UK capacity boosted to 55m a year to cope with 'explosion of demand'

LESS THAN a year after opening the UK's first CD manufacturing plant, independent Nimbus Re-cords has announced that plans for a second factory to boost its total capacity to 25m units a year are now well-advanced.

The new plant will be built alongside the first CD factory on the company's Monmouth estate by extending an existing complex of buildings. The news comes just two weeks after EMI revealed plans to build a 10m-units-a-year


plant at Swindon and become the first major with its own CD manufacturing facility (MW July 20). There are also plans for two other CD plants with a combined capacity of around 20m which, when added to Nimbus and EMI, will be the LM CD process. when added to Nimbus and EMI, will bring the UK CD pressing capacity to 55m a year compared with PolyGram's Hanover plant which is targeting 35m in 1986. Nimbus' new £7½m facility is expected to be ready to start production in the summer of 1986.

duction in the summer of 1986.

but in the meantime the company is operating a 24-hour production line. Non-stop manufacturing has been introduced earlier than expected, but has been forced on Nimbus by "the explosion of de-mand for CDs worldwide".

The company currently produces CDs for EMI, Virgin, WEA, CBS, A&M, MCA, K-tel and BBC Records. Among its customers also are 12 US independent classical labels, a variety of European and Scandinavian classical companies and, in the UK classical sector, Abbey, CRD and Meridian.

Nimbus will be celebrating its first year of CD production on September 13 and by the end of October hopes to have reached its current full production capacity of 6m discs a year. The new plant will contain an additional 20

Amstrad's appeal against that judgment is due to be heard on September 23 and the judge said in last week's hearing that the stay on the CBS/EMI/Chrysalis action will be reviewed in early October. The companies are seeking damages based on sales of the twin-cassette systems.


IPC launches music mag for young


Initial print order will be 350,000 and Holborn hopes the circulation will settle around 190,000. The launch is being advertised on radio, television and in cinemas.

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

JIVE, THE record division of the Zomba group of companies, has signed a manufacturing and distribution deal with PRT, having split from CBS which it had been with since its foundation four years ago.

The deal is a substantial coup for PRT and Zomba chief executive Clive

The deal is a substantial coup for PRT and Zomba chief executive Clive Calder comments: "When we noticed that other key independent labels like Virgin, A&M and Stiff were switching their manufacturing and distribution services from CBS to other companies, we started to examine closely our own relationship with CBS as well as looking around at what similar services other companies could offer. We were very impressed with the enthusiasm and flexible approach displayed by the PRT people."

A spokesman for CBS added: "We are always sorry to see other companies leave us but often factors over which we have no control influence the situation. CBS offers the best manufacturing and distribu-

influence the situation. CBS offers the best manufacturing and distribution service in the business but that does not mean that there is the occasional parting of the ways."

Jive's agreement with PRT is effective as of August 1 and debut product will be Mystery Lady by Billy Ocean. Other bands on the Jive roster include A Flock Of Seagulls, Hugh Masakela, Mama's Boys, Whodini, Tangerine Dream and The Comsat Angels.

Virgin opens classical store

VIRGIN RETAIL opened its first classical store on Monday (29) with the accent on young buyers converted to the medium of cassettes and CDs.

The Virgin Classical Shop is a self-contained part of the Virgin Megastore in London's Oxford Street and, says manager Chris Travers, it aims to stock at least one of every classical CD and tape available. He adds that discounting of all product will be standard practice with "up to £1 off full-price product".

The shop has its own entrance in Tottenham Court Road and there are connecting doors to the main Megastore enabling classical customers to listen to classical product while browsing. But Travers, formerly of HMV in Oxford Street, says he intends to steer away from a heavily specialist atmosphere. He comments: "I don't want to make the shop stuffy or staid

have come here with a retail background rather than having studied classical music and I want to make sure people who come here who are perhaps fairly new to classical music will not feel intimidated."

PRS member fined for fraud





U2's LP sales quadrupled in the week after the show and all five of the band's albums entered the chart, sales of Queen's Greatest Hits went up by a factor of five, Freddie Mercury's solo album's sales trebled as did sales of product by Eric Clapton and Hall And

Rust added: "I've never seen an across-the-board increase in sales like this before. It's turned the chart upside-down.

The record chains, though, are finding some difficulty in getting the albums they want. A spokes-man for Virgin Retail said: "I suspect the record companies have been caught out a bit by the de-mand. There's never been a reac-tion to a television programme like it. It's quite unbelievable."

