A Viewpoint

• Although I have not yet seen *Seven Days* (CBC tv, Sundays) for December 5th, I did read the review of the program in the new edition of CBC TIMES. I have personally done a great deal of research on Vietnam, and will probably agree with the general conclusion made by Beryl Fox, but I am disturbed by some of the American propaganda that appears in the article, and fear that it will be repeated on the telecast. For example, she refers to the Saigon regime as the democratic forces. Now even the Americans do not claim that General Ky's government is democratic, but rationalize that an authoritarian, military dictatorship is necessary to provide stability in a time of crisis. So why the propaganda? She refers to the Communist Viet Cong. This is certainly an oversimplification. Even Dean Rusk recently admitted that there are nationalist forces supporting the rebellion, including the other two major parties, the Socialists and the Democrats, and that they are not all Communists. A more accurate term would have been Communist-led Viet Cong. Later the article states: "Nor is there hatred for the Viet Cong, despite the grinding taxes and the heavy draft." This implies that the Saigon regime does not have grinding taxes and does not impose a severe draft, which of course it does.

Perhaps this type of reporting is to be expected when people are sent

to Vietnam without seriously studying the history of the situation and becoming fully aware of the problems beforehand. The American press admits that it is nearly impossible to accurately report what is happening there and resents and objects to the fact that they have to rely more and more on government handouts and propaganda. And there are other problems. For example, your article says that the people do not resent the Americans in spite of the air strikes. This view is generally expressed to Westerners. But it is contradicted by reports to Asian and even French newsmen. This is part of the Asian culture, telling people what they want to hear.

CBC RADIO marks Christmas with a full day of special programming. International visits, messages of greeting, music, reminiscences, and humor make up the day's fare.

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and Prime Minister the Rt. Hon. Lester B. Pearson will deliver their traditional messages at 10:00 a.m., repeated at 6:10 p.m. The Commonwealth Christmas Broadcast, at 9:30 a.m., comes this year from Scotland, illustrating the links between that country and the other Commonwealth countries.

While we enjoy Christmas at home, thousands of Canadians must be in foreign countries, serving the cause of freedom. Lyal Brown interviews some of our soldiers and airmen in Germany and tells of their preparations for the holiday. The program is heard at 3:05 p.m.

To make the children's day more

complete, a program at 1:10 p.m. presents a children's opera by Walter Buczynski, *Mr. Rhinoceros and His Musicians*, followed by Carl Orff's cantata *The Christmas Story*.

Music for Christmas Day ranges from the Metropolitan Opera production of Offenbach's *La Perichole* at 8:00 p.m., through serious instrumental music to light popular numbers. At 10:30 a.m., *Music for Christmas Morning* comes from Vancouver, with readings by Thomas Traherne and music composed by Manfredini and Finzi, featuring soloist Audrey Farnell. At 11:30 a.m., the Leslie Bell Singers, the Festival Singers and Les Disciples de Massenet are heard on *Choral Music*. And many popular performers from Montreal, Winnipeg and Toronto sing on *Holiday in Music* at 4:00 p.m.

For a laugh, tune in Max Ferguson's hour-long special at 7:00 p.m., with unusual music and rib-

tickling skits suitable to the season. Also, the superb wit of the panel on BBC's quiz, *My Word*, will be heard at 6:30 p.m.

Greetings from the Lieutenant-Governor of the province in which your CBC station is located will be heard at 12:00 noon, followed by a message by James R. Finlay, CBC Director for the Prairie Provinces.

The Christmas Story as it is told in the New Testament is heard at 10:15 a.m., and *Christmas As It Was*—interviews with people who reminisce about past Christmases—is heard at 5:00 p.m.

The days' programming is introduced and concluded with recorded Christmas carols.

A SPECIAL film presentation of Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol*, starring Fredric March and Basil Rathbone, and a visit with the world-famous Moscow State Circus, are among highlights of Christmas Day programming on

the CBC television network.

Other December 25th specials include programs on religious drama, comedy, film programs for adults and children, and festive music, song and dance.

In *A Christmas Carol*, to be seen at 2:00 p.m., March stars as the miserly Scrooge and Rathbone as Marley's Ghost.

Prior to *A Christmas Carol*, at 1:00 p.m., CBC viewers will be able to see a performance by members of the world-renowned Moscow State Circus.

