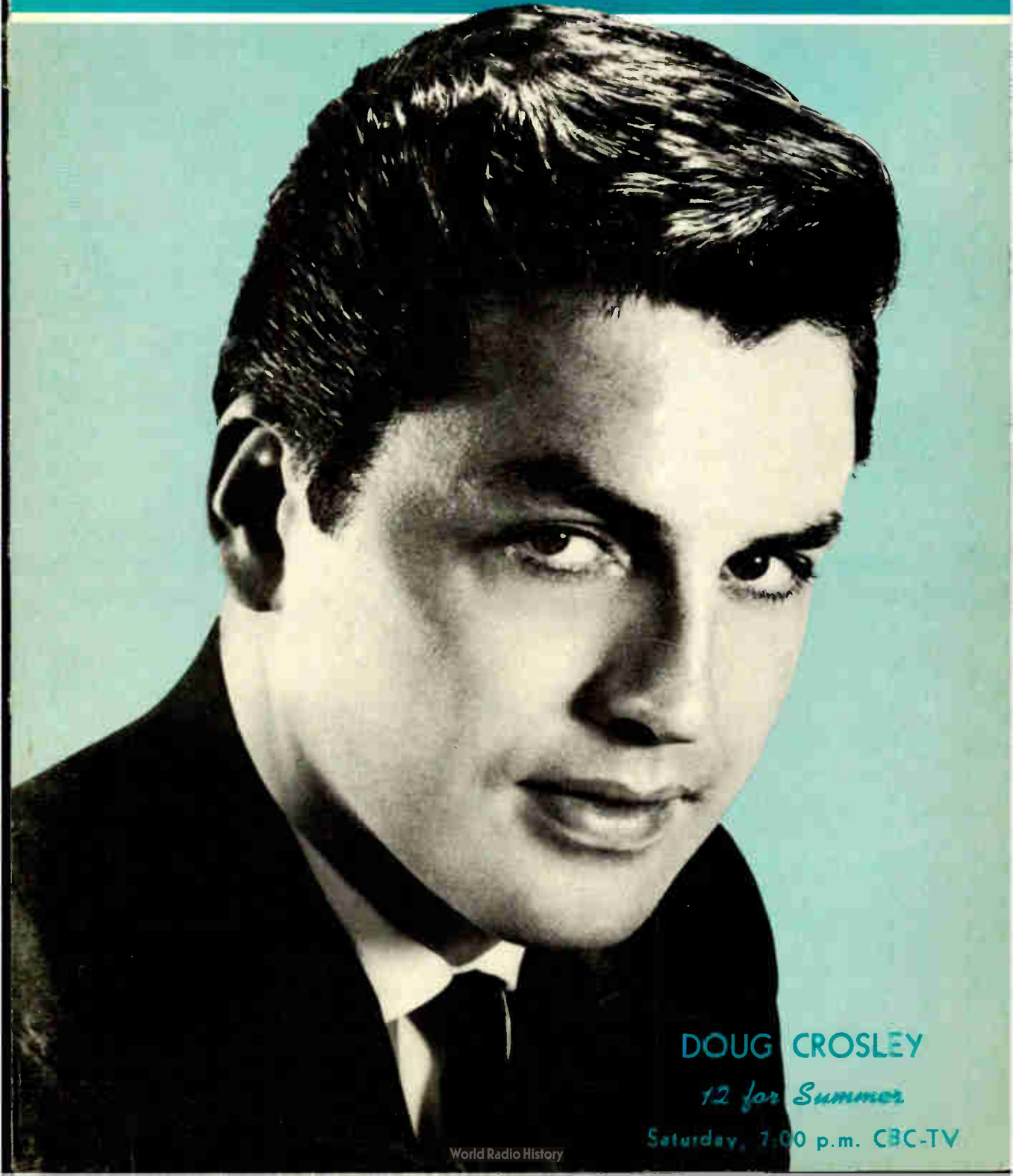

### Priceless Beyond Compare

• My husband and I sat tonight and listened to a program that has moved us, as nothing else that we have seen or heard on the air or on television has moved us, to put down on paper our feeling of intense gratitude to the CBC.

This program was John Reeves' production *If This is a Man* from the series *The Human Condition* (CBC radio, Friday, June 3rd). It brought home so forcibly to us the urgent need to guard ourselves and our fellow men against a recurrence of such horror. It brought home the bitter realization of how conditions can be created that will change men from brothers into animals whose only thought is for themselves.

The tendency today seems to let the past be and to cover up these happenings as some of the concentration camp mass graves have been covered with grass and landscaping. We are asked to welcome with open arms the perpetrators of these crimes.

