Labels keep up the pace in signing new talent for 1999

The UK's leading labels main tained the pace when it came to artist signings last year, according to Music Week's annual A&R signing survey. However, around a quarter of those acts signed in 1997 and half of those signed in 1996 have parted company with

their label. Although some acts have split up or were signed to one-album deals, many have been dropped in the on-going turnover of signings. Those no longer with the label they signed to in 1996 or 1997 are understood to include Belinda Carlisle, Robert Miles, Rialto, My Life Story, Code Red. Dannii Minogue, Kenickie. Michelle Gayle, North & South and Dario G. Some have since

picked up new deals elsewhere. The hit strike rate of acts signed in 1997 is also down on a year earlier. Only 7.5% of 1997's signings have scored a Top 40 album to date, compared with 13.5% of 1996's signings 12

Kennedy to fly to US for Bronfman summit

Universal Music Group UK chair-man John Kennedy was yester-day (Sunday) due to fly to Los Angeles for a meeting with Seagram chief Edgar Bronfman this week to rubber-stamp his restructuring plans for the com-

pany's UK operations.

Kennedy will present his plans at a meeting scheduled for tomorrow that will be chaired by Bronfman and attended by senior UMG executives including Doug Morris and Jorgen Larsen.
"I'm hoping to get final approval of my plan while I'm

says Kennedy. "I just want to get on with [the restructuring] as soon as I get the OK."

If his blueprint is approved, Kennedy hopes to e-mail staff this week with details of the

Warner takes control at China Warner Music UK has acquired

the 50% of China Records it did not already own, prompting spec-ulation about the future of the label set up by Derek Green in 1094

The move, which gives Warner acts such as Morcheeba, Rialto and The Levellers, prompted the resignation of China managing director John Benedict and co cided with seven of the company's 15 staff being made redun-dant. Casualties included A&R director Chris Checkley and director of radio and TV promotions

In 1994 Warner took a 50% stake in China. It acquired the remainder for an undisclosed amount by exercising an option which came up on December 31 last year.

Precisely how the label will be integrated into Warner UK

remains unclear. That decision will be taken by newly-appointed Phillips, who starts his job today and to whom Green will report. Green will continue as acting chairman until a new structure is confirmed.

The sale has an ironic twist for Rialto, who signed to China last summer following a decision by Rob Dickins, then chairman of Warner UK, to drop them from Fast West.

Mode offers European solution to online distribution problem by Tracey Snell

The major UK record companies are

in negotiations to conduct trials of online music distribution with a company that has appointed former RMC chairman John Preston as a non-executive director

Mode (Music on Demand) International has been staging presentations for all the UK majors about its delivery system. Encompassing technologies such as encryption, watermarking and CDquality compression, it aims to provide an end-to-end solution for distributing music electronically on a European-wide or territorial basis.

Fiddler heads for clash with Leeds V99 festival

The Mean Fiddler was last week granted a licence to stage a festival in Leeds at the end of August - just a week after V99 is expected to take place in the city - as it lost its sponsor of the Fleadh Irish music event. The Mean Fiddler has been

anted a five-year licence for the Leeds festival venue Temple Newsam, where it will stage a parallel Reading Festival. Called Leeds 99, the three-day event will between August 28-30, a day later than the Reading Festival (August 27-29). The two events will feature the same acts. Its launch raises a question over

the future of the Leeds led of V99. which for the past two years has taken place at Temple Newsam a week before Reading, V99 organisers Metropolis and SJM say they are confident that V99 will go ahead in the north, but were unable to confirm a date or venue. DON'T IGNORE THE EURO

t first I thought it was a gimmick when I saw a French A shop displaying prices in Francs and Euros on New Year's Day, After all, I suspect like most Brits, I have remained oblivious to the inexorable march of the

single Furnnean currency.