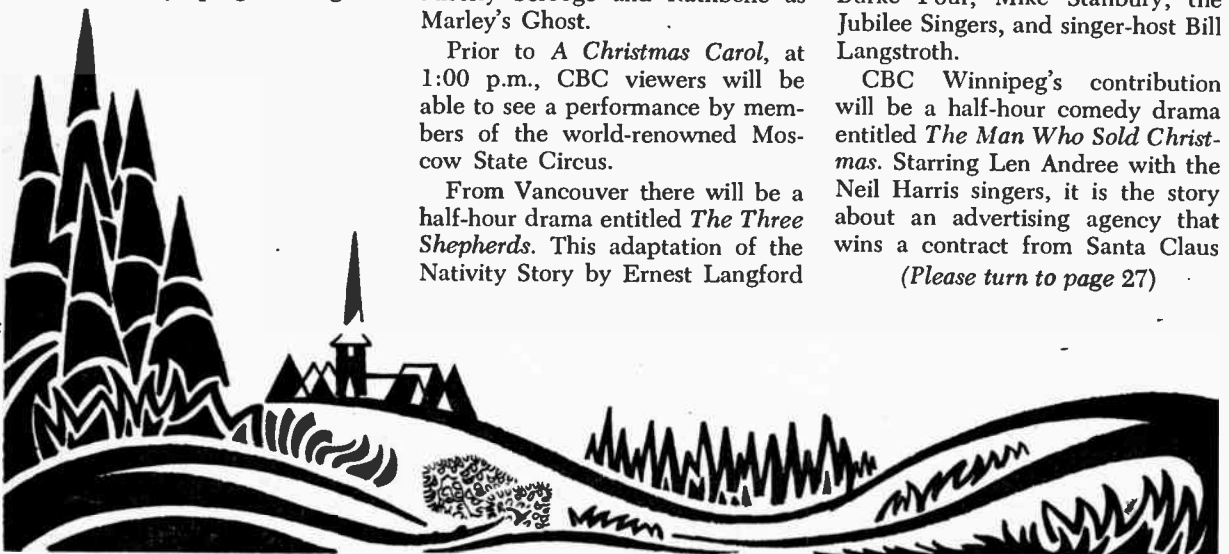
From Vancouver there will be a half-hour drama entitled *The Three Shepherds*. This adaptation of the Nativity Story by Ernest Langford

DR. HEALEY WILLAN:

85, but Not Yet Old

Works by this noted Canadian composer are performed this week on two CBC radio programs.

TO BE A man of exceptional talent with the initiative and opportunity to express it fully, and to have it widely enjoyed and admired in one's lifetime, is to have riches, indeed. But to live to the ripe old age of 85, in good health, and in full possession of all one's faculties, to be as creative and full of new ideas, as dapper and witty as half a century ago, as happily busy

as someone 30 years younger, is to enjoy fortune beyond the dreams of Croesus.

Such a lucky one is Dr. Healey Willan, dean of Canadian composers and a towering figure in Anglican church music, who wears his years as lightly and as niftily as his bow ties. He has accumulated honors enough to support a liberal amount of pride, but he's completely lacking in



self-importance, and his quick, irreverent, and sometimes naughty quips can make

An Interview with Mrs. Martin Luther King

A FEW WEEKS AGO, a crew from CBC tv's Take 30 went to Atlanta, Georgia, to film an interview with Mrs. Martin Luther King Jr., the wife of the celebrated civil rights leader and Nobel Prize winner. The interview will be shown on Take 30 on Tuesday, December 28th. Here, Take 30 hostess Adrienne Clarkson, who conducted the interview, gives some of her impressions.

The week-end in Atlanta was a unique experience for all of us. First of all, Mrs. King herself is a most attractive woman; her physical beauty is enhanced by her calmness and control—a control that one senses is a result of self-discipline. Talking to her, one can see that she is completely caught up in the civil rights movement, not just because she happens to be the wife of its most famous leader, but because she is very involved in the struggle in her own right. As a singer, she gives "Freedom Concerts" across the country to raise money for the civil rights movement.

