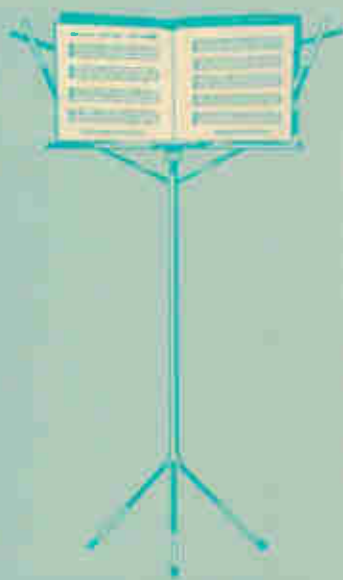

### How About the Baseball Fans?

• It is difficult not to become over exuberant in praise of the versatility and the excellent productions presented to Canadians by our national radio and television network.

I cannot understand why the CBC cannot do as the American networks do, and relay the video tape production of such events to its audience at a later time. . . . I have seen baseball yanked from the network with scores tied or rallies in progress. . . . With some effort on behalf of program organizers, and some sound thinking on behalf of sponsors of network shows following the baseball games, it should be possible to arrange that baseball fans are able to see the completion of a game. . . .

Transmission lines are reserved for a specific period during the day, and this period would have lapsed by the time the delayed telecast was available.*

# around CBC

TEN OHIO AWARDS—five for radio and five for television—have been won by the CBC for achievement in educational broadcasting. The awards are presented annually by the Institute for Education by Radio-Television, Ohio State University, in competitions open to Canadian and U.S. broadcasting networks.

TV awards went to: *Camera Canada's* film, *The Looking Glass People*, about ballet dancers; *The Nature of Things*, for the program *Count On Me*, about computers; *The Ideas of Physics—Order or Chaos*, in the National Schools Telecasts; *The Place of the Skull*, a Good Friday special (special commendation); and *Arms and the Man*, produced by the CBC in co-operation with the Manitoba education department and the Manitoba Theatre Centre (special commendation), Alwyn Scott of CBC Winnipeg, producer.

Winning Radio awards were: *Thar She Blows*, the story of a whale hunt produced for the B.C. school broadcasts; *Summer Fallow—The Awakening*, drama about a farm boy; *CO., the Life-Saver*, produced by Ken Saddlemeyer, Regina, in co-operation with the Saskatchewan education department; *Aspects of Canada—River of Canada*, a CBC International Service transcription about the St. Lawrence; *Issues in Modern Canada—American Influences on Canadian Life*, an Ontario schools broadcast.

AFTERNOON CONCERT on CBW will undergo a change of format during July and August, re-

ports producer Jeffrey Anderson who selects recorded music for the program, heard at 3 p.m. Monday to Friday. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, choral music will be heard—mainly shorter selections, but, on occasions, longer works which will be presented in two parts. On Wednesdays, the program, restricted to a half-hour, adopts the new name of *London Chamber Concerts*, with recorded music from Britain.

MOST CBC RADIO STATIONS have just one morning commentator, but listeners to CBW Manitoba can enjoy the variety of material presented by two women—Lynn MacFarlane and Jean Sangwine.

Each Monday, Wednesday and Friday, Jean Sangwine presents reports of interest particularly to women in the *Morning Comment* period, 10:33-10:43 a.m. Born in Lockwood, Sask., to a pioneer homesteading family, she studied music after completing her high school, obtaining an Associate Diploma from the Royal Conservatory and a Licentiate Diploma from the University of Saskatchewan. She also took a business course, and worked in Ottawa and Toronto while continuing to study music.

"Since marrying my minister husband," she reports, "I've seen a bit of country—New York City, northern Saskatchewan, Ontario and Manitoba. Besides taking part in many church activities I've continued to teach music, lead choirs, play the organ, work in business offices and write. I must have taken half a dozen writing courses, all of which taught me one thing: an authoress must be dedicated to her typewriter."

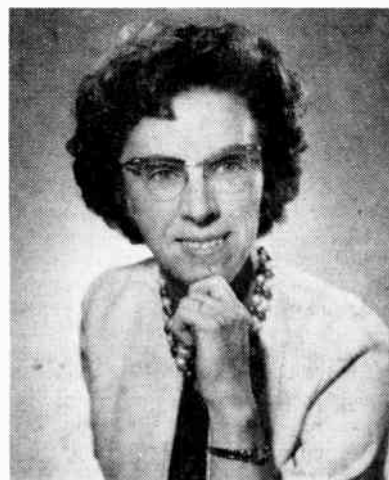
The Sangwines have three adopted children—Eric 12, Janet 10, and Linda 9.