Such programs as *If This is a Man* and the incomparable *This Hour Has Seven Days*—as well as *Document*—are priceless beyond compare and should be guarded against all intruders as jealously as one should guard the basic freedoms which democracy guarantees.

### Setting History Straight

• I have seen your program on Alberta's Ukrainians (CBXT) and have been impressed and wish to commend you on it. However, an historical point should be set straight. You state that two religious groups immigrated. Ukrainian Catholic and Ukrainian Orthodox. This is not so.

The first church established here was the Russian Greek Orthodox Catholic. Greek Catholic priests came later. Most Ukrainians here came from what was then Austria and were there Greek Catholic. Here, most converted to the universal Russian Orthodox Church. Later, a Winnipeg lawyer, a Mr. Wasyl Swistun, founded the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada.

The Ukrainian Orthodox Church was not sizeable until after the Bolshevik take-over in Russia. There was no large Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Ukraine; it is not a universal church.

This is just a small point of little interest to outsiders, but this is the correct history.

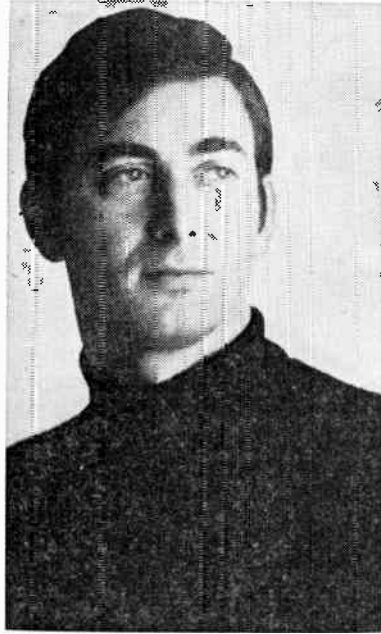

# The Music of Schubert



Allan Sangster introduces  
a new series Wednesday  
nights on CBC radio

FRANZ SCHUBERT was an ugly little barrel of a man, awkward and tongue-tied, with a bad complexion, a strong jaw and thick black hair, but his eyes peered through thick-lensed glasses with such startling penetration that one was conscious of a warm and exultant soul within, and something beautiful in this unprepossessing young fellow that demanded expression. It overflowed in great gushes of music, seemingly without effort.

Aside from the Strausses, he was the only Viennese master who was actually born there, in 1797, but his ancestral roots were in Moravia and Austria-Silesia. He was the 12th child of 14 born to a poor schoolmaster. An older brother, Ignaz, taught Franz to play the piano, and his father gave him violin lessons,

# KEEP COOL! (OR WARM) . . .

*The Nature of Things* explores the many systems of controlling temperature, humidity and air pressure . . .  
Monday at 7:30 on CBC-TV.

WHEN BEES WANT TO VENTILATE their hives, they stand outside and fan like mad. Spacemen go for a jaunt in the wild blue yonder carrying a variety of briefcase which doesn't contain the customary sandwich but is the latest scientific guarantee of temperature, pressure and humidity control while they're aloft. Of course Adam and Eve had the cheapest and least complicated idea of all for making dog-days liveable. But since neither nudity nor even fig-leaves are *de rigueur* these days, the best we can do is to find a happy compromise between the bees' and the astronauts' system of keeping their environments liveable.

This Monday night, July 18th, CBC-TV summer edition of *The Nature of Things* presents a program about some of the natural and man-made systems of controlling temperature, humidity and air pressure. It was produced by James Murray, written by Lister Sinclair, and edited by Moe Weingarten. The executive producer is John Livingston.

Surprisingly, heating large buildings is much easier than cooling them, even in the dead of winter. The program illustrates some modern heat transfer devices for moving heat excess in the centre of activity to cooler peripheral areas, or for storing it in simmering summer weather for use when the frost is on the pumpkin and perspiration is only something in the ads. It will explain why having a refrigerator and other mechanical cooling devices may keep the milk from souring but often makes your temper less sweet by actually heating the kitchen. When man starts to control temperature he alters humidity in the controlled area, and this causes certain problems in condensation, which the program illustrates.

It also considers natural controlled environment, in nature and in man, and some especially controlled environments, such as in

## DR. FINLAY'S CASEBOOK

# Two Favorites Return to Summer TV

THREE YEARS AGO CBC-TV introduced to Canadians a new filmed series from BBC television called *Dr. Finlay's Casebook*. Based on the novels of A. J. Cronin (*Adventures of a Black Bag* and *Further Adventures of a Black Bag*) it had no immediately recognizable stars and appeared to be about 40 years out of date. There was very little glamour, no big city hustle and bustle, and none of the machine-tooled high drama of the more streamlined television medicos.