But now is the time for the rude awakening, Virgin may be one of the few UK music retailers geared up to accept Euros at the moment, but companies across the board will start to feel the effects before long. For UK exporters the pound's relatively weak performance against the new currency was an immediate sign of good things to come, but before long everyone will be feeling the effects more directly. As ever retailers are likely to be in the front line. Of course it is our continental European cousins who will feel the ninch first as prices start to equalise - and equalise downwards. But it cannot be too long before the UK is forced to move in the same direction. Everyone must be prepared to act accordingly before that happens At MW this means that we will compile pan-European surveys

when we compare UK High Street prices every quarter. This is one European trend no one can afford to ignore.

he annual signings survey published in this issue contains The annual signings survey published in this shows that good and bad news. The number of signings shows that despite all the doom and gloom, labels have certainly not stopped chasing acts. But the low hit rate of those acts signed during 1997 is surely depressing. Either it underlines lust how much tougher it is to get records away - or how many acts were signed for the wrong reasons. The question is whether the percentage for 1998's signings will be any higher in a year's time. My suspicion is that all the doom and gloom of recent months means realism and focus will not only be buzz words but will actually guide corporate decisions. Let us hope so.

PAUL'S QUIRKS

FESTIVE SUCCESS, BUT AT A PRICE

Compared with some other retail sectors, the music industry appears to have had a reasonably successful Christmas period. The product was certainly there and the collective spend on TV advertising must have set a new industry record. Yet. until the final week before Christmas, you could sense that there was still an underlying reluctance by some customers to buy the albums they obviously wanted. Price appeared to be the biggest factor with Top 40 chart albums and confusion reigned as ever in the compilation market. Consumers these days are more aware and have much more choice, often comparing prices in specialist music stores with supermarkets, mail order outlets or the internet before deciding where to spend their hard-earned money. As a consumer myself I don't blame them, but even with magazines and TV programmes encouraging people to shop around and drive a hard bargain we shouldn't have to start bartering with customers to sell a competitively-priced Top 10 album or single.

Maybe some advertising this year dwelt too much on the £12.99 price message, or perhaps we're our own worst enemy by promoting full-price product at £9.99 and £10.99 during the year and then expecting customers to buy it at fullprice just a few weeks later. Like most retailers we started a sale straight after Christmas.

We trawled through all our stock and reduced anything that hadn't moved for a while and then took a long, hard look at all the new acts we'd supported and stocked in 1998. Half of them hadn't sold a copy and they ended up in the sale at less than cost price, but we're not despondent - that means that the other half did sell and some of them sold through in

So we'll continue to support new acts in 1999 and despite the fact that we know half of them won't sell a copy, at least we will have given them a chance, which is more than you can say for many other music outlets whose sale racks are already full of last year's top titles with hardly a new act in sight.

export businesses. UK companies say that during the past 12 months they have put systems in place that will enable them to handle Euro transactions. For example, Virgin Retail says around 12 of its large city stores can currently accept pretty well geared up," says chain's financial controller Walker

Like Virgin, HMV set up an internal Euro steering group nine months ago. Although it is not currently accepting Euros in the UK. HMV Europe finance director John Clark does not rule it out in the future "Apart from our airport stores, we don't, as a rule, accept foreign currency, It is not a major issue at the moment although maybe it is something we'd want to consider, alongside other curren



Big-selling long-stayers increase chart stability on eve of millennium

A turns at number one than ever before – 31 of them, including two which first topped the chart in 1997 – it seems a little odd to suggest that the singles chart showed a new stability in 1998. But that's exactly what it did, because most of those chart toppers hung around long enough to sell in large quantities, even if their reigns were on the short side

While the number of singles to pass ough the Top 75 slumped from an all-time high of 1,127 in 1997 to a five-year low of 1,052 last year, a growing amount of hits were shifting in prodigious quantitles, with CIN figures indicating that 20 of them sold more than half a million copies in the year an unprecedented number. And outgunning them all to become only the third single by a female soloist to top the annual rankings in the past 40 years was Believe, the

remarkable comeback single by Cher. Following in the illustrious footsteps of Jennifer Rush, who topped the 1985 list with The Power Of Love, and Whitney Houston, who won in 1992 with I Will Always Love You, Believe sold more than 1,519,000 copies and spent seven weeks

at number one, giving the 52-year old the biggest hit of her career by far Believe also scuppered the title claims of Celine Dion, whose Titanic love theme My Heart Will Go On had to settle for runner-up

spot, despite selling more than 1,302,000 These two were joined by seven other

overseas stars in the Top 10, leaving the Spice Girls as the UK's solitary representatives in the upper echelon with Goodbye, which completed the girls' hattrick of Christmas number ones and sold more than 679,000 copies in December alone, to claim eighth place for the year