# Hypnotism:

## Off the Stage, into the Operating Room

*The ancient art of hypnotism is becoming a useful tool in the hands of skilled medical practitioners.*  
**NATURE OF THINGS** deals with the subject Sunday

THERE HAVE BEEN Svengalis ever since the Stone Age, anthropologists believe. Cavemen could terrify, and thus control, their fellow tribesmen with hypnotism. Later, soothsayers gazing into their crystal balls to foretell the future fell into a self-imposed trance, thinking it clarified their perceptive talents. Egypt had temples of sleep where miraculous "cures" were believed to be made. Hindu fakirs have long been able to sleep in comfort on beds of nails or to walk on red-hot coals by putting themselves into trances. Ancient Greeks made pilgrimages to the God of Medicine, where hypnotic visions took place and all kinds of illnesses

were thought to be healed through trances.

Many religions have made use of self-hypnosis, and even today some fanatical sects use the same device to work up religious fervor. But medical hypnosis wasn't recognized in modern times until the late 1700's, when Franz Mesmer, a Viennese doctor, used it as part of psychiatric treatment. He worked under the erroneous impression that illness was caused by an imbalance of "universal fluids," and that the balance could be corrected by hypnotism, during which he thought a "magnetic force", an "animal magnetism" flowed between doctor and patient.

Members of the aristocracy took up "mesmerism" as a fad, but soon envious colleagues of Mesmer pressed for an investigation of his claims. A cursory study was made by a French commission (which included Benjamin Franklin) and as a result Mesmer was declared a fraud.

But medical men continued to be interested in Mesmer's ideas, and used mesmerism in leading clinics, without, however, any real understanding of its nature, until the middle 1800's, when James Braid, an English surgeon, made a study of it. He described Mesmer's "magnetism" as a state of mind which he

# Ol' Rawhide's

## Unabridged HISTORY OF CANADA

If you think you have been given the full story on the early history of Canada, better tune in to VENTURE Sunday on CBC Radio and learn the truth according to Ol' Rawhide

LAST FALL WHEN the news leaked out that that unrepentent old rascal, Rawhide, was retiring to a rocking chair far from the CBC studios, where he could do no more harm, nobody believed a word of it, of course. That he was in a chair, rocking, was within the realm of possibility, for the old boy has never been one to let an American get ahead of him. But out of harm's way? Never!

Most people suspected Rawhide was using his leisure to sharpen his axe, and likely would emerge one day to take a swipe at something or someone needing (in his opinion) trimming down to size. But most didn't dream that the old codger was capable of such wicked and subtle strategy as he plans to utilize next Sunday on CBC Radio's *Venture*. He's going to get at the very roots of our heritage, knock the props right out from under us with some plain, unvarnished facts about our history of Canada, of which not even the Fathers of Confederation had an inkling.

This startling exposé has had months of secret preparation. Frequently Rawhide stole away from his rocking chair, sneaked onto the milk train for Ottawa, shuffled into the National Archives and dug, and dug and dug. And from the dusty depths of our past he came up with some shocking revelations which should make our history books look sick, and cause not a few puritan ancestors to turn over in their graves.

But the old curmudgeon is such a sly lad that when the brick-bats start flying, he'll be back on the rocking-chair innocently idling away his sunset days and, when nobody's looking, laughing himself silly. The goat in the case will be

that leading light of the Rawhide Little Theatre Group, that suave, dulcet-voiced bundle of Ego, that loyal Canadian, that weak but unimpeachable mother's son, that controversial Canadian reporter, commentator and world traveller, Marvin Mellowbell — only Marvin doesn't know it, yet.

Denied the opportunity of flaunting his dramatic talents these long months, Marvin jumped wildly at the chance of airing his voice again to a national audience, when Rawhide suggested that he appear as host, narrator and producer on a little radio program to mark Dominion Day, a program of "great national importance." So, not suspecting that he will be dropping a bomb that will reverberate across the nation on the eve of its birthday, poor Marvin will be heard in *A History of Canada* on *Venture*.

This extraordinary offering harks back to the very beginning of our recorded history, when the Vikings landed, up to the present exciting times. Listeners will hear an exchange between the discoverer of the St. Lawrence River, Cartier, and Iroquois Chief Donnacona, on Sept. 9, 1535, which certainly shows the intrepid Jacques and the "Lord of Canada" in a different light. We've been led to believe that Cartier won Donnacona's friendship with the warmth of his own personality and a few gew-gaws from the folks back home, but not at all! It was box-tops that did the trick. The wily Indian insisted on box-tops from French corn-flakes in exchange for his mink and beaver pelts, or it would be scalps all round. (He was saving up for a King of France costume complete with

# Belgrade Ballet: THE LEGEND OF OHRID

A Sunday CBC-TV  
Special from Yugoslav  
Radio-Television

AN HOUR-LONG program of ballet, produced by Yugoslav Radio-Television, will be shown on the CBC-TV network on Sunday, June 30. The telecast, which features members of the Belgrade Ballet and the Belgrade Radio-Television Symphony Orchestra conducted by Oskar Danon, was produced especially for an international program exchange conducted by the Columbia Broadcasting System in the U.S., and broadcasters in eight other countries.