Therein, possibly, lay its appeal, for it proved as popular over here as it already was in Britain. The setting is Tannochbrae, a mythical village in Ayrshire, Scotland, where Cronin was born, and much of the series is based on his own experiences as a doctor before he turned to writing. Sharing a practice in Tannochbrae are Doctors Cameron and Finlay, played by, respectively, Andrew Cruikshank and Bill Simpson. Other continuing characters seen in most of the episodes are Janet, the housekeeper, played by Barbara Mullen, and the bumbling Dr. Snoddie, played by Eric Woodburn.

The producer decided to remain faithful to Cronin's original characters and the period, rather than update the stories, partly because the G.P. then occupied much the same position as the parish priest, and partly because there are still places in Scotland like Tannochbrae. "Once over the border from England into Scotland," says producer Campbell Logan, "you're already back to the post-Great War period. I'm a Scot, so I should know." Andrew Cruikshank, another Scot, is inclined to agree. "It was a good period for characters," he says. "Mind you, much of the way of life survives even today. For instance there's still the big division between rich and poor that we show in the series. My home town of Aberdeen is an example. You have the rich on the outskirts of the town, then the poorer people and the unemployed living in the tenement slums. Obviously there have been big changes for the better over the years, but 'Cameron's Country' is still a part of Scottish life today. There must be many a doctor in country practice who recognizes his own problems among the ones in the series."

**New Benjamin Britten  
Opera for broadcast on  
CBC radio.**

BENJAMIN BRITTEN'S latest opera, a new Parable for Church Performance entitled *The Burning Fiery Furnace*, based on the tale of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the *Book of Daniel*, had its radio premiere in Britain a month ago, in a broadcast from the Aldeburgh Festival. A BBC transcription of that performance will be presented on CBC radio on Thursday night, July 21st, at 8:30.

*The Burning Fiery Furnace* is a further development of the operatic convention Britten invented in *Curlew River*,

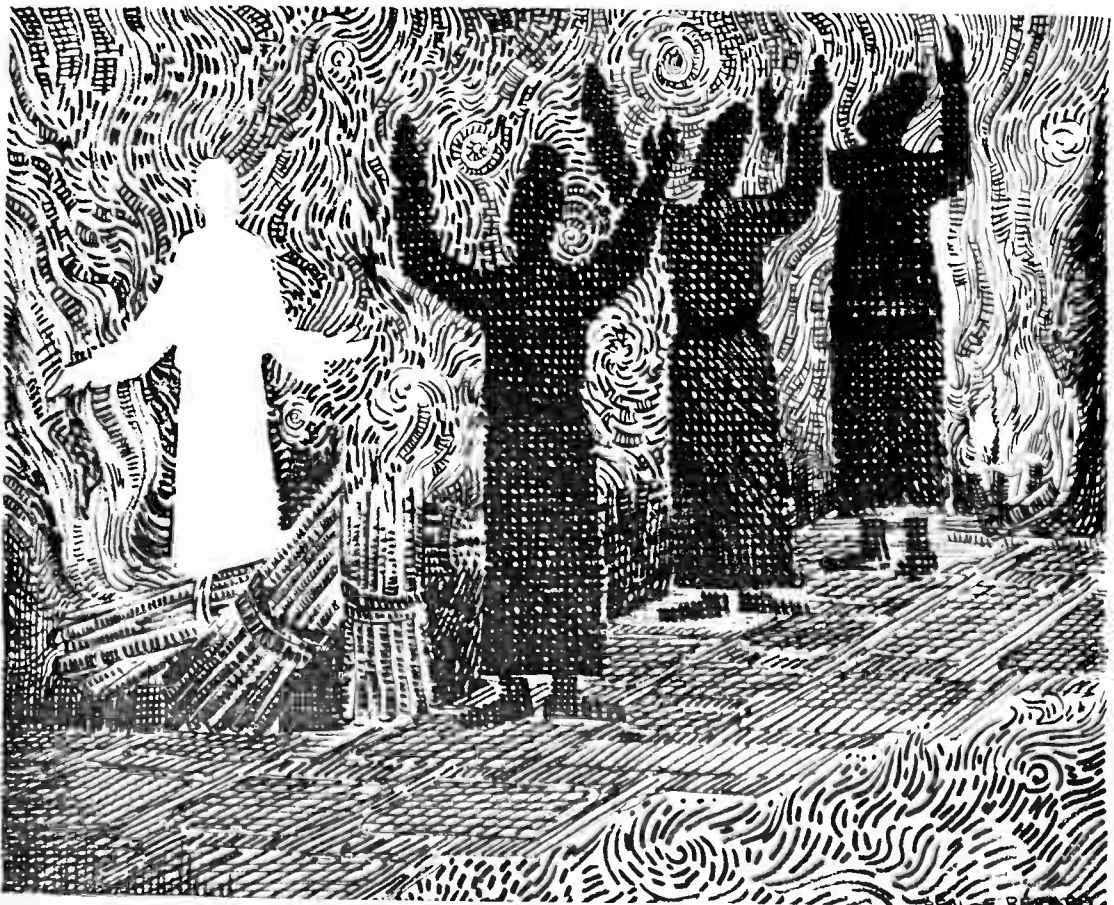
an adaptation of the stylized Japanese *No* plays which had deeply impressed and stimulated him and his librettist, William Plomer, through the years. In that opera they transmuted a Far Eastern Buddhist legend into Western ideology. But this latest work, more dramatic in mood and action than the other, is based on the familiar Bible story, set in Babylon in the sixth century B.C. Plomer says that "It may be felt that in this new version of the old story the character of Nebuchadnezzar, the cult of the 'god of gold' and the resistance movement — ultimately triumphant — of the three young Jewish exiles are not without some relation to our own times."