Martin Luther King Jr. himself is a direct, friendly, warm man, with the air of someone a bit preoccupied. But he is interested and direct, and his four children obviously adore him. On Friday evening, the children, ranging in age from nine to two, put on a theatrical performance for us. "The Yolanda King Winter Playhouse" (Yolanda, or Yoki, as she is called in the family, is the eldest daughter), performs usually on the week-ends when their father is home, and this was one of them. We joined the audience of about 15 people, who included the Martin Luther Kings Sr., and white and Negro friends of the Kings. Everyone seemed to enjoy and respect the performance and we all applauded madly. It was a delight to meet Martin Luther King Sr., who is an outgoing, almost explosively warm person; he told me that he could hardly believe the changes that had happened in the last 10 years, that he never thought he would live to see the Negro so emancipated.

Interviewing Mrs. King the next day, I was very moved by the courage of this woman, who knows that her husband might be killed any day. She seems to see herself and her husband as part of a larger pattern, in which

they are totally involved, but not submerged or insignificant. When she told me of the bombing of their house in Alabama and the stabbing of her husband by a maniac, her eyes filled with tears but her voice remained calm and assured. She doesn't ever minimize the dangers, but she has accepted her role completely.

The high point of the visit to Atlanta for us was the church service at Ebenezer Baptist Church, where Martin Luther King Jr. is co-pastor with his father. The congregation is middle-class and fairly well-to-do (we noticed quite a few mink stoles in the congregation, even though the temperature was in the high 70s) and it seemed that they had all turned

Canada may become the world's leading oil producer by the end of this century, this survey shows on CANADA 99, Monday, December 27th.

JUST AS each man may use his energy to create or destroy, to liberate or enslave, so it is with a nation. The commercial energy of our nation is petroleum.

Now, 99 years after Confederation, Canada has fully entered the petroleum age. Indeed, by the turn of this century, Canada could well lead the rest of the world in petroleum production, the basic commercial energy of mankind.

For its second program in the documentary series *Canada 99*, which CBC tv is presenting as a prelude to the Centennial of Confederation, the past, present and future of the Canadian petroleum industry will be examined. It will be seen on Monday, December 27th at 9:00 p.m. (pre-empting *Show of the Week* on this occasion only).

The sub-title for the program is *All Hell for a Basement*, from a remark attributed to the English writer Rudyard Kipling when he first gazed at the flaring gas wells of Medicine Hat, Alberta. Today, more than half a century later, many of the city's industries continue to operate off its natural gas supplies.

But it is petroleum in its liquid form, crude oil, that is the big moneymaker, the stuff of

fortunes and booms, land plays and myths. In this century, the province of Alberta has proved more than bountiful with its crude oil supplies.

On February 13th, 1947, Imperial Leduc No. 1, on the outskirts of Edmonton, came in with a hiss and a gush that was to launch the biggest resource boom in Canadian history. Within a year, 222 wells had been drilled, most of them hitting the pay zone. In the 16 years after Leduc, twelve billion dollars rolled its way into the Alberta oil industry from all parts of the globe, for oil spells money in all languages. And it's in northern Alberta, on the banks of the Athabasca River, that Canada is pinning its petroleum hopes for the future. It's estimated that the fabled Athabasca tar sands contain over half of the world's known petroleum reserves.

To tell the fascinating story of petroleum, CBC production crews travelled widely throughout Canada, filming in the oil fields of Alberta and at refineries at Sarnia, Montreal and on the West Coast.

All Hell for a Basement was produced by Michael Rothery and written by Ben Maartman under the direction of executive producer Thom Benson. The host is J. Frank Willis.



Where is "The Golden Voice" Now?

*Wishart Campbell is visited at his home in the
Scottish Highlands, Thursday, December 30th on TELESCOPE.*

THE FIRST vocalist to be heard on coast-to-coast radio in Canada was Wishart Campbell, the man who came to be known as "The Golden Voice of the Air." Campbell was at various times throughout his career a teacher, danceband leader, singer, composer, and musical director of a radio station in Toronto. Outside of his professional life he was also a director of the Clan Campbell Association in Toronto.

Listeners who remember his familiar voice may wonder what has happened to Wishart Campbell in recent years. No mystery. He just went "home"—home being not the place he was born, Oro Station, Ontario, but the traditional home of the Clan Campbell of Argyll in Scotland.

