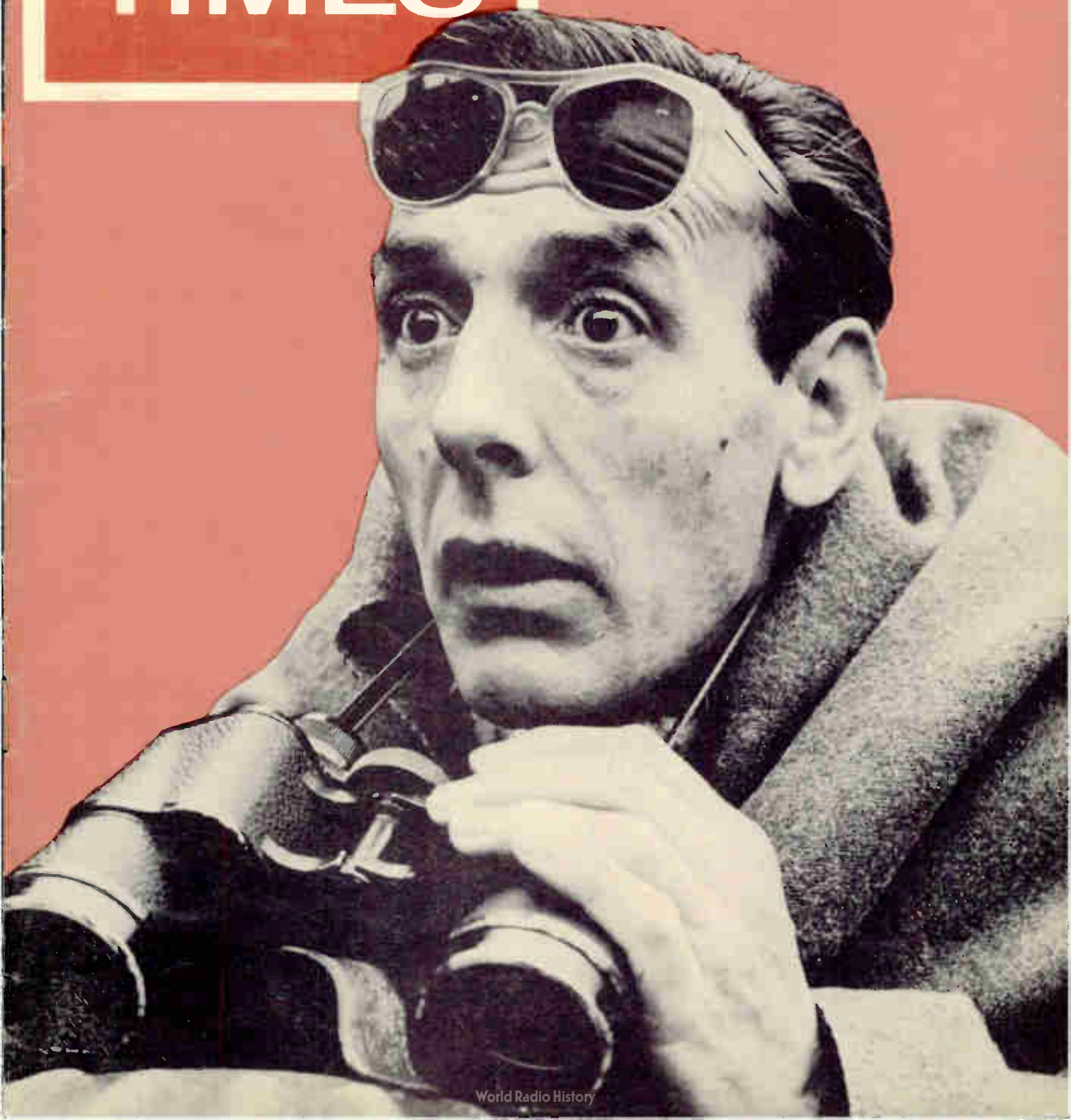

# around CBC

ALBERTANS go to the polls Monday, June 17 to elect a provincial government, and CBC television cameras and radio microphones will be on hand to bring the results to the province as the ballots are counted.

Beginning at 8:30 p.m. MST, one-half hour after closing of the polls and continuing until 10:00 or 10:30 p.m., specially-created networks will carry election results to CBC-TV affiliates at Lloydminster, Calgary, Red Deer, Medicine Hat and Lethbridge, and to CBC Radio affiliates CFAC Calgary, CJOC Lethbridge, CHAT Medicine Hat and CFGP Grande Prairie. The same programs will be carried on CBC-owned CBXT Edmonton, and the transmitters at Grande Prairie and Peace River.

As well as following the results as they are announced, the program will take viewers to the headquarters of the four major political parties to watch the reaction to developments.

During the evening, commentary will be provided by Grant Davy, professor of political science at the University of Alberta, and Ken Mason, CBC's member of the parliamentary press gallery in Ottawa, who is an Albertan. A studio origination from CHCT-TV Calgary also will be carried, with Jack Peach as commentator.

Staff announcers taking part are Doug McIlraith, Alex Moir, Larry Branter and Jim Crossen.

# ROSEMARY CLOONEY:



## All the Attributes for Success

Rosemary Clooney is featured Wednesday, June 26 on *PARADE*

CBC-TV's *Parade* (Wednesday, June 26), Rosemary Clooney.

One of the top recording stars of the last decade, Miss Clooney is now established as a leading figure in the world of popular songs, having often attained the magic number of 1,000,000 in sales of single recordings — an achievement that merits the award of a golden record by the record trade.