The composer conducts, assisted by Viola Tunnard. Soloists include Bryan Drake, Peter Leeming, Kenneth Macdonald, John Shirley-Quirk, Victor Godfrey, and Robert Tear, with instrumentalists from the English Chamber Orchestra.

The work opens with a processional, in which the instrumentalists, appearing as a company of lay brothers, together with a group of monks, move slowly up the aisle of Orford Church, Aldeburgh, the monks singing a particularly beautiful plainsong, which turns out to be a distillation of the opera's musical

# COLORFUL FIESTA DEPICTED ON CINE CLUB

LAST SUMMER, Toronto artist John Gould spent a month in Mexico, sketching the people and their way of life. The highlight of his stay in the little villages of Oaxana and Guanajata, in the central region of Mexico, was a colorful fiesta. He came back with 300 or so drawings in conte crayon, pen and ink, and wash, and several oil paintings.

The 300 drawings he carefully sorted according to a particular sequence he had in mind, and culled them until eventually they were reduced to exactly half. What was in his mind was a short film based on his drawings that would tell a simple story, a day in the life of a Mexican village, from its awakening in the morning, through the climax of the fiesta, to the lazy stillness of evening.

"I got the idea when Alan Jarvis did a show on my work from Spain a few years ago," he says. "I was immediately excited at how well drawings reproduce on television and the sense of movement the camera can give."

## Great Movies

**The Conch.** A screen-play written by the author of *Psycho*, Robert Bloch. Starring Grant Williams, Shirley Knight and Onslow Stevens.

One evening, shortly before 7:00 p.m. in Los Angeles, a young and personable Charles Campbell, phones the homicide squad and informs a police lieutenant that a murder will be committed punctually at 7:00 p.m. He leaves the phone booth, walks along the street and for no reason at all stabs an old man to death with an ice-pick. A few minutes later he casually strolls into a downtown office for the regular appointment with his psychiatrist.

Gould's film, which he calls *Little Monday* (after the Mexicans' colloquial name for "The Monday of the Hill" fiesta), shares the bill on this week's edition of *Cine Club* (Sunday, 7:00 p.m.) with another short film entitled *A Place in the Sun*. *Little Monday* was shot in Gould's studio in two days, co-directed by himself and Julius Kohanyi, and filmed by cameraman Ed Long. The sound accompanying the film and the music that helps create the various moods are by Andrew Duesbury. Arla Saare is the editor.

Gould, who is currently teaching drawing at Queen's University, has exhibited in Toronto at the Roberts Gallery, the Isaacs Gallery, and, before its demise, the Dorothy Cameron Gallery. Two years ago he exhibited at the Arwin Gallery in Detroit, where he will have another show this fall. *Little Monday* has been seen at an arts festival held at the Holy Blossom Temple in Toronto, and has been entered in film festivals in Montreal and Vancouver, as well as the Film Makers' Festival in Los Altos Hills, California.

He regards his sketching trip as "reportage." "For a month I used my sketch pad like a reporter," he says, "looking for the life and movement and flow of events in the towns, day after day. The exciting fiesta has a wild 'Battle of the Bands' between mariachi musicians, the Mexican counterpart of a cutting session in jazz. The whole thing ends with a swinging party." He plans to do another film, this time with a Canadian background. Gould will be interviewed about his work by program host Lloyd Robertson.

The other film on *Cine Club* this week, *A Place in the Sun*, is a Czechoslovakian production from the Studio for Animated Films, Prague. This little fable about three men squabbling for the sunniest spot on a beach was a prize-winner at the Oberhausen, Annecy, and Edinburgh film festivals. It was directed by Frantisek Vystrel.

