbridge, he early started the study of the violin, and when 17 made a successful tour of Canada as a concert performer.

In 1922 he joined the faculty of the Toronto Conservatory of Music, where he met concert pianist Mildred Baker, who later became his wife. When the Canadian Radio Broadcasting Commission, forerunner of the CBC, came into existence, it took over CKNC in Toronto, at which Dr. Waddington was music director. Since that time, "conducted by Geoffrey Waddington" has been one of the most familiar credits on network programs of serious music. He is founder of the CBC Symphony, internationally acclaimed as one of the continent's finest orchestras. His distinguished musical career has been recognized by an honourary Doctor of Laws degree from Dalhousie University.

Dr. Boyd Neel, Dean of the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, came to Canada from Britain in 1953 after an outstanding career overseas that led to his recognition as one of the great conductors of our time. As a young physician in 1932, he gathered together some aspiring young London musicians and rehearsed them diligently for six months before their first public concert. This first concert was a great success, and the group continued to perform all over the world, making outstanding recordings and becoming familiar to BBC listeners. In appreciation of his services to music, Boyd Neel was named a Commander of the British Empire in 1953. In Canada, his name has become well known through his many appearances as a conductor, most frequently on CBC Wednesday Night.

Dirk Keetbaas, noted Winnipeg chamber music conductor, was born in Holland, coming with his family to Ottawa at the age of seven. He began playing the flute at 14, and during the war was first flutist with the RCAF Central Concert Band. It was at that time that he organized his first wind quintet.

He completed his studies after the war with Rene LeRoy, celebrated French flutist, and during eight years in Toronto he performed with the Toronto Symphony, the CBC Symphony and many other groups. He is first flutist of the Winnipeg Symphony, and his Dirk Keetbaas Players are heard regularly on regional and national network programs.

MARGARET MORRIS, a regular panelist on CBC-TV's Sunday evening game show *Flashback*, has collected the autograph of every mystery guest since the series started last fall. Her collection includes such famous signatures as Marilyn Bell, Artie Shaw, Rogers Hornsby, Sally Rand, Adolphe Menjou, Barbara Ann Scott, Ann Rutherford and Bert Pearl.

THE LAST of comedians Johnny Wayne and Frank Shuster's four hourlong specials for CBC-TV this season will be seen Wednesday, May 15. One comedy skit is a spoof on a current movie hit about mutiny aboard a British ship in the south seas.

Beat the U-Boat Menace

ONE OF THE greatest struggles in history, a struggle that contributed decisively to the final Allied victory in the Second World War, was the U-boat warfare in the Atlantic. CBC Radio's Venture series presents two programs about it, on Sundays, April 28 and May 5, at 5:00 p.m.

The German force, with superior training and infinitely better equipment at the beginning of the attacks, succeeded in an almost complete naval blockade of already overburdened Britain by cutting off vital connections to North America. The small, highly mobile *Unterseebote*, with a young, zealous crew-often hand-picked from one of the Feuhrer's pet organizations, the *Hitlcrjugend*-found no match in the few old-fashioned vessels owned by Britain and Canada, which sometimes quite justly were jokingly described as "converted fishing boats."

The attackers had all the odds on their side: they were able to detect the masts and smoke of the big transports from far away without being seen themselves; they would keep at a distance on the trail of the convoy till reinforcements had arrived and darkness set in, and then take full advantage of the surprise factor, driving right underneath the few escorting destroyers and corvettes, to the centre of the convoy. But above all it was the daring and the enthusiasm of the Germans that made this period so successful for them.

The turning-point on the Allied side came during the spring and summer months of '43. The number of real specialists in anti-U-boat warfare had increased greatly, and the improvement of anti-U-boat weapons continued. When the British 10-centimeter radar was used for the first time by aircraft, the U-boats found it almost impossible to achieve success, even in massed attacks against the Atlantic convoys. On one occasion, 60 German submarines failed to score a single hit, and from March to May of that year, for every two ships sunk, one U-boat went to the bottom of the sea. As a result, Grand Admiral Doenitz had no alternative but to withdraw all his U-boats from the Atlantic temporarily, a blow from which the Germans never quite fully recovered, in spite of the introduction of a number of new weapons.

