THE PROPOSED merger of Management Agency Music (MAM) and the Chrysalis Group is moving ahead with an agreement in principle for a reverse take-over which will give Chrysalis a 51 per cent stake in the com-

bined company.

A full stock market flotation of new Ordinary shares in the new company — to be called Chrysalis plc — is planned to raise approximately £5m of cash, net of expenses, which will be used for

In addition, it is anticipated that Chris Wright, Chrysalis chairman and existing majority sharehol-der in Chrysalis, will offer suffi-cient of the new Ordinary shares from his entitlement of the con-sideration to raise not more than

The merger will be effected by way of an offer by MAM for the whole of the issued share capital of Chrysalis and, said a joint of Chrysalis and, said a joint statement this week, in view of the size of the transaction, this offer will be subject to the approval of the shareholders of MAM in general meeting. Existing MAM shareholders who do not wish to participate in

who do not wish to participate in the future of the enlarged group will be given the opportunity to dispose of their MAM Ordinary shares for cash.

On completion of the merger the Chrysalis management team will join the MAM board and will "play a major part in the future running and development of the

combined entity", Chrysalis plc. Apart from MAM shareholder approval, the merger will also be conditional on approval by the Council of the Stock Exchange.

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Is China ready for pop?

WHAMI'S PIONEERING tour of
China may have helped awaken
the "sleeping giant" of world record markets but the fear is that

Europe and the US will be watching anxiously over the next few
months to see whether Whami's

whether the authorities will be
prepared to allow this cultural experiment to continue.

Jonathan Morrish, head of press at Epic and the only representative of CBS to accompany the band to China, sees three major problems in selling music in the country. The first is sheer physical size: China is some 2,000 miles north to south and 4,000 east to west which makes the cost of shipping cassettes overwhelmingly the most popular music medium in the country
— an enormous consideration.

That problem is aggravated by the fact that around 80 per cent of the population lives in rural com-

munities, often many hundreds of miles away from the main cen-

Another major stumbling block to selling is the difficulty in get-ting your marketing message across. Says Morrish: "Marketing is a notion which means absolutely nothing to them. Their shops are very small and it is physically impossible to put posters in there."

Couple this with a lack of televi-Couple this with a lack of television and newspaper interest and the only way of presenting product to the public is through concerts which are difficult and expensive to stage; the cost of Whaml's week-long tour is being put at well over the put at well over £1m.

The difficulty in promoting con-certs is because of the combina-tion of China's massive bureaucracy and its alien politics and they are factors that bring more than just organisational problems. Observers are agreed

that Wham! were allowed into that Wham! were allowed into China as an experiment but if the country's political supremos decide all they offered was more decadent, culturally-polluting music then the experiment stops there and then. The country is currently run by a pro-Western hierarchy but its capitalist-orientated reforms are plagued by corruption and it is feared that Leftist moralists will use this as a lever to stamp out all forms of bourgeois influences, most notbourgeois influences, most not-ably pop music and disco danc-

ably pop music and disco dancing.

In the meantime, though, all eyes are on the progress of the two Wham! cassettes that will be available in China by the end of this month. One is a compilation of tracks from the Make It Big and Fantastic albums and the other is fantastic albums and the other is five tracks from Wham! and five from popular Chinese star Sing Yong Yuen whose cassettes nor-mally notch sales of around 2m.

Morrish comments: "The kids over there know the names of the bands but at the moment they can't buy the stuff," But he adds a note of caution to those who think that China is a ripe fruit for picking by Western record com-panies. "The Chinese will want to assimilate what has happened with Wham! and give a reaction and only when the next Western group goes there will we know how they feel about Wham!

"Just because Wham! have performed there does not neces-sarily mean that the country in a year's time will be full of English year's time will be full of English groups releasing product there. You cannot expect a country that has distanced itelf from the rest of the world for years to become Westernised overnight. The country is like a giant awaking from a sleep and nobody really knows which way it's going to



Blind used in bid to block tape levy

CONSUMER WATCHDOG bodies are using blind people to mount a new concerted effort to block the Government's proposals for a home-taping

concerted effort to block the Government's proposals for a home-taping royalty on blank tapes.

Describing the Green Paper recommendations as "unnecessary and unjust", and claiming that they will "hit blind people hardest of all", the National Consumer Council and the Consumers In The European Community Group have linked with the Royal National Institute For The Blind to stage a press conference setting out their objections.

"Blind people will be there to demonstrate how they use tape and to explain how the Government's proposals would affect them", says a press release. John Wall, vice chairman of the RNIB, will be at the conference to explain why he believes Government proposals to exempt blind people from the levy won't work.

And Stephen Crampton, secretary of CECG — the UK body which defends the interests of consumers on EEC matters — will say why he believes the Government is wrong to claim that international moves make tape levy proposals necessary.

New budget label launch

MULTIPLE SOUND Distributors, which includes the TV-merchandising Warwick Records within its set-up, is to launch a new budget/mid-price label — as yet unnamed — later this year which will embrace 4-album

box-sets and single albums.

Heading the new label will be Steve Edgley who recently left rival budget label Pickwick Records after three years as A&R director, and who was responsible for that company's successful IMP box series and

other budget labels. other budget labels.

