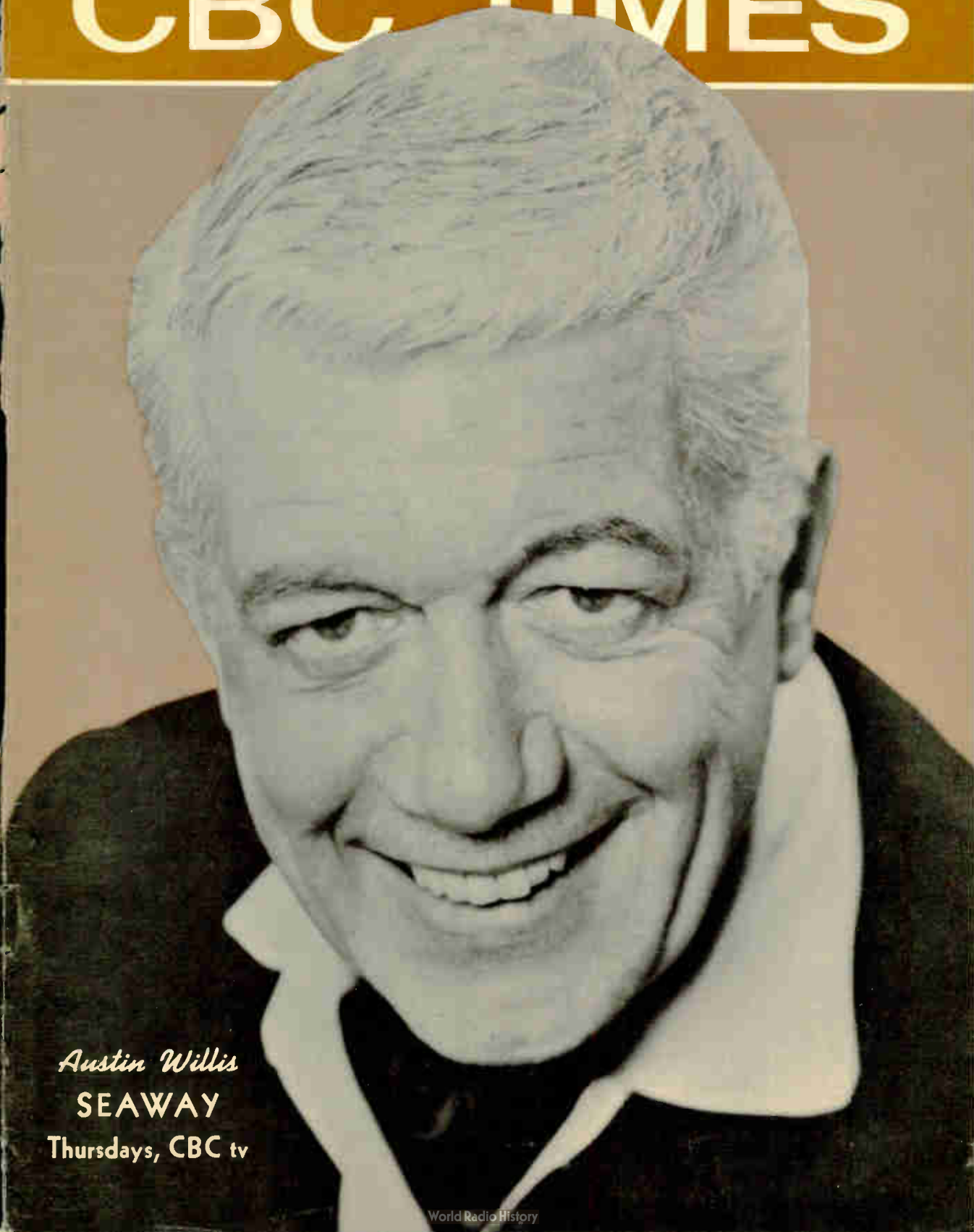

# around CBC

A VARIED musical treat for afternoon radio listeners begins in the CBC radio schedule October 25th. *Prairie Concert*, heard weekdays from 3:30 to 3:55 p.m., will feature serious music programs of a different nature each day.

