





On Christmas Day we have Top Of The Pops' 1983 round-up featuring Freeez, Michael Jackson, Shakin' Stevens, Men At Work, Bonnie Tyler, Howard Jones, Irene Cara, Human League, Duran Duran, Bucks Fizz, Lionel Richie, Heaven 17, David Bowle, UB40, Malcolm McLaren, and the Christmas No.1.

Mike Mansfield brings us Supersonic (C4) on December 27. It's a one-hour special with Elton John, Bonnie Tyler, Shakin' Stevens (again!), Meatloaf, Marllyn, Def Leppard, Limahl, Modern Romance and Soft Cell.

On Friday December 30, the New Year's Tube is a retrospective of some of the best moments from The Tube in 1983 and includes footage of John Lydon, Boy George, Duran Duran, Annie Lennox, Paul Young and the lovely Dame Edna Everage.

Finally, there's a Pop Goes New Year's Eve (ITV) on the day in question which was specially recorded at a cost of £200,000. It showcases Tracey Ullman, Style Council, Limahl, Heaven 17, Nick Heyward, Eurythmics, Rick Springfield, and Culture Club performing 'Victims' and 'Mister Man'

### GENESIS COMETH

Genesis have got 1984 all sewn up.
The supergroup have announced a short series of dates in February—the only European dates next year.

They'll be appearing at Birmingham's National Exhibition Centre on February 25/26/27/28 and 29.

The last two shows will be in aid of charities — the Nordoff-Robbins Music Therapy Centre Ltd, and The Prince's Trust, respectively. 



h Mama, Slade are back with a bang. Their latest single 'My Oh My' has got to be one of the hottest contenders for that coveted Christmas No.1 spot and Noddy Holder and the boys are mighty pleased about it.

Not that they're wide-eyed and innocent about having hit records. They first made the charts with 'Get Down And Get With It' way back in June 1971 and since then have had six number ones and 25 top sixty singles.

There was a lull for a few years towards the end of the 70s when they attempted to break the States, but their triumphant return at the 1980 Reading Festival and a batch of great singles have seen them working their way back into the nation's hearts.

In the early days of the 'Glitter Era' they were rivals with bands like Sweet, T.Rex and Mud. How does it feel to compete with Culture Club and Duran Duran over a decade later?

"There's some great records about at the moment and the competition's constantly changing," agrees Noddy Holder. "But that's the rock 'n' roll business. Things change every year and it's a good thing that they do."

Does Noddy think that Slade's music has changed over the years?

"Not really," he says. "I think we just go along in our own sweet way and make the best records that we can. Hopefully the public'll like 'em and put 'em in the charts."

It seems that plenty of other people like that Slade sound as well. Over the past couple of years several bands have emerged who'll readily admit to being influenced by their brand of good time rock'n'roll. What does Noddy think of Quiet Riot, Twisted Sister and Spider?

"Quiet Riot are huge in the

States and that's great for us. They covered 'Come On Feel The Noize' and it made the top ten. For one of our songs to be that big a hit ten years on only proves that the material has stood the test of time."

On top of that, Slade's ancient anthem 'Merry Christmas Everybody' has been reissued yet again. Does that annoy him?

"Not at all, we're proud of the record. We enjoy it when it comes out. It feels that Christmas is complete to us when we hear it."

Forget Liverpool v. Everton. Forget Corry v. Brookside. Forget Eric'n'Ernie v. Tommy'n'Bobby. The big battle this Christmas is about record sales - and the question on everyone's lips is: Who's going to have the Xmas No.1? Here's a couple of the prime contenders... The Flying Pickets have already rocketed to the top spot - but can they hold on? Or will Slade knock them off? Or even, heaven forbid, someone with an average age of less than

he Flying Pickets are coof pop's oldest combood Almost as old as The Rolling Stones.

Although they've only jus broken through with their chart-topping version of 'Or You', the band have been knocking around together figuite some time.

"We're currently doing bits and pieces for a new album which should be out in January. As we tend to know more about harmonizing and vocal work than most producers, we're producing it ourselves.

"There are obvious limitations in the material you pick but we try and stretch across the range of modern music.

"You've got to keep things simple too. Working without music is like working without a safety net."

Will 'Only You' be this year's Christmas No.1?

"Listening to it on the radio in December it feels quite Christmassy. But it's already got to No.1, and that's much higher than I thought it'd get."

