## LOUIS ARMSTRONG BACK IN HOSPITAL

NEW YORK, Tuesday. - Louis Armstrong is where his in New York's Beth Israel Hospital where his conclition is described as "critical," reports Jeff Atierton.
His cordition is such that he is not, at present, allowed visitors or even to receive phone calls.
The jazz trumpet giant, who will be 69 on July 4, visis taken to hospital last September with blood clots in his leg. His doctors also said that he had
lost too much weight while dieting lost too much weight while dieting. He came out of hospital in January and two
weeks ago he was interviewed in his home for American TV. It was hoped that he would return to work with his All Stars during this month.
Louis went back into hospital on February 19 a fact that was kept secret and was not reported in any of the New York newspapers.
Louis and the All Stars were last in Britain in June when they played a season at the Batley Variety Club. A return to play two weeks at Wakefield Theatre Club last Deeember was cancelled when Louls was taken ill.

The Royal Albert Hall will be decorated with posters and flowers and a special light show will be in-

The sound system will utilise 85 speakers. "We want to create conditions that will be conducive to the artists," says Guest.

A spokesman for the Royal Alberi Hall commented. "If it works it can't do anybody any harm. We are quite happy about it. The only thing that makes us unhappy is unruly behaviour.
