## Question Mark ?

**QUESTION MARK**, a CBC-TV series created to examine the convictions many of us hold dear about ourselves, each other and the space and time we live in, begins Sunday night, October 20, and will be seen every second week. Host and narrator for the series is J. Frank Willis, and production is by Del MacKenzie.

Each program will be devoted to an interview with an extraordinary citizen chosen for his ability to explain the basis of the belief he champions. *Question Mark* isn't a religious series, but because it is about belief, one of its inevitable interests is religion. The first program will offer an interview with the "espresso priest," the Reverend Malcolm Boyd who, 11 years ago, left a successful business career in TV and film production in Hollywood and New York to enroll in an Episcopal Seminary. Now he's chaplain of Wayne University, Michigan. He'll be interviewed by Charles Templeton, who reversed the process by studying for the ministry and then becoming a television personality.

# around CBC

SASKATCHEWAN square-dancers can once again enjoy a program designed specifically for them. *Square Dance Notebook*, with Noreen Wilson as hostess, has returned to CBK, each Monday at 6:30 p.m.

FOR 33 YEARS, George Magrum, now 71, has been a trapper in the Arctic barrens of the Northwest Territories. On *Points West*, 6:00 p.m. Sunday, October 20 on CBC Radio he reads excerpts from his most recent diary, recalling the winter season of 1959-60.

As one of the originals of Canada's Barren Lands trappers, George Magrum has had an interesting assortment of companions on his trap line, at Aylmer Lake near the Arctic Circle. They've included his three sons, a daughter, Dogrib Indians, and other white trappers. Now he's left with only his Eskimo friends to help break the monotony of the long Northern winters. Here is the diary entry for February 19—

"The Eskimos left for Taurcanis Mine today. Jack's wife has had a pain in the stomach for about six weeks now and apparently getting worse. They have a transmitter at Taurcanis and will be able to get a plane to come for her . . .

"The boys brought a big grizzly bear back day before yesterday. He ate on a poisoned bait the fore part of December. We brought him inside yesterday to thaw out. He takes up quite a bit of room in the house. I am hoping to have him skinned before they get back. It will take about five days to thaw him."

In addition to excerpts from George Magrum's *Diary*, *Points West* on October 20 will include a commentary by Thomas Pocklington on the recent civic election in Edmonton.

**EYE TO EYE**, CBWT's weekly look-in-depth at local public affairs, returns to the air Tuesday, October 15 at 7:30 p.m. for another season of outstanding programs. The first show will look at Manitoba's plans for a birthday party, a brand new development in Winnipeg theatre, and bi-culturalism as it affects Manitoba. Frank Rasler is producer, with Lorne Wallace as program organizer.

**FEW PERFORMERS** can match the appeal of talented youngsters—as borne out by the continued popularity of the children's talent programs featured each year on the CBC's stations. The series for the two-to-twelve year olds, *Calling All Children*, starts again on CBWT effective Friday, October 25 at 7:00 p.m., and started Wednesday, October 16 at 4:30 p.m. on CBXT.

Bill Guest returns as host of the CBWT show, with the Harold Green orchestra providing accompaniment. This year there will be eight weekly programs, plus a final awards show in which the week-to-week winners will compete for a grand prize. Adjudicators are Ken Winters, music columnist, actor-producer Dave Robertson, and singer Florence Faiers.

Jim Mitchell is host of the CBXT show, with contestants coming from Edmonton and northern Alberta points.

THE CBC HAS won the top award for educational television films at the second International Television Festival which ended recently at Alexandria, Egypt.

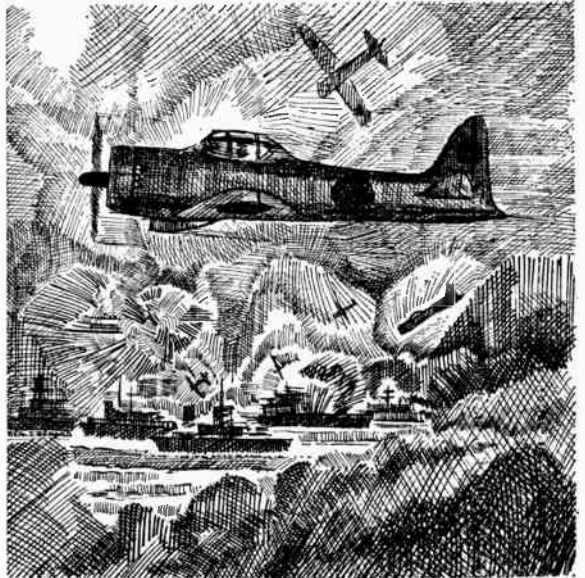

# DAY of INFAMY:

## Pearl Harbour in Perspective



Films by the Japanese detail the political conflict between war lords and statesmen that preceded the attack on Pearl Harbour. CBC-TV presents a special program Sunday, October 20.