Wishart's father, Dr. Neil Campbell, came to Canada from the Isle of Islay in the Inner Hebrides in the late 19th century and became minister of a Presbyterian Church at Oro Station. In 1959 Wishart made the pilgrimage home to Islay to find the croft where his father had been born. The ruins of the croft, the wild beauty of the islands, the hospitality of the people, and the enchantment of Scotland profoundly affected him. At Inverary Castle he met the Chieftain of all the Campbells, the Duke of Argyll, who was to become his good friend and patron. When Campbell returned to Canada all the impressions of his father's land haunted his mind and he began to compose a series of songs, in collaboration with Gavin Creed, under the collective title *A Campbell Comes Home*. Creed, another Scot, was a friend from the war years, when he and Campbell had collaborated on what is still a popular RCAF hymn, *The Airman's Prayer*.

Campbell went back to Scotland the following year for a clan rally at Inverary Castle, taking with him a recording of *A Campbell Comes Home*. The *Glasgow Herald* reported "... the living tradition was represented most successfully by Mr. Wishart Campbell of Toronto, who brought with him a record of songs composed and sung by himself—all celebrating the beauties of Argyll, and all with titles like *Come Ye Back to Inverary*. He was the undoubted star of the ceilidh."

If the exact meaning of ceilidh escapes you for the time being, *Telescope* provides the opportunity to find out on this week's program *The Blood Is Strong, The Heart Is Highland*.

Wishart takes the viewer on a tour of Islay and explains what the island means to him and why he decided to settle there. He is now married to the owner of one of the island's few industries—a whisky distillery—and returns to North America each year to help promote sales.

THE FRENCH have always been able to make good films, but in recent years they've been making more of them. A decade ago the French cinema enjoyed a resurgence and perhaps a wider popularity than ever before with the emergence of the New Wave, a group of talented young directors mostly drawn from the ranks of the critical journal *Cahiers du Cinema*. The great names of the French

cinema — Cocteau, Vigo, Clement, Renoir, Clair—were being jostled aside by Malle, Vadim, Resnais, Truffaut. And along with the new directors there were the new stars they helped to create — notably Bardot and Moreau. Jeanne Moreau was, of course, an accomplished actress long before the New Wave got under way, but it was through Francois Truffaut that she began (Please turn to page 27)

out to hear Martin Luther King Jr. preach his monthly sermon (his wife estimated that he is away three weeks out of every month). The choir sang the hymns with such vigor that I couldn't hear my own voice; during the anthems, the choir clapped their hands and the congregation stamped their feet. The enthusiasm, the directness of their response was a complete revelation. Mrs. King Sr. played the organ, Mrs. King Jr. sang solos, Pastor King Sr. ran the service, and young Martin preached; so it was really a family affair.

The sermon was on the text from Matthew which exhorts us to love those that hate us, do good unto those that revile us. It was overwhelming to sit in that congregation and hear these people murmur "Yes, that's right," "Amen, brother" to these wonderfully loving words; by the time the sermon ended a half an hour later, I was tearful, as I think we all were in varying degrees, because the power of love was so beautifully expressed. King emphasized that the Negro cause must never resort to violence, that to love and forgive was stronger and more moral than to respond in violence.

WE'VE JUST had a perfectly ghastly thought. What if the over-cast skies above Oxfordshire on July 4th, 1862, had opened and sent all pleasure-seekers scurrying home in the rain? What if the Reverend Charles Litwidge Dodgson and his clerical friend had developed colds, boils, wrenched shoulders, or anything to prevent that river picnic with the three little Liddell girls a century ago? What if they had never even met? The possibilities are thoroughly frightening. The world would be much less fun without *Alice in Wonderland*, which, after 100 years, is still among the bookshops' 10 or 15 juvenile bestsellers.

Alice's admirers are legion — not just among the lollipop set, but among many elderly "children" who equate her with a precious, untrammelled part of their lives that is gone forever, except in memory. But most of them don't realize that the miracle isn't Alice's extraordinary ability to squeeze down the rabbit hole and plunge into a series of adventures with some of the most remarkable creatures any child ever met. The wonder of it is that she ever came into existence at all for the rest of us, for her first appearance was one of the most casual, unplanned grand entrances ever made — a howling success with her audience of four, mind you, but no one, least of all her shy creator, suspected that she would last longer than the moment.