With Viva Forever (13th, 622,000 copies sold), Stop (43rd, 332,000), Too Much (100th, 185,000) and residual sales of their earlier hits, the Spice Girls' overall tally of 1,850,000 sales in 1998 was enough to make them the year's top singles attraction for the second time in their career -

There's room for doubt because Royzone sold a minimum of 1,760,000 singles in the year, based on CiN figures. This is certainly an underestimate, however, as the group's biggest hit to date, No Matter What, made a premature exit from the chart after Polydon included a live version of it on one of the CDs for their next single. I Love The Way You Love Me. Chart regulations demand that an existing song be outside the Top 40

an existing song oe outside the rop 40 before being added to a new release. This is a sensible rule – it was introduced to stop cynical marketing of the kind which has seen several big hits deleted while still in full flow, only to be added to subsequent singles as a bonus track, allowing these invariably inferior successors to enjoy a higher chart visibility than might otherwise have been the case. But it left Boyzone's label, Polydor, with a problem, however. Their solution was to reduce the dealer price of No Matter What below that required for it to remain in the chart. At the time, it was selling around 10,000 copies a week, and there's no doubt it would have perked up ably with the arrival of Christmas and its victory as Record of the Year on

Ireland takes the crown but Robbie scores top five double

utside of the Anglo-American axis which has dominated the charts for as long as they have existed, there are comparatively few territories with the ability to supply an ongoing stream of popular music heroes. Jamaica does it sporadically. Australia and Canada a little more frequently, French and German acts occasionally break out of their own markets. while Scandinavia, particularly Sweden, has its moments too. But none can compare with the consistent commercial success of

From the album chart's early days, when Val Doonican and the Bachelors were prominent, the Irish have been quietly fleecing us of a fortune, with artists like Enya, Clannad, Boyzone, Van Morrison, B*Witched, James Galway, Sinead O'Connor, the Cranberries and, most of all, U2 proving popular with UK punters. U2's most famous and venerated album The Joshua Tree came close to being the number one album of 1987, but had the miefortune to come un adainst Michael Jackson's Bad, and had to settle for second place in that year's best-sellers list. It was as close as any Irish act has come to lifting

The act to break the mould are The Corrs the telegenic Irish family act whose trio of hit singles - Dreams, What Can I Do and So Young - lifted their 1997 album Talk On Corners from respectable mid-chart nonymity to the number one position of four separate occasions in 1998. Aided by two repackages, the first inserting Dreams the second substituting the hit mix of What Can I Do and adding So Young (which originally appeared on their previous album Forgiven Not Forgotten). Talk On Corners had sold just 80,000 copies from its release to the end of 1997, a period of 10 weeks. In the past year it has sold a further 1.676.000 copies, making it a worthy

From an apparently impregnable position it almost lost it, however, as Ladies & Gentlemen – The Best Of George Michael made an impressive bid for the title. Number one for the last eight weeks of the year, Ladies & Gentlemen sold more than

1,523,000 copies to earn second place. It is George's highest finish yet, beating his solo peak of five (Older, 1996) and the Wham! record of four (Make It Big, 1984). Ladies & Gentlemen sold twice as many ies as any other artist compilation in 1998, though The Best Of M People and Phil Collins' Hits also acquitted themselve very well. Altogether 24 of the Top 100 albums were hits packages, six more than in 1997 and the highest tally since 1994 when there were 32.