ON SIX OCCASIONS this season *The Ed Sullivan Show* will be preempted on CBC-TV by special hour-long programs dramatizing major events that have shaped 20th-century life. They have been prepared by David L. Wolper, largest American independent producer of television documentaries, who was

described in a recent issue of *Time* magazine as TV's "Mr. Documentary."

The first "special" will be seen Sunday night, October 20. The title, *Day of Infamy*, refers to the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbour on December 7, 1941. Wolper has used Japanese films never before

shown publicly. It indicates that the attack on the U.S. Pacific fleet based at Pearl Harbour climaxed a long, bitter struggle for supremacy between the "peace" and the "war" parties in Japan.

# PALE HORSE, PALE RIDER

FESTIVAL presents a  
dramatization of a novelette

Wednesday, October 23 on CBC-TV

KATHERINE ANNE PORTER's unusually high renown among connoisseurs of fine prose is built on a very small published output. At 69 her reputation rests on only one novel, *Ship of Fools*, and a handful of short stories and essays, but their sheer brilliance, their poetic sensitivity and subtle, non-slick quality, class them in such illustrious company as those of Hawthorne, Flaubert and Henry James.

A year ago Miss Porter received the Emerson-Thoreau Medal of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences for distinguished achievement in literature.

She made her reputation in 1939 with her second collection of stories: three novelettes under the title of *Pale Horse, Pale Rider*. Miss Porter thinks the title story is the best she's ever written. Set in Denver, Colorado, in the 'flu epidemic of 1918, it's a bitter, heartbreaking tale of young love and the horror of war, seen through the eyes of 24-year-old Miranda, who works for a local morning newspaper and lives in a shabby boardinghouse, and Adam Barclay, a handsome young recruit from Texas, temporarily in Denver and staying in the same boardinghouse. Since their first meeting they have been falling in love, driven by a terrible sense of time running out and an uncertain future.

*Pale Horse, Pale Rider* will be presented on CBC-TV's *Festival* on Wednesday night, October 23. The 90-minute adaptation by Fletcher Markle is produced by Eric Till. It stars two young New Yorkers, Joan Hackett and Keir Dullea.

Miss Hackett has been seen in many U.S. television series, including *The Defenders*, *Ben Casey*, and *The Nurses*. She was born in Harlem to an Irish father and an Italian mother, and describes herself

as "Miss Uglysville" when she was growing up. But after graduating from high school the ugly duckling turned into a busy swan in a modelling career. Following a Hollywood screen test, which she recalls as "simply awful," she enrolled in an acting class which paved the way for her successful career as a television and stage actress.

Keir Dullea is best known for his film work, as one of the stars of the unusual and moving *David and Lisa*, currently showing in theatres in Canada and the U.S., and as the young "hood" in *The Hoodlum Priest*. Like Miss Hackett, he and his wife, actress Margo Bennett, live in Greenwich Village, where his father used to run a book store.

He's a graduate of the Neighbourhood Playhouse, spent five summers in stock, appeared on television, and played the young Ernest Hemingway in a drama which closed on its way to Broadway.

# PROFILE of a PUBLIC SERVANT

*Ira Dilworth, man of letters who over the decades had an uplifting influence on the CBC's programming, is subject of a documentary Wednesday at 8:05 p.m. on CBC Radio*



HOWEVER GREAT the influence of the late Ira Dilworth was on CBC development over 24 years, he shunned the limelight, and many devoted CBC listeners never heard of him. He was a quiet, perceptive, reasonable man of innate good taste who sometimes seemed austere, perhaps a little pedantic, but always impressive. He spoke and moved softly, and it took exceptional outrage to provoke him, but once roused, he could sound like one of the wild longhorns on his father's ranch in the Okanagan Valley.