The entire program will be devoted to the performance of one ballet, *The Legend of Ohrid*, with choreography by Margareta Froman and a musical score by Steven Hristic. The ballet, which has been a favourite with Yugoslav audiences since its first performance in 1947, is based on a popular legend set in the period of Turkish occupation of Yugoslavia, which lasted from 1459 to 1866.

In the story, a young Yugoslav peasant girl is captured by Turkish soldiers on her wedding day and is taken as a slave to the sultan's palace; but her fiancé comes to her rescue with a magic sword given to him by the Spirit of the Morning Star. While he fights the soldiers, the girl is transformed into a turtle dove so she can fly from the palace. All ends happily when the two lovers are reunited at their home village and the interrupted wedding preparations resume.

In its settings, costuming and general story-line, the ballet has obvious similarities to Stravinsky's *Firebird*. There are 10 scenes in the television version of the ballet, including large-scale numbers featuring the entire company, a dream sequence, dances by the soldiers, solo dances by peasant girls and boys, an exciting fight scene between the young man and the Turkish soldiers, and a vividly colourful wedding celebration scene.

Since its première in Belgrade in 1947, *The Legend of Ohrid* has been performed more than 200 times in Yugoslavia alone, and has become Hristic's best-known work. The score is based on folk dances from Macedonia, a Yugoslav republic, and from Bulgaria, Rumania and Greece, and is said to sum up traditional Yugoslav music in a way no other work has done.

Hristic was born in Belgrade in 1885, studied music in Italy and in Leipzig, under Max Reger, then returned to his home city where he founded the Belgrade Philharmonic Orchestra. Much of his life was devoted to furthering the Belgrade

# MAN

## Weakest Link In the Drive to Conquer Space

A new series of DISCOVERY explores space scientists' biggest problem in its first two programs, Sundays, June 30 and July 7

FOR THE THIRD successive year, the CBC Vancouver-produced series of documentary programs, entitled *Discovery*, will be seen on the CBC-TV network, beginning June 30. The series, scheduled Sunday nights, will run until September 22, with two program periods in August being pre-empted for special programming.

The series begins with a two-part documentary, scheduled for June 30 and July 7, entitled *The Weakest Link*. The programs deal with research in the field of space medicine being done at the Boeing aircraft plant in Seattle, Wash. The title is derived from a statement made by a spokesman for Boeing, who said: "Man is a sea-level, low speed, 'one G,' 12-hour animal and, as such, is our weakest link in aerospace development."

Ways are being investigated to make this weakest link function as strongly as possible, because man is essential to space research, primarily for one reason: He is the most efficient 170-pound computer yet devised. A human has the edge on other computers because he can make decisions without pre-programming, but in order to get this fragile decision-maker into space, great penalties in the form of life-support equipment must be paid. Every bead of perspiration, every degree of heat and quickening of breathing rate caused by excitement, tension or fear must be taken into account in the design of delicately balanced space craft, and researchers must also determine

what temperature, pressure, humidity and other conditions are required to enable man to function most efficiently in space.

During the programs, host Bob Quintrell discusses the work being undertaken at Boeing with some of those in charge of the research project.

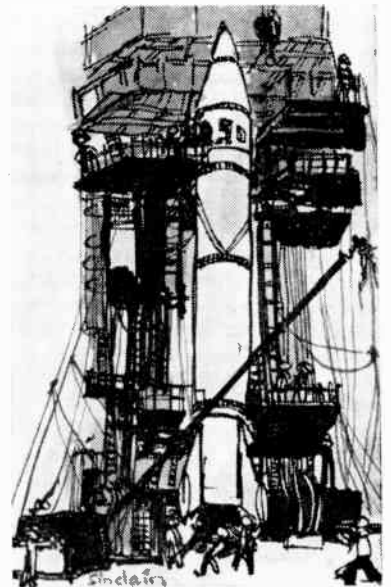
The next two programs in the *Discovery* series, July 14 and 21, will examine the influences that have shaped the design of domestic buildings throughout history. The first program covers the period from earliest recorded times to about 1900; the second is a survey of architectural influences in North America during the past 60 years, with emphasis on dwellings on the Canadian west coast.

Early exploration of a great African river will be the topic of the program scheduled for July 28. In 1864, Sir Samuel Baker and his wife discovered the source of the Nile, and explored the region around Murchison Falls and Luta Nzige Lake, which they re-named Lake Albert. The area exists today in very much the same state as when Sir Samuel first saw it 100 years ago. The *Discovery* program consists of film footage, shot by Chiels Margach, which re-traces the route taken by the Bakers. The accompanying narration is taken from Sir Samuel's book, *The Albert Nyanza*.

The programs of August 4 and 11 will be pre-empted, and on August 18 and 25 two programs on physical fitness are scheduled.

