

Moody Scots Lloyd Cole And The Commotions, currently edging up the charts with 'Perfect Skin' have added a date to their tour. It's at Leeds Warehouse on June 28.

Rubella Ballet, Actifed, In Excelsis and Bone Orchard will all be appearing at London's Heaven on June 18 for Jungle Records second birthday celebrations.

The Meteors, The Gun Club and The Sting-Rays are just a few of the bands featured on a new compilation album, 'Rockabilly Psychosis And The Garage Disease' out in late June on Big Beat Records.

South African trumpeter **Hugh Maskela** has an LP out on Jive on
June 29 called 'Techno Bush', His



The Banshee's sleeve designer Al McDowell helped construct a crystal set for them to perform in.

"It's supposed to look as if we're playing in a diamond," explained Steve Severin.

Then Siouxsie herself had tiny pieces of diamante stuck all over her eyelids.


"It took hours!" said Steve.
There are even some special

effects using mercury – a highly dangerous substance that meant anyone who came into contact with it had to wear a mask to avoid breathing in poisonous fumes.

Director Tim Pope, famous for his Soft Cell epics and actually recommended to The Banshees by Marc Almond, based the video around a live performance.

But there was one special effect missing – guitarist Robert Smith who was on tour with The Cure at the time.



The Sunrise Theater sprawls at the centre of a large area of wasteland in Sunrise, a small town west of Miami.

It's played host in the past to stars like Frank Sinatra and Johnny Mathis.

But tonight it welcomes Billy Idol.

Unheard of in the UK since the days of punk, the former Generation X singer has sold out every one of the Sunrise's 4100 seats, two nights running.

And he's never played Miami before!

The main reason for this is MTV – music television.

Its 24-hour diet of music videos has provided a forum for young bands like Duran Duran and Culture Club.

Suddenly American teenagers are hungry for new wave music.

Billy Idol is becoming a big star in America without having to change the spiky-haired punk rock image he loves and lives up to.

SHOW TIME

By 8.00pm, fans have begun to stream into the Sunrise foyer.



Billy Idol was one of Britain's first punk rockers.
But when the new wave broke, the Generation X
singer looked all washed up.
Now, miraculously, Billy has resurfaced in
America with a huge following of adoring fans.

But if Stevens is a great young showman, Idol's still the star.
Legs astride and body swaying, he'll suddenly leap up, fist beating the air, his face contorted into that similar snarl.

"They told me punk was dead," sneers Billy. "I'm glad you're all here to prove them wrong!"


IDOL TALK

Another mighty cheer and another familiar anthem: every track's a favourite from an album that's spent several months in the American charts.

As the band make their final, perspiring run offstage, the cheering, screaming and applause just seems to get louder.

What effect can all this be having on a skinny kid from Bromley, Kent?

Average age is around 15 or 16, fashion is a clear-cut cross between smart, Duran Duran chic, and ripped and torn punk circa '77. Just after nine the hall



Four shadows flit across the stage and the audience rises en masse.

Seconds later Billy's bouncing onstage amid deafening applause and screaming, the band's crashing into the old Gen X hit 'Ready Steady Go' – and it's hysteria from here on in.

EXPLOSIVE MIX

The Idol band is an explosive mixture of experience and raw youth.

The lynchpin of the band is Steve Stevens, a diminutive New Yorker with a mop of jet black hair.

He rarely plays a solo; his expressive guitar is an integral part of the songs he co-writes

The interview with Billy is conducted in a small room backstage.

He wears large gold-rimmed spectacles that seem strangely at odds with his blond spiky hair, ripped T-shirt and trashy jewellery.

But Idol is no poseur punk. Time and again he refers to the punk ideals – youth, excitement, breakneck rock'n'roll...

DANCING WITH MYSELF


"I didn't feel Generation X was the band it should've been.

"There was a certain amount of energy and a lot of riffing, but I didn't feel we had groove in our music. You couldn't move to it—which was why I started making that 'Dancing With Myself' type stuff.


THE KISS CONNECTION

"After 'Valley Of The Dolls' in 1979, Tony James and I had tried to find new management in England, but we weren't satisfied with any of 'em.

"Then, as a joke, Tony mentioned the guy who manages Kiss – Bill Aucoin. Anyway, we killed ourselves laughing cos we'd get two days'

holidays in New York, right?

"But we went out and saw Bill and he was the only manager who didn't ask at all about money. He just said, 'Why are you doing it?'

