# around CBC

THE SECOND broadcast in the series *Listening to Pictures*, scheduled for *Trans-Canada Matinee* Friday, March 11th on CBC radio, will not be heard in Western Canada because of the broadcast of the Canada-Russia game in the World Hockey Tournament. So that listeners will not lose the continuity, the lecture will be heard on *Trans-Canada Matinee* Monday, March 14th. As well, it will be heard Saturday, March 12th at 10:00 a.m. on *Saturday AM*.

World Hockey coverage this week will include the Canada vs. Czechoslovakia game Thursday, starting at 6:30 a.m. CST/5:30 a.m. MST, and the above-mentioned game, Friday at 1:30 p.m. CST/12:30 p.m. MST.

FOR THE SMALL investment of \$10 a month each, nine Winnipeg women are having an exciting and interesting time learning about the stock market. AN IMPORTANT function of the provincial universities on the Prairies is agricultural research. Many of the hardy strains raised here have been developed or improved by researchers and students as a constructive exercise in learning.

In three programs on CBC-TV's *Country Calendar*, March 6th, April 3rd and May 1st, the three Prairie universities will be visited for a look at the research projects now underway, and the facilities available for research.

At the University of Alberta, visited on the first program March 6th, Bill Owen of CBC Edmonton tours his alma mater to learn about changes made since he was a student there. Included in the interesting projects is a cross-breeding experiment with sheep, using X-rays to study the resultant lambs. Growth chambers for winter-time crop experiments are seen, and three students in agriculture—one a girl—are interviewed to find their reaction to university life.

George Price and Dave Innes will be commentators for the University of Saskatchewan visit April 3rd. George will interview a prospective agriculture student and, with Dave, will visit the university campus to show the young man what goes on in the agriculture department.

Plans for the University of Manitoba visit, May 1st, still are being drawn up.

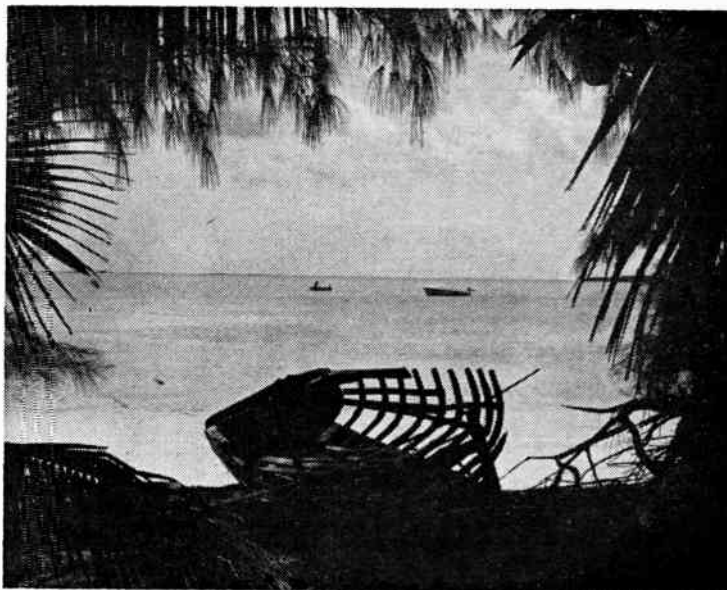
Andros is the biggest of the Bahama Islands, about 1,250 miles due south of Hamilton, and is one of the least-known and relatively unspoiled of the Bahamas.

Ten years ago the Birch brothers decided they'd had enough of Canadian winters and the pressures of city life, so they sold their men's-wear business and took their wives and children to where they could pursue beach-combing and skin-diving. Today they own a resort and a tidy piece of the island.