Edgley said: "There has been a plethora of new budget and mid-price labels during the last 12 months but we will be aiming for an up-market image — we want the sleeves and product to reflect a full-price look while retailing at a low-price."

He added that repertoire would be drawn from various major record company sources. Expected price for single albums will be £2.99 and £7.99 for 4-album box-sets.

Dial-a-disc to break new acts?

A CHARITY dial-a-disc scheme set up last week will have the spin-off effect of giving substantial radio airplay to records by some unknown bands

Independent and BBC stations have promised to promote the project, set up by the African and Overseas Relief Trust (AORTA), by playing the record that can be heard that day. In some cases that will mean around 30 plays in day for artists yet to break

Established names such Barry Manilow and Dionne War-wick have also contributed to the scheme which is a joint venture between AORTA and British Telecom. AORTA supplies the tapes of music and a personal message from the star and a celebrity sponsor and Telecom hands over the profits from the calls made to the charity's famine relief work in north Africa. In the first two days of the scheme 250,000 calls were made nationwide.

All the major record companies have contributed songs to the scheme and are waiving all royalty rights. The scheme is to run for an initial six months but the organisers hope to extend that to 18

New pop festival for Liverpool

ROCK PROMOTER Andrew Miller will be organising the first major pop concert at the International Festival Gardens in Liverpool this summer. The event on June 8 will star Chris de Burgh and is expected to attract an audience of 20,000.

Miller has been negotiating for several months with the Liverpool City Council, Merseyside County Council and Merseyside Corporation to hold the concert at the £25m development which was first opened last year. "Chris de Burgh couldn't play Liverpool, which has always been one of his big catchment areas, during his last tour because of the lack of a venue. We looked at several outdoor venues including the Everton football ground but the International Festival Gardens proved to be the best proposition," Miller said.

Free records for dealers 'disqusting'

THE PRACTICE of giving away free records to dealers was slam-med as "disgusting" at a seminar last week on commercial agree-ments in the music industry.

Seminar chairman Clive Fisher, Polydor's director of legal and business affairs, said: "It's somebusiness arians, said: It's some-thing we have picked up from the US, It's a disgusting habit." He remarked, though, that free re-cords were necessary to achieve required chart coverage.

Music industry lawyer James Wyllie, at the seminar to give the artist's perspective, added: "Free goods is an increasing area. We have tried to put some kind of percentage limit on it but we are all victims of market practices. don't think, though, that the level will ever reach the same as the

level in the States."
Fisher commented after the seminar: "We shouldn't have to give away our product to get it sold but it has to be done be-

sold but it has to be done be-cause everybody does it."
The seminar, held at the Hyatt
Carlton Tower in London, co-vered recording, publishing, vered recording, publishing, management, agency and mer-chandising agreements and was aimed at professional advisers (both lawyers and accountants) and management and record company executives







MTV prospering

NEW YORK: Who's making money on music video? MTV and sister station VH-1, the latter being the music video channel geared to adult viewers and, to a lesser extent, the record labels who have signed exclusive agreements with those stations.

MTV and VH-1 posted operating income of almost \$20m in 1984 on revenues of nearly \$73m. This compares with an operating loss of about \$3.3m on revenues of \$27m in 1983.

The revenue jump is largely attributed to the institution of cable operator licensing fees — the charge cable operators pay per subscriber for the right to carry MTV and/or VH-1. No such fees were charged when MTV first started operating; they were instituted in 1984.

According to the company's annual report and the state of the state of the company's annual report and the state of the state o

instituted in 1984.

According to the company's annual report and other documents filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission, MTV signed a total of five exclusivity contracts in 1984. Of these, only Geffen Records "and certain of WCl's companies" are identified as having been paid a total of \$1.27m for MTV's right to exclusive airing of selected music video clips.

Year-end AC Nielsen reports put the number of cable homes reached by MTV last year at 25.4m up 38 per cent over 1983's 16.3m. Overall, the publicly-traded MTV Networks Inc, which also includes the Nickelodeon children's cable channel, had a pre-tax income of close to \$23m on revenues of \$109m.

Also of note in this regard: HBO paid a reported \$2m for the rights to the hour-long We Are The World special which airs in May, while RCA/Columbia, one of the hottest music video labels in the country right now, will have the cassette version.

WATCH FOR a revival of interest in the music of the seminal R&B singer and writer Sam Cooke. RCA is releasing a live set recorded at the Club Harlem in Florida more than 20 years ago, and will have a compilation album later in the year.

Meanwhile, Cooke's one-time manager Allen Klein is putting together a film biography of the star to be entitled A Change Is Gonna Come. No writer has been assigned and the film isn't

expected to be shot before next year.

LOCAL LAW enforcement officials have arrested a man believed to be one of the biggest bootleggers and counterfeiters in operation. Michael Rascio, who was indicted on similar charges five years ago, has been charged with 591 felony counts related to unauthorised manufacturing of LPs.