The interviews for the Venture documentaries, consisting of personal recollections of the ordinary seaman as well as expert observations of high-ranking officers and scientists, were collected by Colin D. Edwards. With the full co-operation of the British Navy and the U.S. Navy, he spent the greater part of last summer travelling abroad and through North America, gathering 45 hours of tape-recorded material. The task of editing and co-ordinating the stories was undertaken by James Bannerman, who served in the Royal Canadian Navy during the Second World War.

A problem in respect to German participation was encountered when Edwards reached Germany. Former Grand Admiral Karl Doenitz, released after serving a 10-year sentence in Nuremberg prison as a war criminal, refused to tell his side of the story as head of the U-boat command. So did a number of other former members of that command, some of whom are now serving in the new German Navy. However, among the post-war German immigrants to Canada, there are many former members of the U-boat command, as well as of other German ranks. As new Canadians they ignored Doenitz's example and were co-operative in recalling their wartime experiences on tape for *Venture*.

Included also are a number of interviews with seamen of the Merchant Marine – virtually the "sitting ducks" of U-boat warfare.

A Church's Ambitious Experiment: Education with a Challenge

"THE SOLE TRUE end of education is simply this: to teach men how to learn for themselves. And whatever instruction fails to do this, is effort spent in vain."

These words from a shilling pamphlet by the late English mystery writer Dorothy Sayers sum up the philosophy of the unique experiment that was the weekend school of St. John's Anglican Cathedral, Winnipeg.

Founded in the fall of 1958 to provide a program of enrichment, tutoring and recreation for boys, the school continued to hold weekend sessions, with enrollment sometimes reaching 90, until June of 1962. Then the following fall, it having been decided that the school's success had demonstrated a pressing need for better development of youth, it was expanded into a full-time residential school.

A CBC production team was on hand for the final weekend session of the school at its historic site at Dynevor, Manitoba, on the Red River north of Winnipeg. Within a short two-day period, the boys are seen to arrive by bus to study, work, play, learn, rest and pray—a crowded schedule in addition to their regular school attendance at home in the city.

All teachers and staff at the weekend school were volunteers. Teachers from Winnipeg schools took "busmen's holidays" to guide boys through courses on ethics, religion, music, applied mathematics, German, Greek, Latin and debating. They had a mock parliament, a full-scale athletic program, boating and a dozen other organized activities designed to develop the mind and body, and thwart any possibility of boredom. College teachers, a doctor, a lawyer, a Winnipeg city councillor and university professors shared in the teaching, while many others took over the tasks connected with feeding and housing the boys.

Applications for admission came from youngsters of every back-

ground-from well-to-do and poor families, of foreign extraction or well-established Canadians, from good homes and broken homes, the especially bright and the average. As the school worked towards its goals, though, they all grew to have at least one thing in common: they showed great improvement in their regular school work, as their minds stretched to meet the challenge thrown to them.

The spirit of the volunteer staff was contagious, the CBC production crew found. During their weekend at the school, producer Ernie Mutimer found himself on the painting and decorating team, cameraman Harry Makin helped in preparing photos of the boys, and script assistant Jane Mathewson typed letters to parents.

Now that the full-time school is in operation, many of the previous volunteer teachers have become salaried staff-members. F r a n k Wiens, formerly a Winnipeg high school teacher, is principal of the school, and Ted Byfield, who is credited with having been the "idea-man" behind the whole project, has resigned from his position as city editor of a large daily paper to become one of the teachers.

The regular Manitoba curriculum is taught to the 60 boys enrolled in the five classes-grades six to ten-with the enrichment program following regular classes. To aid in supporting themselves, the boys help to operate a 120 - acre farm that has been added to the property, all of which is leased from the Canadian government which once had an Indian hospital on the site.

On the opening of the full-time school, Headmaster Wiens said: "We believe that modern society (*Please turn to page* 33)

The Other Man — Introducing

A New Series Of Drama Serials

As an advance sample of a new CBC-produced series of dramas in serial form, to start in the fall, THE OTHER MAN is presented starting Tuesday, April 30 on CBC-TV

A CBC - PRODUCED suspense play in six half-hour episodes, in the classic style of British thrillers, with red herrings galore and a surprise showdown in the last act, begins on CBC Television this Tuesday night, April 30. Titled *The Other Man*, it was written by Francis Durbridge, one of England's top mystery writers, who has turned out literally hundreds of radio and TV scripts, mostly thrillers.

