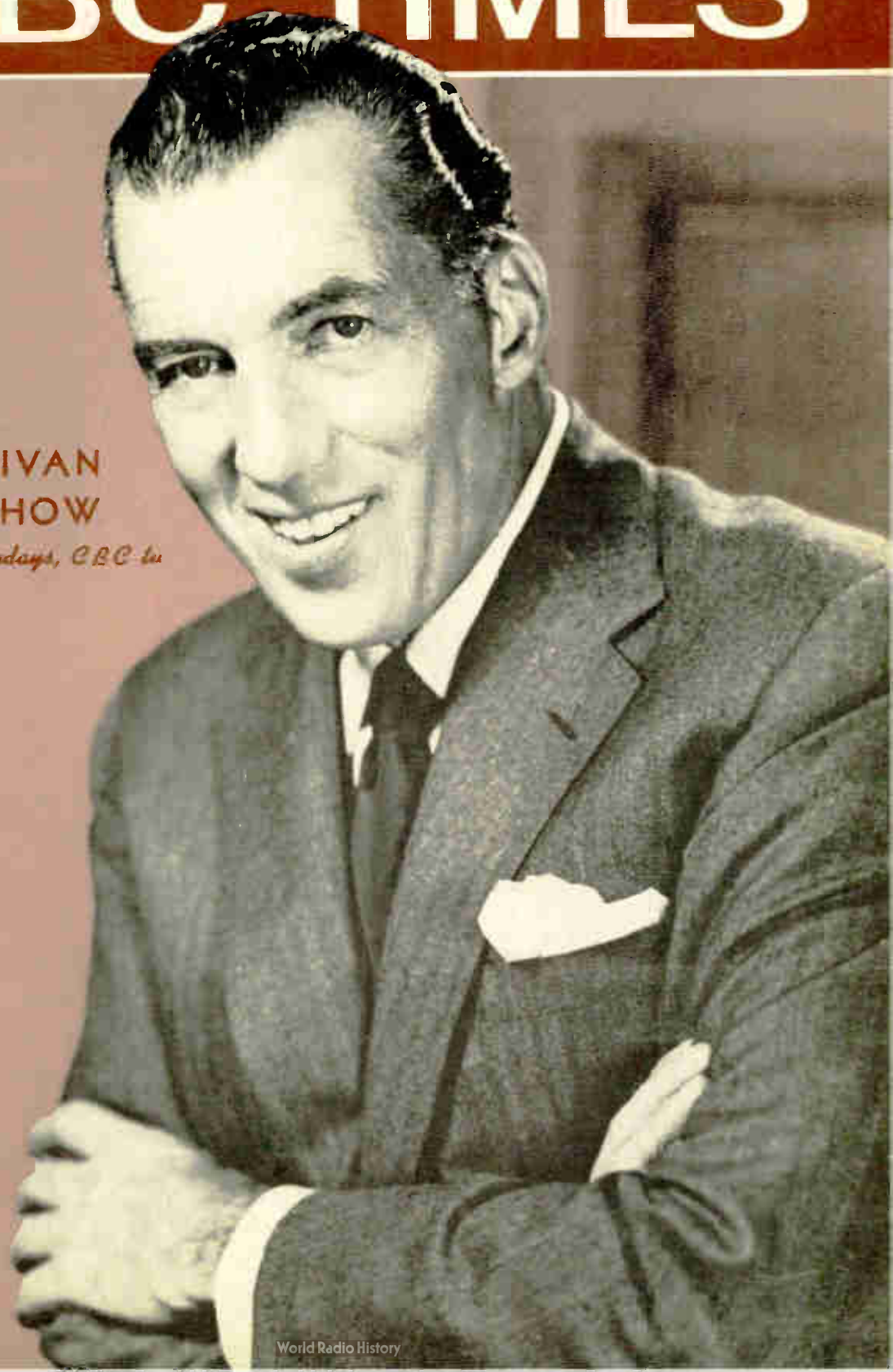

# around CBC

AFTER sixty-six years in show business, the indestructible Buster Keaton is still going strong. In the National Film Board's one-hour production, *Buster Keaton Rides Again*, to be presented on CBC tv, December 11th at 3:00 p.m., Buster proves that 70 years of age have not left their mark on a style that is as familiar as its creator's pork pie hat and baggy trousers.

*Buster Keaton Rides Again* is, in part, a film on the making of a film. It centres about the on-location shooting of a second NFB film, *The Railrodder*, a half-hour color production which has recently gained wide acclaim in international festival competition. *The Railrodder*, to be released to Canadian theatres this month, is Keaton's 87th movie.

Aside from the behind the scenes visit with Keaton and the film crew of *The Railrodder*, *Buster Keaton Rides Again* is a salute to a giant among a fading school of comics.