CD packaging squabbles

NEW YORK: Disputes over CD packaging become more heated as the market for discs expands and pricing pressures mount.

Claiming to have modified the package tried for Prince's Around the World In A Day, Warner Bros will switch catalogue product to all-board packaging, despite having received some 300 consumer complaints in the wake of the Prince release. Elektra will similarly put out Motley Crue's upcoming Theatre of Pain in the new package configuration.

As for CD player prices, \$250-300 is the most popularly-advertised range, with the occasional sales breaking even the \$200 mark. Trying to stir interest in high-end car systems, Panasonic sent a CD-equipped limousine around New York recently to pick up journalists and take them, individually, on a demonstration spin. Pioneer thought its desert-run tests were impressive, but that's nothing compared with New York

In related packaging developments, WEA is undertaking a renewed push to replace the Norelco cassette box for audio

tapes.

The new box would be similar to the one being touted for CDs and represents, in WEA's view, a stab at standardisation which would help manufacturers, wholesalers and retailers with warehousing, manufacturing and display problems.

"If 50 per cent of our business is in the cassette format, why are we forcing the consumer to shop the LP section in order to make his cassette selections?" asked WEA vice president Russ Rach at a retail chain convention in Ohio.

Rockin' Sidney and a host of other New Orleans acts, including Irma Thomas, Clifton Chenier, Queen Ida and Beausoleil have been scheduled to play New York, many of them for the first time.

THE INTERNATIONAL Tape/Disc Association reports that the market for blank audio cassettes stabilised in 1984 with sales of Target for blank audio cassettes stabilised in 1984 with sales of 243m units compared with 240m the previous year, an increase of 1.3 per cent. Value for audio tape dropped 2.1 per cent to \$268.3m from 1983's \$273.9m. The ITA statistics include sales to consumers, duplicator and industrial users, but do not reflect

sales of blank tape pancakes, though the latter is generally more significant in the video rather than audio market. WARNER COMMUNICATIONS, reporting record high profits for its recorded music division in the first half, is the latest company to settle an anti-trust price fixing class action suit brought against most major labels. WCl will pay \$8.5m though as with the other parties settling the case out of court, there has been no admission of guilt.

Fair play

Lerwick has got a number of his facts wrong in his letter questioning why Phonographic Per formance Ltd exists at all (MW, Opinion July 6).

He is wrong about the US: There is not, and never has been, any legal protection given to re-cordings in the US comparable to that given in the UK. Consequent-ly, there is not any "per play per record" arrangement on US radio at least, none applicable to recording companies. I think he must have confused the copyright in the recording with that in the musical work, and possibly the American equivalent of the PRS operates the royalty to which

He is wrong to assume that the more records played, the more record sales will result. At least, record sales will result. At least, one does not automatically follow from the other. The industry has never sold as many records as during the Sixties when the BBC only had 22 hours per week needletime (a very small fraction of what it currently has) and there was no ILR.

He is wrong to lay at our door the fact that radio stations do not

the fact that radio stations do not broadcast more specialist music. This is the result of the basic conservatism, conventionality and general middle-aged flabbi ness of their programme policies, not of our needeltime limits. We do have needletime limits, and for very good reasons, all of which were set out in my letter in

your March 23 issue.

However, the limits are so high that they allow recorded music to

be used as the biggest single source of programme material on Radios One to Four, and on ILR. Certainly, there is enough needle-time to allow stations to indulge in specialist music programming or more imaginative use of spe-cialised kinds of music — but has

cialised kinds of music — but has Mr Nickerson monitored Radios One and Two or ILR recently? If he has, he will know that the records which are played again and again, and which use up the vast bulk of available needletime, are current and past chart records by this page artists. They are by big-name artists. They are played, incidentally, because the broadcasters need them to bring in listeners, in their own interests, regardless of whether they sell records or not.

In any case, we have always been prepared to negotiate in a logical and businesslike way ab-out needletime increases.

out needletime increases. Finally, he is wrong to refer to our members as "the elite 500 companies". Our repertoire of recordings covers over 2,500 labels issued by those 500 companies, issued by those 500 companies, and we are proud of the extent of our membership, its depth and breadth in terms not only of the types of music it covers, but of the sizes of company. Probably there are no more than 50 or 60 of our members who could be called either main companies or led either major companies or large independents.

large independents.