On Mondays, CBC Winnipeg announcer Norman Micklewright will introduce recorded selections and preview the music to be heard the remainder of the week.

Each Tuesday, a recital by noted instrumentalists of the Prairie Region will be heard. The first program, October 26th, will present Calgary organist Robert Bell in works by Bach, Haydn, Healey Willan and others. Other programs will include performances by violinist Eugene Kowalski of Winnipeg, Saskatoon pianist Gart Beckett, Winnipeg 'cellist Clara Benjamin, and many other well-known musicians.

The Wednesday program on *Prairie Concert* each week will feature choral groups from the Prairie Provinces. Almost all Prairie cities, and some towns, are represented by one or more of the choirs in the series. As well as the traditional adult groups, there is a barbershop chorus, several children's or young people's groups, folk song choirs, "pop" choirs, university choirs, and, for the first time on CBC radio in the Prairies, a high school choir—the 272-voice Schola Cantorum from Daniel McIntyre Collegiate, Winnipeg, which begins the series, October 27th. The series also will visit several choral workshops, highlighting rehearsal procedures as well as performances.

All choirs were pre-recorded last spring, to take advantage of the peak-performance stride hit by most amateur choirs at that time of year, plus the more varied repertoire performed during that season. Church choirs and school groups generally are omitted from the series unless they have achieved special public recognition at provincial, national or international levels. Folk ensembles of less than 16 voices also are excluded.

Among the choirs to be heard are the Mennonite Brethren Bible College Choir of Winnipeg, the Canadian Bible College Choraliers of Regina, the Winnipeg Girls' Alumni Choir, the University of Alberta Mixed Chorus, the Ukrainian National Federation Choir of Winnipeg, the University of Saskatchewan Greystone Singers, the Killarney (Manitoba) Glee Club, the Jubilee Chorus of Calgary and the International Peace Gardens Choir. Benjamin Horch is producer of the choral series.

Each Thursday on *Prairie Concert*, an instrumental ensemble will be heard—the Brandon College String Quartet on October 28th. Other programs will come from Regina, Calgary, Edmonton and Winnipeg.

Fridays, CBC music producer John Searchfield of Calgary will talk about music, illustrating with recorded selections. On the October 29th program, Searchfield will talk about *The Art of Listening*, and following weeks will deal with choral music, fugues, modern music, symphonies, program music, the literature of the organ, the music of Christmas and the influence of various dance forms on classical composers.

*Prairie Concert* is organized by Tom Taylor.

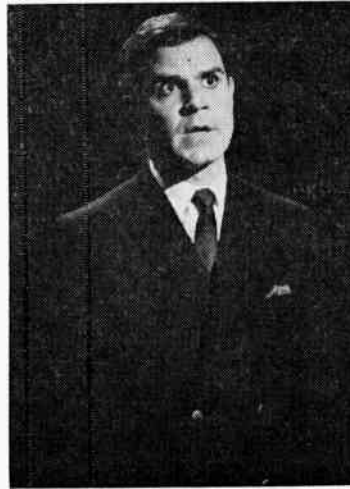

# Serious Music

A new season of enjoyment for music lovers begins this week on CBC radio.

THE EXCEPTIONALLY interesting music season planned for CBC radio gets underway this week as many fine music programs return to the network, and CBC SUNDAY NIGHT, long a showcase for distinguished musicians, singers and unusual musical fare, becomes CBC TUESDAY NIGHT. John Roberts, CBC supervisor of music, has outlined a few highlights.

This Tuesday, October 26th, at 8:05, the Toronto Mendelssohn Choir, conducted by Elmer Iseler, with Lois Marshall as soloist, will present a program including Stravinsky's *Symphony of Psalms* and Godfrey Ridout's *The Dance*. Later the Choir will sing the same program in Boston at a large international choral festival.