The film examines the early days of the vaudeville circuit when an act by the name of the Three Keatons drew top billing across North America. It recalls the early days of motion pictures and the introduction of a young deadpan comic whose face and manner would one day become as famous as slapstick itself.

In 1899, Joseph "Buster" Keaton, at the age of four, joined his parents on the vaudeville stage. It was an Irish knockabout act and Buster, billed as "the human mop," took the brunt of the knocking about. Keaton spent only one day in school but his education was provided by his fellow performers. He was taught to dance by Bill "Bojangles" Robinson. Houdini taught him the art of the magician, and his mastery of comedy was picked up from his father and the many greats of the entertainment circuits.

Buster's introduction to the legitimate stage was in the role of Little Lord Fauntleroy but the experiment which would change his life was his first attempt at the new world of motion pictures. Fatty Arbuckle, who won initial fame as one

of Mack Sennett's Keystone cops, convinced Buster to try his hand at this new medium of entertainment. The experiment was a success and before long the deadpan Keaton had his own studio. He was earning \$200,000 yearly and his films were grossing ten times their cost. By 1927, Keaton was riding high and there seemed no end to his skyrocketing career. The years just ahead brought an abrupt end to the dream.

Through the '30s, the '40s and '50s, the star began his second ascent. The road was not as smooth this time and the setbacks were many but Keaton again came out on top.

*Buster Keaton Rides Again* provides the rare opportunity to study the master of the mechanical gag at work in the field of which he has been king for over half a century.

WHEN A new exhibit is introduced at the Regina Public Library Art

Gallery, the occasion is marked with a chamber music concert, open to the public free of charge.

Known as the *Music with Art* series, the concerts are sponsored by a group that includes many prominent Regina citizens, known as the Friends of Chamber Music at the Library. Leading chamber groups from the city are heard, under overall direction of Jack Behrens, composer and member of the music conservatory faculty at the University of Saskatchewan's Regina campus.

This season, the CBC is recording the concerts for broadcast on CBK Saskatchewan's *Canadian Showcase*, Mondays at 4:03 p.m. The first program was heard November 1st, and the second will be broadcast this week, December 13th. Future broadcasts will be January 17th, February 7th and 21st, and March 21st. Stew Blancher is the producer.

# An Edith Sitwell Anthology

CBC TUESDAY NIGHT  
presents the poetry of the  
unique, eccentric British  
lady of letters.



DAME EDITH SITWELL was timeless. She looked like a wimpled, be-ringed medieval aristocrat in flowing crimson and gold robes, a fantastic, slightly sinister creature almost six feet tall, with a hooked nose, high forehead and mysterious, hooded grey eyes, whom Chaucer must have overlooked in loading his caravan for Canterbury. Even in old age (she died at 77, a year ago) her voice was as light, high and sweet as a teenager's, and her crimson-nailed hands, heavy with pebble-sized aquamarines, were smoothly beautiful and eloquent. She revelled in weird get-ups, and said: "I really believe people would stop believing in God if I started wearing tweeds." But her friends, who called her Queen Edith, said she was more human and kinder than most other people, was entirely without arrogance, and felt deeply obligated to anyone who ever helped her. "But I get cross when people are rude, and I slap them down," she admitted, and frequently made bores and enemies the victims of a ruthless, but witty harlequinade.

She described a poet as "a brother speaking to brother of a moment of their other lives—a moment that had been buried beneath the dust of the busy world. . . . Poetry is the deification of reality, and one of its purposes, amongst others, is to show that the dimensions of man are, as Sir Arthur Eddington said, 'half way between those of an atom and a star'."

Some poets and critics dismiss her verses as artificial and even mechanical. But Arnold Bennett called her "the most accomplished technician in verse." Scottish critic Edwin Muir said that she wrote with a bright, supernatural clarity, and he saw metaphysical horror at the root of her poetry.

She had a lonely and immensely unhappy childhood. Her parents, who despised one another, were almost strangers to her. "I was in disgrace for being a female," she recalled, "and, worse, as I grew older, it was obvious that I was not going to conform to my father's standard of feminine beauty." ## Classic Irish Drama

Sean O'Casey's great play about  
human foibles is seen on

CBC tv Wednesday, December 15th

THIS WEEK *Festival* presents a great theatrical milestone: Sean O'Casey's *Juno and the Paycock*, in which the Irish expatriate pinpointed Ireland's sorrow and weaknesses so movingly and objectively that it established him as a dramatist of the first rank and gave the Abbey Theatre a great boost. It's a tragedy about little people caught in emotions too strong for them, the victims of adversity, who help to perpetuate their sorrowful conditions with Irish foible and madness, wringing the heart while they exasperate the mind, lyrical and funny even as Fate shakes a fist at them. While O'Casey makes it very plain indeed that he sympathizes with his people, he never stoops to sentimentalizing over them or forgiving them their mistakes and vanities. He offers, instead, a moving gallery of portraits partly shadowed by the gloom of the "troubles" in Dublin of the twenties, and the "mur-

derherin' hate" they engendered, partly illuminated by wit as warmblooded as a Donnybrook. The bitterness of Ireland's guerrilla war is only a background for O'Casey's poetic comment on the frailty of a people blind to their own folly.