*The Birches of Andros* was

## TV Dramas Leave the Studio

THIS WEEK *Bob Hope Theatre* and *Show of the Week* will present two outstanding hour-long dramas filmed on location. On Wednesday night, March 9th, at 8:30, *Bob Hope Theatre* offers *Tell Them the Streets Are Dancing* by Phillip Hersch. It was produced and directed by Ronald Weyman, executive producer-director in the CBC-TV drama department, and was filmed by Grahame Woods on Toronto streets and in the homes and meeting-places of the large Italian community. It stars John Vernon, fresh from his Broadway success in the *Royal Hunt of the Sun*, and Bruno Gerussi. On Monday night, March 7th, at 9.00, *Show of the Week* presents *Hero at Hatch's Mill*, a period drama by George Salverson. It was produced and directed by Norman Campbell and stars Robert Christie, Cosette Lee, and special guest star Jonathan White. Its exteriors were filmed in Pioneer Village in the Black Creek Conservation area near Toronto, a collection of reconstructed early Canadian buildings historically accurate in style and detail. Studio sets were designed by Robert Lawson, and costumes by Stevie Calder.

The locale of *Hero At Hatch's Mill* is a small community in Upper Canada in the restless 1830s at the time of the Mackenzie Rebellion. About 40 to 50 miles from Toronto, it is on the main route to points north. Over this rough thoroughfare travel all sorts of people; circus performers, militia, criminals, fur traders, adventurers, settlers venturing into the unknown vastness of Canada with their hearts in their mouths and practically nothing in their pockets. The leading family at Hatch's Mill is, of course, the one that gave the commu-

# HERITAGE:

## In Praise of LOVE . . .

*A visual poem on the many aspects of  
love is seen Sunday at 3:30 p.m. on CBC-TV.*

RECENTLY poet Robert Graves admitted that "There's never been a moment when I wasn't in love. The only things I believe in, really, are love and honor. "Love, that blind, mind-numbing, delirious, soft captivity, a bittersweet miracle not to be missed. It has toppled thrones, won wars, turned shepherds into heroes, and made helpless idiots out of the intelligent and resolute. Without love poverty

would be unbearable and riches boring, age unthinkable and youth wasted. Millions have tasted it and been incapable of describing it. Others have written books about it and have not begun to pin it down satisfactorily. But two poetic mystics from Europe, Antoine de Saint-Exupéry and Rainer Marie Rilke, have given us some of the most delightful definitions of love. Saint-Exupéry told us: "Love does not exist in gazing at each other but in looking together in the same direction." And Rilke said: "Love consists of this, that two solitudes protect and touch and greet each other."

An ephemeral thing, love. Everywhere, yet never in the same place twice. It turns up in the most outrageous circumstances, blooms between the most unlikely people. It thrives where life is too arid even for a cactus, but it can die in what seem the most ideal conditions. Casanova, who probably did as much research on the subject as anyone, warned that "the gentle delights of peace are preferable by far to the charms of love; but one does not think so when one is in love." Dr. Samuel Johnson, who got about a good deal and saw love in all its stages of delight and despair, didn't think much of it, at least, not in its romantic form. "It is commonly a weak man who marries for love," he maintained, and then went on to say that "If you would shut up any man with any woman, so as to make them derive their whole pleasure from each other, they would inevitably fall in love, as it is called, with each other." So much for romance, and love at first sight.

But to scoff at love as a sour delight is to risk the wrath of the ghosts of such famous lovers as Paris and Helen, Lord Nelson and Lady Hamilton, Napoleon and Josephine, Romeo and Juliet, and the others who have immortalized hearts-and-flowers love.

From the days when the caveman fought for his mate with a club to the era when young Lotharios slew dragons just for a smile from their tower-dwelling sweethearts, right up through the days of Victoria, when love was still on a pedestal and gentlemen were gallant, that old black magic flourished bravely. But

# FESTIVAL

## Igor Stravinsky and Richard Burton

*Two highly talented, vastly dissimilar men are viewed on CBC-TV Wednesday, March 9th, at 9:30 p.m.*

A LITTLE over three years ago composer Igor Stravinsky came to Canada to participate in CBC radio and television programs honoring him on his 80th birthday. Since then he has returned on several occasions to work with Canadian musicians in the performance of his works. Impressed by the high standards of the CBC Symphony Orchestra and the Festival Singers of Toronto, with whom he collaborated in the *Festival* production of 1962, *Stravinsky at 80*, he selected them to record for Columbia one of his major works, *Symphony of Psalms* (1930), for chorus and orchestra.