Jean Michel: building the French Resistance

WITH THE welter of Fleet Street publicity about WITH THE welter of Fleet Street publicity about Wham!'s recent visit to China, it seems to have been overlooked that the youthful British pop duo were not in fact the first major Western pop or rock act to play behind the Bamboo curtain. This accolade belongs to Jean-Michel Jarre, the French musician who first sprang to fame with his program of the program of the

rrench musician who jirst sprang to tame with his Oxygene album nearly nine years ago. Maybe forgetfulness or ignorance is to blame, but the Wham! lads were actually following in Jarre's footsteps. His 1981 concerts in Peking and Shanghai were not only filmed but also recorded and released as a double-album.

as a double-album.

Typically, the modest Jarre whose total record sales are now somewhere in the region of 25m units worldwide, refuses to press home his role as a pioneer of Western pop concerts in China, but he is pleased with Wham!s reported success. "I was in

pioneer of Western pop concerts in China, but he is pleased with Wham!s reported success. "I was in China four years ago, and it took them at least two years to digest the whole thing," he says. "Some of my music had been broadcast on Chinese radio, which created interest in me and eventually resulted in an invitation to play several concerts in Peking and Shanghai. We took 70 musicians and technicians, and 15 tons of equipment, and the part of the play 150,000 people saw, the concerts which more than 150,000 people saw the concerts which were also broadcast on TV and radio."

Jarre — son of Oscar-winner composer Maurice —
is no newcomer to pioneering events in the pop
world. His first live show took place in 1979 at the
Place de la Concorde in Paris on Bastille Day, and
attracted an outdoor audience of 1m, earning him a
place in the Guiness Book of Records.

He is also, arguably, one of the biggest-influences

on the current pop scene's synthesiser-based bands
— the Oxygene album was an international success, and the inspiration for many a budding musician. The follow-up Equinoxe was also a hit in 35 coun-

tries.

In London recently, Jarre recalled the initial record company reaction to Oxygene. "I took it to all the big record companies, — not just in France but the UK as well and they all turned it down. Chris Blackwell of Island admitted to me later that turning down the

album was one of his biggest professional mistakes. The companies seemed to be put off the project because I was French and didn't sing on the album. Dreyfus Records, which was only a small label, took a chance with me and three months later we had a good answer for everyone with the success of Ox-

Although his father is Maurice Jarre, whose David Lean film scores have included Dr Zhivago, Ryan's Daughter and A Passage To India, Jean-Michel says Daughter and A Passage To India, Jean-Michel Says that his own musical talents own more to family genes than influence. "My parents' marriage broke up when I was young, and I didn't see much of my father until I was much older. We both have a very different feel for music — my father is very much involved with film music, which is a musical area!

have not really got into."

Jarre's latest album is Zoolock, released several months ago but which he admits he has only just got round to promoting in the UK. A remixed version of the title track has just been released. "I don't like to turn down various record companies' requests for personal promotion, but the logistics involved do pose a big problem. I can't be everywhere at the same time

the same time.

"Zoolock is rather different from my previous work. With the earlier albums I wasn't making any ethnic statement — with this LP I have used voices as instrumentation, in fact done orchestrations with vocal sounds. I worked closely with people like Laurie Anderson, Adrian Belew of King Crimson (and av Talking Heads) and Marcus Miller."

Jarre will be spending considerable time in the UK promoting the album, and says that he would even consider living here in the future. "I have always been moved by the response of my British fans and, apart from liking the music scene, always get a good

feeling on the creative level."

There was talk at one point of Jarre doing an open-air concert in London's West End. "The plan open-air concert in London's west Erid. The plan was that I'd perform in Trafalgar Square with the audience in the Mall but it never really got past the talking stage, although I would still love to do something in London along similar lines," he adds.



TIERS OPERA (pictured), another new young duo hoping to join the ranks of Tears For Fears, Go West and Wham! are accompanied by 72 string players from the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra for their debut single, Girls Voices, on their own Tiers Opera label distributed by EMI. IT WAS a more stylish Paul Young who appeared at Wembley for a series of sell-out gigs recently. The last two years have seen the former Q-tips frontman mature into the UK's finest male solo singer and the success of his latest LP, The Secret Of Association, puts the seal on his remarkable transformation.

highlights.

SIOUXSIE AND the Banshees in a church: the imagery evoked was a mite too obvious to dwell upon at length, but it was certainly a dramatic setting — Siouxsie prancing on the altar, poging peroxide punks in the pews, eerie sha-dows flickering up the walls, plus the most peculiar acoustics thrown up by the environ-

As this was a charity event, held at St James's Church, Piccadilly in aid of Pete Townsend's anti-heroin campaign, it's probably less than gener-ous to note that this wasn't a particularly good performance. But, with tickets at £10 a time and a seven-month wait since they last played live, perhaps the faithful would have been within their rights

have been within their rights to expect more.

The major obstacle was the appalling, and hideously painful sound. Siouxsie screeches aside, there wasn't much variation in texture, just a barrage of noise. Budgie was his usual heroic self, a drummer of splendid power and technique, and new guitarist John Carruthers was suitably morose and distant — he's bound to become a firm favourite.

favourite. But, carping aside, it was for But, carping aside, it was for a good cause and it's encouraging to see a band such as The Banshees willing to make a stance, especially considering the very susceptible nature of their audience. This was a grand spectacle, but like all major concerts the anti-cipation and the recollections will probably be of more en-during satisfaction than the event itself.