The programs will attempt to assess ideas of physical fitness in the past, dating back to the writings of Aristotle, and compare them with contemporary opinions on the subject. Producer Gordon Babineau and script-writer Dave Brock found that there is a wide divergence of opinion on just what constitutes fitness, and there is a good deal of controversy on how to get and keep fit. Some experts will thrash out the question on the programs.

*Bush Pilots of the West* is the title of a two-part program to be seen on September 1 and 8. It will trace the history of heavier-than-air flight generally and will deal more particularly with the beginnings of bush flying, usually

# Le Grand Charles

Charles de Gaulle is subject of CLOSE-UP Sunday

HIS OVERWHELMING belief in the greatness of France and in his mission to serve her greatly have made General Charles de Gaulle one of the most outstanding, controversial figures of modern times. For many, his tall, lean figure, hooded eyes, and elephantine nose have come to represent the symbol of France. There are such a variety of contradictory opinions about him, so many stories and anecdotes, that it is difficult to separate the legend from the man.

Sunday night, June 30, CBC-TV's *Close-Up* will attempt to do so in an intimate, non-political portrait of General de Gaulle which looks back over his life with old friends and colleagues who recall their meetings with him. Included are many recollections by the famous Frenchman himself, beginning with memories of his boyhood in the northern industrial city of Lille, where his father was professor

of philosophy at a Jesuit-run school. Titled *Le Grand Charles*, the program was directed by Allan King, and produced by John Kennedy with photography by Rolph Blakstad and Richard Leiterman.

Helping to sort out the facts about de Gaulle's background, his personality, character and ideals, are his biographer and family friend, Georges Cattai, who recalls de Gaulle's childhood; journal-



ist Rémy Roure, who was confined with de Gaulle in Ingolstadt prison in 1917; Jean Aubertin, a close friend who attempted to enlist political support for de Gaulle's theories between the wars; Paul Reynaud, ex-Prime Minister of France, who welcomed de Gaulle's support in struggling to rouse France to meet the threat of re-armed Nazi Germany; Duncan Grinnell-Milne, a British liaison officer assigned to de Gaulle shortly after his arrival in London in June, 1940, who tells of their first meeting and of the General's determination to support his country; de Gaulle himself, reading his Call to Arms in 1940; Mme. Geneviève Anthoiz, his niece; Emmanuel D'Astier de la Vigerie, one of the leading members of the French Resistance, and later a minister in de Gaulle's Provisional Government; General Pierre Bilette, a wartime chief of staff to de Gaulle and subsequently a leader in the Gaullist party; writer François Mauriac, and Gaston Palewski, a friend since the thirties and one of de Gaulle's closest and most trusted subordinates.

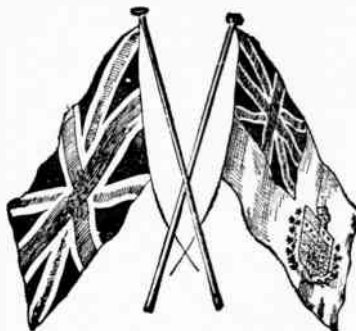

## The Modern Team Helping the Mental Patient

A new series, **LIVE AND LEARN**, presents a six-part study of modern psychiatry

A SIX-PART SERIES on psychiatry, dealing with major mental and emotional ills, will be presented on the CBC-TV network, beginning Tuesday night, July 2. It was shown last fall for CBLT, Toronto, viewers as part of the *Live and Learn* series, which has dealt with a wide variety of topics on an adult level with tremendous success. This is the first time *Live and Learn* has been offered on the network.

It has been estimated that there are as many psychiatric patients in Canada as there are patients with all other forms of disease. Yet many Canadians have little idea how a patient with an emotional or mental illness behaves, what he looks like, in what ways he suffers, how his disability compares with other illnesses, and more important, how he can be helped and how psychiatric illness can be prevented. Psychiatry is one of the youngest and most important of the medical specialties, and in the last decade it has made sweeping advances. Some of them will be discussed in *Live and Learn Psychiatry*.

Each program deals with a major psychiatric disorder, beginning with depression, and later covering hysteria, obsessive-compulsive behaviour, schizophrenia, and psychopathic personality, and dementia. The series was planned in collaboration with the Division of Extension at the University of Toronto and the Metropolitan Educational Television Asso-

ciation, and the main participants are from the department of psychiatry at the University of Toronto. The host is Dr. John W. Lovett Doust, associate professor of psychiatry at the University of Toronto.

Viewers will be able to "sit in" on a case conference in which details of a patient's problems will be discussed, and various members of the psychiatric team will be shown at work with the patient.