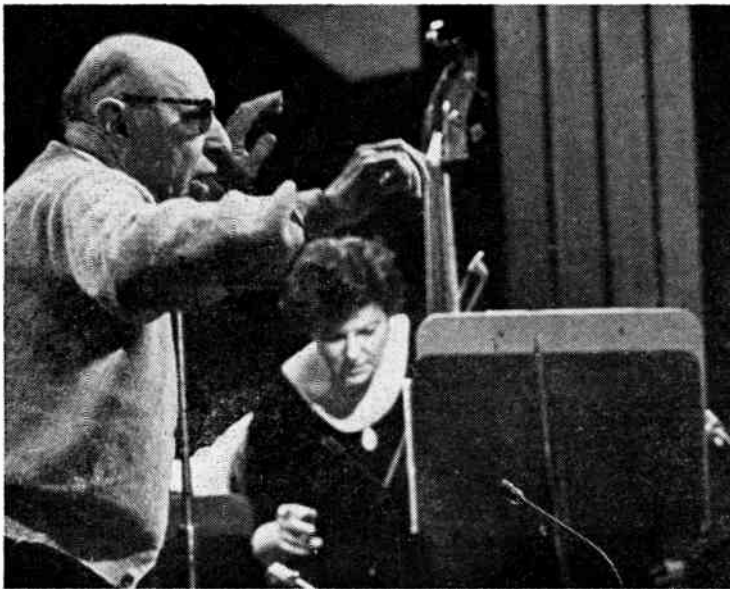
This week on *Festival* viewers will see a film, (jointly produced by the CBC and the NFB), of the recording session at Toronto's Massey Hall, a backstage glimpse of the master at work, striving to achieve perfection. Between rehearsals Stravinsky is seen chatting with an unexpected visitor – lutanist Julian Bream, who was in town for a recital. There is a brief interview with Madame Stravinsky, and other scenes show the composer's young associate Robert Craft, and the recording supervisor John McClure.

Stravinsky is seen relaxing aboard ship as the camera follows him on a voyage to Europe. In Germany he is seen with his longtime friend, the Russian composer Nicolas Nabokoff, now Director-General of the Congress of Cultural Freedom. *Stravinsky* (Wednesday, March 9th at 9:30 p.m.) was directed by Roman Kroiter and Wolf Koenig, with commentary by Don Brittain. now that the psychiatrists, radio, TV, and the admen have gotten their hands on it, it's becoming a rather grim science, as commercialized as bread, and as likely to go stale quickly.

But romantic love is still alive, though shaky, fighting a battle with automation and the frantic speed of life these days. **Happily, the florists and candy-makers** are on the side of Cupid, and if they have their way, romance is going to die slowly, if it has to die.

Vincent van Gogh once remarked that "the best way to know God is to love many things." For, of course, there are many kinds of love. We not only say, "I love you," but also, "I love Uncle Willie," "I love ice-cream," "I love spring in the park," "I love children at play," . . . and travel, and wine—and "I just adore lemon pie." Love is not all valentines. It's too big for that.

And to illustrate this on Sunday,

March 6th, TV's *Heritage* presents an unusual visual poem, *In Praise of Love*, written by George Salverson. It's a gentle look at the many faces of love, seen principally through the eyes of an old man and a teen-aged couple sunning themselves in front of Toronto's new city hall. The old man is dreaming of love. The young people are discovering it. Richard Knowles, who produced and directed the program, has employed an interesting technique. When the old man thinks of anything not actually in front of him, he thinks in "stills" instead of in action film, giving these scenes an unusual texture and a timeless quality. Love is shown in its infinite variety around the old man as he sits in the park, puffing at his pipe and ruminating about "the thing that never lasts but goes on forever."