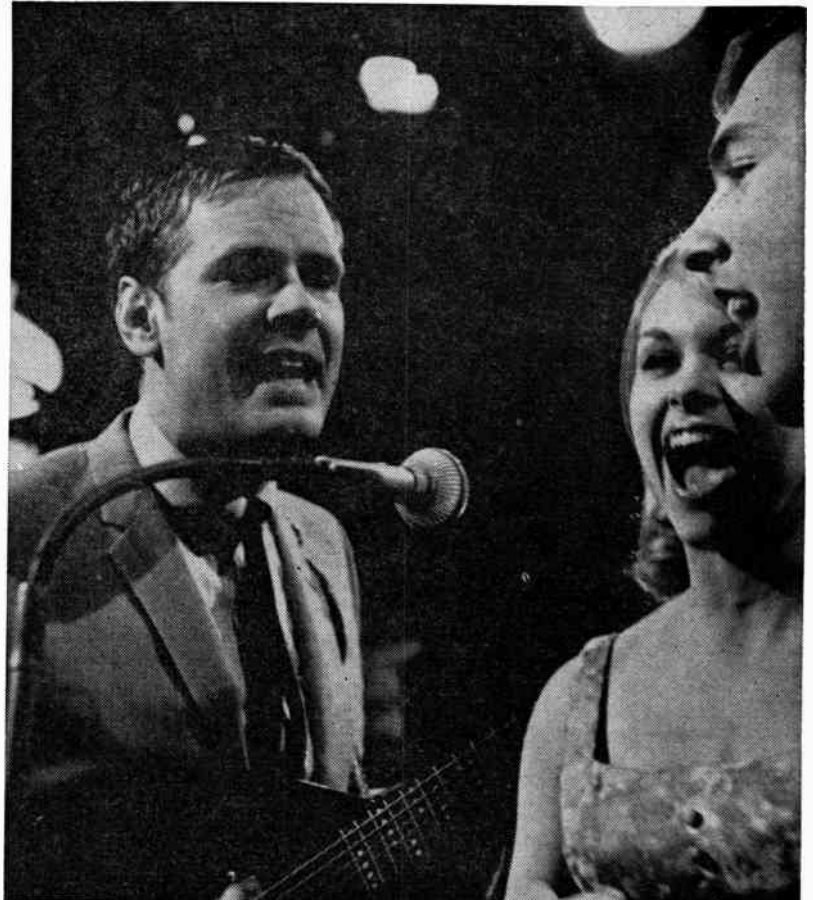

ingredients. The Abbot announces that the story of the Parable will be told, and while the instrumentalists provide an interlude, the monks dress themselves in the costumes of the roles they are to assume.



Continuing his singing tour of Manitoba towns, folksinger Reg Gibson today takes his "Summer Singalong" show to Carberry, Manitoba. Viewers may follow Reg in his travels each Monday and Thursday on CBC-TV's Vacation Time, seen at 4:00.

The Court of Babylon is having a feast to honor three young men. Entertainment includes two treble singers and a tumbler in a delightfully catchy set-piece. But the Israelites don't join in completely, and when a jealous Astrologer challenges them for their aloofness, they say that they must observe the "sacred rules of Israel." Eventually they refuse outright to worship the golden image, so Nebuchadnezzar orders the fiery furnace to be heated, and the Court proceeds to march there. The scoring here calls for a varied assortment of unusual percussion instruments, including a Babylonian drum, small cymbals, and glockenspiel. The 'fire' music rises in intensity as the temperature of the furnace grows hotter, and the youths are consigned to it. But a miracle occurs — the flames separate to show the three young men, quite unharmed, guarded by an angel and chanting praise of the Lord in the *Benedicite*. The Babylonians are impressed into instant conversion.

As the monks remove their costumes the Abbot sums up the moral of the piece: "Gold is tried in the fire. And the mettle of man in the furnace of humiliation." Repeating the introductory plainsong, the monks and lay brothers move back up the aisle.

Most of his recorded works will be presented on radio by Allan Sangster, beginning Wednesday night, July 20th, at 11.03, in *The Music of Schubert*. "He wrote about 1,000 pieces," says Sangster, "and he dated all of them, so it's possible for me to present them in fairly chronological order. I have recordings of about 300 of them — 90 per cent from my own collection, and the rest from the CBC's—enough for 80 or more hours of broadcasting. I spent all last winter gathering them and preparing my scripts, in addition to continuing *The Music of Handel* series, just concluded. It was a most rewarding experience.