Besides answering some general questions about mental illness and its treatment, the series points up the various roles of the psychiatric team. There is the psychiatric social worker, primarily concerned with evaluating the impact of the patient's illness on his social setting and then, through relatives, attempting to mould it so the patient can adapt to it better. The occupational therapist is skilled in appraising the patient's ability to perform tasks and, by adapting tasks to the patient's changing needs, can offer a therapeutic program of work and social activities. Another team member is the clinical psychologist, skilled in testing aspects of the patient's abilities, personality and psychological performance, and, on the basis of his test results, can make scientific predictions about the outcome of the illness and suggestions about the type of treatment likely to yield the best results. The psychiatric nurse has, perhaps, the hardest task of all: to be for the patient both a permissive, loving mother and an emotionally uninvolved, objective person capable of helping the patient to see his behaviour in perspective. Finally, there is the psychiatrist himself, whose medical training was the springboard for the specialized experience in emotional and mental disorders which he uses for treating those patients whose "dark night of the soul" is more than they can bear alone.

# The Class of '39 As it is Today

ON SUCCESSIVE Wednesday nights, July 3 and 10, CBC Television's *Explorations* series will present two programs entitled *Class of '39*. Produced in Vancouver by George Robertson, the programs carry the sub-title *Encounter with a Generation*. Producer Robertson has written the following introduction to the two programs:

"*Class of '39* is an attempt to discover the mind and heart of a generation at two points in time—the long springtime of their graduating year, 1938-39, with the depression still lingering on and the war just ahead; and the present day, the years of the affluent society and executive success. It is not a definitive portrait of a generation, but it tries to be a true cross-section of the more than 250 young men and women who left the University of British Columbia in the summer of 1939 and went into the professions and to war. About 20 speak for their generation, and they number among them politicians, businessmen, housewives, a farmer, a mining executive, a motel owner, and a canon of the Anglican Church. Invited to address the camera, and, by implication, their own generation, they are more idealistic than most of us suppose, but not more than most of us suppose ourselves to be. Many of them were interviewed in Vancouver; some were tracked down in Winnipeg, Ottawa, and as far north as Fort St. John.

"The first program is about that last sunny undergraduate year, when students were, for the most

JUST A FEW days ago, one of golf's recognized greats, Gary Player of South Africa, stated that too much emphasis was being placed on the amount of money being won on the pro tour. Player expressed the opinion that less importance should be attached to the dollar bills the pros were stuffing into their jeans, and more importance placed on the scorecard. His argument was that one tournament victory could boost a pro tour member up among the leaders in money winnings.

A case in point occurred over the week end when Arnold Palmer

walked up to the cashier's wicket in the Thunderbird Open, picked up a cheque for \$25,000, and vaulted from sixth to second place on the money winning list with over \$56,000 in the bank for the year. Undoubtedly most golfers are aware that Jack Nicklaus leads in winnings with a bank account of over \$59,000. But I'd wager that very few people know which golfer has the best average score per tournament on the pro tour . . . and this is Player's argument. Tony Lema has the best average round, 70.292 strokes per tournament, and Arnold Palmer is a very close second.

Player may have a point, but still it's the "long green" that interests the spectators, and attracts the pro golfers to the tournament trail. The larger the prize money, the greater the entries. And this year the Canadian Open, in an effort to lure more of the big name pros, boosted the prize money from \$30,000 to \$50,000. And the extra "do-re-mi" tossed into the kitty has attracted a

first-class field to Toronto Scarborough for the July 3 to 6 tournament. CBC Television cameras and radio mikes will be on hand during all four rounds of the tournament with one hour of live TV coverage on the first three days, and the wind up action on the final day. Radio will report from the scene Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 7:35 p.m. to 7:45 p.m., and again on Saturday.

Also included in the week's sporting coverage is the baseball game of the week Saturday afternoon, featuring the "Mantle-less" New York Yankees, at this writing the leaders in the American League, and the Boston Red Sox, running a surprising third. The usual five-pin bowling feature from O'Connor Bowl will also be seen on the cathode tube.

For radio listeners, first class coverage is provided on Saturday Sports Date—this week, a delayed report on the running of the Irish Derby, and live coverage of the Achievement Stakes.

Special hour-long coverage is provided daily during the first three rounds, and on the final round, Saturday, a special 2½-hour presentation will be shown.

## Web of Life

Home Sweet Home. Host Dr. Ian McTaggart Cowan, professor and head of the zoology department at the University of British Columbia, illustrates on film some of the homes belonging to members of the animal kingdom. The program focuses on three types of "residences:" the dam of the beaver; the eyrie (nest) of the osprey; and the shell of the shrimp.

Today's program covers the years 1924-29 and how racing began in western Canada. Guests are Lou Davies and George Morton who talk about the old barrier-style of starting. to find exactly the right scenes to fit the scripts, and has been browsing through photo files, to add to the 2,000 stills and 4,000 feet of vintage film already in the program's archives.

Costume departments and set designers are thumbing through old magazines and newspapers for inspiration, and raising clouds of dust in attic prowls for accessories; and musicians are busy writing new arrangements in the style of decades ago.