The other 450 are very small, sometimes very specialist producers, and many of them have issued less than five or six titles. If they are the elite, who does Mr Nickerson regard as the proletar-

LPO signs with **Imperial Tobacco**

THE LONDON Philharmonic Orchestra has signed a new £120,000 sponsorship contract with Imperial Tobacco Ltd to make nine further recordings for the John Player Master Series on Classics for Pleasure and EMI Eminence.

and EMI Emineice.

The contract, which will run for three years, continues an association between the three organisations which has now run for 15 years, and has been marked by some particularly successful product. Principal among them was the first recording made in CfP's initial launch, Tchaikousky's 1812 coupled with works by Glinka, Wagner and Mussorgsky, which has so far notched up 400,000 sales. By 1974, the John Player Master series had accumulated 1m sales, and the figure to date exceeds 3.5m, spread over 70 titles. Says Brian Wray, marketing director of ITL; "Against such an impressive history, we are naturally delighted to continue our sponsorship." Salonen signs to CBS

CBS MASTERWORKS has signed the Finnish conductor Esa-Pekka Salonen to an exclusive, multi-record, long-term contract. This will include a complete cycle of symphonies by Carl Nielsen, with the Swedish Radio Symphony Orchestra.

Salonen has already recorded Nielsen's Symphony No 4 and the Helios Overture; and he has also recorded Jolivet's Second Trumpet Concerto with Wynton Marsalis, and the Philharmonia.

Hamming it up

WINSTON REEDY: Live At Hammersmith. MMG Video. MMGV 002. Dealer price: £13.99. Plain 'n' simple performance video of the one-time lead Cimaron playing support to UB40 at the Hammy Odeon back in 1983.

Most of the nine songs are taken from Reedy's highly successful Dim The Lights album of the time, and musically — if you're a sucker for his blend of lovers rock and upful skanking — this will not disappoint.

As a visual spectacle though, it is less engaging. None of the warm response Reedy seems to be receiving seeps through to the living room, chiefly because the crowd are never seen. Their presence is only apparent because of the odd bout of enthusiastic applause.

Reared on big budgets, 1985's video consumer is likely to want more than the out of synch slow more than the out of sylind sow motion and basic super-imposition effects on offer here. The lights are standard rock fare, the backdrop a simple red theat-rical curtain, and nothing old rical curtain, and nothing old smoothie Reedy does — shakes his locks out of expensive felt hat, jumps around a bit, plugs his LP between every song — can stop the boredom setting in.

Sunshine music made drab, and expensive to boot. Long before the 50 minutes are up all but the stalwart will want to forget about the visuals and just listen to the music.

THINGS CAN take time in this supposedly fast-moving business. Ten years on from being hailed as the future of rock 'n' roll and only now is Springsteen at his commercial peak. Five years on from the ground-breaking U2 debut, Boy, and only now is Bono being tipped by the oh-so-shrewd dailies as 'The New Boss''. It was no great surprise then, that having finally scuppered the sceptics with what looks like being the best album of the year in Steve McQueen, the tickets for Prefab Sprout's prestige show should carry the legend "special reduced price".

Still, it worked. The place was packed. Filled to capacity with those who already appreciate that Paddy McAloon is currently writing some of the most tenderly observed songs that have ever been penned in the name of pop music.

The Sprouts are no longer wilfully obscure; they play the game a little bit. Their stage clothes were coordinated: the boys in white Man-From-Havana suits, that didn't quite sit right, and the Prefab sprite Wendy Smith in diaphanous fairy white lace. They looked very Seventies.

They were friendly too. Paddy changing the lyric "still in love with Hayley Mills" to "Mrs Mills", brother Martin twirling on his heels, and the pair of them joining guest guitarist Kevin Armstrong in a Quo spoof. Only Smith looked like she'd held on to the old nervousness, jigging round the stage with all the grace of a real Quo fan.

A lot of the songs were played faster than their recorded equivalents, which detracted a bit But by the way of compensation, the easier structures of the songs from Steve McQueen gave fresh focus to the complex convolutions of those from their 1983 debut Swoon.



AN IRISH record label whose first single release sold more than 100,000 units has finally got round to issuing its second single seven years later, and appropriately enough it features Jake Burns, who with Stiff Little Fingers was launched on the path to success with that first release.

Rigid Digit Records was formed solely to launch
the career of the Belfast band, but following the
initial success it found it just couldn't cope and Stiff
Little Fingers switched to a London-based indie before signing with a major company and having five hit albums.