Beginning on November 2nd, *CBC Tuesday Night* will present a four-part series, *The Music of Mannheim*, in which an orchestra from CBC Winnipeg directed by Dirk Keetbaas (who did the extensive research) will illustrate the early development of the symphony orchestra, as influenced by the famous orchestra at Mannheim in 18th-century Germany.

The Celebrity Series will continue with internationally renowned artists performing at concerts on the campuses of Canadian universities. "By arranging for these outstanding people to record their concerts in various centres across the country," says John Roberts, "we feel we are contributing substantially to the musical life of these cities." Among the musicians booked to appear are two famous Viennese pianists, Paul Badura-Skoda and Joerg Demus; Maureen Forrester, Louis Quilico, Lois Marshall, and Russian soprano Galina Vishneskaya (wife of pianist Rostropovich).

Roberts says: "I strongly believe that composers are as important as performing artists, and in years to come the growth and development of Canadian musical life is going to be judged to a great extent by the work of its composers. So I make a point of commissioning several new works each year—though never as many as I'd like to. This season we'll be presenting the first of a three-part 'entertainment' on a Canadian theme, by John Beckwith (music) and James Reaney (words). Part two will be presented in 1966, and all three parts in 1967. Violet Archer and John Reeves are collaborating on a work for Easter; and there will be new works by Harry Freedman, Otto Joachim, John Weinzweig, and Jean Papineau-Couture."

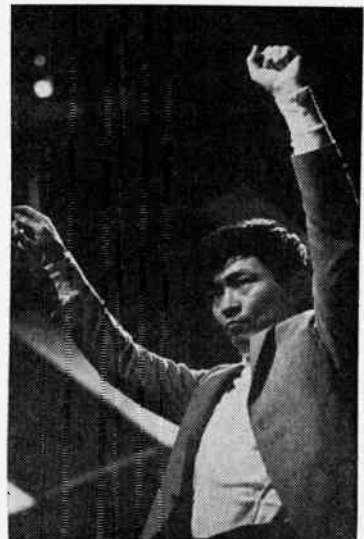

# POINT OF IMPACT

Shirley Harmer  
makes her tv acting  
début on a SHOW  
OF THE WEEK drama  
Monday, October 25th.

SHOW OF THE WEEK's first drama of the season will be a new George Robertson play, *Point of Impact*, in which Canadian songstress Shirley Harmer makes her tv acting début, fulfilling a long-time ambition. Production is by Leo Orenstein. The play is about a popular and highly successful Toronto tv commentator, Spencer Parson (played by Lee Patterson), whose extra-marital involvement with an ambitious girl singer, Laura Lee (Miss Harmer), comes to light when he is the prime suspect in a hit-and-run case. Paisley Maxwell is also starred as Spencer's wife, Dorothy, with Stephen Muise as their small son, Bud; Catherine Proctor as a Little Old Lady; Kathleen Livingstone as Myra; Pat Miles as Mrs. Callaghan; Carl Banas as Brock; and Fred Diehl as Douglas.

A showbusiness friend describes Shirley Harmer as "a terribly sweet and uncomplicated girl with wonderful native wit and wisdom." Paul Whiteman, a great admirer of hers, ranks her with Bing Crosby as "one of the two greatest vocalists I have ever worked with." Success came to her early. Born in Thompson's Corners near Oshawa, she broke into radio in Toronto at 19, a demure girl in saddle-shoes, wearing stars in her eyes instead of make-up. Almost overnight she was featured with George Murray in a CBC tv series, *Four For the Show*, then went to New York, where she recorded several pop records, and began appearing regularly on Whiteman's network radio shows. Back in Canada in 1953 she starred in a long-run variety series, *Showtime*, but returned to the U.S.

frequently for Gershwin concerts with Whiteman. She had abortive flings at the movies in Hollywood and at being a slinky night-club singer on both sides of the border, then decided just to be herself and concentrate mainly on ballads, although she can still demonstrate that she has a very special way with a torch song. As one producer puts it, when Shirley sings, lead melts.