The film cameraman was Norman Allin, with still photography by Dale Barnes. Ron Garant was the film editor, and research was by Jim St. Marie. The old man is played by Charles Sivell, with Tommy Tweed as his voice.

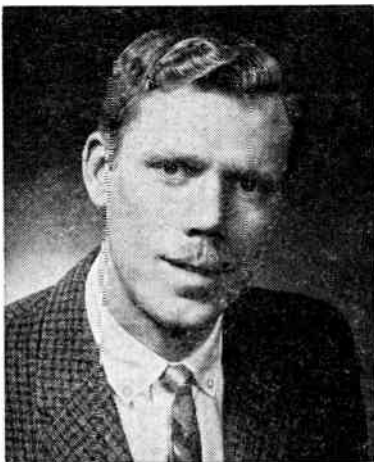

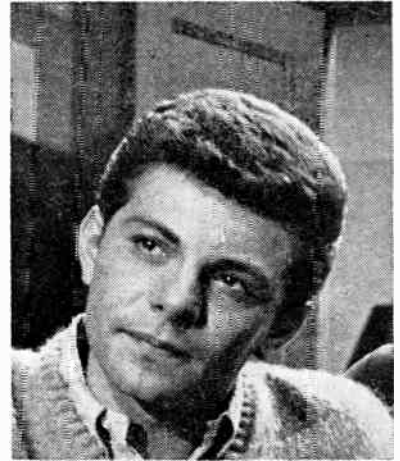

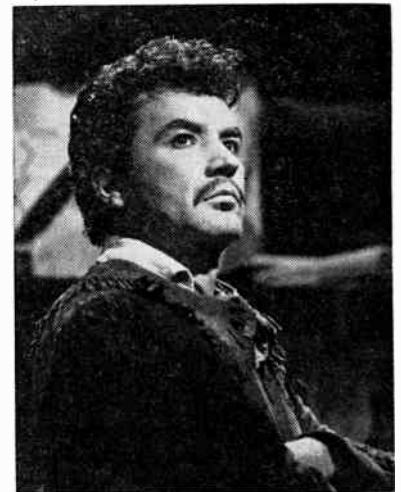

materials essential for the survival of mankind.

The first program (Thursday, March 10th) is sub-titled *In the Beginning* and reviews current scientific data about the origin of the earth, the formation of oceans and the evolution of life from the single cell through a myriad of creatures up to man himself. *The Chain of Life* (March 17th) focuses on the interdependence of all living creatures inhabiting the waters, from those which frequent the sunlit surface waters to those that live in the deeps.

*The Sun, the Moon, the Sea* (March 24th) concerns meteorology, the importance of ocean currents in relation to climatic conditions, and the part the sun and the moon play in determining weather conditions and tides on our planet. Percy Saltzman will be seen on this program discussing the science of meteorology. The fourth program, *Descent to the Depths*, is an account of the ingenuity of man in developing diving machinery and equipment to carry out underwater exploration. In the final program, *The Last Frontier*, we see how oceanography is helping to overcome problems arising from an ever growing population and diminishing supplies of raw materials and fresh water.

Film for this series was obtained from many sources around the world. In addition, a good deal of footage was obtained by a CBC production unit which joined a research vessel of the Great Lakes Institute, the *C.C.G.S. Porte Dauphine*, on a survey cruise in Georgian Bay, Ont.

*The Depths Beneath* was written by Rose Wilcox and Marcus Van Steen, and produced by Doug Davison. Program organizer: Stu Gilchrist. Teacher-consultants on the series: David Craigie, of the University of Toronto, and John Lewis, of Toronto Teachers' College.