Rosemary Clooney was born in the small Kentucky town of Maysville 35 years ago, and made her stage debut quite early in life: As the picked queen in a fourth-grade school production of *Snow White* she terrified the audience with her malevolent intensity. Her family was musical — everybody sang ballads of the Kentucky hills — and in their 'teens Rosemary and her sister Betty, three years younger, teamed up as a singing

sister act on radio station WLW in Cincinnati, where the family was living at the time. While passing through town, bandleader Tony Pastor hired the girls as vocalists with his orchestra and they went on tour through the southern states. After three years of travel, the singing team broke up when Betty decided to return home. Rosemary went to New York, and eventually obtained a recording contract with a major record firm. After some of her records made the best-seller lists, she was approached by Hollywood, made a few movies, and moved on to television and personal appearance tours. During the last couple of years she has had an active career with appearances in night clubs, television guest appearances, a trip to England for concerts and TV shows, and a daily radio show with Bing Crosby.

THE MODERN FORMULA for success for a girl singer: sweet songs, sweet talk, sweet face, expensive costumes, good figure, friendly disposition, and a voice that must be distinctive.

Those are some of the attributes of the vocalists who have been most successful on television in recent years — Dinah Shore, Patti Page, Gisele MacKenzie and a few others. All of these attributes are possessed by this week's guest on