Recently she has been enjoying a quiet but financially rewarding success as a singer in both Canada and the U.S. After videotaping *Point of Impact* she and her husband, Al Bertram, headed for the U.S., where Miss Harmer will make appearances on the *Johnny Carson Show*, and where Bertram will write the NBC series, *Hullabaloo*.

FESTIVAL features a concert by tenor Jon Vickers and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra conducted by Karl Boehm, followed by a short drama, Wednesday, October 27th on CBC television.

## Music and Drama on Same Program

IN MARCH of this year, the CBC announced that free tickets were available to the taping of a tv concert to be given in Toronto's Massey Hall by Canada's internationally famous dramatic tenor, Jon Vickers, the renowned German conductor, Karl Boehm, and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra.

Quick to see that this was an opportunity not to be missed, music lovers eagerly snapped up the available tickets with the result that a large and enthusiastic audience was on hand for the concert on the evening of March 27th.

Arrivals at the venerable old music house were startled at the transformation of the stage. Gone were the dark wood panels that had formed a backdrop for a long succession of illustrious music-makers. In their place was an attractive light-colored superstructure, with tiers for the orchestra members, and a lofty balcony-like platform from which Mr. Vickers was to deliver two of his arias.

To open the concert, Dr. Boehm directed the orchestra in a performance of Mozart's "Haffner" Symphony No. 35 in D major. Mr. Vickers then sang Florestan's great aria from the second act of *Fidelio* by Beethoven, and this was followed by Dr. Boehm and the orchestra in a performance of Beethoven's *Leonore Overture No. 3*.

At this point, Mr. Vickers made his appearance on the high platform to sing the Sword Monologue and Spring Song, both from Wagner's *Die Walkure*, and as his rich voice soared above the orchestra and throughout the hall, the high positioning proved to have been a happy inspiration. Dr. Boehm and the orchestra then brought the concert to a triumphant conclusion with a rousing performance of the overture to *Die Meistersinger* by Wagner.

It was an evening of musical riches, and the audience showed its appreciation by calling the artists back again and again. Toronto reviewers were no less enthusiastic the following day. For Jon Vickers, the tenor from Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, who has won acclaim on all the world's great opera stages, it was a gratifying tribute from his fellow countrymen; for Karl Boehm, a celebrated European conductor, it was a notable North American television debut; for the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, it was another opportunity to demonstrate that it deserves ranking among the world's fine orchestras (a fact recently confirmed by U.K. music critics at the Commonwealth Music Festival).

The entire concert will be presented on CBC tv's *Festival* on Wednesday, October 27th, at 9:30 p.m., as the first portion of a two-part program. (The *(Please turn to page 15)*)

two-part format will be a feature of *Festival* on several occasions this season.) The concert was produced by Bill Bolt. The executive producer was Franz Kraemer.

The second part of *Festival* on this occasion will be devoted to a performance of *Childhood*—a one-act play by the American novelist and playwright, Thornton Wilder. *Childhood* explores the separated worlds of children and adults through the fantasy of a game of make-believe.

As the play opens three children are indulging in their favorite pastime, the creation of imaginary situations in which they each assume a part. Their mother interrupts the game by her scolding, then goes into the house. Their father arrives and he and the mother discuss the "awful" games the children play, particularly the one wherein they (the parents) are imagined as dead. The father reminds the mother of a dream she had in which he and she found themselves on a trip abroad—"somehow alone" without the children. Alone on the porch, he fer-

vently wishes he could be an invisible witness to one of the children's games.

Meanwhile, the children have started a game in which their mother appears as a schoolteacher clad in black and wearing a veil. Declaring themselves to be orphans, the children proceed to discuss what their life was like at home and the virtues and shortcomings of their parents. They then decide to go on a bus trip around the world, and their father appears in the guise of the bus driver. During the ensuing trip and its fanciful events, the conversation between the driver, the schoolteacher, and the children, probes the inter-relationship of children and parents and the thoughts and attitudes that alienate them from one another. As the play moves to a dream-like close, a new understanding is born.