Back on the show are such regulars of past seasons as narrator-host Bill Bellman, comedian-singer Barney Potts, singers Pat Morgan, Thora Anders, Betty Hilker and Pat Walker, and Lance Harrison and his orchestra, who will offer arrangements of music of the '20s and the swing era — serious treatments, not poking fun at the musical styles of that time.

Additions to the cast include songstress Roma Hearn, who has been featured in Vancouver's Theatre Under the Stars, and has been seen frequently on CBUT, Vancouver, in the last few months; a barbershop quartet including Karl Norman, who will also sing solo numbers; and a second orchestra led by Harry Pryce, conductor of the CBC network radio series *Leicester Square* for 19 years, who brings to *Some of Those Days* his special talent for authentic presentations of turn-of-the-century melodies and Broadway show tunes of more recent times. Production and direction of the series is by English-born Neil Sutherland.

part, more concerned with passing exams and going to parties and football games than worrying about the inevitable war. The second part takes as its departure point the war and its obscene waste of human resources. Entitled *A World Without Philip Griffin*, it tries to portray the kind of world that would have been inherited by one of the most admired men of the class of '39, had he not been killed at Falaise.

"We are left with today. There are no conclusions, but a powerful feeling that the class of '39, growing into its late 40s, preparing to assume its share of the responsibility for running this country, has about as much intelligence, optimism and idealism as we could hope for."

Robertson served as writer, director and producer of the two programs. Film cameramen were John Seale, Harry Makin and Ian Matheson, and film editor was Arla Saare.

Opera, of which he was conductor and director for many years. He was also a professor of music at the Belgrade Musical Academy and was first chairman of the Federation of Yugoslav Composers. A traditionalist, Hristic loved folk music and was seldom drawn to abstract or impressionistic styles of composition. His main concern was to raise folk music to high artistic levels, and in pursuing this goal he blended modern compositional techniques with folklore elements in his music. He died in Belgrade in 1958.

The first musical sketches for the *Legend* date from 1927 and Hristic worked on the battle score on and off for almost 20 years, finally completing it in 1946. In its stage première, the choreography was entrusted to dancer Margareta Froman, the Director of the Belgrade Ballet and a vital force in the development of Yugoslav dance ensembles. Born in Moscow, Miss Froman studied ballet in Russia, joined the corps de ballet of the Moscow Imperial Theatre, then toured Europe and America with the famous Diaghilev ballet com-

pany. After some years spent in Yugoslavia she moved to the U.S., and now makes her home in Connecticut.

The ballet was videotaped last year in the Belgrade studios of Yugoslav Radio-Television under the direction of producer Slavoljub Ravasi, and is the first television program from Yugoslavia to be shown in North America.

The publicly-owned Yugoslav television system, established in 1958, comprises three stations — in Belgrade, Zagreb and Ljubljana — with three other stations in the planning stage. The network broadcasts a total of 24 hours a week and reaches about 6,000,000 viewers, more than a third of the country's population; when the three new stations are completed the television service will be available to the entire populace. The network carries programs produced by each of the three stations, with Belgrade contributing about 60 per cent of the programming, and also exchanges telecasts through Eurovision, the continent-wide international network. Strong emphasis is placed on informative and political programs, but the schedule also includes children's programs and variety shows.

credited as beginning in 1921, when Imperial Oil Ltd. purchased two all-metal Junkers aircraft to fly from Edmonton to Fort Norman. The pioneers evolved special techniques to meet the challenge of flying over the vast uninhabited wilderness areas of Canada. The program will include historical film footage of the early days of flight in Canada and interviews with some of the hardy men who piloted the ramshackle fabric-and-wire aircraft of 40 years ago. It also shows many of the services still provided today by bush pilots — air ambulances, fire fighting, and transportation to remote regions of the country.

The final two programs of the *Discovery* series will also deal with aeronautics, on September 15 and 22. Producer Alex Pratt and researcher-writer Dave Brock will present the story of experimentation into heavier-than-air flight done prior to the arrival of the Wright brothers on the scene. Even as early as 1800 experiments were undertaken that were based on remarkably accurate ideas of the principles of flight. The programs will study the work of Sir George Cayley, who developed a practical flying machine lacking only an engine light enough to propel it; the German glider ace Lillian who was killed in a crash in the 1890s; the Frenchman Chanute, who designed the wings of the Wright brothers' plane and who conducted many important flight experiments himself; and other pioneers who made great contributions to the body of knowledge about flying although they may not have received the acclaim won by the Wrights.


On Mondays under the title *Tony Emery Speaking*, the programs will feature wry little essays on modern-day life, delivered by Tony Emery, a West Coast broadcaster and professor of History at Victoria College, Victoria, B.C.

The Tuesday programs, entitled *Curiosity Shop*, will be devoted to studies of eerie occurrences and mysterious happenings, calculated to tingle listeners' spines. Presiding over the weekly adventure into the world of the occult will be Rex Lambert, supervisor of CBC's School Broadcasts department until his retirement three years ago, who has long been interested in "things that go bump in the night."

