ELVIS doesn't mind a gun in the stomach — so long as a lovely girl like ANN - MARGRET is behind it !

Would JOHN and PAUL compose a new song for ELVIS ? NME writers find out, and RICHARD GREEN asks ... **Could Beatlebeat** help Presley?

TOHN LENNON and Paul McCartney are two of the most prolific songwriters today and Elvis Presley is still one of the best singers. What a combination the two would be !

Bear in mind that since "Devil In Disguise" Elvis' discs have not been as successful as usual. Would a complete change of material help boost the sales? A recent TV programme set me thinking in terms of John and Paul.





Caravelles make you sing-along

THOSE familiar huskily whispering toncs of the Caravelles have latched on to another oldie eminently suited to their style, "Have You Ever Been Lonely?" (Decca). I like it better than the duo's last release, maybe because the well-known melody encourages the listener to sing along. A very attractive blend of voices—but it lacks

the magic of their international hit, and its hit

potential must be questionable. To a gallop-tempo backing, the girls revive the Patience and Prudence hit of a few years back, "Gonna Get Along Without Ya Now."

POTTED POPS

AYNE FONTANA & MINIBERNDERS (Fontana) bring a Maurice Williams number "Little Darlin" up to date in much the same style as "Stay." The pounding beat and novelty voca gimmicks make it the group's best to date. A touch of the Drifters in the melodic "Come Dance With Me."

RUSS HAMILTON (Ember) offers two of his own compositions—a dual-track rock-a-ballad with resounding beat "Valley Of Love," and a solo voice medium twist "Loneliest Boy In Town." Not outstanding material, but Russ' best disc for some time.

GERRY LEVENE & THE AVENGERS (Decca) serve more wine in a new bottle, as they revive the down-to-earth rocker "Doctor Feelgood." Lacks true r-and-b feel, but the ex-citing rhythm will keep shakers happy. There is a good sound to medium beat opus "It's Driving Me Wild."

LESLEY GORE

Despite the sorrowful lyrics, Lesley Gore's previous discs have all had an infectious bounce. Now she offers a powerful beat ballad, "You Don't Own Me" (Mercury).

Still in dual-track, it's a well-presented disc which builds strongly, but the melody's not strong enough to boost it into the upper bracket.

I'd rather hear Lesley in her more toe-tapping style—as in "Run Bobby Run," with its exhilarating twist beat. A cute number, this.

MIKE BERRY

A driving, forceful rocker, with the Innocents chanting "yeah-yeah" to Mike Berry's dynamic solo—that's "On My Mind" (HMV).

It's beat all the way, though I can't help feeling that a more pronounced melodic content would have lifted it out of the ordinary. Still, it's great for dancing.

Coupling is a more tuneful medium-pacer, "This Little Girl," which I found very pleasant listening. Both compositions by Mike himself, by the way

JAN BURNNETTE

A resounding rhythmic ballad with a finger-clicking twist beat, an easy-on-the-ear melody, a Breakaways-type supporting group, and added strings building to a climax—these ingredients make Jan Burnnette's "Let Me Make You Smile Again" (Oriole) her strongest release to date. The lass injects warmth and sin-cerity into her styling of the luscious "No Regrets," again with group backing. A good disc from Jan.

Probably won't set the world alight, but it's a beautifully handled ballad, well worth hearing.



BAN MAY MEAN CHEAPER DISCS

BRITISH record prices are almost certain to be reduced as a result of the Government's proposed ban on price fixing. It could present the industry with serious problems similar to those at present being encountered in America. Until now the major record companies have agreed

standard prices for dises among themselves. But with the proposed legislation to prohibit price fixing, dealers would be allowed to sell at whatever price

dealers would be allowed to sell at whatever price they chose. The disc firms themselves would be almost certain to introduce competitive discount systems on the lines of those being operated in America. When he visited London last month, Wesley Rose, boss of Hickory Records and a leading figure in the U.S. recording industry, said that the discount system was placing the whole American record business in peril. He warned that it could happen in Britain unless record prices remained fixed by the manufacturers. The situation was being studied by all the major companies on Wednesday and Philips was the first to announce its intention of making a statement on Monday.


Pye to distribute Top Six cover discs

Dye has taken over distribution of the Top Six I label, which specialises in cover records. The discs—there are six top tunes on each single—have ander, which spectatises in cover records. The discs—there are six top tunes on each single—have up to now been principally sold through newsagents and hookstalls, but Pye will release them in the normal way through record dealers from February 1. Top Six has claimed sales of 100,000 per monthly issue. The NME understands that monthly releases in the series will be continued and the February disc will include a cover of Pye's own new chart success, "Needles And Pins." Last month, Brett Young, who used to make a number of cover recordings for Top Six, was signed by Pye. Programmes on Radio Luxembourg on Wednesdays and Fridays, commencing January 29, will be used to promote the Top Six series.
Pye Records Press officer Pat Pretty has taken control of the company's exploitation office. Peter Huggett, until recently bass player with Lonnie Donegan's group, joins Pye as an administrative assistant.