*Childhood* is the first CBC television production by Curt Reis, who is well known as a director in Canadian theatre circles. Sean Sullivan will be seen as the father, Vanya Franck as the mother, and Deborah Hancock, Kirstin Campbell, and Danny MacIlravey as the children.

Harry Somers' opera, *The Fool*, will be broadcast from Vancouver, with an introduction by the composer. Two other Tuesday night programs of special interest will be *Musical Offering* by Bach, performed in Montreal by L'Ensemble Couperin-le-Grand, with violinist Taras Gabora and organist Bernard Lagacé; and Bach's *Art of the Fugue*, in a new realization by Dr. Hermann Scherchen, which will be part of a joint radio-tv project. Scherchen will also conduct a program for radio's *Concerts From Two Worlds*, and a Toronto Symphony Orchestra program to be broadcast December 23rd. In the Christmas season the Festival Singers of Toronto will present a special program: *Ten Motets for the Church Year*, by composers from Palestrina and Byrd to Willan. The Toronto Mendelssohn Choir will perform *Messiah* on Christmas Eve, and the Montreal Bach Choir will present the *St. John Passion* at Easter. There will be four youth concerts, featuring the Hart House and McGill Chamber Orchestras, and documentaries on Bruno Walter, Pierre Boulez, and Anton Bruckner. Harry Freedman's *To-kaido*, Benjamin Britten's *Spring Symphony*, Stravinsky's *Mass*, and Respighi's chamber opera, *Maria Egiziaca*, will also be performed.

The two top performers in each category will take part in the two-hour finals, broadcast on March 17th.

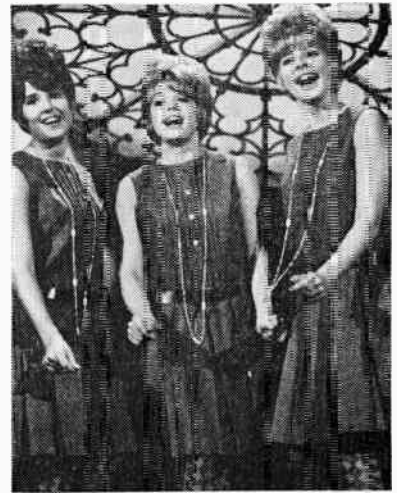

## New Look for Radio Schedule

WHEN IT comes to radio listening, the choice doesn't *have* to be between incessant rock 'n' roll or wall-to-wall music. CBC radio still has that important ingredient—in fact, we think it's the key element—for enjoyable radio listening: Something called Balanced Programming.

What is Balanced Programming? It's a little of this, and a little of that—the proportions are determined by what we believe most of our listeners want, what some of them want, and what we deem it our responsibility to provide. In practical terms, that translates as some serious music, some drama, sports, public affairs programs, comedy, news, shows for youth and children, educational programs, sheer entertainment programs, jazz, farm broadcasts.

Starting this week, many programs are heard at different times than in previous weeks, for the new fall-winter CBC radio schedule goes into effect on Sunday, October 24th. In various articles scattered throughout this edition of CBC TIMES, you will find advance news of the season's plans in the

fields of serious music, public affairs, variety, sports, drama and other areas. A perusal of those articles, and of the listings section of the magazine, will reveal a number of changes from past years. You may find that your listening habits will be affected by the changes; your favorite program may not be in exactly the spot it has previously occupied. But naturally we believe that the changes effected by Director of Radio Jack Craine and his staff are all to the good.

The innovations most immediately obvious are those which occur in Sunday's schedule. A block of live programming will occupy an important place in Sunday's lineup. It comprises three major programs (plus other features): The hour-long variety show *Sunday Showcase*; an "open-line" program called *Cross-Country Check-Up*, which will provide a forum for listeners all across Canada, who will be able to air their views on various contentious or topical issues immediately by merely picking up the telephone; and complete live coverage of National Hockey

League games featuring the Toronto Maple Leafs and the Montreal Canadiens. This brings to CBC hockey fans full coverage of the week-end games: Saturdays on television, Sundays on radio.