While it requires no particular skill to predict the success of U2, Meat Loaf and Mariah Carey compilations, there is always a surprise success. In 1997 it was Bread, and in 1998 it was Ladysmith Black Mambazo, whose The Star & The Wiseman collection sold more than 623,000 copies more than all their previous albums added together.

The most dramatic success story of the year though has to be that of Robbie Williams, who, like the Spice Girls in 1997 and Gloria Estefan in 1989, placed two albums in the top five, Life Thru A Lens

taking fourth place with 1.241,000 sales and I've Been Expecting You ranking fifth with 1,093,000. With sales of only 120,000 in three months, Life Thru A Lens was one of the flops of 1997, but, like The Corrs' Talk On Corners, it unleashed a string of hit singles in 1998, and became a formidable chart force.

By the time I've Been Expecting You came out, Robbie had a legion of fans, and it duly gave him his second number one album of the year - a rare feat - and established him as the number one albums artist of the year (see table above right) with sales of 2.324.000.

The Verve were unlucky not to top the album rankings in 1997. They led for a long time with Urban Hymns, only to slip to second place at the death behind Casis Be Here Now. They led the year-to-date rankings for much of 1998 too, the winsome charms of their first two major hits Bittersweet Symphony and The Drugs Don't Work continuing to cast a spell over record buyers throughout the year, though Urban Hymns was overwhelmed by year's end and had to settle for sixth place. It did, however, achieve the rare feat of selling more than 1m copies two years in

Now series beats off all-comers

ever established, the Now That's What I Call Music! series, celebrated its 15th birthday last year and, in the face of increasing competition, managed to maintain its traditional and overwhelming superiority, to the extent of filling all of the top three places in the annual recap - the first time it has managed a lock-out of the medal positions.

Now 41, released just six weeks before the year ended, was the star performer, and passed the marical 1m sales mark on New Year's Eve, while Now 39 sold 670,000 copies and Now 40 sold 564,000 copies leaving Fresh Hits '98 to take fourth place with irret 442 000 color

The Now series has only once failed to provide the year's number one compilation since its inception - that being in 1984, when Now 3 went head-to-head with The Hits Album and was found wanting. Now Als sold more rapidly than any compilation since Now 35 topped the listings in December 1996 – Now 38 was released a week earlier in 1997 than Now 41 was last year but did not reach the 1m mark until January 10, its sales adversely affected by competition from the Diana Princess Of Wales tribute album.

However, with some of the year's most idely licensed tracks - step forward Run-DMC vs Jason Nevins' It's Like That and Brimful Of Asha by Cornershop - appearing simultaneously on up to 11 of the Top 20 compilations at one stage, and gracing

upwards of 40 in the year as a whole, it is small wonder that the compilation market as a whole is experiencing some difficulty, with major shrinkage of its share of the overall album market occurring in the year

This is vividly illustrated by the fact that while the Top 50 compilations each sold more than 130,000 copies in 1997, only 31. albums reached that figure in 1998. The Female Touch, which occupies 50th place in the 1998 rankings sold 100,000. It is in 165th place in the combined artist/ compilation chart, while the number 50 compilation was 140th overall last year. The last time the number 50 compilation was lower in the combined list or sold fewer copies was in 1993, when it was 171st with

Virgin, which has been the most aggressive and successful compilation company in recent years, and is a partner in the Now series with EMI and PolyGram TV, felt the squeeze more than most, getting its

name on 17 of the Top 50 compilations in 1998, down from 24 the previous year. For the second year in a row, The Full Monty was the number one soundtrack album. Ranked sixth on the overall compilation chart in 1997 when it sold nearly 350,000 copies, it fared even better last year, edging up to fifth position with a further 425,000 takers. It's one of only two soundtrack albums in the Top 50 - the other being Grease, which celebrated the 20th anniversary of its original cinematic release with a successful theatrical revival

generating a hit single and sales of more than 213,000 copies of its remastered, repackaged soundtrack for 15th place in the chart.