Dodgson was a mathematics don at Christ Church, Oxford, a retiring young man with such a bad stutter that he felt more at home in the company of children, particularly little girls, than with their more critical, impatient elders. He was one of the best photographers of children in the Victorian period,

and some of his favorite subjects were the small daughters of Dean Liddell of Christ Church. Dodgson took them on many excursions, but it is the river picnic of July 4th, 1862, in which we are especially interested.

He and his friend Canon Duckworth rowed 10-year-old Alice Liddell and her two sisters up the river to Godstow, and the girls demanded that Dodgson tell them a fairy story enroute, with, Alice insisted, "some nonsense in it." "I distinctly remember," Dodgson wrote long afterwards, "how in a desperate attempt to strike out on some new line of fairy-lore, I had sent my heroine straight down a rabbit hole, to begin with, without the least idea what was to happen afterwards." So he fell back on the adventures they had all had on an earlier picnic, during a heavy rain, when he had insisted that Alice Liddell was causing a flood with her tears.

The children were enthralled by his story, and after the picnic Alice begged Dodgson to write it down for her, which he did. Later he added to and revised it, and eventually was persuaded to have it published — but only after other young friends had tested it and declared they "wished there were 60,000 volumes of it." It was published in 1865, under the pseudonym of Lewis Carroll, which Dodgson arrived at by translating his Christian names into Latin, reversing them, and turning them back into English.

A radio dramatization of *Alice in Wonderland* by Lister Sinclair will be presented on *CBC Stage* on Sunday, December 26th, at 1:00 p.m., with production by Esse W. Ljungh.

swered "Yes," they sought out the priest and were shortly launched on that great adventure, the universal lottery of marriage — only to discover that, unlike other gambles, they couldn't tear up their tickets if they lost.

Since this is the season when proposals are almost as numerous as carols, when marriages still fresh or gone sour often become more so, CBC tv's *Festival* decided to take a look at the ancient institution of marriage — with wit and wisdom, hilarity and tolerance, in keeping with this festive time. Accordingly, on Wednesday night, December 29th, viewers are invited to enjoy *No Two People*, prepared by Stan Daniels, who describes it as "a collection, pot-pourri, salad, menagerie of aphorisms, verses, theatre pieces, words, concerning, pertaining to, touching upon the institution, establishment, way of life, social form, fact, known as marriage — neither a complete nor representative nor particularly fair anthology, but a more-or-less random sampling of thoughts and feelings on the matter, by minds great and not so great."

It's an impudent but extremely funny approach to a serious subject, and Norman Campbell's polished direction keeps it light, sophisticated and thoroughly entertaining.

to move in the magic circle of the young intellectuals. Prior to this she had already made about 20 rather indifferent films, the only exception being Malle's *Les Amants* which won a prize at the Venice Festival and critical acclaim for her acting.

Truffaut's introduction led to a period of creativity in which she made some of her best films—*Les Liaisons Dangereuses*, *Le Dialogue des Carmelites*, and *Moderato Cantabile*.

She says of this period: "I found myself among people I understood better, people I wanted to know, people I admired. The cinema began to mean something to me beyond simply being an actress."

As a child her ambition was not to be an actress but to be a dancer like her mother, who was an Englishwoman with the famous Tiller Girls in the mid-20s. Later, when she was in her teens, Jeanne saw *Phaedre* performed at the Comedie Francaise. It was then she knew what she really wanted out of life. After studying at the Conservatoire National d'Art Dramatique for more than a year, she finally made her professional debut at the Comedie Francaise in Turgenev's *A Month in the Country*.

On *The Sixties* this week Jeanne

Moreau, in an exclusive North American television interview with Ray de Boer, discusses those early years and her subsequent rise as one of the greatest international screen stars of today. Her latest film, *Viva Maria!*, which opened in New York recently, is the story of two dance-hall girls in *fin de siecle* Mexico during a revolution. Starring with her is Brigitte Bardot. *Viva Maria!*, she feels, provides an opportunity to dispel at least one male myth about the friendship of women. "Films," she says, "have never shown the kind of relationship that can exist between two women. Men like to think that women must be constantly jealous of each other, never trusting, never in rapport. That is not true, of course, certainly not today. This film could show that. . . . I do like women and there is a complicity between me and other women. I find very easy the relationship between women, easier than between men and women."