"Schubert started writing so early, but even from the beginning he was pretty good—a little clumsy at first, but he got better so quickly. Much of his music was written to be played at home by his family and friends and today he's the most neglected great composer I've come across. Nobody has begun to touch on his vast musical output. Of the nearly 1,000 pieces he wrote we hear no more than 10 regularly, such as the *Unfinished Symphony* and the *Trout Quintet*. He wrote so many songs that I'm spotting two or three on each program — occasionally skipping out of chronological sequence enough to ensure variety."

Sangster began his *Music of . . .* series in 1952 with 152 hours of Mozart, followed by 27 hours of Berlioz, 120 of Beethoven, 28 of Mahler, 155 of Haydn, and 170 of Handel. "Now there's so much more Mozart recorded," he says, "that I could go on for 200 hours or more."

but by the time he was 12 he knew more about music than they did. His unusually beautiful soprano voice won him entrance to Vienna's leading music school, but it broke soon after, and he had to turn to teaching to support himself, and loathed it violently.

When he was 19 he joined some other young people in a Bohemian life, in which poverty and illness were a constant threat. But friends kept him supplied with a piano and huge quantities of manuscript paper, which he used in a flood of production. His physical stamina could hardly keep up with it—

## Journalists with a Sense of Humor

"COLEMAN WITH HIS JUMPING FROG bet a stranger \$50 — Stranger had no frog and C got him one. In the meantime, stranger filled C's frog full of shot and he couldn't jump. Stranger's frog won."

With that brief item entered in his notebook Mark Twain made his reputation as a journalist with the gift of humor. He was 30 and writing for San Francisco newspapers. Behind him was a patchwork career that began when he was 13 and working as a printer's devil for his uncle's newspaper, the *Weekly Hannibal Journal*. He went on to become a licensed pilot on Mississippi river-boats, secretary to the Territory of Nevada, and a miner. He had been writing a long time when the episode of the jumping frog happened and he was able to turn his four-line notation into *The Notorious Jumping Frog of Calaveras County* and the beginnings of success.

Twain's kind of journalism is the subject of this week's program on the radio series *The Fourth Estate*, which draws on the writings of Twain and two Canadian journalists with the same gift of humor and humanity — Bob Edwards of the *Calgary Eye Opener* ("The management has decided on the name, *Eye Opener*, because few people will resist taking it"), and Richard J. Needham, columnist of the *Toronto Globe and Mail*.

Like Twain, both Edwards and Needham have an easy style, and their essays are liberally sprinkled with quotable sayings. Half a century ago Edwards was writing in the *Eye Opener* such thoughts as: "If money talks, all it ever said to me was goodbye"; "Don't meet trouble half way. It is quite capable of making the entire journey"; and "No man does as much today as he is going to do tomorrow." Today Needham writes, of a trip to Mexico, "... the 300-odd churches of Cholula (population 8,000) present their domes and spires; with one church for every 25 of its people, this community's righteousness should at least come close to Toronto's."

Murray Westgate reads the selections from Mark Twain, Mavor Moore is heard as Bob Edwards, and Ron Hartman as Richard J. Needham. The program is narrated by Harry Mannis and written by Tony Kilgallen. *The Fourth Estate* is produced by John Reeves.

with his book *Les Insolences du Frere Untel* (*The Impertinences of Brother Anonymous or Brother So-and-So Speaks Out of Turn*).

"Although we are launching the series with the Desbiens profile," says Paul Wright, "I should stress that we don't intend to centre all eight programs on the 'quiet revolution.' Each program will be a separate entity, all the films written or directed by different people, giving each documentary a look all its own."

Desbiens came from a poor family in St-Jerome, Lake St. John, an impoverished rural

community where his father was an illiterate laborer. "We were always poor," he recalls, "practically destitute, actually destitute at times." At 14 he entered a seminary, later becoming a member of the Marist Congregation, a teaching order. "When the Brothers gathered me in, they literally had to pay my car fare, give me clothes, and give me free education." This kind of upbringing had a profound effect on him, and when he achieved success with his book he said: "I admit . . . I had a feeling of avenging my father, who has had to keep quiet all his life." When he was 20, Desbiens had a long battle with tuberculosis. He spent six years in a sanatorium and on his recovery the Marist Brothers sent him to Laval University, where he studied philosophy. After graduation he was appointed professor of philosophy at the commercial academy in Chicoutimi.

*Les Insolences* grew out of letters he wrote to *Le Devoir* attacking "our bastardized language," the school system, rigid authority perpetuated by generations of ecclesiastics, the fear of freedom, and the way of life to which teaching brothers and nuns must conform. Desbiens's letters appeared in *Le Devoir* late in 1959 under the pseudonym Frere Untel, for whom some people predicted a dire fate. When Jacques Hebert, the former head of Les Editions de l'Homme, persuaded Desbiens to publish his letters as a book they expected to cause a stir, but nothing like the phenomenal sales that ensued. *Les Insolences* sold over 100,000 copies, an unprecedented figure for Quebec.