Douglas Rain stars as David Henderson, a housemaster in Buckingham College, an English public school on the outskirts of the small Thames Valley town of Medlow. When an Italian named Paul Rocello is murdered on a houseboat tied up on the quay, Henderson's suspicious behaviour puts him at the top of the police list of murder suspects. Detective Inspector Ford, played by Tony Van Bridge, finds the case particularly trying because he likes Henderson, and is under a personal obligation to him -the schoolmaster has helped his son, young Timothy Ford (John Kastner) with his schooling. The murdered man, recently arrived from Venice, had been looking after the houseboat for a distinguished solicitor, James Cooper, played by Ivor Barry, who is in some way connected with Henderson.

Ballet dancer Angela Leigh, in her first straight dramatic role, plays Billie Reynolds, of doubtful reputation, who knows more about the murder than she cares to reveal to the police. When Billie is murdered too, and the murdered man's beautiful sister, played by Victoria Mitchell, arrives from Italy, the mystery at Medlow threatens to become an international crisis. The Inspector in the quiet little town finds himself working with M.I.5 (Britain's secret service) to bring a killer to justice.

The cast also includes William Osler as the town doctor; Michele Learned as his niece (and the romance in Henderson's life); Leo Leyden as a local businessman involved with Billie; Christopher Newton as an eager-beaver newspaper reporter; Robin Gammell as Billie's ne'er-do-well brother; and John Hardinge as Ford's sidekick, Detective Sergeant Broderick.

Director Eric Till, faced with the task of recreating his English scene in Toronto, found the exteriors he was looking for on Centre Island in Toronto harbour, Lake Ontario, where a quiet lagoon fringed with weeping willows strongly resembles the upper reaches of the Thames. The cast, production crew, and cameras were ferried across to the island. For the purpose of the play, a fireboat operated by the Toronto Fire Department became a Thames houseboat.

The Other Man is a sample of the sort of drama fare to be offered in a 52-week series beginning next fall. It will be produced by the CBC on location in many parts of Canada. Ronald Weyman, execu-

tive producer, says the dramas he has lined up will not be affected by the usual studio and time limitations. The stories will all run to their natural lengths, and exteriors will be filmed on the spot of the action for closer regional identity. The BBC has been producing this sort of drama serial successfully for years. Weyman emphasizes that the serials will in no way resemble soap operas. The series will include both adaptations and original dramas. Weyman hopes it will en-

Portrait of Main Street In Film and Song

MAIN STREET, Winnipeg-flowing with the workaday traffic of a busy city, dotted with reminders of the cosmopolitan nature of the people that live and work along it: perhaps most noted across the nation as-at its intersection with its sleek, modern rival, Portage Avenue – being the place where "the wind always blows."

The path of the Selkirk Settlers, paralleling the Red River once the water highway of the French Voyageurs, the street has seen its share of Western Canadian history.

With the Winnipeg Grain Exchange nearby, and great, marbled banks rising on either side of its roaring eight lanes of traffic, it has been, for half a century, the financial centre of the West-a position it has just recently been relinquishing by degrees to its pretty sister street, tree-lined Broadway. Now, as some of its buildings give way to the ceaseless beating of the elements, and some of the more stylish stores and offices relocate further west on Portage, the street becomes scattered with colourful gypsy palmists, hock shops, sec-ond-rate hotels and bars, small factories, pool halls, auction marts and theatres showing sensational films.

In an artful, poetic manner, 20/20 takes a stroll down the street at the heels of a buffalocoated Winnipeg policeman, Sunday, April 28 on CBC-TV. Jim Pirie and Reg Gibson, Winnipeg folk-singers who have won nationwide notice with their frequent contributions to the Max Ferguson Show on CBC Radio, have composed music and songs telling of the street and its people. They are used as seasoning in a script written in blank verse. Narrators are Dave Robertson and Peter Mannering, with Winnipeg police constable Haydn Brisling. Peter Kelly was the producer.

Close-Up

The Threshold of Abundance. This hour-long Close-Up examines a view, stated on the program by Paul Samuelson, professor of economics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, that modern economists have long determined upon the precise means required to alleviate the kind of uncmployment which has become chronic in North America.

The primary means referred to by Professor Samuelson, also a member of President Kennedy's economic advisors, are the fiscal and monetary policies of government. Additional contributions to the analysis of attitudes regarding government e c o n o m i c policies are contributed by a number of Canadian and American experts.