The interview with Jeanne Moreau, which was filmed in Paris, will be accompanied on *The Sixties* with selections from some of her films, including *Les Amants* and *Jules et Jim*. *The Sixties* is produced in Ottawa by Cameron Graham. Christina McDougall is the program organizer for the series.

In Kidney they celebrate New Year's Eve with a house-smashing party, while in Fylch all the men of the village spend the entire day up to midnight kicking the stone of their choice. Jack Duffy and John O'Leary will be reporting on these time-honored customs—which have sprung, full-fledged, from the imaginations of writers Stan Daniels and Martin Lavut, who also double as performers on the show.

The New Year's Eve special serves as a show-case for the talents of Don Gillies and Connie Campbell, Vanda King, Mary Lou Collins, John Rutter, Norma Locke, and Marilyn Stuart. Producer Paddy Sampson and the show's designer, Dick Lambert, have devised some exciting visual effects for the dance numbers, choreographed by Don Gillies and Connie Campbell and set to music by composer/arranger Norman Symonds. The two principal dancer/choreographers worked closely with the producer and designer to create an eye-popping ballet, based on the current op-art trend, in which the two dancers move in a world of moire patterns, concentric circles, wavy lines, half-tone dots, and zig-zags.

Following the National News telecast on Friday night, His Excellency Major-General Georges P. Vanier, D.S.O., M.C., C.D., broadcasts his New Year's Eve message to the nation at 11:09 p.m. on television. On radio the Governor General's address will be heard at 9:07 p.m. (8:07 on CBX and CBR).

Craine, will introduce the rest of the evening's entertainment, at 6:15 p.m. (5:15 in Alberta) *Letter to An Older Generation*, presents the views of young people in various parts of Canada. They include a labor leader, a columnist, an MP, a teacher, and a university student, who express their opinions about the country and their concern for its future. Dr. Sandy Stern, a young Toronto doctor and song-writer, has written the music which links the program. Larry Glover is the producer.

Immediately after a newscast, the first part of *New Year's International* will be broadcast. This program is in three parts and continues for two hours. Prepared by the International Service of the CBC, *New Year's International* is a world-wide roundup of celebrations taking place in various countries.

Maritimes Greets 1966 comes from Halifax and is followed by *One Year From Tonight*. Commentators in every province will describe historic sites that many people will be visiting during Centennial Year in Canada — one year from midnight. The places being prepared for the Centennial include Fort Louisburg in Nova Scotia, the home of Sir John Tilley in New Brunswick, the McBride Museum in the Yukon, Fort Steele in British Columbia, and many other historic buildings in the provinces. Summing up the plans for Centennial Year will be John Fisher, the Centennial Commissioner.

As the night progresses, each time region in Canada will be visited for a description of New Year's celebrations.

short shrift of sham and pomposity in others.

He was born in England, but Canada has enjoyed the direct sunshine of his talent and personality for 55 years, for 45 of which he has been organist and choirmaster of the Church of St. Mary Magdalene in Toronto. Last year he resigned from his post as official organist for the University of Toronto. But in addition to directing and composing for choirs, he is still music director for the Diocese of Toronto Summer School Choir, which he organized 11 years ago, and is editing his scores and other material for publication and performance — most notably his opera *Deirdre*, which was given its first stage performance in Toronto last spring, and is scheduled for inclusion in the Canadian Opera Company's season next year. And, of course, he is enjoying life and his many friends to the full — in his junk shop, which he calls his study at home, with its countless mementoes and ordered clutter, and at his club — a portly, forthright figure in tweed jacket, a home-made cigarette dangling from the corner of his mouth, eyes twinkling impishly, witticisms flying in his wake.

But he glares balefully when he's displeased, and can be a terror at choir rehearsal, when his

Irish is up. In spite of occasional growliness, he is universally loved, not just for the tremendous gift of music he has given the world—over 300 published works — but also for the warmth and sympathy of his expansive, effervescent nature.

