# Shari Lewis Stars on PARADE



SHARI LEWIS of the flaming, orange-coloured hair, petite dimensions and immense versatility, who is described by New York columnist John Crosby as "all eyes and mouth and talent and charm," will be a guest on CBC-TV's *Parade* on Thursday night, November 14. Best known as a puppeteer and ventriloquist (performing all the voices for her characters without the slightest trace of lip movement), she is also a singer, actress, storyteller, mime, magician, dancer, musician, author and mother.

A New Yorker, the daughter of a music teacher and Peter Pan the Magic Man, she began to sing, dance and perform magic tricks publicly when she was only two, and by the time she was four was working with her father. At 17 she joined the straw-hat circuit as a dancer. That year, while recuperating from a broken leg, she learned the arts of puppetry and ventriloquism, and less than a year later, after being a winner on Arthur Godfrey's Talent Scouts, she and her puppets were starring in New York TV shows. Since then she has won several television awards, has made numerous recordings, published several books for children, and has become one of the bestknown TV personalities, along with her remarkably life-like puppets, Lamb Chop, Charlie Horse, Hush Puppy, Wing Ding, and others.

TELEVISION may revive the serialized novel as popular entertainment, predicts Thomas B. Costain, the eminent Canadian-born novelist and historian.

Mr. Costain's Son of a Hundred Kings is the first novel to be serialized on the CBC-TV network's new program, *The Serial*. The 10 weekly episodes are being seen Thursdays at 8:30 p.m. The novel was adapted by Leslie McFarlane.

For decades after Charles Dickens' novels *Pickwick Papers* and *Oliver Twist* appeared as serials, magazines built huge circulations by running long stories and novels in episode form.

"Magazines, for some reason I can't understand, have dropped out of the serial field," said Mr. Costain, as he was interviewed by the CBC at his New York apartment. "Your program, *The Scrial*, may start something important. It comes at exactly the right time. Television may take over the serial field that magazines have abandoned."

Ronald Weyman, executive producer of *The Serial*, hopes to present his *Chord of Steel* later in the series, Mr. Costain said. This is a biography of Alexander Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone, and, like Mr. Costain, a native of Brantford, Ontario.

Starting December 5, Thomas Raddall's *The Wings of Night*, set in Nova Scotia, will be serialized on the series.

NORTHERN MESSENGER, CBC Radio's unique message transmittal service for people in isolated regions of the far north, returned to the air November 1 and is heard each Friday night at 12:15 a.m. on CBW and CBK, 12:05 a.m. on CBX.

The three powerful CBC long wave transmitters on the Prairies reach much of the north country, supplemented by the shortwave transmitter of the Northern Service.

Announcers Gren Marsh and Norm Micklewright read the English messages on the program, and Georges Paquin reads the French. Messages in other languages, including Eskimo, are broadcast from time to time, using tape recordings.

Not only does Northern Messenger reach far into the North, it also is picked up by U.S. listeners as far south as Louisiana, who, needless to say, are fascinated with it.

Messages for transmittal should be sent to Northern Messenger, CBC, Box 160, Winnipeg. W. H. Randall is producer.

FESTIVAL'S SECOND Antigone production this season is the Christopher Logue version, now in rehearsal for future telecast. Jean Anouilh's Antigone-a very different treatment of the legend-was presented on the series earlier this season.

Joseph Wiseman heads the cast of the new production as Creon; and Roberta Maxwell, a young Toronto actress just back from two years of work in England, will play Antigone.

Wiseman, veteran of many films and Broadway productions, will be seen on Quest this season in the title role of Eli, the Fanatic, an adaptation of a story from Goodbye, Columbus, by Philip Roth.

THE FARM FORUM Radios for India Project has come to an end. Nearly two hundred forums contributed to a total of \$10,000 to provide radios for Indian farm forums. The project began in 1960 when, at a Farm Forum Conference, it was decided to try to send funds to India to buy radios. India at that time, had 2,000 farm forums and plans to organize 25,000 by 1965. Today over 12,000 farm forums are operating in India, and it is hoped that 50,000 may be organized by 1965.



"THE 20TH CENTURY shall be the century of Canada and of Canadian development." That was the prophecy of Sir Wilfrid Laurier in 1904. It seemed a safe enough forecast at the time. Canada's mineral and agricultural riches lay largely untouched, a vast wealth of natural resources, ripe for development. But how true is Laurier's prediction today?