The best-selling soundtrack for a 1998 movie was Lock, Stock & Two Smoking Barrels, which sold more than 84,000 copies and was ranked 72nd overall. The rest of the Top 10 soundtracks (with overal compilation ranks in brackets) were: 4 (103) Jackie Brown; 5 (117) The Wedding Singer; 6 (128) Trainspotting; 7 (132) Armageddon; 8 (140) Godzilla; 9 (142) City Of Angels 10 (143) Pulp Fiction. All of the above, of course, sold fewer copies than James Horner's Titanic soundtrack, which occupies 10th place in the artist album chart with 883,000 sales. Alan Jones

AIRPLAY TOP 50

Radio: more in tune with sales

Radio programmers and record buyers were in total agreement in 1998 when it came to the year's most popular act. Robbie Williams, who sold more albums than anyone else across the 12 months. spread his dominance to the airwaves as Angels became the most-heard radio hit of the year. Spending 35 weeks in total on the Airplay Top 50, the song reached an overall audience of 1,321m, a comfortable 68m more than the runner-up, Here's Where The Story Ends by Tin Tin Out. It was one of three singles by Williams in the year-end Top 50 as Millennium finished at 12 and Angels' followup, Let Me Entertain You, at 14.

Despite topping an end-of-year radio chart for 1998, Angels was among four of the eight biggest airplay hits of the year to have been released the previous year, while Cornershop's Brimful Of Asha (ninth) had its first sales chart run in 1997. Although the earlier a record is released in a year the more weeks it has to build up overall plays. the presence of so many 1997 releases so

high in the year-end list is remarkable. Radio, often accused of staying too long with certain tracks after sales have dropped off, was, initially at least, more than justified in remaining with 1997's Angels, Torn by Natalie Imbruglia (third), the Lighthouse Family's High (seventh) and Never Ever by All Saints (eighth) as all remained big sellers well into 1998, reflecting a year when airplay and sales were closer than in recent years. The two tracks on last year's biggestelling single, Elton John's coupling of Candle In The Wind 1997 and Something About The

and 121st respectively in that year's overall riplay chart, although still better than Aqua's Barbie Girl, runner-up on the sales chart of the year but ranked an unremarkable 186th on airplay. By contrast, Cher's Believe 1998's biggest-selling single, finished a credible 17th in the year's airplay chart and would no doubt have finished significantly higher had it had more weeks in the year to accumulate plays. With a six-week run, it spent longer at the top of the Airplay chart than any other record bar Tin Tin Out's sevenweek stayer Here's Where The Story Ends, In all, 15 of the 20 biggest sales hits of the year made it into the 1998 radio Top 50, and at least one other (the Spice Girls' Goodbye at 86) could well have made it if it had been

released earlier in the year.

Other big sellers abscent from the airplay Top 50 include Chef's Chocolate Salty Balls (PS I Love You) - seven on sales but struggling at 489 on airplay - and Baddiel/Skinner and the Lightning Seeds' 3



Tin Tin Out and Natalie Imbruglia Lions '98 - 14 on sales and 151 at radio

The latter had earlier topped the Airplay Chart but vanished on the back of England's exit from the World Cun The main releases that failed to transfer sales success on to the radio, however, were

the newly-arrived teen pop acts, B*Witched's C'est La Vie was the fifth-biggest sales hit but only finished at 62 on radio. Likewise, Steps' run of three Top 10 sales hits was accompanied by a disappointing best overall airplay showing of 173 (Heartbeat), while Billie finished even lower down with Because We Want To - her biggest radio hit at 225 The Spice Girls bucked the anti-pop trend by registering two of radio's 50 most-successful tracks, led by Stop - their only single to date not to be a sales number one - redistering at 36. In 1997, the best they could manage was 44 with 2 Become 1

The Spice Girls helped Virgin Records' tally to seven in the Top 50, matching Warner



registering twice with Savage Garden and once each with six other acts, and PolyGram which appeared an unbeatable 13 times In contrast, Robbie Williams' personal success was a rare triumph for EMI, its only

representative in 1998's Top 50. Four of PolyGram's tracks were in the top eight of the year, including Eagle-Eye Cherry's Save Tonight (fourth) and Karen Ramirez's Looking For Love, which was radio's sixth biggest-hit of the year despite only peaking at eight on the sales chart. Polydor's Cherry was the highest-ranked new artist on the chart with the Top 10 occupied completely by Nineties acts.