MAX HEADROOM, the film charting the background story of the world's first computergenerated TV presenter, must surely set new precedents for small screen sci-fi, even if the subsequent half-hour pop show so far seems little more than a new angle on old prom-os and half-witticisms.

Brooker is not altogether happy about the present scene and the attitudes of those who wish to be part of it. "The era of writers like Chinn and Chapman has more or less disappeared. Now the bands mostly want to write their own material, and the days of in-house writers at publishing companies seem to have gone. But bands dry up creatively like anyone else occasionally, and they should look further afield for their material.

"More melodic music is coming back gradually, and some people are reverting to using live drums in the studio instead of the machine. The punk thing almost destroyed the music industry, but a few good acts came out of it by becoming more pop-

acts came out of it by becoming more poporientated."

Brooker believes that record releases running at about 100 per week are too high, with only a small percentage likely to get airplay and general unfairness to the acts involved: "If I was signed to a record company, I would want certain stipulations and guarantees about promotion," she says. "It's crazy if companies pay large advances and then don't promote the record when it's released. It seems that you need a video these days to sell a record, but they're very expensive and there's still little scope for them in the UK."

His versions of Meditation, I Cover The Waterfront and Lift Darlin among others rank with the best these tunes have ever received, and jazz specialist shops and others with jazz instrumental browsers should not miss the opportunity of displaying it.

WUNDERLICH: Memoir MOIR 104. A first-class opera Memoir MOIR 104. A first-class opera-tic tenor, who died tragically young, in a popular music mood, with memor-able versions of Granada, Be My Love and Plaisir D'Amour as well as lesser known items. With symphonic-scale backing, this is an album which has crossover appeal to both MOR and the lighter classical market.

EYDIE GORME: Vamps The Roaring Twenties. Memoir MOIR 103. One of the most dynamic women of popular

song in recent decades gives scintillat song in recent decades gives scintillating and authentically atmospheric treatment to songs such as Who's Sorry Now, Toot Toot Tootsie Goodbye and Button Up Your Overcoat with exactly appropriate accompaniment from Don Costa's orchestra. The LP first appeared in 1958, but has a timeless appeal reflecting the mood and vivacity of the era it depicts.

One of the best close harmony groups in pop music history in top form on typically characteristic stylings of Life is Just A Bowl OI Cherries, My Funny Valentine. Come Rain Or Come Shine and Misty among others in sessions recorded instrumentally in Canada and vocally in Germany in 1978. This is the type of vocal virtuosity which could now win vocal virtuosity which could now win a whole new audience

JAMES LAST: Non Stop Dancing '85. Polydor POLD 5172. And non-stop selling for sure for this well-tried Hansi formula of dancing music with modinstrumental electronics and a party-type atmosphere.

One of the best of the latest appeal records, this smooth reggae number was written and organised by Leon Lieffer and Tony Douglas of the Blackstones with Gene Rondo. Over 200 singers and musicians appear, with many top names from the British reggae scene, including Aswad, Dennis Brown, Janet Kay. The Proneers, Winston Reedy and Trevor Walters.

RED GUITARS: Be With Me (One Way OW 1(T), Cartel/Red Rhino). This moody track, well produced by lan Broudie, with a sensitive vocal within a sparse arrangement, should bring them yet more well deserved exposure.

SPANK: Oh Baby (Champion CHAMP (12)1, PRT). Slick and soulful this track boasts an effective backing of bubbling bass punctuated by melodic horns. A strong, emotive, vocal leads into a chorus of memorable harmonies which will ensure attention for this superb soul number.

FREEEZ: That Beats My Patience (Beggars Banquet BEG 129(T), WEA). The first material since main man singer John Rocca left for a solo career and it shows a marked change of direction, moving away from the former electro dance style to modern soulful pop of rolling bass, swiring synths and a clear catchy vocal crisply produced by Peter Wilson. Should ensure them a completely new audience.

DENNIS BROWN: Slow Down Woman (Greensleeves—(GRED 175), Spartan/Jet Star). Light and breezy reggae with sparsely arranged loping rhythms forming an excellent backing for Dennis Brown's rich, vibrant vocal. Produced by Prince Jammy and enlivened by various quirky effects, this soulful reggae track deserves attention.

Following the increase in business over the past year, the TRG salesforce has been expanded with the addition of Keith Watkins, who joins from K-tel as a director.

"This appointment has allowed us to move Bob Barnes more into the area of specialist products such as window displays, posters and self-adhesive labels," says group managing director Lee Newbon. "We believe that we are now the only company that has a rep selling just such specialist

only company that has a rep selling just such specialist product."
Additional appointments have seen Wesley Howe and John Butcher becoming directors, and George Duffy joining as a sales representative. At the same time, the internal account executive has been increased with Richard Fox joining from Polydor along with Jo Riggs from K-tel.
"We are delighted with the inroads that Bob Barnes has made in the display and point-of-sale areas of the record business," adds Newbon. "We see a healthy growth area in this side of the business."