But now Jake Burns, lead singer and songwriter with SLF, has formed The Big Wheel, and their debut single On Fortune Street/Here Comes That Song Again, is the second release on Rigid Digit Records. The band has been gigging continuously since the

beginning of 1984, but Burns says: "When we felt that we had got it right to start making records, A&R men just seemed to blow hot and cold on us. We've wasted a lot of time talking to people who couldn't make up their minds, or took an age doing so, so we're going it alone.
"Back in 1978 Stiff Little Fingers were turned down

by every company we approached so we did it ourselves and a year later those same companies were knocking our door down. I believe in what we are doing now just the same."

On Fortune Street is being marketed by Survival

Records whose A&R/promotions director David Rome says: "Feedback on the single has been very good so far, and it has been picking up a lot of airplay around the country. We're hoping Rigid Digit could be about to have its second hit seven years later."

TO REDUCE it to its very basics, this concert was about two things: BB King and his guitar, Lucille. One transformed the other into something approaching the extraordinary. And it's impossible to say which does what and to whom.

most elementary medium, the blues. Twelve-bar, the slow blues of tinkling piano, tears, regret and deceit is always a mournfully taut experience, but King transcended this. He almost made it celebratory. In touching the raw spike of naked emotion he created a music of communication, a glorious sound encapsulating a shared feeling: a rare and indefinable gift. Hammersmith Odeon was awash with the simple pleasure of his music as a surprisingly mixed audience of young and old, of fan and muso revelled in the sheer delight of seeing the great man. Special mention should also be made for his backing band, a truly professional collection who knew exactly when to make their con-

RAY CHARLES is always a welcome visitor to the UK and his recent appearance at the Royal Festival Hall, as part of the Capital Radio Jazz Parade week, was enthusiastically received by a packed house which even included an incognito Alison Moyet.

He doesn't over-stay his welcome; everything is condensed into a crisp 70 minute set, but he still managed to include many of his hits as well as some of the other song standards. The old favourites were included—Georgia On My Mind, What'd I Say, Crying Time etc — all laced with Charles' wry humour and accompanied by his quirky stage movements and personality.

Ray Charles is one of the few artists who can keep an audience totally enthralled. The pity is that his recording output nowadays seems to be so spasmodic but maybe his record company CBS has something up its sleeve for the not-too-distant future.


10 RECORDS, which has made itself very much a label to be reckoned with in the dance field during 1985, should score again in August with what looks like being the hottest compilation album of recent dancefloor hits since EMI's Now Dance a while back.

Titled Turn It Up, after the Conway Brothers' current pop smash which is already giving 10 its biggest black crossover smash to date, the double album will offer full-length versions of 12 12-inch successes of the last six months from the 10, Bluebird, Hot Melt and Virgin labels. 

but the success of Harold Faltermeyer's Axel F serves as a reminder that people will still buy a record without lyric or vocal if the track is sufficiently strong without such accoutrements. A funky instrumental currently doing the rounds on import is likely to appeal to a different kind of listener from Axel F, but should not be overlooked by the breed of jazz-funk buyers who will still put large amounts of cash in the direction of dealers who stock the slightly left-of-mainstream likes of Ernie Watts, Larry Carlton, Tom Scott and high-priced Japanese imports.

The record in question is a 12-incher on the US Allegiance label (with an outlet here through PRT) by saxophonist George Nardello, whose name may not be immediately recognisable, but whose session credits stretch back a full quarter-century into the rock/R&B past of Philadelphia and New York, and early discs by Chubby Checker, Patti LaBelle, Claudine Clark and even Elvis Presley. Nardello has recorded several times as a soloist through the years, for labels such as Roulette, GNR-Crescendo and 20th Century, and had the black hit single Love Fantasy Crescendo and 20th Century, and had the black hit single Love Fantasy for Pavillion in 1980 under the guise of the Philadelphia Luv Ensemble.

for Pavillion in 1980 under the guise of the Philadelphia Luv Ensemble. Today he is back to his own name, and grooving his way through a 6½-minute workout on the old jazz/R&B classic Harlem Nocturne, a tune perhaps best known in this country as the theme to the Mike Hammer TV series starring Stacy Keach.

It also has an R&B and pop hit pedigree (in the US, at least) via a 1959 recording by New York band the Viscounts, which became a Top 40 hit all over again in 1965, and turned up again as recently as 1983 on the soundtrack of John Carpenter's movie Christine (and the Motown soundtrack album thereof, though the track actually belongs to Arista). All this has laid down a good deal of subconscious awareness of the tune, a factor which will certainly help Nardello's version sell — and particularly if a lot of DJs begin using it on club floors as a late-evening slow burner. Such a response would also obviously make it worthwhile

"CREATIVE MARKETING" has become an evil seemingly necessary to the survival of the record industry, which after all is concerned more with the selling of bits of plastic than with the dissemination of great music.