After study at McGill and Harvard Universities he became a teacher and principal at Victoria High School, then a professor of English at the University of British Columbia. In 1938, when Dilworth was 44, Gladstone Murray, then general manager of the youthful CBC, invited him to join the public broadcasting service as head of its British Columbia region. Dilworth had had no experience in radio and was not inclined to give up his academic life (which had been a childhood dream). But Murray persuaded him that his bountiful knowledge of literature, music, drama and art could make a valuable contribution to Canada through the broadcasting medium.

For the next 20 years Dilworth threw himself into improving and expanding CBC services. Among other accomplishments, his influence placed "serious" music securely in radio schedules for the first time.

In 1947, when he became general manager of the CBC's International Service, he came up against pressure groups that were to test the spirit of academic liberalism which formed the basis of all his interpretations of the CBC's mandate. It was the time of McCarthyism, of constant battle with lobbyists and fanatics, of trying to reconcile his "CBC idea" with proposals made by senior civil servants. Finally, the strain told, and the man who had helped see the CBC through some of its most difficult years suffered a heart attack.

On his recovery, which he insisted was complete, he went to Toronto to become, successively, director of program production and director for Ontario, then took on the added duties of director of English networks. But his health was failing, and in 1958 it forced him to give up his post. He was appointed director of program evaluation and as such continued to apply his critical faculties to the service of the CBC up to his death a year ago.

# HOLLYWOOD'S *Peter Pan*

*Walt Disney has retained an enthusiasm for life, combined with vast creativity and hard-headed business sense. TELESCOPE focuses on him Friday, October 25.*

---

PETER PAN, you will recall, never grew up. While everyone around him, even his beloved, story-telling Wendy, grew into dull, dusty adulthood, Peter retained the marvellous enthusiasm, wonder and naiveté of a child.

This sometimes caused problems. He was uncomfortable and sometimes nasty in the presence of grown-ups. But when he went back to his Never-Never Land his good spirits returned, for in that magical world he was completely at home.

Walt Disney is an enthusiastic person. He gets excited about anything and everything. He loves stories, but he is not particularly fond of bankers and financiers, the epitomes of our stuffy, grown-up world. And when he returns to his fantastic, magical Disneyland, he seems completely at home; more—he is king of all he surveys.

It would be an over-simplification to describe America's master story-teller only in terms of Peter Pan, an innocent wandering through the world, starry-eyed at its wonders. It takes more than child-like wonder and enthusiasm to build a multi-million dollar entertainment empire. But Disney's youthful enthusiasm may go a long way toward explaining the success of that empire. For one thing, it wasn't created intentionally; Topsy-like, it just grew.

"We grew to our present size," Disney has said, in discussing his business interests, "almost against ourselves. It was not a deliberately planned commercial venture in the sense that I sat down and said that we were going to make ourselves into a huge financial octopus. We evolved out of necessity. We did not sit down and say to ourselves, 'How can we make a big pile of dough?' It just happened."

Then a hint of the Peter Pan rebellion creeps in: "It's those bankers who can know you one day and not know you the next, you can thank them. Because of their attitude, we felt it a matter of self-preservation to make ourselves self-sufficient."

When criticizing financiers and business tycoons, Disney is exposing a sensitive side of his own personality, for Disney the artist seems to be slightly embarrassed by Disney the businessman. The creative artist and the astute entrepreneur, inhabiting by chance the same person, sometimes bring about conflicts. Most often, the conflicts are resolved in favour of the artist, but the struggle sometimes shows up in a strange kind of abrasive sensitivity, as if the artist were ashamed of the commercial success of his alter ego. "Some people forget that you can still do good work even though you work with dollar bills," Disney has remarked, in a slightly defensive manner. "That doesn't mean we pull back on quality."

That was the artist speaking. But then there's the Mr. Hyde side of the personality: "Once you are in television, it's like operating a slaughterhouse. Nothing must go to waste. You have to figure ways to make glue out of the hoofs."

For example, he has made television shows out of his old movies, and movies out of old television shows; he built the fabulous amusement park, Disneyland, then made up television shows about the construction of the park and the various activities

## Noel Coward's Still the Same

FOR 40 YEARS critics have been saying that Noel Coward is a superb theatrical craftsman, but shallow, and his vogue couldn't possibly last. Meanwhile he dished up some 50 variations on his theme that "Nobody can live without loving somebody, nobody can love without leaving somebody," and the worse the critics' notices were, the longer his plays ran. At 24 he had four hits running in London at once.