In his 90-minute drama British playwright Jack Pulman shows that growing up is not so much a matter of acquiring experience as of becoming aware of experience in a continuously unfolding process. The boy in the play is portrayed by 13-year-old Martin Stephens, a veteran of numerous films, such as The Innocents, Count Your Blessings, and Village of the Damned, who played the title role for six months in the London production of Oliver.

world he must spend them in seems terribly complicated and full of mysterious contradictions. "Life is a book with chapters in it," his kindly, raffish Aunt Jane explains to him. "Some are happy, some are sad, and some are just chapters that don't mean anything." Pulman handles his theme with great restraint and drollery.

After the BBC produced the play a couple of years ago, the London Sunday Telegraph noted that Pulman "made it clear that for all but the most fortunate (or most withdrawn children) the process of growing up is sullied by their parents. Young Edgar's chunk of experience included (in order of importance) long trousers at last, a room of his own, and first encounters with sex, instability, death. If he asked why nice Aunt Jane had been driven from the house, Mum said: 'Sssh, never you mind.' On holiday she forbade him to talk to the hotel cook, at home to the Jamaican street cleaner. Why? 'Never you mind.' When old Grandpa passed on, the adult world reacted with sentiment and the trite consolations of religion. Only Edgar and his schoolfellows gazed with unaffected curiosity on the dead face. Time and again the impression was of innocence being smeared by grown-up prejudices."

Presently young actor Martin Stephens is having his first experience of living away from home. He's at a boarding school on the coast of Kent in England. He plans to go on to university later, and perhaps become an architect. Meanwhile he spends his holidays acting. He's been self-supporting for nearly four years-ever since his father died. His mother was a repertory actress in Manchester before her marriage, and his twin sisters, Judy and Sally, also act.

Martin likes making films, "although in a way it's nicer to be on the stage, because there you know the way people in the audience are feeling. But I like radio best because the BBC let me play cricket in the studio lobby."



Little University Sets World Example

FOR 74 YEARS St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, Nova Scotia, had been training young people in the arts and sciences and priding itself on the way many of them l a t e r distinguished themselves. Then, in 1929, when the Depression struck, it took a radical step which extended its classrooms to include the world, in an adult education program which has been copied in the United States, Africa, Europe, China, South Korea, Central and South America, and other places.

On Wednesday Nights, April 24 and May 1, CBC-TV's *Explorations* takes viewers to visit the Little Campus of the World in Antigonish to see how the adult education program operates, and to see the benefits of its application in Maritime communities.

The faculty at the university was disturbed, back in the late 1920s, by the plight of thousands of Maritime fishermen, farmers, miners and industrial workers who, plagued by poverty, illiteracy and lethargy, blamed the times, the government and anything but themselves. In 1929 the university sent a bevy of staff members to tell these people bluntly that they should stop pitying themselves and organize to do something about their problems. The university offered to help.

Study groups of farmers, fishermen and labourers were formed to pool knowledge and experience; mass meetings, conferences and leadership courses were arranged, credit unions were started and insurance benefits improved. Eventually a radio station was purchased by the university alumni to broadcast a school of the air for adults.



LITTLE UNIVERSITY SETS WORLD EXAMPLE (Continued from page 17)

On-air lessons are given not only in practical subjects which will help listeners to better themselves as wage earners, but also in music, poetry and public health.

The results of the scheme have been startling. Farmers and fishermen are now enjoying greatly increased earnings through co-operative marketing, cheaper purchasing through consumer co-operatives, and housing developments where members often build their own homes, with plenty of lawn and garden space around them. Groups once split by religious intolerance are united in common effort, with well-stocked libraries, better schools, community centres, widespread ownership of private property, and they have learned to develop and to benefit by the art of conversation. They achieve their objectives through personal improvement and group action, rather than by appealing for government assistance. Farmers and fishermen in the Magdalen Islands saved collectively for 10 years to buy a \$75,000 trading ship and a \$300,-000 co-op fish business which completely changed their economic outlook. And that's just one instance of many similar ones of selfhelp inspired by the university.

Now visitors come to the campus from all over the world to study the extension school set-up. And the regular university courses in arts and science are attracting more and more students from across the continent and other countries. Enrolment in regular courses is expected to reach 1,950 by 1965. The Carnegie Corporation of New York, which has contributed many thousands to the university's extramural work, has said that St. Francis Xavier University is providing "some of the most original and effective extramural work which has ever come to the attention of the corporation.'

JULIUS LAROSA, who for 10 years has been trying to get away from being known as the young pop singer who was fired on the air by Arthur Godfrey, will be guest on the *Tommy Ambrose Show* on Friday night, May 3.