R&B Reproductions will soon be able to offer the facility of electronic page composition in addition to the full range of

electronic page composition in addition to the full range of services already offered including laser scanning.

Robor prides itself on being able to meet the ever increasing demands of the record industry for quality of sleeves produced and speed of turnaround. "That, coupled with our ability and skills to devise and produce original packaging

ideas keeps us ahead of the field," says MD lan Robinson Uptons continues to be the TRG group's biggest supplier to the music industry. Nick Toms, managing director comments: "The total music business units we produced last year was 51m, and the fastest growth area has been in 12-inch disco bags — 15m — followed by the special 7-inch gratefold wallets." gatefold wallets.

"Our ultra-violet four-colour printing presses are proving to be essential to keep up with the demands of the industry." On the compact disc front, TRG is currently talking to a number of companies with a view to becoming substantially involved in the UK production of the manufacture of the new sound carrier's packaging.

Derek Christian, joint MD of Uptons, has visited Germany twice in connection with the development of a machine which will automatically manufacture CD packaging. And Bob Barnes has been in the US recently taking note of the US approach to CD packaging.

MONIQUE GUNN, managing director of Senol Printing, runs her 23-year-old company by the dictum "efficiency will keep us there". It's a philosophy that has paid off, for Senol now supplies 12-inch LP sleeves for many small companies who specialise in the nostalgia and jazz markets.

'The runs are sometimes small," says Gunn, "but when they are added up among the various labels, they amount to a very large output. There is a demand worldwide for this kind of product, and we give a personal service geared to individual needs.

"We have installed new machinery for the production of assette inlays and I can honestly say that we've had a very good year. With trends constantly changing, one has to stay ahead, and now we are looking closely at the CD market. It would be a step forward for instance if the booklets for CD could be done here and hopefully that will happen.

"But a whole range of attitudes will have to change because personally I don't like the packing on CDs. The plastic cases don't last, they are not attractive, and I feel the whole thing needs re-designing.

"I am convinced," she adds, "that the printing for CDs will happen here, and if we have to change in order to accommodate new needs, then we shall. I would like people like ourselves, as printers and suppliers, to have a little more scope in the growing future of CD."

More work and a greater flexibility

Stace investment pays

HEAVY INVESTMENT in printing sleeve machinery has generated new work and greater fle-xibility at Robert Stace & Company, one of the most successful printers to the music industry.

There is no doubt that our investment programme has paid off," says Chris Bennett, group marketing director. "We have always director. "We have always believed in keeping up with new printing technology and as a result business is heal-

Bennett finds that runs on LP and cassette inlay are around 60/40 in that order, 50/50 if it's TV-advertised product. "There's also no doubt that an eye-catching sleeve will help sell product," adds Bennett. convinced that a lot of people might go into a shop to buy a particular piece of product, spot a well-designed, well-printed sleeve and buy the record.

"It's very much a question of matching up the image to the music inside that seems to be working in most cases. Those kind of records are rather like toys at the end of the supermarket check-out.

Robert Stace's customers include most of the leading labels, and Bennett points to the fact that this has un-doubtedly helped business over the past year.

"In a way we are somewhat cossetted because we don't control the area of creativity," he says. "But when you are dealing with successful companies and first-class designers, it makes our job that much easier and rewarding.

On CD packaging, Bennett has reservations: "There is no doubt that the next five years will see a massive growth in the CD market, but I'm still not convinced that the present packaging is helping to sell the product.

"The LP sleeve is unique and its sheer size gives an impression of value for money. The same problem happened with the introduc-tion of the cassette and I think someone will come up with an answer to present CD in a better visual light. We have a few ideas of our own along those lines and, as always, we shall try to keep that little bit ahead of the market.

12-inch work

RECORD COMPANY Services' Phil Waller reports plenty of activity on 12-inch

singles.

"We have a lot of work on at present, and although a lot of our clients are the smaller independent labels, we are also working on other projects," he says. "One of our recent rush jobs was to our recent rush jobs was to prepare a bag for The Osmonds' single in time for the Country Music Festival. We are also involved in the corporate image on design and print for the IPI. Like a lot of others, we are looking at the CD market, but there's not much that can be done until more work comes to this country."

New policy

● LEICESTER-BASED printers E Hannibal & Company restructured its policy during the past year, a move which, according to sales director B J Smith has already begun to pay off.
"The budget end of the

market is constantly under pressure because of the margins, but we are keeping our margins up. This is be-cause we intend to stay in the music industry, but on our terms," he says.

"We aim to give top service to those willing to pay, and at the same time keep our company profitable. So far as CD is concerned, it's a market we're looking at, and as prices come down, there will obviously be more work around.



Run by Marylyn and Nigel Goodall, Artsleeves was set up in 1980 and has been busy ever since designing sleeves for a number of budget label back catalogue releases, as well as a sizeable amount of current product.