Now, at almost 64, his wit as razor-sharp and sophisticated as ever, he's in Toronto for a trial run of his latest musical, *The Girl Who Came to Supper*, at the O'Keefe Centre, before its Broadway opening. It's based on Terence Rattigan's *The Prince and the Showgirl*, with words and music by Coward,

and Bostonians who saw it earlier this month describe it as "a delightful musical comedy, sentimental as an old valentine, yet sophisticated, stylish and wicked."

After arriving in Toronto, Coward took time off to record an interview with Toronto *Star* columnist Lotta Dempsey, which will be seen on CBC-TV's *Take Thirty* Monday afternoon, October 21.

As slim and elegant as ever, Coward looks like one of his own characters, nonchalant, exquisitely poised, bored, but he insists that that is just the outward Noel. The real one, he says, is a hard worker—that, he avers, is the main reason for his success. He goes early to bed, rises at first light, and writes till noon. "Then I relax, I paint, visit, go out to dinner. But none of this popular image of hard-drinking or high life. British, British, right down to the roots. And I do hope I'm getting a bit old-fashioned."

# Is Racial Strife A Laughing Matter?

INTER-RACIAL strife may seem an unlikely subject for comedy. But then, so do death, drunkenness, infidelity, mental retardation and a host of other subjects that form the basis for much of traditional comedy. What is desperate tragedy to one man may be high comedy to another, and the difference usually depends on one's point of view.

In the view of at least one group in the United States, racial problems do make for comedy, or at least provide the background to it. They are the five members—three Negroes, two whites—who make up the cast of *The Living Premise*, a theatre venture begun last June in New York. A few weeks ago

IT'S BEEN many years since a loose-hipped football player named Gabe Patterson galloped down the sidelines at Mewata stadium in Calgary to give the Stampeders of that era fits in a playoff game with Saskatchewan Roughriders.

Patterson's heroics didn't win the war for the Roughriders but they started a rivalry which, during the intervening decade and a half has found the Roughriders and Stampeders clashing in at least one

extremely important game nearly every season.

Somehow the schedule-makers manage to match Calgary and Saskatchewan late in the season when the playoff berth is at stake. In the early 1950's the Roughriders were usually the winners. Recently Calgary has come out on top in the important ones.

This Saturday, in CBC Television's game of the week (an afternoon game by the way), once again it's Saskatchewan and Calgary. The major difference is that the battle is for second place, not just that third and final playoff spot.

Coaches Bobby Dobbs of the Stampeders and Bob Shaw of the Roughriders have moulded two completely different ball clubs. The Stamps are an offensive-minded outfit that likes to try and kill the opposition with the pass, but is

capable of crushing them under a monstrous ground game led by Lovell Coleman, Earl Lunsford and Jim Dillard.

Against the Roughriders, the ground game usually falters. Saskatchewan has a proud defensive team and nearly every team in Canada has found that to try running is to knock one's head against that stone wall. Passing is almost as dangerous. The Roughriders lead Canadian football in pass interceptions.

Already this year, the teams have played two games and only one point separates them. Calgary won in Regina 17 to 16, and the teams tied 4-4 in Calgary when the Roughies, minus a placement kicker, were unable to get the winning points through the goal posts with opportunity knocking.

Canadian Football League action isn't the only outstanding sports attraction for the CBC Television fan this week-end. In the National Football League the New York Giants of Al Sherman will try to pulverize the season's biggest flops, the Dallas Cowboys. Also on Sunday there will be a film of overseas sports events on a regular show called *Sports International*.

Saturday night's hockey telecast features the Toronto Maple Leafs and Detroit Red Wings, and by the time this game hits the airwaves, Gordie Howe could be in position to become hockey's all-time leading goal-getter. He needed only four goals to tie Maurice Richard's record of 544 when the season started.

Also on Saturday, CBC Radio will feature the Canadian championship stakes from Woodbine race track in Toronto, and the Cambridgeshire Stakes from Great Britain.

illustrate the prolonged and often violent political conflict over national policy in Japan. Step by step, the program traces the growth of Japanese militarism, the invasion of the Asian mainland without governmental consent, which encompassed the "Manchurian adventure," the "rape of Nanking," and the "Panay incident" in which a U.S. gunpost was fired on.