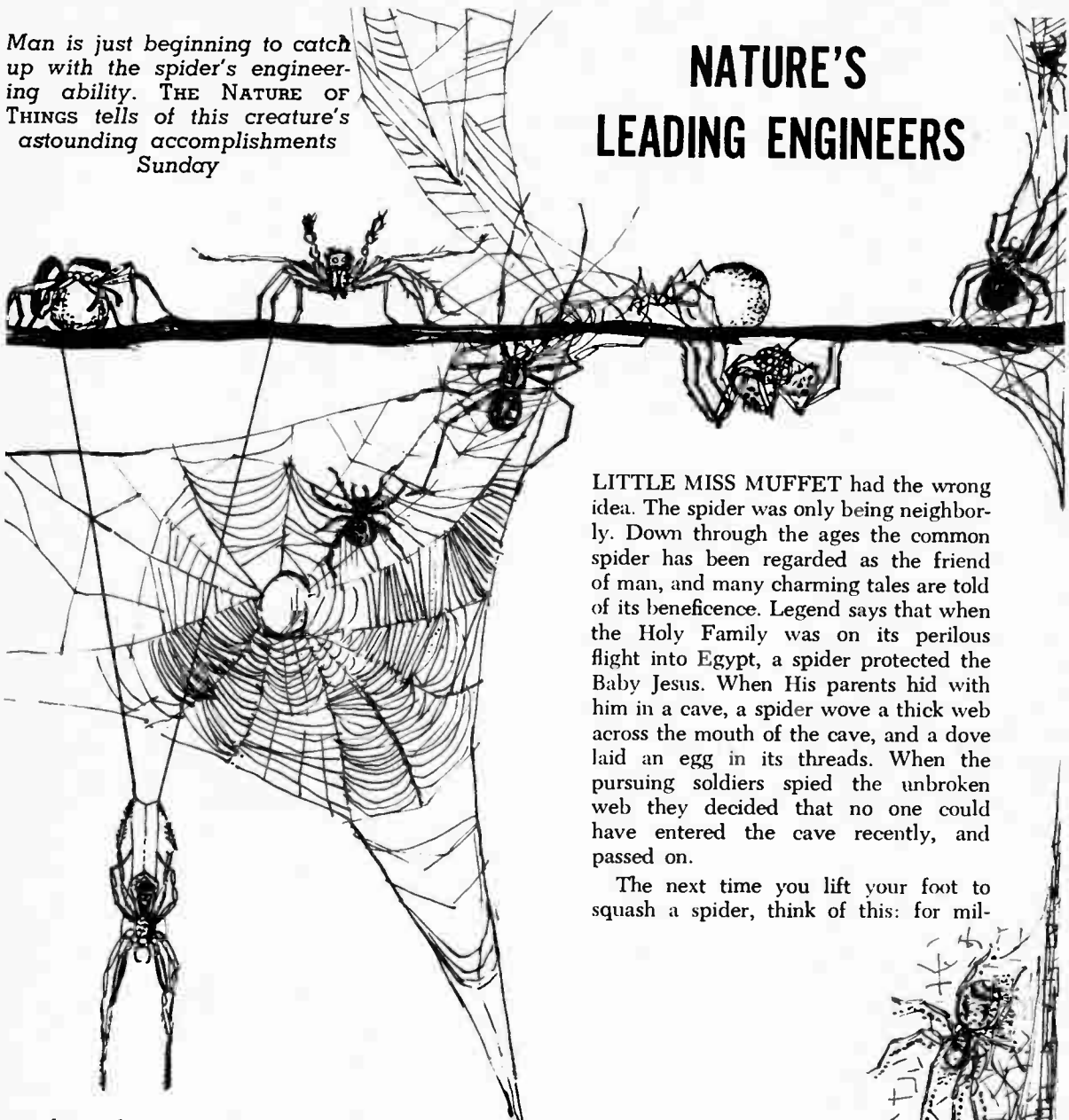

## NATURE'S LEADING ENGINEERS

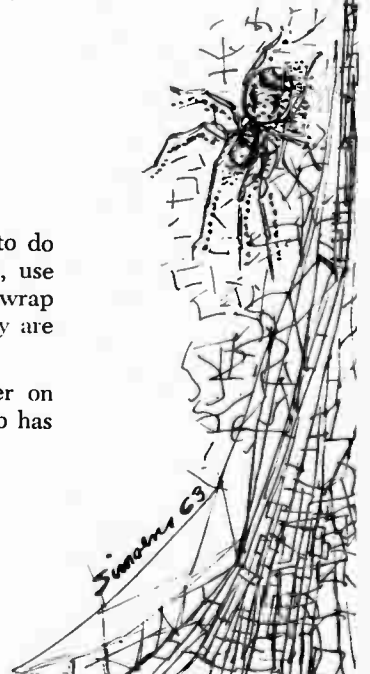


LITTLE MISS MUFFET had the wrong idea. The spider was only being neighborly. Down through the ages the common spider has been regarded as the friend of man, and many charming tales are told of its beneficence. Legend says that when the Holy Family was on its perilous flight into Egypt, a spider protected the Baby Jesus. When His parents hid with him in a cave, a spider wove a thick web across the mouth of the cave, and a dove laid an egg in its threads. When the pursuing soldiers spied the unbroken web they decided that no one could have entered the cave recently, and passed on.

The next time you lift your foot to squash a spider, think of this: for mil-

lions of years this little insect has been doing things man has learned to do only comparatively recently: make fishing nets, string telegraph wires, use bird lime, fly by means of balloons, go under water in diving bells, wrap food in plastic sheets. There are thousands of kinds of spiders and they are some of the oldest and most successful of the land-dwellers.

CBC-TV's *The Nature of Things* devotes a program to the spider on Sunday afternoon, June 23rd. The script is by William Whitehead, who has

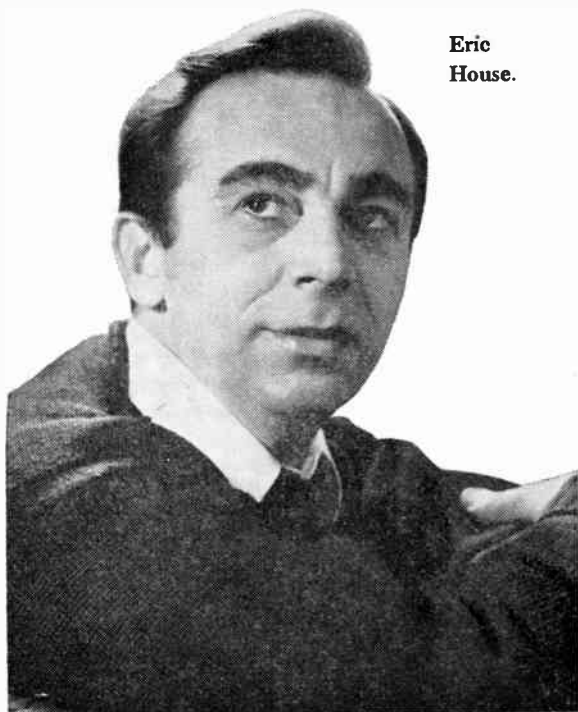
# PLAYDATE:

## House Returns for Role in Hosie Play

A TENSE SITUATION threaded with a grotesque humour is played out, in and around a farm and a fishing village on a bleak, isolated stretch of Maritime coast, in *The Stone Boat*, an original play by Herb Hosie. It will be produced by David Gardner on CBC-TV's *Playdate* this Thursday night, June 27.

Eric House, who has just returned from London, where he appeared for several months in the West End production of the highly successful all-Canadian stage revue, *Clap Hands*, will be seen as Henderson. (House is currently rehearsing for the Stratford Festival production of *The Mikado*, in which he plays Ko-Ko.) The character he plays in *The Stone Boat* is a sensitive, modest, dignified man with a talent for anger, who has tried to get away from it all by withdrawing to a lonely coastal area. But his seclusion is shattered when he becomes involved in a strange conflict between a rough-and-ready giant of a fisherman, Fogarty, and his stolid son, Jim, an even bigger draft-horse than he is. Mrs. Fogarty, a shapeless creature with feral teeth and flyaway hair, and Agnes, a raw-boned, complaining spinster, are active on the bleachers. Each is convinced of the rightness of his or her situation, almost to the point of absurdity. But while they disagree violently, they recognize the mystic bond that binds them together.

Their game of one-upmanship is laced with provocative humour and original twists of words and phrases.

The role of Fogarty is played by American character-actor George Matthews, a burly, beetle-browed veteran of many films and Broadway plays who has been seen often in TV series such as *The Defenders*. His son is played by 21-year-old David Stockwood, whose likeness to Matthews is remarkable. This is his first acting appearance. While the play was being filmed he was also studying for his final exams at the University of Toronto. He had been planning to enter law school in the fall, but now he's thinking of "taking a year off" to have a whirl at an acting career. Stockwood first caught producer David Gardner's attention while appearing in a Trinity College production of Brecht's *Trumpets and Drums* at Hart House.

Marigold Charlesworth appears as Agnes, Robin Smith as Mrs. Fogarty, and Sydney Brown as a storekeeper.

The title of the play derives from a stone boat on Henderson's property, which Jim wants to borrow so he can clear some land for farming. Fogarty is determined to keep Jim at sea with him, and threatens to beat up Henderson if he lends the boat to his son. Finally the father-son battle so involves Henderson that he's haunted by it night and day, and his frantic struggle to stay on the fence is a losing one. The violent climax is inevitable.

Originally Herb Hosie wrote *The Stone Boat* as a radio script—most of his 40 plays have been broadcast on CBC Radio. It is his first script for *Playdate*. David Gardner describes it as "a play that can be enjoyed on two levels: it's an unusual story and a unique character study; and it's a symbolic play on the moral implications of neutrality, withdrawal and indifference."