It also means, of course, that the programs which have formerly made up *CBC Sunday Night* (and, before that, *CBC Wednesday Night*, if your memory takes you back that far) will be moved to another location. That location, to which the entire evening's programming will be transferred—complete with the inimitable James Bannerman—is Tuesday night.

Among the major program series, *Project '66* and *A Man at Westminster* are both treated individually in this week's issue, although strictly speaking *Westminster* falls within our sphere of attention for next week, starting as it does on Saturday, October 30th. Another program of prime interest, not touched on this week since it begins on November 15th, is *As Time Goes By*, a nostalgic sampling of the best from the '30s and '40s, the pre-television golden years of

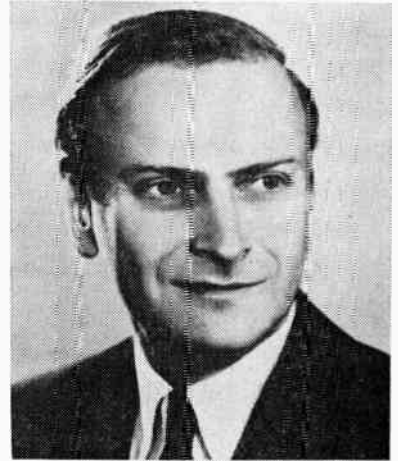

# Yehudi Menuhin Soloist Monday

YEHUDI MENUHIN, lean, intense inventor, vegetarian, Yoga enthusiast, teacher and world-renowned violin virtuoso, will be heard on radio Monday night at 11:00 as soloist with the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra in a concert conducted by Victor Feldbrill. Menuhin will play the Brahms violin concerto on the opening concert in a series presenting the Winnipeg Symphony and the Vancouver Symphony on alternate weeks.

Menuhin has been a virtuoso for 42 of his 49 years. When he was two, his father, a poor Russian emigré in San Francisco, smuggled him into a concert under his coat, and the tiny child lost no time in telling the whispering person in the next seat to be quiet and listen to the music. Five years later, the San Francisco public was listening entranced to *his* music. By the time he was eight he was so advanced a performer that his teachers suggested study in Europe, and he decided he wanted to work with the great Georges Enesco, whom he had heard play. So his father took six months' leave from his job, and set off for Europe with his family. On reaching Paris and contacting Enesco, they learned that he was leaving early next morning for a long concert tour. "Oh that's all right," young Menuhin told him. "I'll come at half-past five tomorrow morning and play for you while you're shaving."



He did, and Enesco forgot all about shaving as he listened in amazement to the small boy's performance. After that all sorts of doors were opened to Menuhin, and he is now one of the busiest and most admired violin performers in the world. He has many interests outside music, but he takes particular delight in playing at festivals. Last August he received the Freedom of Edinburgh, the highest honor the Scottish capital can confer on an individual. He was made a freeman "in recognition of his world eminence as a musician and of his humanity, in gratitude for his unflinching support, from the outset, for the ideals of the Edinburgh International Festival, and for the help and inspiration he has brought to people throughout the world by his unique artistry as a violinist."

## Cross-Country Check-Up

LAST MAY, within the context of a broadcast series having to do with Medicare, the CBC radio network experimented with a program utilizing the "open-line" technique — that is, listeners were invited to reach for their telephones and share in the discussion then taking place. The results were interesting and encouraging, but the program was limited in scope by the fact that listeners could call from only five centres in Canada.

On Sunday, October 24th, the CBC Public Affairs Department is inaugurating *Cross-Country Check-up*, an open-line program that is really nation-wide. Anyone, anywhere in Canada, will be able to call collect to a Montreal number and join in the program discussion.

Apart from its wide geographical range, the main difference between the new program and some others of the same type is that its topic, or topics, will be chosen in advance — it will not be a series of haphazard complaints or comments from listeners.