Meanwhile, a number of old favourites from 1997 retained their popularity during 1998. In fact, four of the five biggest radio hits of 1997 figured in 1998's year-end radio chart. The reward for enduring popularity, however, must go to Everything But The Girl's Missing, which dropped off the sales chart in

They reached number 11 with their debut hit Say You Do some nine months ago, but their progress has been all in the wrong direction since, with Say It Once peaking at number 16 and The Right Time halting at number 28 They debut at eight this week with Rescue

Cher's Believe dips out of the top five for the first time, slipping 4-7 on its 12th week in the chart. It has sold 1.54m copies so far, overtaking Jennifer Rush's The Power Of Love to become the second biggest seller by a female soloist in UK chart history.

Ahead of it, and certain to be overtaken in the next week or so, is only Whitney Houston's I Will Always Love You, which sold 1,57m.

AMERICAN CHARTWATCH

If but one album on the Top 200 suffered a decline in sales last week, as US retail caught a cold thanks to the combination of the usual post-Christmas sales slump and some historically bad weather, with winter storms causing chaos through much of the east and midwest

The only album to triumph over market conditions was the movie soundtrack The Faculty, which sprinted 136-59 with a near 20% upswing in sales. R&B fans seemed hardier than most, and most of the chart's big climbers are therefore hip-hop records, with Jay-Z's Hard Knock Life moving 10-3, 2Pac's Greatest Hits surging 11-6 and The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill charging 16-10. Hardcore rapper DMX retains the number one slot with Flesh Of My Flesh, Blood Of My Blood, which sold more than 248,000 copies last week,

Several Brits took advantage of the slump make their own modest advances, with Fatboy Silm's You've Come A Long Way Baby, which peaked at number 132 a while ago, reentering the chart at number 174, while Five's self-titled album improves 157-131, Phil Collins' Hits bouncing 87-81 and George Michael's Ladies & Gentlemen album up 91

77. Having had a pre-Christmas lift, the Spice Girls' albums resume their decline, with Spiceworld down 74-89 and Spice making a similar 76-90 slide. Spice celebrates its 100th consecutive week on the chart this week, more than any other current hit album.

On the Hot 100 chart the Spice Girls latest single Goodbye finally makes a move after three weeks in its debut position - and unfortunately, it's sharply downwards, moving 11-37. The only other British record on the chart, It's The Things You Do by Five, makes an even speedler decline, falling 70-97. Meanwhile, Cher's Brit-written hit Believe which had been improving nicely (99-78-58-

47) suddenly goes into reverse, sliding back to number 52. Finally, it may be a new year but some things never change, one of which is Diane Warren's dominance. The writer of LeAnn Rimes' How Do I Live and Aerosmith's I Don't Want To Miss A Thing, has another number one under her belt this week, with Brandy's Have You Ever? climbing 3-1. And, aside from Prince's 1999, which re-charts at number 40, Warren also wrote the chart's only other new entry, Boyz II Men's I Will Get There, which debuts at number 76.

INTERNATIONAL PROFILE: **SPICE GIRLS**

the latest chapter in the Spice Girls international career could hardly be beginning in greater contrast to the first Three years ago, as virtual unknowns, the

group started the first of what would become an ongoing series of trips around the globe as they turned from wannabes to the LIK's biggest pop exports since The Beatles. Forward to 1999 and the only promotion directly involving the girls for their first single recorded as a foursome is a video and several radio interviews they carried out from London.

With half the line-up pregnant and the other two members involved in other projects, Virgin Records' international department has been fairly restricted in the support it can give Goodbye. But, despite these challenges, the track is, so far, more than living up to expectations, going to number one in New Zealand and Italy, and reaching the Top 10 in most European territories

Their popularity in the States was further confirmed by the single entering the sales chart at four in its week of release and debuting at 11 on the Billboard Hot 100, though its lack of sirplay prevented any

further chart progress. As Virgin's international marketing manager Bart Cools notes, "Since the chart changed to 80% airplay and 20% sales it's even more difficult to get a single high in the charts."