Gardner has high praise for Hosie's original writing and unique style. "He has a capacity," Gardner says, "for touching the raw centre of people's lives, and in this he is a little like England's Harold Pinter."

Hosie was born in a small fishing village in Scotland, and in his early teens lived in a community on the Canadian east coast similar to the one in his play. He re-visited the Maritimes recently on an NFB scriptwriting assignment. "Like most of my plays," he says, "*The Stone Boat* started as an abstract idea and developed into a human dilemma, with some implications. The characters are partly imaginary, partly based on some I've met. This is a play about unhandsome people."



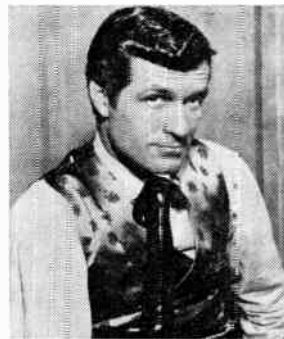
Back for another season, this year's **MYSTERY THEATRE** presents  
top U.S. stars in featured roles

FOR REAL ESCAPIST entertainment, there's nothing like a crackling, suspense-filled "whodunit." At least that seems to be the opinion of the millions who buy and read mystery thrillers every year. People in all walks of life share a taste for the mystery and detective yarns that appear by the hundreds on bookstore shelves; not too long ago, U.S. President Kennedy revealed that Ian Fleming's novels featuring secret service agent James Bond were among his favourite reading (when the president isn't busily scanning real secret service reports, presumably).

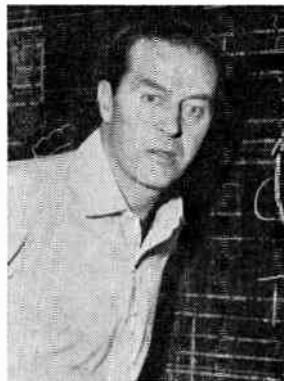
Television has had its full share of private-eye dramas, of the Dashiell Hammett - Mickey Spillane type, but the true mystery story in the classic tradition—represented by such authors as Conan Doyle, Agatha Christie, Dorothy Sayers, to name but a few—is more rare in the electronic medium. This week, such a series begins on the CBC television network. *Mystery Theatre*, an anthology of original mystery and suspense films, will be shown on Mondays beginning June 24th.

This will be the third year in which *Mystery Theatre* has been shown as a summertime replacement program. During its two previous seasons, it won an award each year as "the best mystery television show." The prize, called the Edgar Allan Poe Award, was given by the Mystery Writers of America. The earlier series were produced in England, but this year the programs will be filmed in Hollywood, and will star some well-known American performers, including Broderick Crawford, Ed Begley, Jack Kelly, John Forsythe, Lola Albright, Ray Milland, Charlton Heston, Lloyd Bridges and Hugh O'Brian.

The host of the series will be Frank Gallup, a resonant-voiced veteran announcer whose assignments have ranged from the New York Philharmonic Orchestra broadcasts to playing straight man for comedian Milton Berle. He became best known as the regular announcer on Perry Como's weekly television show. Gallup's experience with TV mystery shows dates back to 1950, when, as narrator on NBC-TV's *Lights Out* suspense series, he was described as "the face with the hollow voice." He has served as host on both of the previous *Mystery Theatre* series.

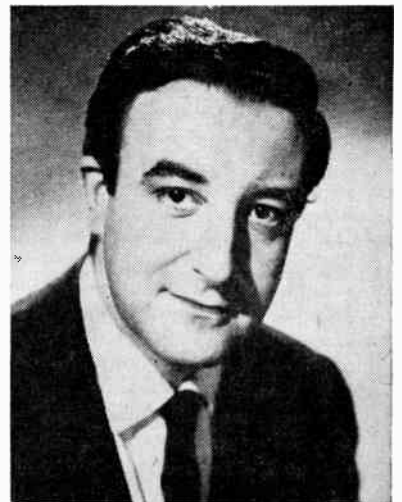
# Award Commemorates Production Crew Killed in Plane Crash

THE WILDERNESS AWARD, a unique annual award to honour outstanding films made for CBC-TV and those who made them, has been established by friends and colleagues across Canada in the memory of Norman Caton, Len Macdonald and Charles Reigler, who were killed in a plane crash in Alberta last February while filming *Wilderness* for the CBC-TV series, *Camera Canada*. (The film was telecast on CBC-TV Monday evening, May 27). The Award will not only pay tribute to the particular contributions these three men made to television in Canada, but will be a means of recognizing the best achievements of those who will make films for CBC-TV in the future.

The necessary money to finance all that such an award entails is being contributed by friends and co-workers across Canada who knew and admired these men and their work, and who are interested in continuing achievement in the field of television film. The Award had been set up by a committee with Vincent Tovell, a producer in the CBC's public affairs department, as chairman, and Arved Jedjase, assistant chief accountant, as treasurer.

The first Award is to be made for a film telecast in 1963, and will be made each year by a panel of five judges of the highest calibre, only one of whom will be on CBC staff. Under the general terms of the Award, film entries may be in French or in English, and may have been made for local, regional or national use. Only films made by, or commissioned by and made under the production supervision of the CBC for use on a CBC-TV program will be eligible. The Award will be given to a film which is either a complete program in itself or a complete film within a program. Not eligible are films made to sell or specifically to promote a commercial program, or which can be classified as commercials.

For the final judging, each of the seven CBC production centres (British Columbia, Prairie, Toronto Area, Ottawa Area, Quebec, Maritimes and Newfoundland) may select up to five films from programs originating in that area. Final judging will be done in one central CBC location. The competition is open to films telecast between January 1 and December 31. The Award will go to the film itself, and the trophy will be sent each year for display in the region in which the program originated. Individual awards will be given to the principal contributors to the award-winning film, which will, whenever possible, be given a special national showing on CBC-TV.