Among the artists for whom Goodall has designed sleeves are Ray Charles, Little Richard, Glen Campbell, Fats Domino, Neil Sedaka, Gene Pitney and Gene Vincent, and many more. Labels making frequent use of his expertise include Premier, Energy, Flyright, Bulldog and President, and the trio of Interstate labels — Krazy Kat, Harlequin and Gospel Heritage.
As well as the constant flow of budget product sleeves, tour books and posters Artsleeves is responsible for, Nigel Goodall is now looking to current chart material with the idea of working closely with fresh record companies, artists and their managers to progress further into art direction, as distinct from straight sleeve design.

"We offer the complete range of service," says Nigel Goodall. "Whatever a record company wants we'll do it. The key word is service."

Green sleeves

BRUCE GILL set up Green Ink as a one-man operation in 1981 after he was made redundant from his job as art director at a London design studio. Now the Peckham studio has a staff of four and has successfully turned once scant music business connections into handling complete campaigns for many major record companies.

Green Ink covers the whole spectrum of design, from stickers to entire promotional packages. But the main emphasis is on sleeve work, with current projects including Everybody Wants To Rule The World by Tears For Fears and The Myzterious Mizter Jones by Slade.

Other recent work has included the complete Starlight Express campaign, Sharpe & Numan's Change Your Mind single, plus contributions to sleeve for London's highly-promising Swamplands label, Bronski Beat, Los Lobos and The Bluebells.

ODAY'S SINGLES — dominated market has, inevitably, had a

The mixture in young buyers of astuteness and naivety, coupled with a strong visual and fashion awareness, has challenged

marketing managers.

Finding the "new" gimmick is the problem; buyers are too astute for coloured vinyl, picture discs, "limited edition" picture bags and other ploys to make much impact.

With the 12-inch single and the picture bag the norm, buyers are tempted by the extras — the free 12-inch single tucked in an album's gatefold sleeve; the envelope or wallet with a five-track 12-inch single; the fold-out sleeve that becomes a poster; lyric sheet or photo sheet inserts and so on.

Many have gone into total styling, to provide a unique image that could start a trend. This usually involves an outside agency, perhaps a photographic stylist or a fashion consultant, meeting a new band long before release dates and meticulously planning a style that is different and will suit the band's music (most important) and one that the band can maintain with credibility.

Established artists do not, of course, need such consultants, though are happy to take advice on certain aspects.

Marketing attitudes vary. One step removed from the record industry is Cream Creative director Margaret Taylor. Cream is an advertising agency (EMI Records a major client) as well as a design and marketing consultancy, and has advertising-style "think tanks", nutsand-bolts marketing expertise, and teams of in-house designers in all age groups and from different walks of life. Plenty of internal (though often unconscious) feedback is the result.

Taylor explains: "A style must suit the market and it must be appropriate for all the forms — records, TV, advertising — whatever will be used. It's quite easy to have an idea if you are not at all creative. Having the right idea for the market is the difficult thing. When Cream designs sleeves (and related print) they are for established, MOR-pop artists, young hitmakers and new bands.

There is no point commissioning a beautiful illustration or stylish

acts are almost MOR — the acceptable face of pop."

In contrast to this business approach — and in itself a great idea for a well-serviced market — is Island's forthcoming campaign for a summer series of mid-price Reggae Greats packages. (The Wailers and Gregory Isaacs pictured above).

Thirteen LPs are due over the months with various singles from each. Most are single-artists collections, other compilations — Lover's Rock. The DJ's album and Rockers. The campaign, previewed to the media early in April at the upmarket Hamilton Gallery in Mayfair, is intended to draw attention to current illustrative design.

Not all the designers chosen are record business names. Each illustration matches the artist's theme — a different brief. On the backs of the sleeves are photos.

"This is real sleeve art," says Island's Bruno Tilley. The campaign is pitched at widening reggae's audience and, because it is a mid price range, budgets had to be kept reasonable.

A major Island music project, which also requires special market-

A major Island music project, which also requires special marketing, its own logos and graphics, and a generic feel is the Washington Go-Go launch. This "new" sound, emanating from the Fourth & Broadway label qualifies for a whole new house style. This street ghetto dance music style is in the sleeves and associated marketing graphics, and is highly original.

But despite this considerable investment in "new" art, there is still a reluctance to affirm that the sleeve sells the record. "It only works in a negative way," says one art director. "If the image is wrong it works against sales, but not necessarily the other way round. It had to be down to the music.

And the marketing, Virgin's Gary Wathen instances the success of the Working Week LP, which came with a free 12-inch single in a gatefold, and other gatefold 12-inch single sleeves, as example of wrappers which did not sell the product. He points to new acts such as Stephen Duffy, whose Kiss Me 12-inch has done very well in a usually soft sales period.

usually soft sales period.

All-important these days is the logo. There are so many print areas it's crucial to link them all, from teaser campaigns to fly posters to full-page press advertisement to sleeves.

Logos may change for a follow-up batch of releases, to create fresh appeal while still reflecting the band's personality and the music.

CBS' veteran art director Roslav Szaybo has observed the stronger marketing flavour in design these days. Singles covers, once try-outs for new designers, are now like business cards, introductions for artists which tie in which the LP, the product to be sold. A major record company art department is looking at something like 250 covers a year. To do this, keeping standards high, is quite a challenge. "A wonderful sleeve won't sell a dreadful record, but you will inevitably find a good song in a good sleeve," says Szaybo.