The blossoming of greatness should still lie ahead, for huge areas of the country have as yet been largely unexploited. But the world has moved rapidly in directions that Laurier could not have

foreseen, and today the resources that automatically spelt wealth in an earlier age no longer have the importance they once did; now, as never before, well-trained people are vital to a country's development. On that basis, in the view of some observers, Canada, far from teetering on the brink of greatness, is in danger of becoming a backward nation.

"The quickest way to become a backward country," says Dr. John J. Deutsch, chairman of the recently formed Economic Council of Canada, "is to neglect education." His view is shared by others,

who point out that for tomorrow's world we must concentrate on the development of a new national resource: not minerals, but minds.

"We can no longer consider education to be a terminal experience," says Alan Thomas, executive director of the Canadian Association for Adult Education. "No nation can afford to direct its education to only one segment of the population. It's far more dangerous to have an ignorant adult around than an ignorant child." Education. once considered something to which only the young were exposed, has now become a matter of concern to people of all ages, and, in the opinion of some, improved standards of general education are essential to the maintenance of our present standards of living.

The importance of adult education and re-education is an outcome of the rapid changes taking place in today's world. In the past, innovations in most fields came about relatively slowly; it was

# Remembrance Day Service

THE RADIO and television broadcasts of the annual Remembrance Day Service in Ottawa, to be presented the morning of November 11, will bring to listeners and viewers the scene at the National War Memorial, as His Excellency the Governor-General Georges P. Vanier, Prime Minister Lester B. Pearson and others lay wreaths in tribute to those who lost their lives in past wars. The Governor-General will lay his wreath on behalf of the Queen.

Others taking part in the service will be the Mother of the Year, the Dominion president of the Canadian Legion, the Chiefs of Staff and members of the diplomatic corps. Commentators will be John Rae (television) and Bill Kehoe (radio).

# The Normandy Invasion


FROM THE terrible holocaust of the Second World War, many recall one date as the most unforgettable: June 6, 1944—the day on which the Allies launched their massive assault on Hitler's European fortress; when the greatest armada the world has ever known slashed through the German defences to land thousands of Allied troops on the beaches of Normandy; when hundreds of those troops gave their lives for the liberation of Nazi-oppressed Europe.

The story of the invasion, from the initial preparations to the end of the first day of the operation, will be told this week in a documentary film entitled *D-Day*. The program will be presented on CBC Television on Tuesday, November 12 at 10:00 p.m.

# Remembrance of Two Wars

THE SECOND World War ended in May, 1945, and again in August, 1945, and is the more immediately remembered. But the First World War was so much the more disastrous and humbling that after half a century its horror hangs still over the 1918 Armistice Day: November 11.

CBC Sunday Night, on November 10 at 9:00 p.m., will present Remembrance of Two Wars—An Elegy. The program, cast in the formal structure of an elegy, is a blending of the songs, poetry and sounds of war with excerpts from conversations with veterans of both Wars from all parts of Canada. It recalls events that were, at once, the most magnificent and the most appalling of Canada's past.

# **Babies that are Different**

The tragic story of a thalidomide baby is told by her mother Sunday on CBC Radio's PROJECT '64

IN 1957, WHEN a drug called Contergan appeared on the West German market, it was hailed as the first absolutely safe, non-habit-forming medication for the treatment of insomnia. The following year the drug was sold in Britain, and on October 5, 1960, an application by the U.S. firm of Wm. S. Merrell was made to the food and drug directorate in Ottawa to distribute the sedative in Canada, where it went on prescription sale on April 1, 1961.

A few days earlier, an edition of the British Medical Journal had published several letters to the editor, suggesing a possible connection between the administration of the drug to expectant mothers and a malformation of the babies' limbs, called phocomelia. On December 1 representatives of the U.S. drug company producing thalidomide and related drugs had a meeting with directorate officials to discuss its side effects — peripheral neuritis and malformations. By that time, the drug had been withdrawn in Germany.

The rest of the story is well-known. There was a thalidomide baby crop born in West Germany, England, Scotland, Brazil, Japan. In the U.S. only the stubborn insistence of Dr. Frances Kelsey prevented widespread use of the sedative. In Canada today there are some 100 babies afflicted with malformations caused by the drug. Because of this tragedy, special committees have been formed on federal and provincial levels, to see what can be done for the children, and many magazine and newspaper articles have offered opinions of scientists, doctors, clerygmen, lawyers and politicians.