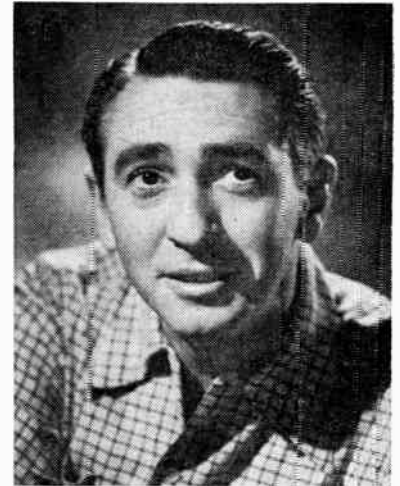

# Repairing the Damaged Emotions of Young Boys

ACCORDING TO RECENT surveys, five to 10 per cent of school-age children show signs of emotional disturbance severe enough to require treatment, and a great many of them are from homes which could not be termed underprivileged.

The normal emotional and character growth of a child is a slow one. The most important stages are the early ones. If one stage is interrupted or delayed, the resulting damage may lie hidden for many years, and then, when the person is under stress as an adult, it may show up in mental illness, alcoholism, drug addiction, or harmful behaviour to himself, his family, or community.

An emotionally disturbed child is one whose behaviour already indicates that damage has been done. Probably he's of average or higher intelligence, his physical growth is normal, but his performance at home or school may be sporadic, irrational or even destructive. Usually he has an unsatisfactory relationship with his parents, he has trouble relating

normally to other adults and to children. Emotionally he's at sea with no anchor and no compass.

Monday night, June 24, CBC-TV's *Camera Canada* presents the story of one such child, based on an actual case in the files of Boys Village, Toronto. There, since the fall of 1960, boys with severe emotional disturbances have been cared for, treated professionally, and helped back to emotional health under the executive direction of Robert Shaw, who has a master's degree in social work, a degree in theology, and a degree in applied science and engineering.

Written and directed by Ron Kelly, the hour-long documentary highlights the experiences of eight-year-old Jimmy Edwards, who was referred to Boys Village by the Juvenile Court. It traces his earlier behaviour problems, shows the difficulties and experiences he was involved in during his first months at the Village, and the remarkable progress he had made at the end of a year.

Appearing in the program are Boys Village social workers Aileen Baird and Keith Shackleton. The film is presented with original music especially composed by Lucio Agostini.

## African Awakening

*What are the factors shaping the future of Nigeria, Ghana and Sierra Leone? CBC-TV deals with the question Tuesday*

RECENT EVENTS in Kenya, Ethiopia and other countries of the former "dark continent" have once again focussed the attention of the world on Africa. Indeed, during the past decade the world's gaze has scarcely strayed from that continent, as the economical, social and political patterns of life there have undergone sweeping and rapid transformations. To the casual observer, the forces affecting the African political scene can be confusing and contradictory, and the flow of events moves so quickly that one has little opportunity to study the background.

In an effort to acquaint viewers with some aspects of the African political and economic situation, CBC-TV has presented a number of filmed programs this season which have illustrated various facets of African life and social relationships. This week, another filmed program dealing with the subject will be presented. Entitled *African Awakening*, it explores the many factors and influences at present shaping the future of Nigeria, Ghana and Sierra Leone. It will be shown on Tuesday, June 25, on the CBC-TV network.

The synopsis describing the film points out that "it is of the utmost importance to understand the nature of the task now being faced by the present generation in Africa." Made with the co-operation of the governments concerned, the film "is not a mere catalogue of contemporary achievements in education, industry and agricultural development," but also "reflects the unity of aspiration and endeavour in nations whose response to this historic challenge is based on an adaptation of their traditional social ways and cultures. It expresses the thoughts, words, attitudes and culture of peoples who, in contact with the ideas and thinking of other nations, are playing an ever-increasing part in world affairs."

## REPAIRING THE DAMAGED EMOTIONS

It's a remarkable document, a tribute to Ron Kelly's patience in making it. He had the complete confidence of the boys involved, and their trust in him is evident in the extremely moving but completely natural scenes he was able to film with them. The story pulls no punches. As its small characters play out their harsh and telling roles, they point up the inadequacies in even the best-intentioned of us when dealing with the fragile, highly complicated emotional mechanism of a boy.

Jimmy is the result of a broken home. His mother neglected him and his four brothers and sisters, and when his father married again, his step-mother felt incapable of handling Jimmy's problem. On the program both parents discuss his case and how their own upbringing affected their understanding of him. He became a chronic run-away. He stole, lied, and

defied every kind of authority. Nobody seemed able to "reach" him. He completely baffled his parents. "We all had problems as kids and grew out of them," said his father, who believed that soft treatment would do his son no good. He countered all Jimmy's misdemeanors with strenuous corporal punishment, and felt that the boy should be sent to a training school.

Fortunately for Jimmy, the Juvenile Court referred him to Boys Village, where he learned to live with other boys and with adults, to respect authority and to learn not to be afraid to feel and express warmth towards other human beings. Of course it was a difficult year, with many setbacks, but at its end Jimmy had discovered how to be himself, to live with rules, to respect others and their property, and to share affection. He looks forward to being free to find his own life as an adult, and, someday, perhaps, to being an understanding and loving parent.

