The Wicked Messenger" has much more of the deep imagery and meaning of the "Bringing tt All Back Home " era but the last two tracks are particularly in teresting. "Down Along The Cove" is a straight fwelve-bar Tonight," with steel-guitar back ing, is definitely country and western in flavour
Dylan's voice has changed. Cone are the rough edges, replaced by slightly strained bily a result of his accident, but still recognisable as Dylan. It seems that he has backtracked
and the record, despite its new songs, is an appraisal of what he has written in the past applied to what he is writing now
The new Dylan album is interesting and intriguing, but because of the variety of song-fypes and styles gives no definite indication as to where he may go next he does go anywhere.
The beat group backing is replaced
by a simple bass and drums thythm section with occasionsl addifion of a second guitar to Dylan's own guitar and har. monica playing.
The new Dylan is simplified un eleciric and stifl one of the best songwriters of the decade.