Films also show the futile opposition of Japan's civilian leaders to the growth of military authority, culminating in the resignation of Prince Konaye as premier in October, 1941, and the assumption of power by General Hideki Tojo as premier and war minister.

American films from that time show warnings unheeded by the U.S., preparations unmade, and negotiations continued even as enemy bombs fell on U.S. battleships lying at anchor. For the Japanese war lords, Pearl Harbour was a dream fulfilled, the successful conclusion of years of planning to smash the one military force believed capable of halting their conquest. And for the United States, Pearl Harbour was a bitter shock, a turning-point in the life of every American.

*Day of Infamy* deals not only with the attack on Pearl Harbour

and the events which it climaxed, but pictures the leading American and Japanese personalities whose actions shaped the course of history. Several observers have described the program as the first TV documentary to place the story of the attack in proper historical perspective. Certainly it is a grim reminder of the strengths and weaknesses of both conquest and neutrality.

they visited Toronto to tape a half-hour program for CBC-TV's *Quest*. It will be seen Tuesday night, October 22.

The show is a successor to *The Premise*, a topical revue specializing in political satire that ran for three years in New York and London. Joan Darling, a member of *The Premise* cast and co-director of the new show, has explained the creation of *The Living Premise*. The producers wanted to explore, she said, "the largest area of absurdity left in the United States—that of the inter-racial problem." She added that the show "will deal with the world from a predominantly Negro point of view, and demonstrate that people are people, whatever their colour.

"Since we have never wanted to shock for shock's sake," she continued, "but rather to tell the truth, enjoy the ridiculous and make people laugh, *The Living Premise* is a theatre of comedy. It is also a theatre of truth. It holds neither black nor white sacred. It holds people sacred. It is passionately concerned with making fun of anyone who is absurd, regardless of colour."

How well the members of this controversial theatre group realize their aim can be judged by viewers on Tuesday night.

there. Visitors are drawn from all over the world—Khrushchev's disappointment at not seeing the park was one of the best news "brighteners" of the decade—most of them drawn by the television shows, which reaped millions while at the same time advertising Disneyland and forthcoming Disney movies.

One parent, visiting the 60-acre land of enchantment said: "Disneyland may be just another amusement park, but to my kids it's the Taj Mahal, Niagara Falls, Sherwood Forest and Davy Crockett all rolled into one. After years of sitting in front of a television set, the youngsters are sure it's a fairyland before they even get here."

Like Hugh Hefner's vast *Playboy* empire, each of Disney's multifarious enterprises tends to promote and publicize all the others, from Mickey Mouse watches to feature-length motion pictures.

But, as Disney pointed out, it all came about almost by accident. His venture into nature films a few years ago, for instance, was a matter of lucky chance. He hired some film cameramen to shoot footage of wild animals in their natural habitat for study by his animators. When the film came in, Disney found that the footage of actual animals served his purpose better than animation. So, almost without knowing it, he was embarked on the series of True-Life Adventures that included *Beaver Valley*, *The Living Desert*, *White Wilderness* and many others.

The conflict in Disney between artist and businessman, awed child and slick entrepreneur, is not a major factor in his personality, nor even a particularly obvious one. Jekyll and Hyde successfully occupy the same space. But the latter depends

heavily on the former; the adult would be lost without the child. When Disney the innocent, wondering youngster ceases to wonder at the world, Disney the businessman will have nothing to sell.

The refusal to take on the hard, cynical shell of the grown-up has always marked Walt Disney's career, a career that has spanned 40 years. The son of an Irish-Canadian building contractor who was brought up near Goderich, Ontario, Walt was born in Chicago in 1901, at age five moved with his parents and four sisters and brothers to a farm in Missouri. On the farm he developed his avid interest in animals, always had a half-dozen pets roaming the premises, and there made his first sketches. He drew his first "character"—a neighbour's horse—when he was eight; the event went pretty well unnoticed by everyone but the family, the neighbour, and the horse.

His interest in drawing increased as he grew older, and after attending schools in Missouri, Kansas City and Chicago (the family moved around regularly, following the fortunes of the building trade) he enrolled in an art school in Chicago.