Heading the family of Boyles who illustrate his theme is the indomitable Juno, majestic in her determination not to let the chaos around her disrupt her family unit, nagging, wearing herself out with work, railing against men's stupidity, but always humorous, tender and generous as her heart breaks.

In contrast to Juno is her husband, "Captain" Boyle, a lazy, talkative creature who never went to sea, but who "sthutts about from mornin' till night like a paycock," prating about the glory of Ireland but never lifting a hand to work for her, trying to live in style and ignore the churning times around him, who, in spite of his cruelty and selfishness, is a most pathetic figure; and his merry, treacherous sidekick, Joxer, a hypocrite if there ever was one, who finds that so many people and things in life are "darlin'"; the Boyles' son, Johnny, a frightened, embittered, ex-rebel who

UNDER A DECREE issued last October by the President of the Republic, Marshal Humberto de Alencar Castelo Branco, all political parties in Brazil were abolished and the country placed under a six-month period of martial law. Only through such extreme measures, said Branco, can the military government carry out the economic reforms needed to rescue Brazil from the rampant inflation that is crippling the country. Branco, who led the military revolt in March, 1964, that swept out the left-wing government of former President Joao Goulart, now has more power than any Brazilian leader has had since the strong-man of the '30s and '40s, Dr. Getulio Vargas.

A report on Brazil after 18 months of military rule will be presented this week on *The Public Eye*. The program is the work of a group of young students who make their debut in television journalism with this documentary. Two—Giles and Alexander Neel—are English, and one—Robert Showman—is Canadian. The only professional in the production unit was the cameraman, Michael Dodds, also English.

Giles Neel, who wrote and directed the film, is 22, read History at Cambridge, then Law and Diplomacy at Tufts College, Massachusetts, and is currently studying at the Annanberg School of Communications, Philadelphia. His brother Alexander, who combined the roles of sound-man, co-producer and unit-manager, is 21 and a student of Architecture at Cambridge. Showman, who studied with Giles at Tufts, is 23, and worked closely with Giles developing the outline of the film, and since he had been to Brazil before, he also served as liaison, setting up interviews and arranging with Brazilian Army officers the filming of various projects being carried out by the army. These projects include the building of roads and railways, dams and bridges, educational and medical facilities, and the clearing of jungle areas for civilian development.

The students spent over three months in Brazil travelling widely throughout the country, often as the guests of the army, to interview church leaders, cabinet ministers, cattle ranchers, businessmen, and ordinary workers.

Drilling soldiers are filmed by the production crew, guests of the army during much of their stay.

looks that she made her wear a black veil over her face when they took walks. When the girl grew too quickly and developed a stoop, her father encased her in a painful, head-to-toe apparatus of steel and canvas designed to straighten her out. All it did was damage some of the muscles in her back and legs. Her parents made no effort to understand their shy daughter's love of poetry. Her father said: "Edith will commit suicide when

she finds she cannot write poetry." But at 24, when she was put to bed with the measles and away from the bullying of her family, she began to write, assaulting convention with eloquent imagery, and when her first volume of poetry was published a year later, she realized that she *did* have beauty, but within. She left home and set up in a Bayswater flat of her own, which became the mecca for the literary nobility of Europe and America. She was rarely out of the news, arousing controversy most of the time. Her *Facade*, a series of poems with musical accompaniment, was received with such fury at its first performance in 1923 that, she recalled, "I was nearly lynched, the audience was so angry." In this age of conformity she stands out like a refreshing whiff of freedom.

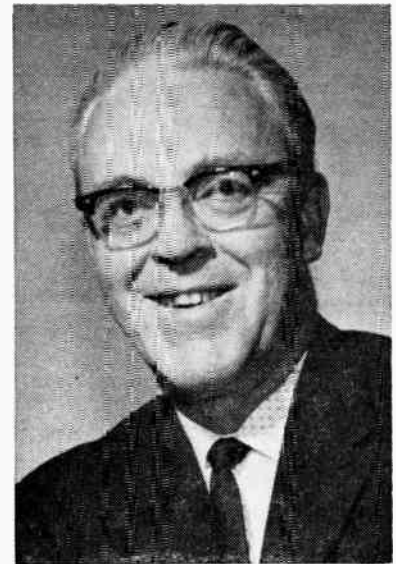

# The Heroine Nobody Knew

A BELGIAN family named François has a memento called *A Book of Foolish Questions*, in which relatives and close friends write something in keeping with the title of the book. One entry, written over half a century ago by an English governess to the family, reads: "What is your greatest ambition?" "To be buried in Westminster Abbey." — signed Edith Cavell.