# OUCH&GO

Annie Lennox needs more than two strong arms to protect herself. Her triumphant return to hometown Aberdeen has left her speechless – literally.

The constant strain of touring Britain, Europe and the States while writing and recording the new album 'Touch' has taken its toll. On doctor's orders, Annie is saving her voice for each night's show and leaving the daytime talking to partner Dave Stewart.

As the No. 1 team makes its way backstage in Aberdeen, we're greeted by a cheery but tired Dave Stewart and a smilingly silent Annie. As we tiptoe up to her, she hands me a piece of paper bearing the legend, "Hello – sorry I can't speak, but I have to protect my voice!"

Fortunately, Dave Stewart has become a practised hand at speaking for Annie. True, he sometimes drives her into a state of terminal frustration but, for the most part, he knows his Annie.

### ANNIE'S VOICE

Dave: "She seems to have nodules on her throat, which is fairly serious, so as you can see she has to rest her voice when she's not onstage.

"Actually, it's quite serious and two specialists have told us that she must have an immediate operation – but two other specialists have said 'No, that's the worst thing she could do!' Its ludicrous.

"So straight after this tour, she's flying over to Vienna to see another specialist . . . and he'll decide."

### HOLIDAYS

Dave: "Well, I'm going to Agadir in North Africa and Annie's not sure yet where she's going after Vienna. We've got six or seven weeks off, which is the first time we've had off in years – since I went off on holiday with my mum and dad when I was about six!

"But we need that much time, because the rest of this year has been so concentrated – it'll take us at least two weeks to get all that music out of our systems, just to wind down and relax and get into playing footy on the beach!"

### PRESSURES OF FAME

When asked if she ever gets sick of seeing her own face on the covers of magazines, Annie smiles slowly and contentedly, writing down "No, I love it!"

Dave: "But we've really had to adjust to being well-known, which took us about four or five months – and we were worried about spreading ourselves too thinly.

I used to go to my mother's regularly at weekends but I can't do that so often now...but we

coming from the Lennox lips is as startling as a thunderclap.

Patiently, but clearly almost exasperated, she explains: "I saw Depeche Mode at Hammersmith and nobody bothered me and I was right in the middle of the crowd."

"Oh, that's exactly what I said, didn't I?" asks Dave.

### ANNIE'S MUM

Meanwhile Mr and Mrs Lennox arrive backstage and hug their daughter proudly. While Annie's dad plays a tune on the bagpipes (which are used later in the show), Annie's mum

can still go out, I even walked through the crowd at Hammersmith Palais before we played and wasn't recognised."

Annie nods in agreement and points to herself. "And you?" offers Dave, more in hope than help. Annie shakes her head in annoyance and frustration like a contestant on *Give Us A Clue*.

"It's been like this for days," laughs Dave as Annie's pen flies across the paper in a frantic scrawl. "Oh, Annie was at Depeche Mode and nobody knew who she was . . ." reads Dave with final relief.

Annie looks even more impatient with this lack of communication.

"Bloody hell," she whispers in her soft Aberdonian accent, but the sudden-ness of sound reveals a few home truths about Annie.

"Oh, I always thought she was musical, and I encouraged her, but sometimes it was difficult... I was a wee bit disappointed when she left the Royal Academy, but I knew she'd carry on, I knew she'd have a musical career!

"Their music is so good, I always thought they'd get to the top and Dave is such a super chap, too! The most exciting thing for me is when they get high up in the charts...

"No, No, I never tell people I'm Annie's mother unless they find out. I'm really pleased, but I like to keep it to myself."

### TOUCH

Dave: "The last thing we wanted

was to make another record like 'Sweet Dreams'. In fact we just forgot that completely and went into the studio as though we'd never made a record before — all of our recording is like a child's recording."

### SINGLE

Dave: "I can honestly say this album contains some of the best work we've done – my favourite track is 'Here Comes The Rain Again' – the next single.

"I'm more drawn to actual songs than weird sounds and that's why I like singles so much, because you've only got a certain time to do everything . . and when you get that, it's like the ultimate art-form for 1983."

### **VIDEO**

Dave: "It's not a drawback being so well-known for videos, I think it's exciting.

"The reason why we just did 'Right By Your Side' with just our band playing was because we were getting a bit tired of seeing overblown Hollywood-type videos for songs that were just normal. We had quite a funny one worked out, but instead we wanted to remind people that we're a live band too!"