Returning to Kansas City after graduation, he started a commercial art studio and did animation work for a slide-film company, producing first a series of animated cartoon newsreels of local happenings, then branching out into cartoon fairy tales. In 1923 he headed for the centre of film production, Hollywood, and arrived there with \$40 in cash, one suit, some drawing materials and boundless ambition, energy and imagination. He pooled funds with his elder brother Roy (later to become business head of the organization), borrowed \$500 from an uncle, and set up shop in a disused real estate shack.

The fledgling company struggled along for a few years, making a series of different cartoon pictures,

## Men of Letters View Dickens Today

IN THE LIGHT of American critic Edmund Wilson's re-assessment of Charles Dickens in his famous essay *The Two Scrooges*, Hugh Ross Williamson asks, "Where does Dickens stand today?" and gets a variety of provocative, erudite answers from some well-known writers, in a half-hour BBC radio program to be heard on *CBC Wednesday Night*, October 23, at 10:30 p.m. local time. Ross Williamson is a critic, biographer, historian, playwright, novelist, and author of 'whodunits'."

In the program, novelist-playwright J. B. Priestley traces Dickens' life and explains how and where the private side of it has been reflected in his writings. Novelist-critic Pamela Hansford Johnson recalls that she was 28 when she came across a copy of *The Old Curiosity Shop*, which sent her back to all Dickens' other books she had read in her youth. Through this second, more illuminating, reading she re-discovered Dickens. She gives her views of him on the program.

V. S. Pritchett, author, essayist, literary critic and contributor to many periodicals and newspapers, believes that Dickens' early career as a court reporter gave him a fine view of all types and classes of

people. Dickens understood that "talk" is a form of life and that people talk to one another, and to themselves, out of the curious solitude of their inner life. And it is this aspect of Dickens' work, his ability to create people through their conversations, that Pritchett finds most revealing and interesting.

Poet and detective story writer C. Day-Lewis, and Moray McLaren, author of novels, short stories, plays and travel books, trace the influence of Dickens on Wilkie Collins in his book *The Moonstone*, and on Compton McKenzie in *Sinister Street*. And from a recording in the BBC archives, playwright-novelist St. John Ervine, in typical fashion, describes Arnold Bennett's affinity with Dickens, a man Bennett couldn't bear to read!

A recording by actor Frank Pettingell playing one of Dickens' best-known characters, Uriah Heep, in his autobiographical *David Copperfield*, is used to illustrate the program.

then, in 1928, Disney created the character that was to change his fortunes: Mickey Mouse. The impudent but lovable rodent became a world-wide favourite, and the Disney studios began to expand. In 1929 they produced the first of the *Silly Symphony* series; in 1932 they created the first colour cartoons; *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*, the first feature-length cartoon, appeared in 1937, and was followed in succeeding years by *Pinocchio*, *Fantasia*, *Dumbo*, *Bambi* and many others; the first combination of animation and live action was attempted in 1945, in *The Three Caballeros*, and was followed by Disney's move into the field of straightforward live-action films without animated sequences.

Disney made his first tentative entry into television with a Christmas special, and launched his full-scale TV career in 1954 with a series of hour-

long shows. The next year he created the *Mickey Mouse Club* programs, later instituted a number of half-hour adventure films for TV. Both Mickey Mouse Club and the filmed half-hours have since been dropped, and Disney concentrates his TV activities on his weekly show, which incorporates cartoons, *True Life Adventures*, science education, history and music.

This week, CBC-TV's *Telescope* series aims its lens at Walt Disney and the fantastic domain he has created. Entitled *Walt's World*, the program was filmed at Disneyland, where host Fletcher Markle interviewed Disney about his career, his philosophy and aims, and his plans for the future. Markle is an ex-employee of Disney, having served as director of *The Incredible Journey*, the forthcoming Disney film based on Sheila Burnford's book and set in Canada. The *Telescope* program, to be seen Friday, October 25, at 9:30 p.m., will include some scenes from that film. Ross McLean is producer of *Telescope*; Robert Barclay directed this week's episode, *Walt's World*.

tremendous enthusiasm it engendered resulted in an International Society of Contemporary Music being formed to bring together new scores and prominent musicians from all nations for an annual festival to be held in various European centres. The Second World War put a crimp in the Society's activities, but the U.S. took over as host for the duration.