Nurse Cavell's youthful ambition was never realized, although her body was transported to the Abbey in 1919 for services which were attended by King George V and Queen Mary. Afterwards she was laid to rest in Norwich Cathedral in the county of Norfolk, where she was born in 1865.

The circumstances of Edith Cavell's death are well known, but as a person she remains a somewhat remote figure whose dedication to the nursing profession seemed to preclude close friendships. Sunday at 10:30 p.m., on radio's *Project '66*, listeners will

ville each received the death sentence. Most of the others were sentenced to hard labor, anywhere from three years to 20. After the execution of Nurse Cavell in the grounds of the Tir National, the other death sentences were commuted. A member of the firing party who could not bring himself to fire on a woman died with her.

In the nursing service, Edith Cavell was the direct descendant of Florence Nightingale. At the time she entered nursing there were still only a few qualified nurses and conditions were still generally poor. Before becoming a probationer nurse she went straight from the comfortable world of a governess living abroad to a totally different way of life as an untrained worker in a London hospital, where she worked from six in the morning until 10 at night doing menial tasks alongside charwomen. Years later, when her administrative talents had won her an enviable reputation in several London hospitals, she was invited by the president of the Belgian Red Cross, Dr. Antoine Depage, to return to Brussels, where she had formerly lived with the François family, to help set up a new training school for nurses.

Shortly before her execution the chaplain of Christ Church, Brussels, Rev. H. S. T. Gahan, visited her and recorded the words that echoed around the world: "... standing as I do in view of God and eternity, I realize that patriotism is not enough. I must have no hatred or bitterness towards anyone."

**Cast:** Phillip II, King of Spain, a bass; Don Carlos, Infant of Spain, a tenor; Rodrigo, Marquis of Posa, a baritone; the Grand Inquisitor, a bass; A Friar; Elizabeth of Valois, a soprano; the Princess Eboli, a mezzo-soprano; Theobald, Elizabeth's page; the Countess of Aremburg; the Count of Lerna; a Royal Herald; Flemish Ladies, Inquistors, Gentlemen, and Ladies of the Courts of France and Spain. Members of the populace, pages, guards, familiars of the Holy Office, soldiers, magistrates. Deputies from the various provinces constituting the Spanish Empire, etc.

The time: about the year 1560.

**Act 1.** The Forest of Fontainebleau. Don Carlos, son of Phillip II, and Crown Prince of Spain, is the affianced lover of the beautiful Elizabeth of Valois, daughter of Henry II. Don Carlos and Elizabeth meet for the first time, and Don Carlos pretends that he is only a messenger from the Infant with a gift for her, and tells her of Don Carlos' admiration for her. She opens the package and finds a miniature of Don Carlos, and at once recognizes him as the original. They fall deeply and passionately in love with each other, but a messenger arrives bearing the news that for reasons of state she is to marry Phillip II, and not his son Don Carlos; the lovers are thrown into despair.

**Act 2.** The royal marriage is duly solemnized but Don Carlos cannot overcome his love for Elizabeth. His friend, Rodrigo, advises him to go to Flanders to forget his passion, so he asks Elizabeth to gain the requisite permission from the King. The interview only serves to re-awaken the intensity of their love, and Don Carlos clasps her in his arms forgetful of all else, and then hurries from the scene.

**Act 3, Scene 1.** The Queen's Garden. During a carnival Don Carlos meets the beautiful Princess Eboli, and mistaking her for Elizabeth, tells her of his love. The Princess loves him herself, and joyously removes her mask. When she realizes she has deceived him she is filled with jealousy and threatens to reveal Don Carlos' love for Elizabeth to the King.

**Act 3, Scene 2.** A large square before Nostra Donna d'Atocha, with a funeral pyre. The bells are ringing joyously and the Court and the Queen, and later the King, enter as for a holiday. Don Carlos appears at the head of a delegation of Flemings and begs for mercy for them. The King refuses and Don Carlos, drawing his sword, vows to be their savior. The King orders him to be disarmed but everyone is afraid to attempt it, until Rodrigo asks him for his sword and then he yields. The funeral pyre is lighted and it is here we hear the joyous song of the Inquistors.

**Act 4, Scene 1.** In the King's library. The Grand Inquisitor convinces the King that Don Carlos must be imprisoned, and the Princess Eboli arouses his jealousy by telling him of the love that exists between his son and his wife.