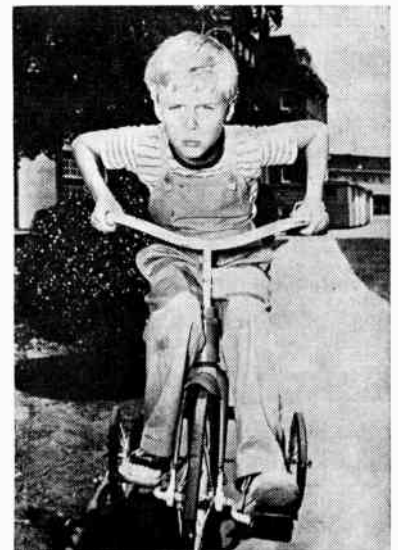

## Frank Scott:

### Writer, Professor Poet, Individualist

*VENTURE presents a portrait of one of Canada's most stimulating personalities*

IN THESE CYNICAL days, sick humour and yes-men to the contrary, it is still possible to follow one's conscience, to be an individualist with a strong mind of one's own, and yet be a rousing success.

Sunday afternoon, June 23rd, at 5:00 p.m., CBC Radio's *Venture* presents a portrait of one such man. He is Frank R. Scott, writer, poet, wit, professor of law at McGill University, socialist, and defender of the underdog—a tall, handsome person with an aquiline nose, a clear, cold voice and a warm heart, who is probably Canada's leading authority on constitutional law. He will not tolerate a fool, but he will fight injustice of any sort with a white and relentless anger.

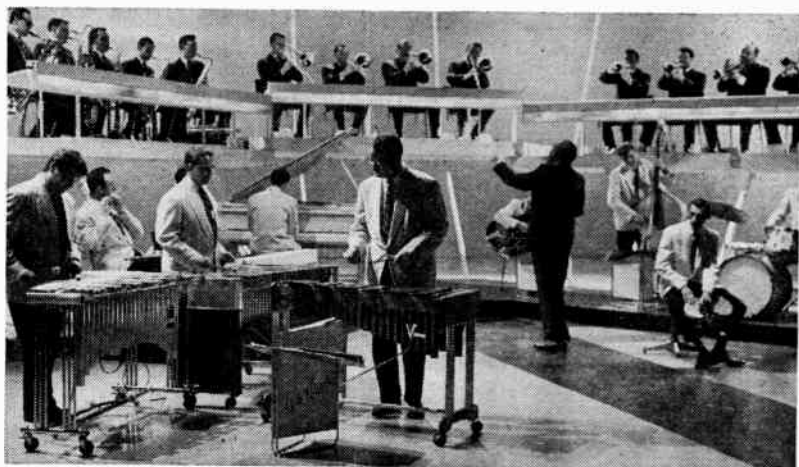
The *Venture* portrait has been prepared by Stephen Vizinczey from interviews with Scott by Jed Adams and Elspeth Chisholm, interviews with some of Scott's old classmates, colleagues and others

who know him well, including Hugh McClelland, René Levesque, and Madame Therese Casgrain, and with a few of Scott's students at McGill. Scott will be heard reading some of his poetry.

Stephen Vizinczey says the whole point of the program is to find out what makes Frank Scott tick, and adds that for younger listeners it should provide an interesting picture of the era just before they were born, the confusing thirties, because Scott's life began to follow its broad and unusual pattern during that important period of Canadian history.

Frank Scott graduated from Bishop's University, Lennoxville, Quebec, and was a Rhodes Scholar for three years at Magdalen College, Oxford. While he was studying law at McGill in the late 1920's, he became a leader of the Montreal Group of Poets, who included A. M. Klein, novelist, lawyer and poet; A. J. M. Smith, editor of *The Canadian Book of Poetry*; and Leo Kennedy. Later Scott was associated with some younger poets who published *The Little Magazine* in Montreal. In fact, he has been closely connected with several of the movements which have contributed to making modern Canadian poetry a lively art. He has been a founding member of such magazines as the *McGill Fortnightly Review*, *The Canadian Mercury*, *Pre-*

done post-graduate work on the Black Widow Spider. Viewers will learn about the appearance, habits and habitats of the spider, how it produces the gossamer for its webs and life-lines, and the variety of uses to which it puts the silk.

"If you wish to live and thrive, let the spider run alive," the saying goes. In many parts of the world it is considered extremely unlucky to kill a spider, and North Americans say that stepping on a spider brings rain. Tahitians never harm a spider. They believe it is the shadow of a god. And the Chipewewa Indians hang a spider web on the hoop of their papoose's cradle-board "to catch the harm in the air."

If you find a spider in the house it's supposed to be a sign that riches and happiness await you. But if you're in the Scottish highlands, make sure you find a spider only in the evening—otherwise, it's bad luck. If a spider drops on you from the ceiling, llegend says, you'll receive a legacy soon, and if a spider walks across your clothes when you're wearing them, you'll have a new outfit before long. If you'd like ready cash always, catch a spider and keep it in your pocket. In the Ozarks they say that if you find a spider web with your initials on it near the door, you'll be lucky forever.

Spiders have long been thought to have special healing powers. An ancient cure for ague and jaundice required the sufferer to swallow a living spider rolled up in butter or molasses, though in parts of the north of England this was frowned on as a dangerous practice. If swallowing a spider didn't work, then you could get rid of your ague—or ward it off—by shutting a spider in a box and leaving it to die, or wearing one or more in a bag around the neck. Apparently this did the trick for some, because an Englishman, Elias Ashmole, wrote in his *Diary* in the 17th century to

the effect that "I took this morning a good dose of elixir and hung three spiders round my neck, and they drove my ague away."