Girls of the village bring news that Nemorino's rich uncle is dead and has made him sole heir. They all try to capture him and he believes the love potion is taking effect. Dulcamara likewise offers his love potion to Adina, but she refuses it, believing that she has lost Nemorino for ever. Adina purchases his release from the army which proves her love and they embrace. Belcore resigns his pretensions to Adina's hand and Dulcamara, who pretends to attribute the happy result to the efficacy of his love potion, does a good business in the village.

## Jazz Pianist Oscar Peterson

AN INFORMAL hour of conversa-  
tion and music with the great jazz  
pianist Oscar Peterson will be pre-  
sented this Sunday on radio's *Proj-

# An Asian Views Viet Nam

IN JULY, 1954, representatives of the French Union Forces in Indo-China and the People's Army of Viet Nam reached an agreement on the cessation of hostilities between the two. This was the now-famous declaration of the Geneva conference, which stated, among other articles, that general elections would be held two years later, in 1956. Now, a decade later, the country is still divided, still suffering the agony of war, and still without the free elections promised its people. What went wrong? To provide some answers to that question, Dr. K. W. Kim, of the department of political science at York University in Toronto, has prepared a series of six talks entitled *Viet Nam Perspective*, to be broadcast on radio's *The Best of Ideas*. In these lectures Dr. Kim deals with the relationship between colonialism, nationalism, and communism; the first Indo-Chinese war of 1946-54, with the French as the background to the current "Second Indo-Chinese War"; the significance of the Geneva Conference; the roles of North Viet Nam's President Ho Chi Minh and the late Ngo Dinh Diem, who deposed Emperor Bao Dai in 1955 to become Chief of State in the South. Dr. Kim also considers the fact and/or fiction of the two Viet Nams; the military versus the political factors; and the power politics of the United States and of China.

The first program, sub-titled *The Setting*, will be broadcast Monday, March 7th. Subsequent programs will cover: *Colonialism, Nationalism, Communism* (March 14th); *Geneva: Before and After* (March 21st); *The Two Viet Nams* (March

28th); *The War* (April 4th); and *Viet Nam: New Myths and Old Realities* (April 11th).

The most significant fact emerging from Dr. Kim's review is that external relations have always played a decisive role in Viet Nam, ever since the Chinese conquest in A.D. 111. Constant pressures from outsiders — Chinese, Portuguese, French, and now Americans—have resulted, says Dr. Kim, in an almost instinctive use by the Vietnamese of the foreign elements. He believes that, precisely because of the complexity involved in the historic, geographic, economic, and political Vietnamese spectra, the present situation can't be assessed solely or even primarily in the framework of Western liberalism. Dr. Kim is a native of Korea, born in the North and educated in the South. He came to North America to continue his studies and graduated from Williams College, Williamstown, Mass., in 1959. Later he received his Ph.D. in Political Science from Harvard University. In 1963 he was appointed a member of the faculty of York University. Dr. Kim has published a number of articles in various journals, including *Ideology and Political Development in South Korea*, published in the summer, 1965, edition of *Pacific Affairs*.

*The Best of Ideas*, broadcast Mondays at 10:30 p.m., and repeated on the FM network Tuesday afternoons at 3:30 p.m., is a selection from the series *The Best Ideas You'll Hear Tonight*, which is heard Monday through Friday on the FM network at 6:30 p.m. Janet Somerville is the producer, Phyllis Webb and William Young the program organizers.