**Act 4, Scene 2.** The Prison of Don Carlos. Rodrigo comes to visit his

# Noah's Ark, Tourist Class

EPHRAIM KISHON is a humorous Jew whose writing is as pun-gently satisfying as gefilte fish. He has a great gift for seeing the funny side of his people, especially when they don't realize they're being droll. A sense of humor is a wonderful human safety valve, because it gives us a good sense of proportion. But a taste for irony such as Kishon's takes us one step further towards adjusting to life, for it allows us to appreciate a joke on ourselves.

It's a shame that more writers with a strong nationalistic flavor don't have Kishon's delightful knack for laughing at himself. He pokes exuberant fun at the Jews with a biting but wholesome sarcasm that sometimes gets downright slapstick, but never seems alien, no matter what his reader's own background may be. His trick is to exaggerate in making a comedy of adversities so that they grow more understandable, and thus become easier to put up with.

His "ghetto humor," as it is called, overlooks few Israeli institutions or Jewish traditions. He jibes at them all, but with companionable, meaningful style as crisp as a bagel.

This Sunday, December 12th, CBC Stage presents stories from Kishon's second collection of satirical sketches of life in present-day Israel, *Noah's Ark, Tourist Class*.

They were selected and arranged for radio by another Jew with a well-exercised sense of humor, who enjoys a joke on himself or his people, Toronto actor-writer Paul Kligman, who will also have a role in the production. It will be directed by Esse W. Ljungh.

These are hilariously funny tales of human foibles, pointing out that men and women get themselves into all sorts of predicaments by allowing their imaginations to work overtime, and by being so pre-occupied with their own thoughts that they don't listen to what the other fellow says. *Noah's Ark, Tourist Class* offers a chuckly hour of laughing at ourselves as others see us. Kishon's characters are universal—fallible, gullible, vain, practising one-upmanship like mad, and rather loveable, in spite of themselves.

Kishon is a Hungarian-born journalist who settled in Israel in 1949 at the age of 27. Three years later he began a satirical newspaper column and he's been writing with his tongue in his cheek ever since, combining a harsh sort of wisdom with warm laughter, rather like an ancient prophet—understanding, tolerating and forgiving his people's foibles and weaknesses, pointing out to them that laughter can be the key to survival.

# Somer's Chamber Opera on Radio

THE WORLD broadcast première of *The Fool*, a one-act chamber opera written by Canadian composer Harry Somers to a libretto by Michael Fram, will be presented as part of *CBC Tuesday Night*, December 14th, 9:00 to 10:00 p.m. on the radio network.

The performance will originate at the CBC's Vancouver studios and will feature a cast of four principals and the CBC Vancouver Chamber Ensemble, conducted by John Avison. Tenor Garnet Brooks will be heard as the Fool, baritone David Geary as the King, mezzo-soprano Phyllis Mailing as the Queen, and soprano Mary Morrison as the Lady-in-Waiting.

Harry Somers' first opera, *The Fool*, was composed in 1953. The work was given its world stage première in Toronto, in November, 1956, under the sponsorship of Canadian Music Association (Ontario). In March, 1959, it was staged in Montreal under the sponsorship of The Society of Canadian Music. Both productions were presented in co-operation with The Canadian League of Composers.

In the work, Mr. Somers has given the singers four levels of expression: speech, song speech, song recitation, and song line—the latter being the closest approximation to conventional operatic style. The score calls for a quartet of woodwinds, a quartet of strings, a double-bass, and a piano.

Michael Fram, a Toronto lawyer, worked nights for a month writing the libretto for *The Fool* and has also collaborated with Mr. Somers on several other works. Mr. Fram has outlined the action of the opera as follows:

"'The Fool,' or jester, loved as a son by the King and Queen, as a man by the Lady-in-Waiting and with a privileged position in the royal household, announces that he intends to launch himself into flight

from the castle tower. The only possible motive for what others regard as a suicidal action is the King's request that the Fool be more guarded in speech and restrain himself in the State's interests. The Fool will discuss his motives with no one, but in a soliloquy he reasons that his real motive is not the King's request (although this affords the excuse for his proposed action), but his desire to attain a perfect freedom in flight.

"As the appointed time approaches, the King realizes for the first time that the Fool is in earnest and tries to dissuade him. The two quarrel bitterly, the King considering the Fool's idea of freedom as selfish and leading only to anarchy, the Fool looking on the King's idea of freedom under the law as control of the individual leading only to tyranny. They reach an impasse and the King attempts to restrain the Fool physically, but the latter breaks away, runs to the tower, stretches his improvised wings, and leaps to his death. In the concluding ensemble, the Queen and her Lady-in-Waiting lament a loved person who committed suicide under the influence of madness, but the King wonders if what he saw was fall or flight."