According to legends around Suffolk a child could be cured of whooping-cough if its mother held a spider over the child's head, saying: "Spider, as you waste away, whooping-cough no longer stay," then hung the spider over the fireplace in a bag to die. An old Herefordshire cure called for a spider to be held over the mouth of the child with whooping-cough while the same words were repeated, and then given its liberty outside, the idea being that it would run away with the disease.

Even today spider-webs are considered an effective, if rough-and-ready, cure for bleeding, if pressed onto the wound, and in some remote places are rolled into pills and used for the control of asthma and insomnia. Warts, according to an old book of cures, can be banished forever if the sufferer rolls up a spider web into a small ball, places it on the wart, sets fire to it and burns it to ashes. The prescription doesn't suggest what to do for the ensuing burn or blister.

Really, the only blot on the spider escutcheon (aside from renegades like the Black Widow) is their cannibalistic habit. The male has to be terribly clever in his courting to keep from being gobbled up by his lady-love, and all members of the family have to act slippery to avoid being Dad's lunch. But perhaps spiders can be allowed this artistic instability because they have accomplished such feats. Their perseverance can put man to shame. Robert Bruce was encouraged, as he languished in hiding in 1305, by watching a spider fail again and again to make its web, and always come back for another try. And their intelligence and ingenuity give us cause for thought. Spiders may not have produced a Shakespeare, but they had their Edison long before ours, and their Moms have always wrapped Junior's luncheon sandwiches in a plastic bag. Of course, Cousin Aggie Spider was probably the filling.

so far already, and I feel I'm just about ready to go over the top." Not a rosy philosophy for a man of only 30, but the trouble is that he can't decide whether he wants most to be an impressionist or an actor. He can dance and sing, too, which complicates things further. Meanwhile he's doing a bit of everything. "And when I'm not workin'," he says, "I bug my agent."

Gorshin went to school in Pittsburgh, where his imitations of Al Jolson and other celebrities were popular at club parties. After two years in an engineering course he was drafted into the U.S. Army. On service in England he won the European All-U.S. Air Force Talent Contest, was immediately assigned to Special Services, and entertained at service clubs through Europe.

About a year before Gorshin was discharged, a representative of Universal - International Pictures, who had caught his act in Munich, suggested that Gorshin talk to a New York film agent, and the result was a role in *The Proud and the Profane*. Gorshin wangled an Army leave for the filming in the Virgin Islands. But when the picture was edited he found to his disgust that he appeared in only one scene, with Thelma Ritter. He decided he'd chosen the wrong career.

However, he wasn't successful either in the odd jobs he picked up here and there, so, when he was \$400 in debt he lit out for California to make one more attempt to break into films. Acting roles proved few and far between, but his imitations continued to bring him lots of laughs at private parties, so his agent labelled him an impressionist, quickly booked him into a club, and when Gorshin was presented with a cheque for \$25 he gladly went along with the gag. Better still was the bonus the job brought — a wife, who was a waitress at the club.

Ironically, as his fame as an impressionist spread, movie acting offers came more frequently. He branched into television and paid

off all his debts. When he was driving back to Hollywood from a visit to the East Coast in 1958 he fell asleep at the wheel, the car smashed up, and he spent several months recovering from a fractured skull. To his chagrin he had to turn down several interesting film and television jobs during that period.

Again he made a fresh start, but without such a hard struggle. His roles kept getting bigger and better, and once more his impressions were relegated to private parties. Then he was invited to do some imitations on Steve Allen's big variety program on U.S. TV in March, 1959. Overnight the appearance made him known coast to coast. He had more night club offers than he could handle, and film roles tailored for his special talents. Many critics felt that his performance as a merryandrew type of Method actor in *Bells Are Ringing* merited an Oscar.

He continues to do impressions and straight acting roles in films and television but says he wants impressions to take second place to acting, singing, dancing, etc. "I don't want to encourage the public to forget the real me," he explains.

Both the real Frank Gorshin, the singing, acting, capering performer, and the shadowing one who jumps in and out of the personalities of Edward G. Robinson, Al Jolson, and dozens of other famous men, will be guest on the *Tommy Ambrose Show* on CBC-TV this Friday night, June 28. Gorshin will sing *Bim, Bam, Baby*, and, with Tommy Ambrose, *Teamwork*, and *Me and My Shadow*. Tommy will sing *Love, Mamselle, Did You Ever See a Dream Walking?*, *Alright, Okay, You Win, Try a Little Tenderness*, and *The Good Life*.

## 'The Beatitudes'

### On CBC Wednesday Night

SINCE THE REIGN of Charles II, England's top-rated musical post, from the point of view of prestige, has been that of Master of the Kings or Queen's Musick. The duties of the office-holder, like those of the Poet Laureate, are loosely defined. Originally the Master presided over the monarch's private orchestra, playing at meals and state ceremonies and taking part in services at the Chapel Royal. Since the death of Queen Victoria, the position has existed in little more than name, but its holder is still required to advise the Queen on musical matters for great state occasions. Beyond that task, the Master is free to please himself as to what he composes or doesn't compose, although in practice it's found that at least one new work always turns up at a Royal Wedding, a Coronation, or some other important event.

The present incumbent is Sir Arthur Bliss, a 71-year-old, white-moustached gentleman who bears a resemblance to Sir Edward Elgar (who was himself Master of the Queen's and King's Musick for a number of years). Born in London in 1891, Bliss attended Rugby and Cambridge, studied music at the Royal College of Music under Stanford, Holst, and Vaughan Williams, and except for a period spent in the Grenadier Guards during the First World War (he was wounded twice and was mentioned in dispatches) has devoted his whole life to composition. His career has spanned many different creative movements in music, and he has seen great changes take place in the world's way of life. "I remember watching Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee when I was six," he said recently. "Now I hope to see the first people land on the moon." He maintains that composers and artists often live to a good age because of their sense of excitement. James

Joyce once told him, when Bliss said that he couldn't understand Joyce's books, that he didn't know himself what he was writing, what it was worth, or where it was going—"but it's so exciting!" Bliss thinks that this is a good motto for any artist.