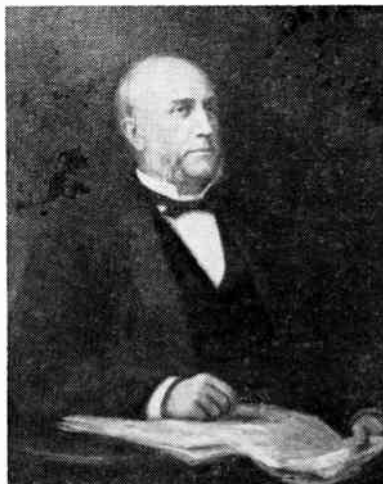
# The Fireball Who Founded The Globe

HE WAS a big-framed Scot of six-foot-three, with red hair, a ruddy complexion, enormous feet, large hands which he used expansively to emphasize his remarks, big ideas, and the fortitude to fight for them relentlessly against formidable odds. He laughed easily, he burned with energy and earnestness, and he was liked by both his elders and his contemporaries. He was George Brown, the fiery, forward-thinking founder of *The Globe* in Toronto, and one of the greatest Canadian champions of liberty, who helped enormously, personally and through his newspaper, to bring about Confederation.

The story of the rise of this forceful personality from an obscure immigrant journalist to one of the major political forces of the last

century, as dramatic and colorful a tale as any in our history, will be told on *CBC Tuesday Night*, March 8th, in a radio profile entitled *Big Geordie*. The script is by Joseph Schull, who based it on the biography *Brown of the Globe* by Professor J. M. Careless of the University of Toronto. This is Schull's first script for radio since his eight-year sabbatical to research and write his biography, *Laurier*, which grew out of Schull's two-part drama about Sir Wilfrid heard on CBC radio some years ago. Production is by J. Frank Willis, with music composed by Phil Nimmons and conducted by Samuel Hershoren.

George Brown and his merchant father left Scotland for New York when George was 18. The father's business had failed, and they were seeking a fresh start in the New World. They found it — through a shop and a small newspaper they published, in which George made himself unpopular by attacking the slave trade. After six years they settled in Toronto, where the British traditions were more to their liking. In 1843 the city was still an outpost; it had no gaslight, water was delivered to the door by vendors, and it could be reached only by ship or stage-coach. Shortly after establishing *The Globe* in 1844, with a hand-press and a primitive postal system as his only news link with the outside world, George Brown began changing the whole outlook of the city and then of the country. He fought against special privileges for church or class, and corruption, and for separation of church and state and the acquisition of the Canadian West. He was an arch foe of John A. Macdonald, but joined him in a coalition to fight for what he felt was the only answer to Canada's problems — Confederation. He resigned from the coalition later, but never gave up his fight for a Dominion of Canada, and played a leading role in the Charlottetown and Quebec Conferences.

# When British Parliamentarians Were Publicity Shy

*Voluminous reports in the press about deliberations of the House of Commons have been permitted for less than two centuries.*

TODAY WE TAKE IT for granted that when we send men to Parliament to talk on our behalf, we will be told what they talk about. When the newspaper of our choice arrives at our door we know it will tell us everything important that has transpired in Parliament in the last 24 hours. If we have the inclina-

tion, the time and the money, we can subscribe to *Hansard* and keep tab on every word uttered in Parliamentary sessions. But the vast majority of us prefer to depend on the newspapers to keep us informed about the Commons.

This precious freedom wasn't always ours. It was won only after long and bitter fighting in which some lost their lives, some were imprisoned or maimed, and others risked their all in defence of their belief that the people have the right to know what their representatives are doing for or against them in the House of Commons.

On succeeding Saturday nights, March 5th and 12th, *A Man At Westminster*, the colorful radio drama-documentary series about the growth of our freedoms in parliament through the centuries, presents two programs about the battle the Press fought for the right to report Parliamentary proceedings without censure or shackle. So many of the other freedoms we enjoy today are dependent on this first step. It was made by heroes as courageous, selfless and dramatic as any in our history. Among most of us they are unsung. Yet they served as the goad or the gadfly that wouldn't stop until it had pushed Parliament into admitting and often correcting some of the ills of our society which had robbed us of happiness, pride and independence for centuries.