Another university professor who is heard frequently as a CBC broadcaster and critic is Chester Duncan of Winnipeg. On Wednesdays, under the title *Duncan's Diary*, he will comment on current happenings as seen in a somewhat sardonic light.

Actor-writer Henry Comor shares Rex Lambert's fascination with things supernatural — three years ago he prepared the *ESP* series heard on CBC Radio — but in his Thursday afternoon broadcasts this summer he will concentrate on an entirely different field: manners. His series of quarter-hour programs about the history of etiquette, customs and habits has been entitled *Mind Your Manners*.

Tommy Tweed, actor, humourist, playwright and historian, and known for many years as the "metre reader" on CBC Radio, will be heard every Friday in the series giving poetry readings, mainly in a humorous vein.

four, count them, cardboard crowns studded with genuine synthetic jewels in rich, dazzling three-colour tones.)

Led by Marvin, listeners will attend a dinner given for Champlain to make him forget the marvelous parties at the French Court, and if you think Canada didn't have some pretty snappy antidotes to French cuties, French viands, and French liquid refreshment, you've been looking at the wrong engravings.

The history books we ground our way through in school have kept something important from us. This scandal will be revealed when Marvin spills the beans that part of Laura Secord's message was deliberately deleted from the pages of Canadian history by the sensitive guardians of our country's youth. Now the time is ripe for the truth to be told, bitter as it may be.

But *Venture's* offering isn't all shocking. Prepare to shed tears as you listen to Marvin's moving rendition of a sampling from the works of that immortal Canadian poetess, Elizabeth Barrett Blueing, whose writings have shamefully had to take a back seat to the efforts of Robert Service and Pauline Johnson.

Not neglected in this historical travesty are the Riel Rebellion (there were shenanigans going on that even Riel didn't suspect), the Gold Rush (what really happened will make your hair stand on end), the Boer War (shameful, shameful, the way we've been misled), and Canadian culture, which will fall flat on its face in the course of this uninhibited exposé. There will be lots more, of course, but you'll have to hear it—to believe it.

jecting the Canadian image through people and places, with each program reflecting Markle's viewpoint on the subject at hand. The treatment will be more personal than in a documentary, and will be more unconventional than formal, more light-hearted than solemn, and more concerned with the overlooked than the obvious.

One show will concern what host Markle describes as "the coffee-house syndrome—from Vancouver to Halifax," another will take him to Mexico to interview Canada's only bullfighter, Carolyn Hayward, and to film her in action in the *corrida*.

Born in Winnipeg, Markle first made his name in Vancouver, while still in his mid-teens, where he worked with the highly skilled drama team under Andrew Allan's leadership. Later he moved to Toronto, served with the RCAF in the Second World War, and before leaving Toronto for New York in 1946 had written about 250 dramas for CBC Radio. In succeeding years he was involved with an

enormous variety of radio programs, television dramas and films. "I have run the gamut from *Lux Playhouse* to *M Squad*," he has said, "with a good many westerns in between." He has produced and directed more than 500 television films, including such series as *Life With Father*, *Playhouse 90*, *Thriller*, *Hong Kong* and *Father of the Bride*. His most recent directorial chore was on Walt Disney's movie *The Incredible Journey*.

Parts of *Journey* were filmed on location near Toronto last fall, and at that time Markle made his first extended visit to Canada since leaving 17 years ago. He liked what he saw, and decided to return to Toronto permanently to pick up the threads of his writing career, which has suffered in the past decade because of his busy schedule of production and directing responsibilities (his work-week in Hollywood often ran to 115 hours). Another reason for leaving Hollywood, a place he describes as "the land of the wilting lotus," is the weather, oddly enough. "You get to miss the seasons," he points out. "And that smog is really no joke."

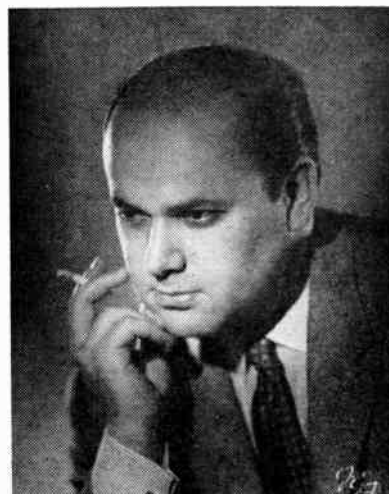

## HYPNOTISM: OFF STAGE

named hypnotism, after the Greek *hypnos*, meaning sleep. About the same time the first operation under hypnotic anaesthesia was performed in France and over the rest of the century it was repeated hundreds of times with success, particularly by James Esdaile, an English doctor in India who, by using hypnosis in all kinds of operations, including leg amputations, had reduced the mortality rate from 50 per cent to 5 per cent, all without pain. But he was branded a fake and ousted from practicing medicine.