Gothic explores

GOTHIC PRINT further consolidated its position as one of the UK's top sleeve printers through 1984, with such ventures as supplying the bags for the phenomenally-successful Band Aid record, and making its first moves into the potentially

vast CD inlay card market.

Founded in 1980 when the record industry was in a bad state of recession, Gothic Print more than weathered the storm, and has been growing ever since with turnover increasing annually to a current figure somewhere in excess

of 16m sleeves a year.

"When the Band Aid thing came up we were glad to donate the first 100,000 sleeves in order to give it a kick off, and we ended up doing somewhere around 1.3m for them," says company secretary Steve Simmons. "We got tremendous support from our staff, with them working lunch hours for no pair." he cause

tremendous support from our staff, with them working furich hours for no pay," he says.

Foremost specialists in seven and 12-inch sleeve printing, Gothic has also acknowledged the inexorable rise of the CD, and has already printed various inserts and booklets for the market. They will be keeping a more than careful eye on it in the coming months to ensure that as it grows they grow.

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SLEEVE & LABEL PRINTING

THE RECORD sleeve is once again at the forefront of design with such companies as 4AD and Stylo Rouge putting more and more work into creating mini works of art.

HE RECORD sleeve is still the music business designer's treat. Advertisements, often put together in a rush, have not changed much in the past 12 months, but sleeve design is a constantly developing art.

The so-called typographic revolution of around two years ago has inevitably settled into comfortable familiarity, and the Bauhaus-art style has nearly gone. Expensive testing of new sorts of paper and card has stopped, presumably because the end-user, the fan, didn't notice the difference.

Rob O'Connor of Stylo Rouge is a regular award winner, and long time observer of design trends. This year CBS entered some of his sleeves, resulting in both the winning point-of-sale campaign for Alison Moyet (done with Simon Cantwell of the CBS art department, guided by Kit Buckler) and for singles; Paul Young's I'm Gonna Tear Your Playhouse Down.

O'Connor believes record companies are less worried about money spent on design, though Cream's Margaret Taylor commented that there seems to be no logic to it. Vast sums are spent on no-hopers, while money is denied for important projects.

Despite falling budgets for LP sleeves, as that market diminshes, and more designated for singles and cassettes, companies are prepared for the extras.

These include details like transparency retouching and, on a more technical note, expensive experiments with the printer's equivalent of the Quantel Paintbox. Nevertheless, there is still the old standby, the artist photograph. As long as the designer is in at that stage, he or she is seldom going to feel thwarted.

Town and Country Planning's Martin Atkins has not noticed the budgets going up much, despite being as busy as always. Record companies are still this studio's biggest clients, so it has become involved in gatefold sleeves and other forms, and even a holographic sleeve.

Designers such as O'Connor and Atkins appreciate a continuous

sleeve.

Designers such as O'Connor and Atkins appreciate a continuous flow of new names and the change in demands, essential for a designer to avoid an individual stamp which could so quickly look dated. But some manage the stamp without the postmark.

Vaughan Oliver, for example, has worked with 4AD, the Beggar's Banquet designer label for four years, developing his style as the label band's music evolves. He incorporated his department into 23 Envelope, involving art student and photographer Nigel Grayson. His stamp is his personal response to the music, guided by the

band's own ideas on mood or feel, or perhaps inspired by a lyric line

band's own ideas on mood or feel, or perhaps inspired by a lyric line — more art than marketing.

"It works now," said Oliver, "and I hope a sleeve will still work a few years from now. We ignore trends and I'd like to think that if an album is in someone's collection until 1990 the sleeve won't have dated."

"We're very low key here," he said. There is even the rare accolade of phone calls asking who 4AD's printers are. Every designer knows the frustration of spending days working out colours only to find that the result varies through the run. Though technical developments make for layout flexibility and speed of origination, the business end hasn't caught up, designers complain. Oliver agrees.

"Ordinary card and the methods used doesn't allow for fine art printing," he said.

once under-rated designer who occasionally doesn't use print, is Chris Morton of C-More-Tone. His extraordinary range of style has brought him customers ranging from sprinted straight on to the cardboard envelope) and a reggae sleeve which was a painted photograph, right up to the award-winning work for the Dire Straits Alchemy sleeve, and related print.

As small labels melt away, larger ones appear, and Virgin is an appreciator of Morton's work. He particularly liked being involved with Working Week from day one.

"The good thing about this band was the opportunity for me to plan ahead and design an entire look for four singles and an album," said Morton. "It is disappointing when a one-off singles bag vanishes because the record flops; far more satisfying to be involved in a series of releases so no good idea is wasted."

He has been able to apply the long term approach to another Virgin band, General Public, with the different sleeves nevertheless having a similar look. Giving him great delight of late is painting a sleeve for The Kinks.

"It's like playing back my childhood." he said, delighted that the US success of one of our most reliable oldies led to Ray Davies commissioning the sleeve painting as a result of seeing Chris' private work, consisting of the paintings he does for fun at the end of a hard day at the drawing board. Look out for the new single, Do It Again.