Alan King, the author and painstaking researcher of this popular 26-week series, tells us that in Cromwell's time, and earlier, when the constituencies were in almost total ignorance of what went on in Parliament, men would take surreptitious notes there, share information over coffee at one of the inns, and write letters home to let family and neighbors know about

speeches in the House. But the Press was not allowed to publish reports on Parliamentary activities.

In 1732 Robert Cave began publishing regular accounts of Parliamentary debates in a publication he had recently introduced, *The Gentleman's Magazine* (copies of which are in the library of the University of Toronto) and escaped punishment by the skin of his teeth. He and a few pals would take notes as unobtrusively as possible in the Gallery of the Commons, compare and adjust them afterwards to make sure they hadn't left out anything important, and then give them to historian Sir William Guthrie or to young Dr. Samuel Johnson, who would write speeches from them as if they had occurred in the Session. Naturally these were not published as being straight from Parliament, but were presented as reports on the "Senate of Great Lilliput," but that didn't fool anyone but the law.

One of the best early press reporters was a chap called Memory Woodfall, who had almost total recall, and could nip into the Gallery, absorb hours of harangues, nip out and get it all down on paper with remarkable accuracy.

Not surprisingly, Parliament steamed furiously about what it considered a violent intrusion on its privacy, and summoned many printers to the bar of the House. They chose to ignore the order on most occasions. The Mayor of London fortunately refused to commit the culprits, and the House's prosecution failed. In the spring of 1771 the whole thing petered out in a typically British compromise in which nothing got down on paper. To this day there is no rule in the House of Commons permitting newspapers to print reports of Parliamentary sessions.

## TV DRAMAS

nity its name. The Hatches live in the big red inn by the pond. They consist of the patriarch, Noah Hatch (Robert Christie); his wife, Maggie (Cosette Lee); their son Saul (Marc Strange); and their daughter, Silence (Diana Leblanc). Hatch was the leading spirit behind the building of the mill, the tavern, the inn and the general store. Harry Peale, a rogue and petty thief (Johathan White), arrives in town and convinces the Hatches that he's a fur trader and in love with Silence. Their courting goes well until the British militia arrives, and the neurotic Colonel (Chris Wiggins) accuses Harry of being a rebel, and threatens to have him shot. Allen Doremus plays the Lieutenant. Eric Clavering appears as Jake, and Ed Kelly as Irish.

The interiors for the drama were shot in the studio, but all the exteriors turn the clock back with remarkable accuracy. Producer Campbell got into the spirit of the times by moving cameras over the

snow on pairs of toboggans strapped together.

In *Tell Them the Streets Are Dancing* the death of a young Italian construction worker as the result of Caisson sickness, an occupational disease, sends Dr. Stephen Felix Wojcek, a big-city chief coroner, on an investigation of working conditions in the tunnel where the young man worked, an investigation with explosive results, including an even more serious disaster in the same tunnel.

Cameraman Grahame Woods used a transistorized hand-held, shoulder-holster camera which allows for much greater mobility and realism in the action, particularly out of the studio. Woods took it into Toronto Western Hospital, St. Agnes's Church, an Italian café, and into Italian homes, where a floor camera would have made manoeuvring much more difficult. The result was documentary-type shooting, rarely possible under traditional TV drama set-ups. This was the first time the hand-held camera had been used through an entire CBC-TV drama department

production, but the technique was not new to Woods, for he has used it with great skill and artistry on other occasions, notably in the dramatic public affairs program *The Open Grave*, and in *The Gift*, a documentary about a survivor of the Hiroshima bombing.

John Vernon plays Dr. Wojcek, with Bruno Gerussi as Mario, a union official. There are over 135,000 Italians in Toronto—the largest Italian community outside Italy—and they have a thriving Little Theatre, *Piccolo Teatro*, from which Ron Weyman selected 10 or 12 principals and many extras for this production. Other performers were chosen from the rest of the Italian community; some of the construction workers in the play are the real thing.