In 1892 public exhibitions of hypnosis were condemned in England, and under no circumstances were female patients allowed to be hypnotized except in the presence of a relative or someone of their own sex. No one fully trusted hypnotists, and Victorians thought it highly improper for a young lady to be left alone in a room with one of them. That he would have her in his power in seconds seemed certain.

At the turn of the century the already shaky reputation of hypnosis as therapy received a sharp set-back when Sigmund Freud introduced psychoanalysis as a much more effective treatment for hysteria and mental illness. Hypnosis was almost discarded until the First World War, when it was revived as a treatment for shell-shock, but it was still so mysterious a cure, and doctors understood so little about it, that no great progress in its study was made until the impetus of the Second World War, when it was experimented with again to combat neurosis. The success of this helped to free it from many of the fears, taboos and superstitions surrounding it. Now it is recognized as a valuable instrument for treating certain types of personality disorders and psychosomatic illnesses, for helping patients to sustain awkward positions for skin grafting, to relieve pain in childbirth or under surgery when ordinary anaesthetics are not suitable, and in dentistry. But it can be extremely dangerous in the hands of amateurs.

Many leading contemporary doctors have risked their professional reputations to keep hypnosis alive as a science, by employing it in treatment whenever it seems practicable. One of the few who are doing actual medical research into hypnosis on a sustained basis is Martin T. Orne, M.D., Ph.D., of the department of psychology at the Harvard Medical School, whose much-respected work with his staff of 14 is underwritten by a number of organizations in the United States, such as the U.S. Naval Office of Research, the Massachusetts Mental Health Centre, the U.S. Air Force Office of Scientific Research, and the Group Psychology Centre of the Institute for Experimental Psychiatry.

Recently Dr. Orne made a special trip to Toronto to video-tape a half-hour discussion and demonstration of hypnosis for CBC-TV's *The Nature of Things*. It will be presented on Sunday, June 30, as the final program in the current series. Production is by James Murray. John Livingston is program organizer.

With host Lister Sinclair Dr. Orne talks about the phenomenon of hypnotism, and clears up some common myths about it. He points out that hypnosis makes use of the *subject's* abilities, not the hypnotist's. The hypnotist makes the suggestions, but the subject does all the work. To induce hypnotism requires no magic talents. It's not sorcery—it's quite within the range of the average layman. But while it's not difficult to induce, it's extremely hard to control, and in the hands of an inexperienced person can have tragic results. As one psychiatrist puts it, "Hypnotism is easy to teach but hard to use wisely. It is like the surgeon's scalpel. Anyone can cut with it, but only a trained surgeon can remove an appendix with it."

### BARBECUED SPARERIBS

3 cups canned tomatoes  
1 cup diced celery  
1 cup diced onions  
1 clove minced garlic  
1/3 cup cider vinegar  
1/2 cup sugar  
1 tsp. ground cloves  
1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon  
1 tsp. salt  
1/4 tsp. freshly ground pepper  
1/4 tsp. chili powder

Combine all ingredients. Simmer for 1/2 hour, then add 1 cup of any brand of barbecue sauce.

Rub 4 lbs. spareribs with salt and freshly ground pepper. Bake for approximately 30 mins. in a covered roaster at 400°. Brush well with sauce, basting frequently. Bake uncovered until tender.

# Ghost Squad: British Thriller Returns for Another Season

A BOOK BY former Detective-Superintendent John Gosling of Scotland Yard's Criminal Investigation Department, who was among the first members of the Ghost Squad (or Phantom Squad, as it was dubbed by the British press), inspired a British-made television drama series which begins its second summer season on the CBC television network on Tuesday evening, July 2.

Titled *Ghost Squad*, the series is about the undercover work of an elite corps of British police agents who infiltrate the international underworld in a campaign against vice and crime which evade orthodox police detection methods. Even the Bobby on the beat doesn't know who the members of the Ghost Squad are, because there is nothing about them to connect them with the famous police organization they represent. Among the members could be a glamorous air hostess on a charter flight, perhaps the quiet, serious-looking pilot, the mousy-looking chap on the morning bus, or the frowsy belly-dancer in a second-rate cabaret.

Chief of the Ghost Squad, Geoffrey Stock, is played by Anthony Marlowe, seen for many years on the British stage, screen and television, who is proud of his Cockney birth—in a London hospital within the sound of Bow Bells.

Michael Quinn plays an American agent, Nick Craig, who is assisted by British operator Tony Miller, played by Neil Hallett. Craig is an easy-going fellow who enjoys a good time, while Miller is a more energetic, forceful type of person who believes in using his fists as well as his brains to score a point. Another regular cast member is Claire Nielson, a red-haired, green-eyed actress playing the Ghost Squad chief's personal secretary, Jean Carter, who shows promise of becoming a competent Ghost Squad operator.