"In French Canada," wrote Frere Untel, "no one dares to think, or at least, no one dares to think aloud. The absence of all serious discussion in the province brands us irretrievably. Conversation with oneself is the beginning of madness, they say. Solitary thought processes can lead us to madness as well. French Canada's drama is one of non-communication."

For circumventing the authority of his superiors in publishing the book without first obtaining permission, Desbiens was 'exiled' for three years in Italy and Switzerland and reprimanded by the Vatican. On his return to Canada he wrote a sequel to *Les Insolences* which was published under his own name earlier this year in an English-language version entitled *For Pity's Sake*. It is this book, part autobiography, part social commentary on Quebec, that provides the basis for the first program on *Eight Stories Inside Quebec*.

"Desbiens, as much as anyone, represents the type of individual that has gone to the forefront in recent years in Quebec," says Paul Wright. "He is a vibrant, hard-hitting person—an intellectual, but an intellectual who can speak to the masses and be understood." This profile of Jean-Paul Desbiens is directed by Arnold Gelbart, with narration by Howard Rysphan.

Next week (July 27th) the subject is bi-lingualism, some of the problems it causes and some of the solutions that have been found in many sectors of daily life. Montreal is the chief city where the two language groups confront each other. Hundreds of thousands of people from the

Armenian has been writing romantic plays about the way life ought to be, rather than what it is (a pleasant switch from the current school of reality-seekers), such as in *My Heart's in the Highlands*, a gorgeous play, probing deep into the American way of life with great simplicity." It stirs the conscience and elates the soul as few modern plays have done. For this reason Cohen has made it *Cohen's Choice* for *CBC Tuesday Night*, July 19th, at 8:08. The radio adaptation is by Tommy Tweed, who has an engaging way with a word when it is required to convey, as in this case, a mixture of tenderness, haunting morality, humor and exuberance.

*My Heart's in the Highlands* is a poetic fable about the charming, rather fey individualists who drift through life hanging on tightly to the belief that they are not cogs in a machine. On the fly-leaf of the play Saroyan dedicated it (in part), "To the pure in heart. To the poet in the world . . . To the heart in the highlands." The title is from a poem by Robert Burns: "My heart's in the highlands, wherever I go."

The setting is a poor district Fresno, California, in 1914. Young Johnny and his father, Ben, live in exceedingly reduced circumstances, but they are happy. Ben is a self-styled poet who writes when the spirit moves him. Unfortunately he is still unpublished, but Johnny worships him as a great artist. The only thing marring their contentment is the fact that Ben cannot compromise with the rubbishy mediocrity of most human values. "Why do they destroy themselves running after the things of death?" he demands. "Why do they turn away from life? . . . Give them ugliness. Foul their dreams, you maniacs, frauds!"

One evening as Johnny idles in the sun after a skimpy supper, he hears "the loveliest and most amazing music in the world" — *My Heart's in the Highlands*, played on a golden bugle by a

very old man who turns out to be a former Shakespearean actor, Jasper MacGregor, who asks for a drink of water "for an old man whose heart is not here, but in the highlands." He has an interesting influence on their lives.

In his foreword Saroyan says: "The meaning of the play is the meaning of reality itself. As for the message and moral of the play, it is the simplest and oldest in the world: It is better to be a good human being than to be a bad one. It is just naturally better."

Another *CBC Tuesday Night* drama on the 19th is *The Foundling*, a play in verse by Peter Gurney, to be heard at 11:15. Transcribed by the BBC, it describes the experiences, real or imagined, of an impressionable little boy who frequents an ancient, 14th-century country church where he encounters a bearded tramp whom he imagines to be God. The play is a study in sound of the boy's search for faith: in his imagination he gives life to the carvings in stone and wood that abound in the church, until one day he finds the old tramp dead.

Margaret Rawlings appears as the Presenter; Robert Eddison as Stephen as a man; Lan MacNamara as Stephen as a child; Owen Barry as the Rector; Beryck Guyler as the Tramp; Anthony Jacobs as the Foliage Head; and Richard Williams and Betty Hardy as Stephen's parents. Music by Humphrey Searle is performed by the BBC Chorus and the Symphonia of London, conducted by the composer.