Weyman tells us that location shooting offers much more scope to everyone concerned with a TV drama, beginning with the writer. "The amount of story material available as soon as you step out of a TV studio is almost endless," he says, "and the potential we have in the drama-documentary scene is what dramas and documentaries have not exploited to date. Canada has an international reputation for film documentaries, and most of our leading writers for TV and film learned their trade writing and researching for documentaries, and have a real eye for history. This, over the years, has resulted in excellent documentaries, but has had little reflection in good Canadian TV dramas. If we apply some of these techniques to dramatic expression, we are on to a whole new field of skills and story material.

"The coroner drama seemed to be the ideal vehicle for some of these unique skills. In the last year we couldn't open a paper without reading something about the field of the coroner. It contains an infinite amount of real-life documentary material easily transferable to dramatic terms if we write it as a documentary and shoot it as if it is happening for the first time right under our noses. The result is vigorous, direct, exciting, dynamic reality."

Mr. Hockey still transmits the game's excitement to his audience.

WILL FOSTER HEWITT ever retire?

"When I feel I can't make a contribution — I'll quit," says the veteran broadcaster. "But I don't feel I've reached that point yet. I don't want to hog the puck but as long as I feel I'm of use, and I enjoy it, I'll stay. When I feel I'm slipping I'll be quick to step down."

Hewitt, who's been the voice of hockey since the first game was broadcast in 1923 (between Toronto Parkdales and Kitchener Seniors), certainly has no immediate plans for retirement.

This season he's back with his first love — radio; his description of Toronto Maple Leafs' away games are broadcast "live" Sunday nights on CBC radio.

What does he think of the relative merits of TV versus radio? "I like television because it proves what you're saying is true — the audience can see what you're describing. But, speaking personally, I prefer radio: it gives me much more scope in describing the plays. On television you hold back on the talk because it's often superfluous but on radio you can go the limit on this kind of descriptive broadcasting."

Over the years "Mr. Hockey" has had many listener reactions to his broadcasts. "Most of the mail and phone calls I get now are strictly business: people wanting me to settle arguments about particular players or controversial plays. I've had to settle many bets for fans. The nice thing about all this is that they take my word for it. I've had calls from as far away as the Northwest Territories — at 4:00 in the morning."

Who are the personalities who have captured Hewitt's imagination during his lengthy career in broadcasting? "In the early '30s Howie Mornez of the Montreal Canadiens comes to mind. Later in the same decade Eddie Shore of the Boston Bruins was one of the most colorful characters. In the '40s

Sylvanus (Syl) Apps of the Leafs was my favorite. In more recent times I rate Gordie Howe of Detroit, Maurice Richard of Montreal and Bobby Hull of Chicago as some of the more outstanding player-personalities."

Has Mr. Hockey ever been bored at a hockey game? "Yes, I've been bored. Usually, the defensive type of game is boring. And I think it's important for the commentator to say when a game is bad. I do. Otherwise your audience may not believe you when you say it's a good game."

Hewitt joined the *Toronto Daily Star* as a reporter in 1922, the same week as Gordon Sinclair. He joined because the *Star* had one of the first commercial radio stations on the continent. His first hockey broadcast was made on that station in 1923.

"I never had the idea radio was just a gimmick as many people did at that time. I knew it was going to be important—but never thought it would be so important to me," says Hewitt.

## He's Not Quitting Yet

In his 43 years of hockey broadcasting he has had some distressing experiences. "The most frustrating came in 1928 when I was doing the play-by-play for a Toronto-Ottawa football game from Varsity Stadium, and it was darn cold. It was an exciting contest and I thought I was doing a pretty good job. After the game I found something had gone wrong in transmission and we hadn't actually broadcast a word."

Hewitt was elected to the Hockey Hall of Fame last year — the only radio-TV personality to receive that honor. And he continues to consolidate his position as Mr. Hockey via the Sunday night NHL broadcasts on CBC radio this season.