One report of the firing incident reported that Godfrey said he was prouder of LaRosa than of any other talented entertainer he had developed, and had fired him to further the boy's career. In another report Godfrey charged that LaRosa had "failed to show that loveable, likeable, down-to-earth quality that for lack of a better word I call humility."

Although at the time he was furious with Godfrey for the precipitous and public way he ended their association, LaRosa now is grateful to his patron for the experience he was able to acquire on the Godfrey shows. And, of course, the firing did spur on LaRosa's career. "When Mr. Godfrey hired me I was a frightened 21-year-old kid," he says. "I had mike fright for the first six months. Before that I didn't know a thing."

LaRosa was born in Brooklyn in 1930, to Salvatore and Lucy LaRosa, who had emigrated from Sicily. In his teens Julius was a member of the All-City Chorus of New York and sang with his high

Thomas Costain's Son of a Hundred Kings, a Dickensian novel with his childhood setting in mind –Brantford, Ontario – has been adapted in 10 episodes by Leslie McFarlane. Set at the turn of the century, it tells of a mysterious little boy newly arrived in a small Canadian town from England.

Charles Israel is adapting Cheila McKay Russell's *The Living Earth* in 10 episodes. She is the author of *The Lamp Is Heavy. The Living Earth* is based on her experiences as a district nurse in northern Saskatchewan, where the cast and crew will go to film exterior scenes. Another drama, *The Open Sky*, will be filmed in Alberta, and Weyman is hoping to line up a series with a B.C. setting.

families of cats; a finger-snapping hipster; or a sincere young man who is searching for an identity which constantly eludes him.

A few months ago he decided to try something new. He formed his own trio featuring his singing, the guitar playing of Lennie Breau of Winnipeg, the bass of Eon Henstridge, and the comedy routines of them all. Last fall they "shook down" in Toronto, Montreal, Ottawa and Hamilton to see whether they could get along together. When they found that they could, they set their sights on New York, long a goal of Francks. "We won't set foot in New York unless we're going to bomb it," he insisted. Currently they're bombing the daylights out of enthusiastic patrons at the Blue Angel there, with plans for a tour of other American night spots, off-beat coffee houses, and supper clubs. Francks calls their distinctive kind of music "experiments in crossing time and space."

He says he's grateful for the "tremendous grounding" he got in Canada and for the fact that Canadian showbusiness didn't harness him, but he criticizes the "play-it-safe" standard of Canadian pops singing and variety. "We're like fence-sitters. Look: the late Jack Kane once told me, will you please stick to the melody a little more, Don? Because if you don't, 'Uncle Charlie' will never understand it. But my point is that 'Uncle Charlie' isn't stupid. He's pretty hip. And if he were to hear that song again and again, he'd get to like it."

This Wednesday night Francks and his trio turn up on CBC-TV's *Parade* with a half-hour show including Francks' singing of *Night and Day*, *Favourite Things*, *I'm in Love*, *I Believe in You*, *Growing Up*, and, for all the "Uncle Charlies," a medley including some popular and some almost forgotten children's songs from away back.

Francks has a plan for the next few years which includes the occasional return visit to Canada, one of which will be to play Alexander Mackenzie in an NFB film. "My aim," he says, "is to become a top, all-round performer in the Chaplin tradition—and be recognized as such. I give myself three to five years. And after I've made enough money, I want to make my own films, with my own stories, in Mexico—the climate there suits my clothes."

Tony Hancock Now on CBC Radio

Hear this favourite British comedian Tuesday at 8:30 p.m.

CHARLIE CHAPLIN got out of the Rolls Royce, kicked the tramp in the stomach, picked up his cigar butt, got back in the car and drove away. Chaplin was a violent but great comic in those halcyon days, but Tony Hancock is amazed that he had the courage to do the scene at all.

Hancock says he would dare to do it because he likes belligerent. malicious comedy, and he could probably get away with it as easily as Chaplin, but he's one of the few who could. Like Chaplin he enjoys playing rebels, the sort who fall flat on their faces and always try again. And that's probably the secret of his remarkable success on TV, radio and in films, because nearly everyone would like to rebel, too, and the next best thing is watching this flabby-faced character in the sagging pants fumbling through the sort of ordinary and extraordinary situations that crop up daily all over the world, slapping and getting slapped but invariably coming back for more.