About possible topics on the program, its organizer, Christina McDougall, says, "We are instiga-

ting the 'ombudsman' approach in some of our programs. We shall check up on apparent miscarriages of justice or violations of civil rights which do not seem to have had any redress. We shall investigate the difficulty of obtaining low-cost housing and other problems facing families today; and such subjects as the attitude of the police to minor traffic violations and infringements of citizens' rights. We shall provide the opportunity for people across Canada to exchange experiences and views. We will be contacting people in authority, government officials, and experts, to obtain their advice. We hope also to be in touch with people in other countries if an event of interest to Canadians seems to call for it."

The host of *Cross-Canada Check-up* is Brad Crandall, who at one time was host of an open-line show in Toronto and now runs New York's most popular program of this type, four hours each weekday. *Cross-Country Check-up* is produced by Andrew Simon in Montreal. Moses Znaimer, in Toronto, is assisting on the "ombudsman" items.

## RADIO DRAMA:

# Greek Tragedy to Canadian Comedy



SOME UNUSUAL, highly entertaining drama is promised radio listeners this season — from the classics to uproariously funny contemporary works. The Sophocles tragedy, *Elektra*, based on furious, horrendous intrigues in the ancient house of Agamemnon, will introduce another *CBC Stage* series on radio, at a different time: Sundays at 1:00 p.m., beginning October 24th. Diana Maddox has adapted the drama from a new translation by David Grene. It will be followed on October 31st by two stories by Mavis Gallant, Montreal writer based in Paris, adapted by Len Peterson.

"After that," says Esse Ljungh, CBC supervisor of drama, "I'm hoping to do Fry's *The Lady's Not For Burning*; a Peterson adaptation of an excruciatingly funny story by Farley Mowat, *The Dog*

*That Wouldn't Be*; a gassy Icelandic tale, *Eyvind of the Hills* by Johann Sigurjonsson, adapted by George Salverson; an adaptation of Kenneth Galbraith's book, *The Scotch*, a very amusing take-off of an Ontario community, adapted by Leslie McFarlane; *Noah's Ark — Tourist Style*, by Ephraim Kishon, another hilarious take-off, this time of the Jews by a Jew, adapted by Paul Kligman; a double bill from the medieval mystery cycles of York and Wakefield; Lister Sinclair's version of *Alice in Wonderland* — to celebrate the centennial of its first publication; *Alceste*, by Canadian poet Daryl Hine—a new translation of the modern version; a new play about man's soul-searching by Toronto psychologist Dr. Ian Malcolm; a series of ancient accounts of creation from various cultures, under the title of *In the Beginning* (was the Word), all done in medieval style like *Everyman*, with songs and music complementing the simple, direct words."

*CBC Tuesday Night* will continue to present plays of special importance. Some of the most interesting, beginning in April, are grouped under the title of *Cohen's Choice* — a series of 12 which Toronto critic Nathan Cohen considers the best-constructed, most effective and real. The first is Strindberg's *To Damascus* (Cohen thinks it is *the* play of all time), followed by (it is hoped) *The Killer* by Ionesco; *Madras House* by Granville Barker; *In the Jungle of Cities* by Brecht; *Judith* by Giraudoux; *All God's Chillun Got Wings* by Eugene O'Neil, and others.

*Midweek Theatre* (Wednesdays at 9:00 p.m.) continues with outstanding plays from various CBC production centres.

radio. Still another major project is the program series *1967 and All That*, a Friday evening two-hour omnibus of *Canadiana*. We'll have more on this program in CBC *TIMES* very soon.

Critical reviews of the arts will make up a new program called *Sunday Supplement*.

*CBC Saturday Morning* will present a digest of the best of CBC radio's daytime programming, prepared for those who are not able to listen to the many interesting weekday features.