No longer is it enough for the music to stand or fall on its own merits. Stunts have to be pulled. Currently the most effective has been (shades of Papa's Got A Brand New Pigbag?) the deletion for six weeks to build up back orders of Lisa Lisa and Cult Jam with Full Force's I Wonder If I Take You Home (CBS TA 6057), a squeakily nagging virtual anthem for young black kids which should now be properly reflected in the charts.

You probably already know about the excellent remix of Arrow's Long Time "The 'Hot' Mixture" (London LONXR 70) incorporating bits from, and flipped by a version of, his older classic Hot, Hot, Hot — definitely the pressing to push now — while Steve Arrington's Dancin' In The Key Of Life (Atlantic A9534TE) has been flipped by master mixer Les Adams' Megamix of five

tracks from the parent album. These are stunts cunning enough to work.

A rather arrogant UK remix of the US remake of Eugene Wilde's Chey Chey Kulé (Fourth & Broadway 12BRW 30), however, has done less well so far than some anticipated maybe because everyone has a hunch there are better B-sides to come.

Incidentally, in the US, the B-side of Kool & The Gang's Cherish (Remix) (De-Lite 880 947-1) is an interwoven medleying Fresh/Misled (Special Mix) which you can bet your bottom dollar will end up one day here as part of some cunning stunt!

More straightforward (so far) releases worth stocking include the eagerly anticipated Howard Johnson's Stand Up (A&M AMY 266), from his LP The Vision which arrived on import (SP-4982) ahead of UK release next week (AMA 4982); the radio-aimed delightful Miquel Brown's Close To Perfection (Record Shack SOHOT 48); the long overdue Rockie Robbins' I've Got Your Number (MCA MCAT 975);

the heavily promoted Total Contrast's Takes A Little Time (London LONX 71); the selling though wrong choice (his Systematic is hotter) of Billy Griffin's If I Ever Lose This Heaven (CBS TX6415); the sloweddown Phil Fearon-ish Mercy Mercy's What Are We Gonna Do About It? (Ensign 12ENY 522); the similarly Phil Fearon-ish, Detroit Spinners-reviving, Peter Royer's Love Is In Season (Club JABX 17); the classy Shirley Brown's Boyfriend (Fourth & Broadway 12BRW 31), always the standout track on her album.

Other UK releases include a remake of The Intruder's Who Do You Love (Streetwave MKHAN 50); Danté's So Long (Cooltempo COOLX 112); Universal Robot Band's Barely Breaking Even (Streetwave MKHAN 48); Thelma Houston's Fantasy & Heartbreak (Remix) (MCA MCAT 989); Spliff Riff's In The Night Time (JKO 12JKO 110, via EMI).

Hottest recent import is Colonel Abrams' Trapped (MCA MCA-23568), while others include Lukk featuring Felicia Collins' On The One (Easy Street EZS-7518); The Gap

Band's Disrespect (Total Experience TED1-2615); Harry Ray's My Baby Loves Me (Panoramic PRI-1203); Sylvia Bennett's You're My Fantasy (The New York Music Company NYMD-1204); Brass Construction's Give And Take (Capital V-8652); Curtis Mayfield's Baby It's You (CRC Records CRC 12-001); Videeo's Young Whipper Snapper (Atlantic O-86867)—a real feminist's delight, in which the woman they're singing about is referred to throughout as a "heifer" (who can "even turn the gay guys on")!

Finally, although yet to fly over the counter, a couple of "sleepers" from some months back which have been building a solidly based buzz in London and may be worth attention from record companies here are Royalle Delite's (I'll Be A) Freak For You (Skyview SKR 5800) and Aleem (featuring Leroy Burgess)'s Get Loose (NIA NI-1243). Incidentally, four weeks ago it was The Paul Simpson Connection's Treat Her Sweeter (10 Records TEN 59-12) which was likely to, and did, make a short sharp impression!



THE FIRST pic of London's new signing Total Contrast, whose Take A Little Time (MW, 27 July) is predictably off and running saleswise after just days on release. Delroy Murray and Robin Achampong both previously worked as insurance salesmen to help finance the recording and release of the singles on their own Total Contrast indie label. Looking for a With-Profits Plan to augment their existing club success, they eventually decided that the major label route was the best Policy!



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


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