On Wednesday night, July 20th, at 9:30, the first of two hour-long dramas presented originally on the CBC's French TV network, will be shown, with English dialogue dubbed in. It is *L'Indiscret* (The Indiscreet One), a microscopic examination of the psychology of waiting. It was written, produced and directed by Louis-Georges Carrier, who says "*L'Indiscret* is the camera which describes for us, coldly and objectively, just what it sees:

an indiscreet cyclops, which looks and reports back to us, honestly and without prejudice, what it has witnessed . . . A woman is waiting, torn with anguish. Will he come? Is he just hanging back, or has he decided to make the break final — her whom she still loves?" The play is almost entirely visual, with no dialogue, and the young woman says little. She is played by Monique Miller, with Melody Greer as her English voice, and Peter Donat as the voice of *L'Indiscret*.

Quite another sort of love, possessive to the point of madness, is the theme of an hour-long original radio drama to be heard on *Summer Stage* this Sunday, July 17th, at 1:03 p.m., with production by Peter Donkin in the Halifax studios. The author is Kay Hill, Halifax-born writer who is now living on the Spanish island of Mallorca. It's the story of the love affair between Adèle, eldest daughter of French poet, dramatist and novelist Victor Hugo, and an officer in the British army.

The action moves from London to Halifax, Canada, around the year 1862, as it reveals the considerable problem of Lieutenant Albert Pinson when he conducts a liaison with Adèle. She's an affection-starved woman

in her 30s, and when she falls headlong in love with the dashing lieutenant, it's with a possessiveness reaching past the border of sanity. She pursues him to London, then to Halifax, determined to make him marry her. Adding an intriguing undertone to the main theme is Mrs. Hill's brief examination of the mind of Victor Hugo. She paints him as an egocentric and an extremely cold person. It is these characteristics, repeated in Adèle, which motivate her reaction to being spurned at last by the bumbling and thoroughly frightened but determined Lieutenant Pinson.

The *Midweek Theatre* production on radio on Wednesday, July 20th, at 9:00 p.m. is *Cold and Bitter Tea* by Aubrey C. Green of Winnipeg. He describes it as "an introspective look at the interaction of people in a small family group — the Prestons. They are sad people, lonely in their despair." Meanwhile, her son Michael is being slowly but surely destroyed by Mrs. Preston, his sister, Ava, and his wife, Mildred. He has an enormous talent for failure, even at the end. two groups come together daily in buses, crowded elevators, and lunch counters, yet few can understand each other. Nevertheless, there is a growth in the number of private language schools and the people attending. To learn a second language perfectly, says one teacher, would require an investment of something like two or three thousand dollars. Some, who already have a knowledge of another language, can take refresher courses for only a few hundred dollars while others can avail themselves of free courses offered by the Provincial Department of Education.

Paul Wright observes that the need to speak two languages in Montreal touches everyone "... bus drivers, waitresses, store clerks, lawyers, journalists, top-rank executives. In some occupations bi-lingualism is a hard fact of day-to-day existence which determines a person's prosperity or even job survival." Entitled *This Blooming Business of Bilingualism*, this television essay on the life of a major city functioning in two languages will be directed by Peter Pearson.

Later programs in the series will visit the Jewish community in Montreal (Canada's largest settlement of Jews); follow a young English girl through Quebec City in search of 'the English of yesteryear'; and talk to three married couples, each one of whom represents the many Canadians of English and French stock who have married partners from one or the other language groups. Separately and together they discuss religion, the education of their children, and their response to Quebec nationalism. The result is a program as much about marriage as about larger questions.

IN 1954 a young man named Donald James Yarmy crashed an audition for Arthur Godfrey's *Talent Scouts*.

"What's your name," barked the auditioner. "Er, Don Adams sir," the man quickly replied, knowing he had lied but still hoping the name could be interesting enough to get him a job in the entertainment profession.

A week later he was on the show and won the contest. Needless to say he kept the new name.

Today Don Adams is the star of his own television series, *Get Smart*, the popular comedy-adventure series spoofing current fictional cloak - and - dagger heroics seen Friday evenings at 8:30 p.m. on the CBC television network.

In *Get Smart*, Adams has the starring role of espionage agent Maxwell Smart (Secret Agent 86) who combines knowledge and brilliance with zealous inefficiency and remarkable lack of insight. Nonetheless, Smart manages to triumph over his liabilities - and assets.

After that Adams became a regular on the *Perry Como Show* for a year-and-a-half, did nine

*Jimmy Dean Shows*, joined Garry Moore's night time show for numerous outings and performed as a guest on many major U.S. TV variety programs, including NBC-TV's *Tonight Show* starring Johnny Carson.

Prior to being signed for the starring role in *Get Smart* he

was seen as house detective Glick in *The Bill Dana Show*.

Adams is married to the former Dorothy Bracken, who was with the June Taylor Dancers. Don has four children by a previous marriage.

*Get Smart* also stars Barbara Feldon and Ed Platt.