Currently, Harry Somers is at work on two full-length operas, as yet untitled, both especially commissioned for the Centenary and dealing with Canadian historical subjects. One is based on the life of Louis Riel and is being written in three acts to a libretto by Mavor Moore. It was commissioned for the Canadian Opera Company by the Floyd Chalmers Foundation. The other, on a somewhat smaller scale, has a libretto by William Kilbourn based on his book, *The Firebrand*, about William Lyon Mackenzie, and was commissioned by the CBC.

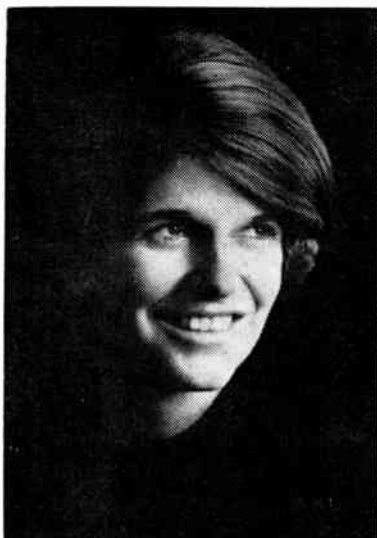
## Discuss Second Vatican Council

AFTER MORE than three years' work the second Vatican Council ended in Rome last week. The historic meeting of nearly 3,000 prelates was opened on October 11th, 1962, by Pope John XXIII almost four years after His Holiness first announced it. "To meet the present needs of the Christian people," said the Vatican announcement, "the Pope, taking inspiration from secular custom of the Church, has announced three events of the greatest importance: a synod of

the diocese of Rome; celebration of an ecumenical council for the universal Church; and the modernization of the code of canon law, preceded by the forthcoming promulgation of the code of the oriental law.

"Regarding the celebration of ecumenical council, this, in the thought of the Holy Father, looks not only to the edification of the Christian peoples, but is intended as an invitation to the separate communities to seek unity which so many desire in all parts of the world."

The Council debated many issues, some of them controversial, which touch the lives of almost all peoples throughout the world. In retrospect, what has Vatican II meant for Christendom? Listeners to *Christian Frontiers* will hear a discussion on this topic, by some of the clergymen who attended the Council, on this week's program, Tuesday, December 14th, 7:30 p.m. The program was prepared in Rome and includes: Msgr. William Baun, an American Roman Catholic; the Rev. Dr. Albert Outler, an American Protestant; the Rev. Dr. Lukas Vischer, of the Swiss Reformed Church; the Rev. R. H. N. Davidson, of the United Church of Canada; and the Rev. Dr. E. R. Fairweather, of the Anglican Church of Canada.

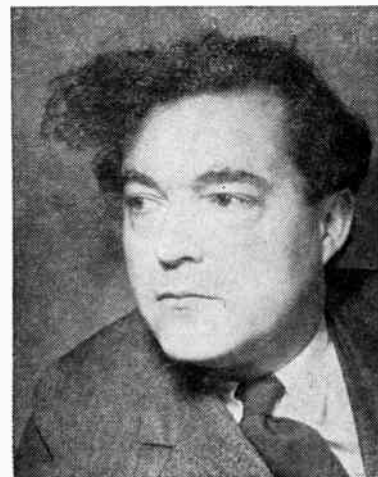

and placed 15 of them around the rooms of his palace.

In 1747, when the 62-year-old Bach was visiting Frederick, who was his great admirer, the King took Bach on a tour of the palace to show off his new instruments, and insisted that the composer try them all. After he'd played several, Bach asked Frederick to suggest a theme on which he could improvise a fugue. The King did, and the resulting three-part fugue was

later used as the opening section of the *Musical Offering*.

Bach promised to "work out this right royal theme more fully," in a style "as such an excellent theme demanded." And later the King received not only the promised six-part fugue, but also a trio sonata, the original improvised three-part fugue, and ten canons, all constructed from the King's suggested theme.

When this *Musical Offering* was later published, the works were not presented in the order in which Bach had intended them, and this, combined with the fact that he hadn't made his intentions too clear, destroyed the inter-related scheme of the work, and so it was dismissed by many critics as just a jumble of pleasant pieces thrown together any old way. And no one bothered to look into the matter further until 1928, when Hans David, after long, painstaking research, prepared an edition pointing up the intricately balanced construction of the *Musical Offering*.

## Canada's Apathetic Young People

Friday at 8:00 p.m. on CBC radio: a look  
at the mood of the younger generation.

THIS IS the most shocking of all the programs in the *Canadian Mood* series," says John David Hamilton, who introduces this week's program, *The Invisible Wall*. Written and narrated by Nancy Bacal, the program is a disturbing look at young people in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec.