"Designers have more flexibility with a famous band," Morton explained. "Everybody knows what they look like." With bigger labels, the image is record-company orientated. "I always bear that in mind," he said.

What he likes best is different styles for different people.
"You have to be flexible or be a dead duck." he said. "Illustrators can be flavour of the week, so we have to keep changing." Despite the variety and artistic standard of his work, he retains the craftman's approach so important to a sleeve designer.

Though the music business (or rather the bands) cannot always be credited with setting fashions, sleeve art certainly can. Publishing and advertising over the last few years have visibly adopted the music business look (check out the Newman TV commercials).

Much of this is due to the ingenuity of video directors, too. John Pasche said: "There's a lot of money invested in video, so it makes sense to carry on these images on record sleeves and related material." The new Paul Hardcastle packaging reflects the scratch technique used in the video for 19, a song about Vietnam. "There are numerous packaging variations now," Pasche continued, "the booklet form, the picture disc sitting on cardboard plinth and so on. Some of these are thought up by designers, and this heavy new singles surge is a real change for the art departments."

The other significant change is the use of computer gadgetry. The Astron is a budget version of the Quantel Paintbox. Used for the Hardcastle video, it can multiply images, change colours and many other clever things. The video intercuts library clips of Vietnam with multiple artists shots scratched in with other images.

The Citex is something a designer will either fall in love with or avoid completely. Small comfort to the transparency retouching and layout craftman, it puts design back where it started, in the print shop. Studios with teams of designers, paste-up people, typographers, instant lettering and Grant enlargers now compete with a photgraphic computer than can retouch, save unused bits of a picture, photos or paintings and bring them back later, lay-out type and much more.

But on the same premise that digital sound can't improve the music, computers can't make the de

some designers will over ride the buttons and go back to the drawing board.

The last word from a Citex fan, Virgin's Gary Wathen: "It's like a movie special-effects system. We can put a band on a beach, retouch a risque photo or illustration, make slight alterations to adapt to individual territories' requirements, re-plan layouts, move images about, and try numerous different looks."

Despite this, there is still room for the artist who prefers to hand-paint and hand-letter a sleeve from scratch Like the charts, there's room for everybody in the sleeve design world.

THERE HAS rarely been a tighter race for top position in the disco/dance charts than on the current week's listing. As the Rah Band gave away just a little momentum, the sales position was almost neck-and-neck between the David Grant/Jacki Graham duet, the Cool Notes and Phyllis Nelson.

In the end, Grant/Graham's Could It Be I'm Falling In Love stole ahead of the others by a whisker, but all three are selling on a par

— and in huge quantities across — and in huge quantities across the country, as also evidenced by the very high national pop chart positions of each — and The Rah Band too, for that matter, who are back in the national Top 10 for the first time since 1977's The Crunch.
Paul Hardcastle, still flushed with American success for his Rain Forest, crashes in at an effortless number 16 in his first

effortless number 16 in his first chart week with 19. The (in retrospect) rather ironically entitled Eat Your Heart Out failed to quite live up to expectations, coming on the heels of Rain Forest, but the new record is stronger, and theoretically has everything needed to finally provide a major pop crossover

Hardcastle has probably had more records which have come more records which have come to rest at number 41 nationally — and thereby missed out on Radio One and Top Of The Pops recognition — than any other performer in history. A dubious honour, and one which he would undoubtedly like to be rid of.

A huge riser on the chart (43 to 13) is Lillo Thomas' Settle Down, now on UK release through EMI (Capitol 12CL 356) after many months as an import favourite in clubs. The British 12-incher cou-ples a long, remixed vocal ver-sion with an instrumental variation and the Thomas co-written I Like Your Style.

Indications are that Capitol may have been just a little wary of this release, having previously caught a cold with eventual UK issues of long-term, in-demand imports by Brass Construction and others. Settle Down looks unplifely on first domestic sales likely, on first domestic sales showings, to disappoint at all, major success could lead to further experimental soul outings from the EMI stable.

MCA, which apparently can do little wrong in the dance field these days, has scored again with a new entry at 34 for Rockie Rob-bins' double-sider Work For Love/ We Belong Together, two tracks

extracted from his new album. also entitled We Belong Together (MCF 3259). Robbins has been around the scene for some time, kicking up a little dust in the specialist import market now and

again, but this marks his bow into wider UK recognition. The 12-inch version of Work For Love is another mix by the successful and in-demand team of John Morales and Sergio Munzibai.

Whitney's

ARISTA'S four-track demo by recent UK visitor Whitney Houston, plus the album which is now in the American charts, have found widespread popularity on British club dancefloors.

In fact, so enthusiastic was feedback on all the demo EP tracks, that Arista has been hard-pushed to make a decision as to which should be

extracted as the debut single.

The track eventually chosen was the duet Someone For Me with Jermaine Jackson — a shrewd choice bearing in mind Jackson's own recent Top 10 pop success with Do What You Do. The original album track is being remixed by DMC's Alan The Judge Coulthard, and the results will be on 12-inch on April 26.



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
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
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