Caravelles and Craig Douglas change labels

THE Caravelles and Craig Douglas are among the artists who switch from Decca to Fontana, as a result of independent recording manager Bunny Lewis' deal with Philips Records for the future distribution of his Ritz label. Also involved in the switch to Fontana-Ritz are the Mudlarks, the Avons, Harry Robinson and new Bunny Lewis signing Marilyn Powell, who will make her disc debut on February 28. First release under the new banner will be the Avons singing their own composition, "I'm The Girl," on February 14.

• Lewis has also concluded a deal with the Grade Organisation, which will act as agents for all the above artists. Lewis remains their personal manager.

Another triumph for Britain ! EATLES TOP U.S. CHART CORD THREE W RF

LESS than three weeks after its release in America the Beatles' history-making single "I Want To Hold Your Hand" has sold more than a million copies there and leaps into the No. 1 spot in one of next week's U.S. trade magazine charts ! British sales of the record have now reached the million-and-ahalf-mark, making it the biggest ever selling single here, with "She Loves You" close behind in second place for this honour.

Amid a frenzy of excitement comparable with the rise to fame of Elvis Presley, the Beatles have earned their first American Gold Disc with astonishing speed. Capitol is making arrangements for them to receive it either at a Press conference following their arrival in New York on February 7, or alternatively on the "Ed Sullivan Show" two nights later, cables Nat Hentoff.

"BILLBOARD" HOT 100 AT 69. "Hand" sales reached 1,500,000 in Britain this week and "She Loves You" is barely 50,000 behind it, making these two records the champion-selling singles of all time in this country. cables Nat Hentoff. If the award is made at the Press conference, the Beatles will receive it from Capitol Records president Alan Livingstone. The record shoots from No. 43 to the No. 1 spot in next week's "Cash Box." 



DEREK JOHNSON reports—

AFTER missing out on her last release, Brenda Lee has come storming back into the reckoning with her poignant styling of the lilting ballad "As Usual." This is one of the toughest periods in chart history for girl soloists-and for this pocket-sized lass to have forced her way in among the all-powerful beat boys with an honest-to-

goodness ballad is some feat. When Brenda's previous disc failed to make the grade, not a solitary voice was raised to suggest that she might be slipping. For we all knew that this supreme artist is without equal, and that any temporary chart absence reflected on the material rather than the artist. Nevertheless, it's interesting to consider the reasons for

the failure of her last record. And I don't think it's too difficult to find the most logical explanation. Over the years Brenda has developed from a teenage rock

sensation into a mature and adult performer. And this growing-up process has enabled her to express herself much more effectively in ballad material. We

more effectively in ballad material. We all know that she can still beat out a r h y t h m i c finger-snapper with greater verve than anyone else of her generation—but it's as a balladeer that she has risen to new end sufference heights

balladeer that she has risen to new and supreme heights. Breade and her recording company have always followed the sensible policy of coupling two contrasting titles on one disc—a rocker on one side and a ballad on t'other. Until a couple of years ago, it was usually the beat item which received preferen-tial treatment. tial treatment.

But more recently, as Brenda has matured, the ballad sides have been

matured, the ballad sides have been meeting greater approval. Last year, Brenda secured three chart successes in this country—all of them ballads. They were "All Alone Am I," "Losing You" and most recently "I Wonder." Indeed, Brenda hasn't had a beat hit since the end of 1962, when Brunswick finally got around to releasing her three-year-old seasonal disc "Rockin' Around The Christmas Tree."

Christmas 1762. Towards the end of last year, Brenda was enjoying a hit in the States with a warm and colourful ballad titled "The Grass Is Greener." In view of her string of ballad hits in Britain, I fully expected her to repeat this success over here. But it didn't work out that way. For in this country, it was decided to


done with the best intentions in the world, probably in an attempt to ring the changes. But at a time when Britain had all the beat records it needed, Brenda's was lost in the rush. A pity-for 1 feet certain "The Grass Is Greener" would have elicked, had it been recated as the "A" side. However, this temporary slip has now been rectified. For although Brenda's new twosome also includes a rocker, "Lonely, Lonely, Lonely Me," British Brunswick has decided to go along with the States-and to release "As Usual" as the top side. The decision has paid off handsomely, for the disc has come bounding into the NME Chart at No. 17. This combina-tion of haunting melody and impeceable performance is surely one of Brenda's best-ever recordings, and it will be in-teresting to see how high it can climb in the beat-dominated hit parade. It's worth noting that in 1963, Brenda didn't get into the Top Ten at al, her highest position being 11th with "All Alone Am I." Nevertheless, such was her consistency that she finished amongst the leading 20 disc sellers for the year, and was the best-selling girl