Miss Bacal travelled thousands of miles throughout the two provinces to find how Canada's young people, most of them in their early 20s, are preparing for the future and what hopes and ambitions stir them. She found that, in general, the youth of Ontario have very little spirit, prefer to be carried by the tide rather than strike out on their own, are apathetic about such things as politics and Canada's role in world affairs, and have few ambitions beyond acquiring material comforts and security. "They are obsessed," says Miss Bacal, "with the getting of the magic symbols

of security. Canada has the oldest young people in the world."

This shocking indictment of English-speaking Canadian youth is borne out by what they themselves have to say. Some typical comments heard on the program are: "Security is very important to me"; "I'd like to retire early"; "I find it satisfying to swim with the tide"; "I want a husband with a good job."

Most of the young people interviewed are those living in small communities outside the large cities, and most have not had to struggle hard or fight for a fairly good standard of living. "Canada is comfortable and they want it to stay that way," concludes Miss Bacal. "Complacency seems to be the main foundation of the Canadian future."

In Quebec the affluent society affects only a few, and young people there are more idealistic, more politically aware, and generally more concerned with their place in Canadian Society as a whole. Religion, politics, and education are the three things they are most concerned with. The Separatist movement does not have wide support among them outside the universities. They prefer to think in terms of "independence," which means, for them, to be an integral part of Canada but as clearly identifiable individuals. Many of them have rejected religion, and the once-absolute authority of the church in Quebec is weakening.

## Playing Nick King Takes a Lot of Hustling

There's hardly time for Stephen Young, star of SEAWAY, to catch his breath between filming of episodes in the CBC tv series.

NICK KING, the trouble-shooting ship owners' agent in *Seaway*, is a young man who likes to be where the action is.

Stephen Young, 26, who plays this starring role in the Canadian film series (telecast on CBC tv on Thursdays at 8:00 p.m.) is a similar sort of guy.

Since *Seaway* went into production last June, the pace has been merely frantic for Stephen Young and co-star Austin Willis (who plays Admiral Fox). With a shooting schedule of roughly an episode a week, the action is practically non-stop.

The two regular stars and the entire *Seaway* crew are currently in Toronto on location, which means that Stephen Young is home for the first prolonged period in months. The other day he managed to meet a couple of old school friends for a coffee.

Stephen's days at Forest Hill Collegiate in Toronto weren't exactly leisurely, either. He found plenty of action in basketball, hockey, baseball and swimming, and at one time thought he'd like to make a career in professional baseball. He was voted president of his class.

"Afterwards, I tried a lot of different things—selling, working for a finance company, selling radio and tv time out west," he relates. "For a while I was involved in the production of commercials."

A bout of mononucleosis brought him home, and he spent the next four months recuperating. But he bounced back to health, and was soon working as a production assistant on a Toronto-produced tv series, *Faraway Places*. It was on this series that he met John Trent, the Toronto film producer who was later to cast him in the Canadian-produced daytime serial, *Moment of Truth*.

But the faraway places beckoned, and Stephen joined a Toronto chum, Paul Bertoya, on a private expedition to Italy. "We each had a one-way ticket, and \$135 between us," he recalls, "and we did all right—two months' work in *Cleopatra* (with even a few lines), then to Sicily for *The Leopard*, with Burt Lancaster, and to Madrid for *55 Days to Peking*."

Stephen landed what he terms "my first decent part" in a two-part Walt Disney tv film, *Hector, The Stowaway Dog*, shot in Lisbon. "I'm still getting the residuals," he says. His pal Bertoya had meanwhile returned, and was subsequently starred with Brett Somers in CBC tv's *Festival* production of William Hanley's *Mrs. Dally Has a Lover*.

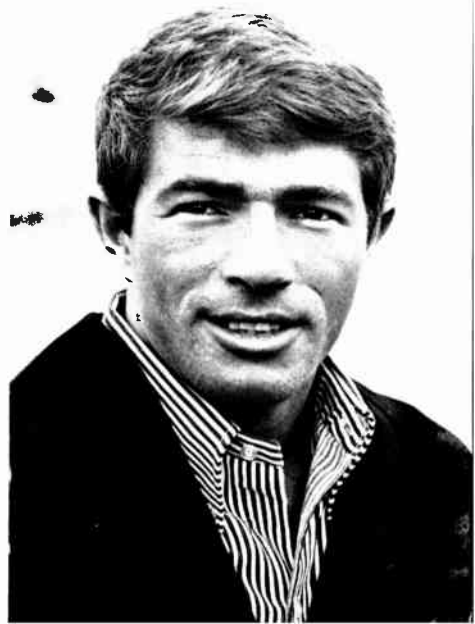
Following another film role, in Madrid (*The Thin Red Line*, starring Keir Dullea) and a brief, unremunerative trip to London, England, Stephen made his way to Hollywood, where he worked in the tv film series *The Untouchables*

and *Combat*. Then came the call from John Trent and an offer of a sustaining role in the Toronto-produced daytime serial, *Moment of Truth*, an assignment that lasted seven months.