This Sunday afternoon, November 10, at 5:00 p.m., CBC Radio's *Project* '64 presents a program about thalidomide babies from the point of view of the person most concerned with the problem, the mother of the malformed child.

Production is by Dita Scholz, who says: "On January 20, 1962, Mrs. Karl Beeston, now 23 years old, pretty, petite, and feminine, gave birth to a daughter, Kimberley Anne. The baby has badly deformed arms, and no legs. Shortly after the baby's birth, and at intervals of about six months, freelance broadcaster Marjorie McEnaney talked to Mrs. Beeston, a young woman with an extrordinary amount of common sense, about her feelings about the child's severe handicap, governmental aid, her opinions on abortion and the Belgian euthanasia trial, and about the treatment her child re-



ceives, from doctors, the family, and from strangers -people she might meet at a supermarket.

"Mrs. Beeston is trying her best to have the child grow up as normally as possible under the circumstances. She is dead set against putting her in an institution, because she feels Kim needs parental attention and love even more than a normal child. Kim has inherited her mother's big blue eyes and, like any other baby, she gets into everything – closets, kitchen cupboards, and even manages to climb into the bathtub. She has learned quite a few words, she can handle a fork and spoon, and she glides across the room on her tummy at a good rate of speed.

"Every time we talked to Mrs. Beeston she stressed the fact that she would have agreed to an abortion, had she known beforehand, with no consideration for the legal or religious consequences. When she was told in the delivery room about the malformation of her newborn, she kept hoping it would die. Today she and her husband, a lithographer, would not want to give up the child under any circumstances. It is their first, and they are planning on a larger family later on."

The Queen of Spades

Alexander Pushkin's exciting tale comes to CBC Television Monday, November 11 on PLAYDATE.

> a glove in Fate's face and walking off with his pockets heavy with the means for a life of ease. He was vehemently sure that *he* would break the bank. The bank wouldn't break him.

> Then he heard a bit of news that made it look as if he would be able to accomplish it the easy way. A young friend told him that his grandmother, the Countess Anna, an old harridan nicknamed The Queen of Spades, had learned a sure-fire secret of winning at Faro from a gypsy with whom she had once been in love. She had divulged it only once, to her late husband, and it had made them rich, but she refused to tell it to anyone else. Herman decided to get it from her somehow. # Experiences On a Retreat

AN EXAMINATION of the retreat movement in the Roman Catholic Church will be presented on CBC-TV's Heritage, Sunday afternoon, November 10, in a program entitled The Weekenders. Filmed at the retreat house of the Augustinian Fathers at Marylake, near Toronto, the program will give expression to the thoughts of a young man who is making his first retreat.

Appearing in the program will be Father Gregory Baum, retreat master at Marylake, and Father Arnulf Hartmann, prior of the monastery.

A retreat, in religious usage, is a period of time, varying from a few days to a month, spent in worship. meditation, prayer and instruction,

under the guidance of a priest or leader in a retreat house or convent, alone or with others. The retreat is not intended to be merely a period of withdrawal from the everyday world, but also a time for constructive, guided thought and education toward the enrichment of one's spiritual life, to learn more of God's nature, and to dedicate oneself more perfectly to His will.

Christ and the disciples went into retreat, and the fathers of the early Church encouraged all Christians to do likewise. The orderly systemizing of retreats came about in the 16th century, through the Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius Loyola. Others contributed to the movement and by the end of the 19th century the retreat had been firmly established as a part of Catholic life.

The Oxford Movement re-established the retreat as a custom of the Anglican Church, and today some Protestant denominations have begun to encourage the practice. One world-wide interdenominational movement is called Ashram, a Sanskrit word used by those of the Hindu faith, who also practice retreats.



enough that fresh ideas be introduced to each successive generation of students. Today, however, such changes occur much more rapidly. In the field of science, for example, concepts and many practical applications change with dizzying speed.

In the view of some authorities on economics and education. Canada today faces a crisis in education; present facilities are inadequate to meet the demands of the future; we are inadvertently creating problems that will cause grave concern in our society a decade hence.

An examination of the situation will be presented this week on CBC-TV's Horizon (Sunday, November 10) in a documentary film directed by Jim Carney, entitled Price of a Future.