Though he has grown comparatively conservative with age, Bliss was anything but a traditionalist in his early years. In the 1920's he was the most notable among the composers who brought a new cosmopolitanism into English music with numerous works for unusual instrumental groups as well as full-scale works which showed an awareness of contemporary Continental activities. He was the first English composer of stature to write music for the cinema (a score for the film version of H. G. Wells' *Things to Come* in 1935), and later became the first to compose an opera specifically for television.

It was not surprising that Bliss should have been one of the first musicians to venture into the field of movies and TV, for he has always been eager to keep in touch with new ideas. "By temperament," he has said, "I live in the present and as far as I can into the near future." In the 1920's he went off to Paris to study the new music being written by Honegger, Milhaud, Stravinsky and Poulenc. His restless curiosity and eagerness to explore new fields has led him to compose in almost every medium, from piano solos to grand operas; two of his best-known works are the ballet scores for *Checkmate* and *The Miracle in the Gorbals*.

Bliss has held a number of administrative appointments during his career. He has been a professor of music at the Royal College of Music and at the University of California, and from 1941 to 1944 was Music Director of the BBC. He was knighted in 1950 for his services to English music.

Just about a year ago, in connection with the consecration of the new Coventry Cathedral, Sir Arthur Bliss completed a new cantata entitled *The Beatitudes*, scored for soloists, chorus and orchestra.

view, and *Northern Review*, and has been associate editor of the *Canadian Forum* and the *Tamarack Review*. "Publishing being what it was in the thirties," he recalls, "we had to do our own."

In 1936, with A. J. M. Smith, he edited *New Provinces*, the first anthology to introduce the "new poetry" to Canadian readers. And of course he has published several volumes of his own unsentimental, astringent poetry with its tough, sharp-edged images, including *Overture, Events and Signals*, and *The Eye of the Needle*, and it has appeared in leading magazines. He writes in brilliantly satirical vein, he writes of love, of the need for social responsibility, and shows his great understanding of the "world behind the world" which is the poet's deeper concern.

After graduating from law school and practicing for a year, Scott joined the McGill law faculty and has taught there ever since, apart from a year at Harvard on a Guggenheim Fellowship. Asked how he could be a courtroom lawyer, teacher, political reformer and still find a place for poetry in his life, he replied: "The law is crystallized politics. And a good constitution is like a good poem. Both are concerned with the spirit of man."

He has written widely on Canadian constitutional questions. He

has long been active in the CCF Party—from 1942 to 1950 served as national chairman. In 1952 he was Resident Representative in Burma for the U.N. Technical Assistance Program. He has been a member of the National Council for the Penal Association. And he has served publicly in many other ways.

Scott lives in the Westmount district of Montreal, in an old, high-ceilinged house hung with many canvasses by his well-known artist wife, Marion Scott. There he often entertains groups of English-speaking and French-speaking men and women of all ages—poets, artists, musicians, scientists, celebrities and others hardly anyone has ever heard about, but who are the catalysts who make a gathering stimulating. He listens with an approving ear as their ideas cross-pollinate, occasionally interrupting to nail an argument with cool legal precision, sometimes leading a train of thought on an oblique slant when the poet in his nature is uppermost. In his image of himself, poetry, rather than law, is the stronger influence. "I'm not a lawyer's lawyer," he says. "After all, three of my degrees are in arts and only one in law." But legal authorities say that on the couple of occasions when he has appeared as counsel in Supreme Court cases (remarkable victories for him) his presentations were among the most brilliant ever made before Canada's red-robed justices.

The work was given its first performance at an inaugural concert for the cathedral in May of 1962. Later, the BBC made a transcription of the new cantata, conducted by the composer, and this recording will be heard this week on CBC Wednesday Night (radio, June 26, 8:05 p.m.). The soloists are soprano Jennifer Vyvyan and tenor Richard Lewis; the chorus parts are sung by the Coventry Cathedral Festival Choir, formed from choral societies throughout Warwickshire; and the orchestra is the BBC Symphony Orchestra, whose concertmaster is Paul Beard.

The libretto of *The Beatitudes* was prepared by Christopher Hassall and his text includes excerpts

from the Bible and from British mystical poets, amongst them Henry Vaughan, George Herbert, and Dylan Thomas. The Biblical excerpts consists mainly of the Beatitudes—the blessings spoken by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount—that which give the cantata its name.

Another musical highlight of this week's CBC Wednesday Night is a program of unaccompanied choral music, sung by the John Alldis Choir, and also made available through the BBC transcription service. The program consists of three works: A Little Cantata of Proverbs, by the contemporary English composer, Alexander Goehr; *Vexilla Regis*, by the Austrian composer, Anton Bruckner; and *Symphony for Voices*, a setting by Malcolm Williamson of five poems by his fellow Australian, James McAuley.

- 1 cup shredded coconut
- 3 cups sifted all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 egg
- ½ cups milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

In separate episodes, the irrepressible Lucy dons a matador's costume to fight a bull, does a skit in pantomime with Red Skelton which has been hailed by U.S. critics as one of the finest examples of this type of acting in the history of television, becomes a Girl Friday on a daytime television program, pretends she's a geisha girl in Japan, climbs into a knight's armor suit to upstage Tallulah Bankhead, and leads a hunt for uranium in the Nevada Desert.