"For a while, after I got the *Seaway* part, I was still working on *Moment of Truth*," he says, "and that meant I was hopping back and forth between Toronto and Montreal. It got so that I hardly knew which city I was in." Even after he was written out of *Moment of Truth*, the pace was formidable.

Young enjoys his association with Austin Willis ("a great guy") and the *Seaway* crew ("they're tops, too"), and he's learning. "One thing, I'm an objective viewer of my own work," he adds. He's also hoping that the prediction contained in a recent newspaper review will come true. It said, in part: "With the experience he (Young) is gaining on the series, the relatively unknown actor looks like becoming a hot property, as they say in the trade, long before the series is out."

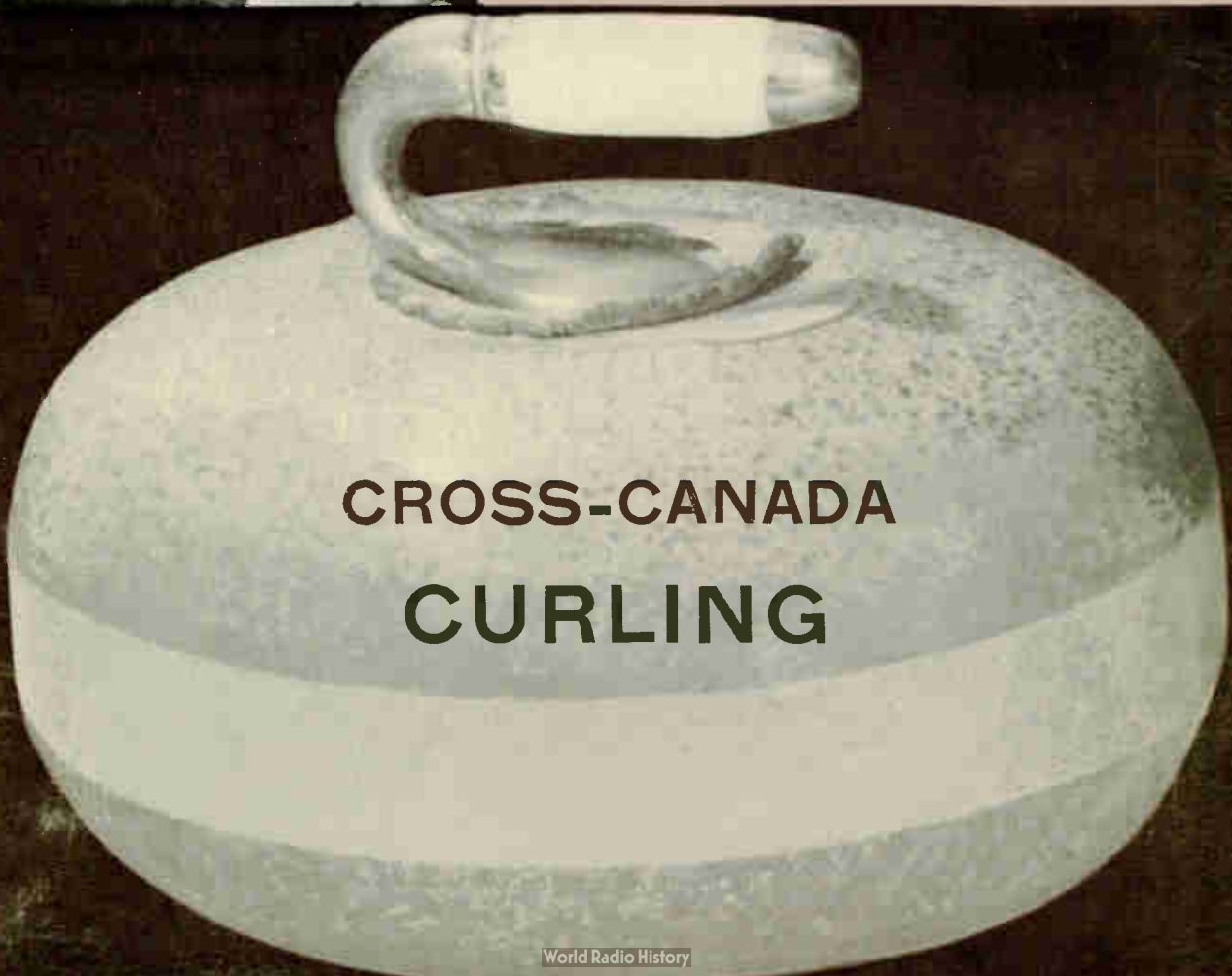