# Freedom of the Press?

Just how free are our newspapers to publish the news? THE SIXTIES studies the question in two programs Sundays on CBC-TV

PRESSURES BEHIND what we read in the newspapers and hear on the air will be explored in the next two editions of CBC-TV's *The Sixties*, Sunday afternoons. Is there a deliberate attempt to manage public opinion? Do governments try to control the news media, and is the "free press" too free?

Managing the News on November 10 will consider attempts by governments to apply pressure to . newspapers. Moulders of Opinion on November 17 will consider how the newspapers see their role as a go-between for the government and the people, how the papers decide what they will tell the people, how they go about telling it, and how free the press should be or can afford not to be.

Speakers will include Konrad Ahlers, editor of Der Speigel, a West German newspaper which was much in the news some time ago when it revealed to the German public details about the NATO defence forces and Germany, which were supposed to be classified information. Minister of Defense Strauss ordered the newspaper offices raided and some of its members were arrested. Later Strauss had to resign. The Sixties asks: How far can a newspaper go in revealing news it feels the public should know about, and how far can a government go in controlling the paper?

Another speaker is British tycoon Cecil Harmsworth King, the biggest newspaper publisher in the world, whose empire includes the Daily Mirror, Sunday Pictorial, The People, and Debrett's Peerage. The Dairy Mirror published letters from John Profumo to Christine Keeler in the recent British scandal, and titillated public interest so greatly that

# Biography Of a Disaster

SHORTLY AFTER midnight on September 17, 1949, fire broke out on the luxury liner S.S. Noronic, docked at Pier Nine in Toronto Harbour. The holiday ship carried 524 passengers, most of them from Detroit and Cleveland, bound for a five-day pleasure cruise to the Thousand Islands. Flames swept through the ship with whirlwind speed, and by 3 a.m., when the last survivor was taken off the blazing hulk, 119 passengers were dead, dozens more injured.

On this week's edition of CBC-TV's *Telescope* (Friday, November 15), the tragic events of that night will be recalled, in a program titled *Biography of a Disaster*. Script writer and director of the film is Harry Rasky, who covered the terrible event as a young reporter. He recalls it in these words:

"The Noronic was for me a time of growing up. I had been working as a cub reporter, fresh from the know-it-all class of '49 at the University of Toronto. When the Canadian Press bulletin bells sounded the alarm on our teletype, I headed for the scene of the disaster. I went against the wishes of my city editor, but I wanted to be where the big news was.

"I had no knowledge of death. It was part of faraway wars and adventure stories. Now it was time to find out myself, firsthand.

"When Ross McLean, producer of *Telescope*, suggested the *Noronic* as a topic for a film, suddenly the vivid images and odors came back to me almost like last night's nightmare. As I combed through Toronto newspaper "morgues," I began to wonder about the survivors: How had that moment in time affected their lives?

"It was like a detective's job, finding them and asking them to remember. One person led to another. Every person and place told a story. The results of what I found make up this *Biography of a Disaster*."





Lisa, with whom she was on terms of confidence, Herman made a point of meeting and attracting Lisa, and then gambled not only with Fate, but on Lisa's love for him, a situation complicated by the fact that the old Countess believed he was a sorcerer who had put a curse on her house, and warned Lisa against him.

As the plot moves along with murder and suspense Lisa shows that there is something of the gambler in all of us. The great 19th-century Russian poet and short story writer, Alexander Pushkin, described the situation in The Queen of Spades, one of the exciting tales in a small volume which he published under the nom de plume of Ivan Byelkin, and which included The Captain's Daughter, set in the time of Catherine II. The Undertaker (a ghost story in the manner of Edgar Allan Poe) and The Pistol Shot. Tchaikovsky was so intrigued by The Queen of Spades that he wrote an opera based on it. And it becomes a passionate, intense and intriguing drama in the television adaptation which CBC drama producer Leo Orenstein has prepared for presentation on Playdate this Monday night, November 11. Production is by Ronald Weyman, with John Colicos and Hilary Vernon starred as Herman and the Countess.

An untrained young actress who says "my theatrical career sort of crept up on me," will be making her CBC-TV debut in a major role in The Oueen of Spades. Patricia Collins of Toronto will play Lisa, the young and innocent companion to the old Countess. She also appears on CBC-TV's Festival this week, Wednesday, November 13, in A Resounding Tinkle, half of a double-bill of unusual contemporary plays. On December 23 she appears again on Playdate in Sheridan's The Critic, and in several other major TV dramas later in the season.