For Cools, Goodbye represents the start of the next chapter in the group's history. "It's the first single released without Geri, so for them it's some statement," he says. "Though it's called Goodbye it's not a goodbye. instead they're moving into different areas Two of them are having children. Emma is doing Sleeping Beauty and Mel C is in the

studio at the moment recording." As such, exact plans for the next Spice Girls releases are yet to emerge, though a tour documentary is due to come out on video at Easter. "It all depends when they go back in the studio," says Cools. Virgin is working on the basis that there might well be a third Spice Girls album this year.

In the meantime, however, the group can at last take a pause on what has been almost one continuous round of promotion worldwide. 'It's giving them a bit of a break because they've had the two most hectic years anyone's ever had," says Cools.

UNDERWORLD 'KING OF SNAKE' (JUNIOR BOYS OWN) (TECHNO) spired by Karl Hyde's experience of an illegal snake fight in Tokyo and debuted arly last year at the Heavenly Jukebox, this slice of charged euphoria is driven along by "King of snake" stutters, builet-train paced breakbeats and a furious hi-NRG rasping synth akin to a Bobby O/Giorgio Moroder production. Dave Angel's rework with its hissing intro equally maintains the relentless exciting repetition and Dave Clarke's remix slithers around a "Many fazes/I'm hip"-type sped-up break with a "Drink and you go pink" hook. Even at promo stage, this shot onto Radio One's B-list and just like Daft Punk's 'Revolution 909' there is clear proof that looped hypnotic grooves can remain 'underground' even when they hit the most commercial of peaks. • • • •

GREECE 2000 'THREE DRIVES' (HOOJ CHOONS) (HOUSE)

A firm favourite of 1998 that was being played throughout the year gets a welldeserved second run. The original lead line main hook features prominently in these new mixes, the pick of which is the Miro version which runs the track at a slower pace and introduces a ghostly male vocal throughout. Matt Darey in his Lost Tribe guise combines his own version with the Miro mix, creating a more ballsy sound which was showcased early on the 'Gatecrasher' compilation. It's probably the best of all the mixes, not only on this package but from the previous ones as well.

MUTINY FEAT, MARY JOY 'BUSS' (SUNFLOWER)

The Masters At Work liked this Dylan 'Earl' Barnes production from 1996 so much that they approached the South London indie label about doing some remixes. Their lush MAW Main Mix sets off Mary Joy's sweet soulful vocals with solid beats and extra-smooth sax, strings, guitar and piano themes, while their stripped-down MAW Vocal Dub is a deep and driving take that sensibly keeps the sone intact. The double-nack also features the chunky and busy orininal mix and inventive Latin-flavoured versions from the Rhythm Doctor.

PAUL VAN DYK PRESENTS HUMATE 'LOVE STIMULATION' (DEVIANT) (HOUSE) A track which was

Lucid follow their 10 hit 'I Can't Help Myself' with another strong release. The Translucid versions play first, having already obtained extensive radio and club support, using

another powerful distorted vocal and combining it with built-up strings and big synth stabs in the main bits. Nalin & Kane provide two underground versions, running the vocal in a more subdued manner over a different progressive arrangement. Another strong club and national chart contender. . . .

VARIOUS 'OLD SCHOOL VS NEW SCHOOL (JIVE ELECTRO) (ALTERNATIVE)

In similar style to Tommy Boy's 'Greatest Beats' where healthy back catalogue was given up to top current remixers, Jive's new imprint has unleashed four remix 12-inches. There's only space here to list them rather than review: Aphrodite tackles A Tribe Called Quest's 'Ince Again'; Grooverider revamps Stone Roses' 'Fool's Gold'; and the Freestylers rekindle Whodini's 'Magic Wand', the latter already familiar to those aware of 'FSUK 2'. DJ Icey, Norman Cook and Bassbin Twins also get their teeth into Jive classics; all are done to perfection by both remixers and the A&R department. . . .