Some fine examples of Dr. Willan's work for the church and the concert hall will be presented on radio this week. On Boxing Day, December 26th, in radio's *Concerts From Two Worlds* series, Sir Ernest MacMillan will conduct the Toronto Symphony Orchestra in a performance of Willan's *Concerto in C Minor* for piano and orchestra, with Sheila Henig as soloist. The *Concerto* is a large-scale work, in one continuous movement with three sections. The first is a lively *allegro* with an energetic introduction; the second is a sensitively lyrical *adagio*; and the third is a spirited *allegro* based on one of those fine, broad singing tunes so characteristic of the composer and his early background. It was given its first performance on CBC radio in 1944.

On *CBC Tuesday Night*, December 28th, at 9:30, The Festival Singers of Toronto, conducted by Elmer Iseler, will present *Eight Motets for the Church Year*, of which two, *Behold the Tabernacle* (Trinity) and *Hodie Christus Natus Est* (Christmas) are by Dr. Willan.

western world. But perhaps the most striking feature of all about these young people behind the Iron Curtain was that they were, in most cases, not only individualistic and critical but prepared to come out openly with their comments, both among themselves and to us."

White gloves and bow ties may seem startling features of a dancing class in a Communist State, but in Czechoslovakia some young people still prepare for the social round in the strictest of bourgeois traditions. Formal lessons in dancing and etiquette are attended by dressmakers, typists, factory apprentices, mechanics and electrical engineers. The dancing master, too, is employed by the State.

Kee says "We had thought of trying to convey the special character of Czech youth by comparing them with the youth of their neighbor, Austria. But a few days in Prague (preceded by a short reconnaissance in Vienna) were enough to show us that the story was more interesting than that. For in spite of the utterly different political context, Czech youth was, in its attitudes, strikingly similar to that of Austria. How had this come about in a state that was for long the most severe and Stalinist of Communist satellites?"

"This sort of thing is not something you can write straightforwardly into a film script; it is a feeling that has to be absorbed invisibly, an atmosphere that must assert itself rather than appear in the form of a plain statement. I think what helped us most was a remark made by one of the few Party members we met who seemed able to take in his stride the attitudes of modern Czech youth today. 'You can't bring children up on revolutionary principles,' he said, 'and expect them not to be revolutionary in their turn.' And it was from this concept of the Revolution in 1948 as parent that we created the mood of our film about the lives of young Czechs today."

CBC Stars Entertain Cyprus Troops

THE CBC has again been asked to entertain UN troops stationed in Cyprus. Accordingly, a star-packed CBC Concert Party visited the Mediterranean island, from December 5th to 14th. They put on six shows for UN troops in Cyprus.

This CBC troupe were the tenth to travel overseas at the request of the United Nations—through the co-operation of the department of national defence—since 1961. UN troops in the Middle East, Europe and Cyprus have enjoyed performances by a series of top CBC variety artists during this time.

The CBC radio network show *Cyprus Showcase* will broadcast highlights of the tour on Sunday afternoon, December 26th.

There are about 1,000 servicemen in the Canadian contingent serving with UN forces in Cyprus. Last December a visit by a CBC Concert Party proved so popular the commander of the Canadian contingent, Col. J. L. Drewry, invited the CBC to send a troupe again this year.

In addition to the Canadian contingent, soldiers of other nationalities serving with the UN Cyprus forces were among the audiences for the shows. The CBC group also staged a show for a permanent British sovereign base on the island.

Host of the CBC's Cyprus show is Gordie Tapp—marking the seventh time he has performed this job for the CBC's Forces Showcase overseas trips. Stars of this year's show are: dancer-comedienne Jean Christopher, who has been seen on many CBC tv shows; Doug Crosley, well-known Canadian vocalist; champion fiddler Al Cherny who has been on several previous overseas tours; Bob Downey, an illusionist who has been on two previous tours; Daniele Dorice, a singer from Quebec City who has performed in theatres and night clubs throughout the world and who accompanied a CBC Concert Party to the Middle East earlier this year; and The Lounsbury Sisters, a baton duo who have been on five previous overseas tours and have been seen on many Canadian and U.S. tv shows.

During the Cyprus tour, Gordie Tapp taped a special show for his CBC radio series *The Gordie Tapp Show*, to be broadcast on Monday, December 20th, from 1:15 to 1:45 p.m.

Executive producer of *Cyprus Showcase* is Ken Dalziel, who has been at the helm for all the previous CBC Forces Showcases. The director is John Cantelon.