Miss Collins is ecstatic about the "lucky break" that has landed her in the top drawer of television performers in just a fraction of the time it usually takes a young actress to make the grade, and says that credit must go to her family and friends, who urged her to give up her job as a copywriter to try her wings in professional theatre.

"I'm terrified of being typecast as a sweet, spineless ingenue," she says, but her CBC-TV roles this season suggest there is no danger of that.

Others in the cast are Dermot Grice, Charles Palmer, Ian Thorne, Fred Euringer, Gerard Parkes, and Cosette Lee.

Alexander Pushkin lived a life no less exciting than one of his own tales. He was born in Moscow in 1799 to an ancient family of Russian aristocrats. From his great grandfather, Hannibal, a favourite Negro general ennobled by Peter the Great, he inherited curly hair and a darker complexion than most Russians. When he was 18 he was given a ministry post, began his brilliant writing career, and became a gay society man of fashion whose outspokenness on the subject of liberty in one of his poems reached the ears of authority and Pushkin narrowly missed being shipped off to Siberia.

He next accepted a post in the Crimea, where, becoming enmeshed in secret societies with fanatics, once more had to leave. Back at his father's place he was embroiled in further trouble, but managed to burn any incriminating papers in the nick of time, when tipped off about an impending search by government authorities.

Influential friends made his peace with the Emperor, who later described the author as the wittiest man in Russia. Pushkin died at 38 from wounds acquired in a duel fought with his brother-in-law who, Pushkin insisted, had been making eves at his wife. He left four children and a rich legacy of literary works, including his masterpiece, Eugene Onegin, a novel of manners in verse: the drama Boris Godunov; the fairy romance Russlan and Ludmilla; and many historical poems and others written under the influence of Byron.

# No Escape From **Our** Personalities

AN ORIGINAL radio play by the distinguished Swiss dramatist Max Frisch, titled Rip Van Winkle, will be presented on CBC Stage on Friday night, November 15, at 10:30 local time, in a translation by Michael Bullock.

The play is an earlier version of the theme which Frisch later developed into his great novel. I'm Not Stiller-that man can't escape from the idea of himself which he has built up over the years, or which others have constructed around him; that there is absolutely nothing he can do or say to get out of the clutches of this personality, no matter how desperately he wants to.

In vivid and extremely witty style, Frisch draws a portrait of a man who tries to run away from his own identity, only to be caught and forced back by society into the role it had allotted him, because it wouldn't tolerate his transformation

Two plays are seen Wednesday, November 13 on FESTIVAL

### A Resounding Tinkle

N. F. SIMPSON is an eminently sane man of 44 with a delicious sense of humour, who teaches in London, reads philosophy for relaxation and looks like a mischievous monk. He says there's a devil inside him trying desperately to get out. His conscious won't allow it in reality, but he's found that giving the imp its freedom is just the ticket for plays.

Six years ago he won a prize in the Observer's playwrighting contest for his A Resounding Tinkle, and critics hailed him as another Ionesco.

His dramatic world is lower English suburban middle class, but his is highly intellectual entertainment, relying on free association and purely verbal logic wrapped up in punchy humour. A *Resounding Tinkle* is a fantasy based on reality -the senselessness of half-unconscious life in suburbia today. Eric House stars in the *Festival* production by David Gardner, with Patricia Collins, Ian Thorne and Michael Rawtree.

### I Spy

JOHN MORTIMER is a 40-yearold Londoner, a lawyer by profession, specializing in divorce, and a playwright by the way, but a success in both fields, which comes into focus in the *Festival* production of his *I Spy*.

It tells of a rather comical but sensitive private detective, hired by a lawyer for his client, who makes the mistake of falling in love with his suspect and becoming the co-respondent he is supposed to be tailing. Mortimer imbues what might have been routine squalors of a divorce investigation with a moving innocence and humour and a sympathy for those who let their loving natures lead them into topsy-turvy situations. the government had to embark on a large investigation of morality in high circles. The *Daily Mirror* insisted that it was protecting public interest and morality by publishing every available detail about the Profumo case, but, asks *The Sixties*, how far can a newspaper afford to go in such a direction? Can delving into scummy backwaters of some private lives be classed as satisfying public appetite or is it really just pornography? Another British scandal discussed in the program as it was reflected by newspapers is the Vassal spy case.