THE SONGSTRESS 'SEE LINE WOMAN' (LOCKED ON) (GARAGE) First released on Ibadan, this Nina Simone sampling production from Kerri Chandler and Jerome Sydenham was one of last year's essential US import buys.

Their priningly version still stands out on this UK double-pack with its super-cool keys, free-flowing flute and reverentially handled vocals. Todd Edwards comes close with his typically choppy interpretation, while Charles Webster takes things deeper in his Presence guise. The track's crossover potential is increased considerably by Full Intention's thumping remixes which are a bit heavy handed but have plenty of mainstream club appeal. . . .

THE FREAKAZOIDS '@TIC FUTURE' (ZOID) (RREAKS) A bit of a cheeky homage to 'Planet Rock' which has been done extremely well (better than the commissioned mixes that appeared before the New Year). The boys build up a solid 808 groove with scratches aplenty along with analogue synth washes and the trusty vocoder voice snatches. It's all good harmless

HANDS BURN 'GOOD SHOT' (SPOT ON)

Seb Fontaine's superbly simple pumping instrumental piece is running amok. The main intro is a looped protruding bassline which gets backing in stages from the percussion levels, interrupted only briefly by an electro warble, before heading off again to a naggingly infectious single plano riff.

T POWER 'FUNK DENTAL HYGENE' (BOTCHIT & SCARPER) (BREAKS)

This former S.O.U.R. recording artist noted for his contribution to the drum & bass sub-genre, tech-step, returns after a two-year absence with two classy breakbeat cuts. 'Funk Dental Hygene' is a drum & bass-infused track with subbass and swinging effects. On the flip 'Who Gives A Funk' heads into the P-Funk era. I'm sure George Clinton would give his blessing. • • • •

Some industry observers were understandably suspicious when a Music Week A&R survey in September reported that more than half of the key senior executives polled were optimistic about the talent around, with almost half intending to spend more on signings in the next 12

But that sense of optimism appears to be reflected in MIV's 1998 Rosterwatch, which has identified 167 new album artists added to the rosters of the industry's biggest and most influential labels during last year.

Although the figures can never be definitive -certain labels decline to name some or all of the acts they have signed, while the list of labels included in the survey cannot be exactly the same each year - that figure is not significantly

1997 and 1996 respectively But while the number of signings is one indicator of the state of health of the A&R community, the success rate being achieved by those signings is even more important than ever. Given the general disquiet about the state of the industry, MW's signings round-up is particularly interesting this year

The picture that emerges is mixed Fach war we examine the strike rate of the previous year's signings. It is never high, but looking back at the list of new signings for 1997 that MW published a year ago, it emerges that only 7.5% - equivalent to one in 13 - have scored a Top 40 album to date. That is down from the 13.5% rate achieved by 1996's signings at this point 12 months ago, and from the 16% achieved

by 1995's signings the year before that. it could be argued that more time is being spent on developing each act - after all, most acts average two years in

development. But looking back at the strike rate for acts signed in 1996, the figures are even less impressive. While 12 months ago 13.5% had released a Top 40 album, a year on only a further 3% have joined their ranks.

When it comes to notching up Top 40 singles the figures are much better, further emphasising that ma 19.5% the leap from deal to chart breakthrough is far from easy. Only 19.5% of

22% of 1996's signings at this point 12 months ago and from a third the year before that. Moreover, looking at the fortunes of those acts signed in 1996, two years on only 1.5% more have managed to achieve a Ton 40 single hit.

While many column inches have been written about the turnover of acts signed and then dropped - not least because of Seagram's PolyGram purchase - there are rarely any hard-and-fast figures to draw on. Looking back at the 1997 signings named In MW's survey a year ago, however, around **Artist signings** continued apace in 1998

Last year saw the arrival and dismissal of many names. Stephen Jones analyses the A&R trends

What happened to last year's tips?