This year's Festival was held in Amsterdam in June, and although it didn't make any hair stand on end or cause small riots the way the ISCM Festivals used to when 12-tone technique was less widely used and appreciated, in its four orchestral and two chamber music concerts it presented some significant works showing healthily independent thinking and considerable originality. Some 34 compositions from 17 countries were heard.

CBC Radio's *International Festivals* series presents some of them on Friday night, October 25, at 11:00 p.m. (11:05 p.m. on CBX).

One of the most colourful and striking is *Dugaku* for Chamber Orchestra by Yoritsune Matsudaira, a young Japanese composer. It's conducted by Bruno Maderna, an outstanding Italian composer of electronic music and founder of a centre for composing, performing and recording it at Milan Radio.

*Three Movements for Orchestra* by George Perle, one of two American works performed at the

Festival, while far from radical, illustrates well the composer's brilliant amalgamation of the serial technique of the 12-tone school with the concept of functional harmony in traditional music, allowing for both horizontal and vertical dimension. Perle teaches at the University of Louisville, and it is interesting to note that while he mostly follows the 12-tone technique in his composing he is also noted for his magazine and newspaper articles on old music.

The chief figure among modern Dutch composers, Willem Pijper, who died in 1947, is represented by his *Six Epigrams*, written in 1928 — a fascinating example of the method he evolved for compressing melody into a short line, creating utmost tension in harmonic combination and developing themes immediately — a complete musical idea in a nutshell. He also wrote a number of large abstract works. He was head of the Rotterdam Conservatory for many years, and was highly respected for the simplicity and directness of his style by even the most conservative Dutch musicians who disapproved heartily of polytonality and atonality.

Also included in the program are four songs by Schoenberg, played by the famous 80-year-old Amsterdam Concertgebouw Orchestra with soprano Sophia van Sante as soloist.

Raymond Burr, TV's *Perry Mason*, goes about his work in a calm, unruffled manner. Perhaps that is why he has stood up to seven seasons on the show.

# No 'Temperament' For This Artist

RAYMOND BURR enjoys his work.

"I like a quiet life, too," the Canadian-born star told a CBC interviewer recently. "I'm known not for the scandals in my life, but for my career and for the good I've been able to accomplish. It lasts longer, and I'm much happier with it that way."

The new *Perry Mason* series began Wednesday, September 25 on the CBC-TV network.

Inner peace and contentment have helped Burr survive in the *Perry Mason* series, where other actors might have fallen from fatigue and strain.

He doesn't believe in artistic temperament. "It's the extroverts who make a loud noise. And when you have that kind of explosion with actors or directors, you find

they have very little powder left afterwards."

Filming one play each week doesn't leave the rugged, 46-year-old Burr much free time.

"They would be very happy if I worked on the *Mason* series 365 days a year. This I refuse to do—I work on it only 364 days," he said with a chuckle.

"After seven seasons of one-hour shows a week, I think it's a miracle we've gone on this long. But I'm fond of the people I work with," he said. "We've had the same cast and crew for six years, and there have been no untoward incidents in any way. That's unusual, considering the pressures people in this business are under."

Burr said he didn't fear losing his identity as an actor because of his identification with *Perry Mason*.

"Many of my old motion pictures are still playing on television, and I've also been on summer stock two years now.

"Live theatre is very different from the *Perry Mason* formula. That's why I enjoyed it so much. Summer stock is like a breath of fresh air after the somewhat confining format of a television series."

The actor is under contract for the television series "for a good many years to come," and he and a network have discussed his appearing in special dramas next year.

"One of these would be a costume play," he said. "It's a long time since I have done anything like that."

He hopes to do a musical, but "not with any dancing," he pointed out with a grin. It would open in London, a city he loves.

Besides the musical, Raymond Burr also plans a concert tour with a symphony orchestra. He will read a program of Shakespeare's sonnets with a symphonic score especially composed for the concert. This is one of the projects of his own production company.

Also in the future is involvement with five films, with Burr in three or four of them. He may direct one, although he hasn't directed a film before.

But for now, it's back to the stiff production schedule of *Perry Mason* at Hollywood's old Chaplin studios, where some of the screen's biggest successes were filmed. This year, the *Perry Mason* crew are the only company shooting in the studios.