In the United States many are saying that the Kennedy administration tries to manipulate the press sometimes directly, or by persuading the press to print certain stories. In the Cuban affair, some Americans insist, the information given by the press was not accurate. Robert J. Manning, assistant Secretary of State for Public Affairs in the Kennedy administration, will be interviewed on *The Sixties*. Donald' Gordon, former CBC correspondent now

lecturing in political economy at the University of Alberta, Calgary, who has been preparing a Ph.D. thesis on the relationship between the press and government in Britain, France and Ghana, will be interviewed about his findings.

Another speaker will be Robert Dapalme, a cartoonist formerly with *La Presse*, Montreal, and now a freelance editor-cartoonist. He will discuss how the press sees its job of influencing and informing the public, how politically committed he sees himself as a moulder of opinion, and how he feels other newspapermen are carrying out their role in Canada.

Among other speakers to be heard from will be several from the Ottawa Press Gallery, including Dick Jackson of the Ottawa *Journal* and Peter Newman of Maclean's magazine.

Scripts for the two programs are by Chris Young, editor of the Ottawa *Citizen*. The host for *The Sixties* is Frank McGee, appointed minister without portfolio just before the last federal election, and now political reporter for the Toronto Star. The program organizer is Christina McDougall. Production is by Cameron Graham.

# Inter-Faith Marriages

IS A TRULY happy marriage possible between persons of different faiths?

For each program, three CBC-affiliated radio stations solicit opinions from their listeners on a particular t o p i c. These opinions, recorded and forwarded to a central point, are then broadcast on the Tuesday night programs.

It is hoped that the technique will enable listeners to hear candid expressions of feeling, not from experts or authorities, but from fellow citizens. Two of the stations involved in gathering opinions on this week's topic are CKOV, Kelowna, B.C., and CJQC, Quebec City.

Inter-faith or "mixed" marriages have increased in number in the last few decades. Studies of the subject show that, in the United States and Canada, more than half of all marriages are between people of differing religious beliefs. Masses of statistics tend to become confusing, but, generally speaking, members of Protestant denominations have been marrying outside their own churches to an increasing degree, while Roman Catholics, Jews, and Mennonites have shown the highest proportion of "in-group" marriages. While the percentage of inter-faith unions among other faiths hover around the 50 per cent mark, these three groups maintain a figure of about 90 per cent, with a consistently steady increase being noted.

Some studies have also shown that there are about three times as many divorces or separations in Catholic-Protestant unions as there are when the partners share the same faith or denomination.

#### **CIRCASSIAN CHICKEN**

Boil chicken until tender. Cool. Slice and place in pyrex pan in layers. Then make sauce.

#### SAUCE

1¼ cups chicken broth
1 cup walnuts
6 blanched almonds
½ tsp. sweet paprika
1 tsp. minced onion
¼ cup soft bread crumbs
Salt to taste

Put all ingredients into blender and buzz until smooth. If you do not have a blender use a mortar and pestle and pound until smooth. Pour over cold chicken, serve as an entree or luncheon dish with a salad.

#### SHISH KEBABS

This quiz discussion program which sets high school teams against each other in a nationwide competition will be heard this year at the new time of 4:30 p.m. Sundays. Previously it was heard at 1:00 p.m.

Returning as host and moderator will be Jed Adams.

During the forthcoming 26-week season, five programs will originate in the Saskatchewan-Manitoba area, five in Montreal and the Maritimes, five from Alberta and British Columbia, five in Ontario, three will be taken up with the series playoffs, and three will be specials.

The first of these specials, December 1, will feature an international match between high school teams from Malvern Collegiate in Toronto, and Jamaica High School in New York City.

On December 29, *I.Q.* will feature a special year-end review with youth panels around the world commenting on top news stories of the year. For this program the CBC will link groups in Toronto, Washington, London and Berlin.

The other special will be a program origination from Yellowknife, NWT, February 23.

As in past years, each program will feature a half-time interview with people prominent in the news. These interviews will be conducted by high school panels in various cities.

Among those scheduled for interviews are CLC President Claude Jodoin, The Rt. Hon. Vincent Massey, Minister of Trade Mitchell Sharp, British Chancellor of the Exchequer Reginald Maudling, and U.S. Attorney-General Robert Kennedy.

The purpose of these interviews, according to host Adams is: "To confront youth with people who have something to say about our time."