### THE BEST THING

Dave: "The best I've done this week? Last night's gig in Glasgow! And also a great Mexican meal I had with Kiki Dee. Oh, and I forgot – I had central heating put in my flat which is great because before I had to jump out of bed and run round to keep warm!"

### THE END

The Eurythmics tour finished triumphantly in London, closed by a post-gig party at Barnes' Old Rangoon restaurant. Annie presided in her best orange wig and party frock and looked a lot healthier than in Scotland.

Before she went to Vienna, she and Dave flew up to the Orkneys to film a video for January's single, 'Here Comes The Rain'. Overworking to the last

"He was called Gary and was a junior British judo champion. One day I remember saying 'Throw me, go on throw me, it won't hurt', and he said 'It will Trace'. He did, and it did.

"I met him when I worked as a Saturday girl at a jean shop."

### MINI MINOR

"When I was young Mum wouldn't let me wear mini skirts, and they went out of fashion by the time I was old enough.

"Now I take it really seriously and the popularity in Europe opens all different markets to do telly over there."

### **BREAKING AWAY**

"The image came when I thought about doing a video for 'Breakaway'.

"I thought about the other girls who've done records, and I thought of Toyah and Kim Wilde.

"They've all done it through an image, not a song in a way. And I'd always loved Dustry Springfield, Cilla Black, Helen Shapiro – all stars of the '60s.

"When I saw the videos that people were making I admired them and thought they were clever, but they weren't me.

"It was all groups standing on a Northumberland hillside looking all windswept and serious. I can't do that, I'd start laughing."

### FIRST LOVE (AGAIN)

"Next year I'm going to do two new television series.

"Singing isn't as important as acting. That'll always be my main love.


"People who buy my records are great, but I like my privacy.

"Sometimes when I'm in Sainsbury's the shelf-filler will stop me and ask for Lenny Henry's autograph.



A longtime admirer of such musical stylists as David Bowie and Bryan Ferry, Nick's synthesiser helped to mould the early Duran sound.

### BABY

"Nick was born and bred in Birmingham. He wasn't born at hospital but in my mother's house in Mosley. He weighed in at 7½ lb.

"He was a lovely little baby — very good

and very quiet."

### **GROWING UP**

"As soon as he was old enough, Nick wanted to join the Boy Scouts. We put his name down and he had to wait quite a long time for someone to come round and see him. Finally the man turned up. He said Nick could join the Scouts straightaway.

"By then Nick had changed his mind and didn't want to go. That was the end of that.

"As a young boy, he was very much a chatterbox, very lively and extremely inquisitive.

"He always wanted to know what was going on around him. He asked questions constantly and wanted to know absolutely everything."

### SCHOOL

"Nick went to Silverstream Junior School and then to Woodrush High School, in Hollywood, Birmingham.

"He quite liked school, I think, particularly

art and music. In fact he still writes and sees his English teacher Mr Smart whenever possible.

"They're very proud of him at Woodrush today. I'm told they've got a picture of the group in one of the classrooms and they play their music quite often.

"Nick got seven 'O' levels at Woodrush. He was going to stay on to take his 'A' levels but decided halfway through the summer holidays he didn't want to continue.


"He didn't want to go on to university, either. He just wanted to get out into the world and find out what it was all about. He did help me out in the toyshop for a while for

David Hart, Head of Art at Woodrush High School, Birmingham, recalls Nick as a very co-operative schoolboy.


He says: "Nick is highly imaginative and talented, particularly in art. He was very capable technically and a very confident boy.

Birmingham Holiday Inn last month. It was a surprise 18th birthday 'do' for one of their friends . . . a great fan of Nick's.


"So we did. We had a smashing evening."

"He always played his guitar and was very mature for his age."

"I don't envy him and I certainly wouldn't want to be a star because it's such hard work.

"On the other hand it's been good for me because it enabled me to work at the Duran Duran fan club. I love this work. I never wanted to have a conventional job. Before this I had three jobs in three years.

"As for the star part, I leave that to Andy.
"Really we're just like one big happy
family. I live with my brother and his wife
just outside Birmingham.

"He is still good at the business side of things, and has finally finished his plans to open a wine bar in our home town of Whitley Bay.


"It's going to be called Rio and opens on December 9. You know, he came back for two days and finalised everything – he really is red hot at business.