Farms, business, and labor interests are served in some new programs: *Countrytime*, a new Monday night show, will supplement CBC daytime farm broadcasts; *Business Barometer* will continue to provide news of interest in that field; and the new digest of labor news and activities, *Your Job*, will be heard weekday mornings at 6:55 a.m.

Youth must be served, runs the saying, and on CBC radio it is served particularly by two brand-new programs, both on Saturdays: *The Action Set*, a show tailored exclusively to the teenage taste, will include such features as *Our Mann in Hollywood* (Larry Mann on the showbusiness scene), movie reviews by Alex Barris, interviews with entertainment celebrities, and top-of-the-chart music; music will also figure large in the other show,

*The Saturday Beat*, on Saturday evenings.

Also for the younger listeners, ranging from teens to toddlers, there are: *Playroom* (already in progress); *Who Will Come With Me*, which will feature readings from children's classics every evening, Monday through Friday; *Rod and Charles*, who will present their unique combination of zaniness and education every weeknight at 6:45; and such long-established CBC programs as *CBC Stamp Club* and the *Canadian School Broadcasts*.

CBC News will continue its comprehensive coverage of world and local events, through an increased number of newscasts plus such programs as *Sunday Morning Magazine*, *From Our Own Correspondent*, and other programs. The major challenge will be presented, of course, on November 8th, when the full resources of the department will be assembled to provide fast and accurate results on the national election.

In other program areas, listeners will find that most of the familiar programs have been retained in the new schedule. # TV's Complex

## Master Clown

Multi-talented Red Skelton  
is back on CBC television regularly, Tuesdays  
at 8:00 p.m.

IN THE grounds of his home stands a life-size marble figure of Christ; in his dressing room at Hollywood's Television City hangs a crucifix; in his pockets, he carries a rosary and a phylactery; and when he goes home at night, the last items to be zipped into his briefcase are the religious articles and family pictures that decorate the make-up table.

This is the Red Skelton the public never sees, the deeply religious family man who belongs to no specific denomination; the Skelton who, in the past 20 years, has given away an estimated \$1,000,000 to charity—without claiming tax deductions.

Skelton's hour-long variety show is seen each Tuesday at 8:00 p.m. on the CBC television network. This is Red's 15th consecutive season on U.S. television.

Richard Bernard Skelton was born in Vincennes, Indiana, possibly in 1913 (he isn't sure). His first showbusiness venture was as a guitar-playing and singing "mid-get" for a travelling medicine show. He was 10. Next, he gathered experience in vaudeville, on showboats and in the "clown alley" of a circus.

Red struggled along in burlesque for several years, until he clicked

at Shea's in Toronto with a new doughnut-dunking comic routine, one of his most popular sketches over the years.

With a new impetus to his career, Skelton went on to growing fame in radio and motion pictures. Three years of service in the U.S. Army interrupted his career from 1943 to 1945. During this time, Red performed more than 3,800 shows for servicemen.

Skelton's 15 consecutive years on network television have confounded the proposition that tv wears out the jester who appears on a weekly basis—or, if not him, then his audience. Although he still does much the same sort of material now as when he first quit films for tv, he retains the loyalty of an immense public.

Skelton is a man of many paradoxes. His eccentricities are famous. He chews away at 10 to 30 cigars a day without ever lighting one; pyrophobia is but one of the many private agonies he has suffered from most of his life, this one stemming from a childhood incident when his father's half-brother burned down the store the family lived in.

Until a few years ago, the Skelton legend portrayed him as a moody, intense Pagliacci who



viewed those around him with distrust and suspicion. He refused to talk on the telephone, insisted on wearing maroon ties, abruptly fired business associates. If he became angry at one of his writers, it is said he would refuse to sign the man's pay cheque, making him wait for it indefinitely.

But then he decided to reorganize his life, ridding himself of unfortunate advisers, and trying to understand personality problems he had always refused to face. He has found a renewed joy in life, with the help of Georgia, his beautiful second wife of 19 years, and his teenage daughter Valentina. Last year, an exhibition of his paintings indicated that he might have been a professional artist had he not chosen showbusiness.