Hancock talks as if he were continually trying to suppress a burp. He moves as if he thought the ground were going to cave in under his next step. When he ambles before the cameras his perpetual slouch, sad eyes and obstinate mouth leave no doubt that he is the rebel concealed within the little man in the street, opinionated, sometimes silly, rarely learning from his mistakes, stepped-upon as regularly as a crack on Main Street, wanting to say to hell with this and that and you and you, but mired to his sagging jowls in middle-class conformity.

It wasn't by accident that he hit on his sure-fire recipe for making bizarre comedy out of calamity. He found it the hard way. His first audience walked out on him when, at the age of 16, he thought a

steady stream of barroom jokes would keep the customers happy.

Hancock had left school a year earlier, convinced he was born to fail, and recalls that "photographs taken of me at the time show me looking like an Italian waiter or a single, disembodied egg." He's still gloomy in his outlook - worries excessively over everything from keeping his career in high gear to keeping his weight in low-but his humour is now much cleaner, much more subtle, than he would have thought possible at 16, showing the influence of his varied career since then - civil service, RAF, pantomime, the Windmill Theatre, and the grind to establish himself in radio, TV and films.

He deplores the current trend in sick comedy. "Sick humour," he says, "is superficial, because you are not approaching any things of real value. It may be reflecting some social disease. But humour should not do it in this way, not state the point so hard. Your comment is in what you do, not in what you stage. Andiences understand; they know what passion is, they know what pain is. If you show something for them, they recognize what you have to show. I attack myself, as well, don't forget. So without any question there is no limit to what a comedian can attack if he wants to -the H-bomb, anything.

Starting this Tuesday, April 30, at 8:30 p.m. on CBC Radio, Hancock will be heard in a regular halfhour of rib-tickling comedy recorded by the BBC.

VEGETABLES

FRENCH PEAS

Put 3 leaves of lettuce in skillet, over this place 1 package slightly defrosted frozen peas, then add 2 tablespoons butter, 4 green onions, ½ teaspoon salt, 3 sprigs parsley and a pinch of chervil. Place another leaf of lettuce on top and cook until peas are barely tender. (2 tablespoons water should be added to skillet to prevent sticking during cooking.)

Remove lettuce. Cream 1 tablespoon butter with ½ teaspoon flour and add to peas. Shake over heat and serve.

BRUSSEL SPROUTS WITH FILBERTS

Cook fresh brussel sprouts in chicken broth. Saute coarsely-chopped filberts in butter. Thicken sauce on sprouts with cornstarch and toss nuts over just before serving.

CORN BALLS

1 tin corn (cream style) 1 cup flour 1 tsp. baking powder 14 tsp. salt 3 cggs Pepper 3 chopped green onions

Beat all ingredients together – drop by spoonfuls into hot fat. Fry until brown.

Little Joe Much the Same Off Camera

"I'M A devil-may-care little devil!"

This is how Michael Landon sums up his starring role as "Little Joe" Cartwright, youngest of three brothers in *Bonanza*, seen Sundays on the CBC-TV network.

In many respects, it's a good description of the 25-year-old actor, starting with his school career down to his present pre-occupation with snakes, spiders and fast cars.

Mike has a high IQ, but graduated nearly last in a high school class of 301 students. "I just didn't like to study," he explains. "I was too busy trying to be the class clown."

However, he had scholarship offers from several universities for his outstanding record as a javelin thrower.

Before entering university, Mike stayed in Santa Barbara, Calif., making up scholastic deficiencies and teaching swimming. The latter presented a slight problem—he didn't know how to swim and was deathly afraid of the water.

Landon got into showbusiness with the help of a friend. While working in a warehouse near his home in Hollywood, he agreed to read for a buddy taking screen tests at a motion picture studio. When the test was completed, Mike, and not his friend, was signed to a contract.

His first starring role was in I Was a Teenage Werewolf, a picture he'd like to forget. He also played the title role in Legend of Tom Dooley, starred in Maracaibo and played the albino in God's Little Acre. He has acted in more than 100 TV shows.

Landon likes fast cars, animals, insects and snakes, including a pet tarantula he found while on location in the Mojave Desert. His pet snakes include a boa constrictor.

The young actor has long since made up for his early distaste for school work by reading almost anything he gets his hands on. He enjoys discussing almost any subject, and recently sold his first screenplay, which was broadcast on *Bonanza* last season.

His TV father, co-star Lorne Greene, calls him, "one of the brightest young men I've ever met."