"Bill knows the music's got to be exciting to the people *inside* the group, never mind outside."

Aucoin managed Generation X—unofficially—for two years. When Billy split away, he continued to look after his affairs.

BANNED

"My first solo single 'Mony Mony' was a big dancefloor hit but when we sent it round the radio stations, they wouldn't play it cos I had spiky hair.


"The record company wanted me to brush it down like David Cassidy. I said sod off!

"Anyway, on the next single 'Hot In The City' we sent it round without my picture. Then they started playing it..."

THE BREAKTHROUGH

"The 'White Wedding' single was the breakthrough. It sold enough copies that when the video came along on, MTV people were able to start having a relationship with me.

"So then I got the chance to do interviews and I had the nucleus of a group and I was able to go out and play."

THE BAND

"The band has not been manufactured or marketed. It's not like people think. We just gradually drifted together.

"And Steve Stevens is not trying to look like Tony James. Tony always wanted to look like he came from New York, but Steve's the real thing: he comes from Queen's, he's always looked like that.

SUCCESS

"I value success anywhere, cos success is with people, not selling records.


"I value England emotionally, but I can't do anything about it if they don't like me. I'm not gonna change.

"A lot of people in England don't want to think American music's any good, despite the fact that most English music is totally ripped off.

"Like Soft Call always talked about Suicide. Of course! Cos Suicide are brilliant – they've been doing that music since 1970. They did it for nothing for years."

"And I just don't hold that attitude – I love loads of American music.

"These people who are English purists are idiots. And the day we lose patriotism is the day we'll have a world we can live in."







The action begins at the ABC, Fulham Road . . .

THE STAR

No one in the foyer of the ABC Fulham Road recognises Nick Heyward.

Mind you, he hadn't expected anyone to.

Last week he nipped off to see Terms Of Endearment with his fiancée Marion and he's quite used to going out with the minimum of fuss from fans.

"Actually I'm thinking of sending out press releases when I go to the pictures," he tells me, "just so it's more of a hassle.

"And my address might go in the Evening Standard classifieds if things get really bad!"

THE WALLY

Nick and his manager Dave, photographer Mike Prior and I make our way to seats E15-18.

Nick puts his sunglasses on. They're fitted with prescription lenses for his short-sightedness.

"You must make it clear," he tells me, "that I lost my normal glasses the other day. They must have fallen through this hole I've got in my pocket."

As the lights go down for the B-feature, White Water, Mike flashes off a quick picture of Nick. Nick stifles a burst of laughter.

NICK GOES APE OVER GREYSTOKE

Is this man macho enough? Not according to that well-known muscle man Nick Heyward.

THE B-MOVIE

Nick finishes his ice-cream – "Derelict Monkey flavour" – as up on the screen a group of bearded beer-guts struggle down some rapids in a raft.

Nick's not impressed. "That looks like Steve Norman in the front there with the hairy chest!"

Another dinghy meets up with the first and the two crews start hitting each other with oars.

"They're really getting into it now," declares Nick. "You know that little stick I was eating the ice cream with? It helps you get into it. It's really a scale model of a paddle!"

He leans back in his seat and shakes his head. "They get away with murder on these B-films, don't they?"

The film splashes to an end about five minutes later. Nick's lost for words.

"I dunno . . . I mean . . . I likedit!

"Actually I think it was like a Grateful Dead video. It lasted about twenty minutes and built up to a crescendo where they battled each other with water and paddles."

Ads for Pernod, carpets and a place called Bas's School Of Bartending follow. Then it's time for *Greystoke*.

POP CORN

Stifling the occasional urge to choke on our popcorn, Nick and I watch intently as the story of Tarzan is re-told in a gripping yarn that actually takes the subject seriously.

Featuring actors dressed in unique and very realistic ape costumes, the film shows how young Lord Greystoke, played by French actor Chris Lambert, is raised in the jungle by the apes.

But he is rediscovered by an explorer and sent back to his real grandfather (Ralph Richardson) to try and take up a normal existence in England.

In the end, of course . . . well, we won't give that away. Let's



just say it's a happy one. An emotional one.

No wonder Nick was heard blowing his nose loudly as the closing credits rolled . .

LORD OF THE BEER BOTTLES

At the end of the film we exit out of a side door into an alley-way lined with crates of beer behind wire-mesh.

Nick's still full of the film. "I'm being drawn towards those crates," he says, peering through the mesh. "I think my

real father was a beer bottle.

We head for a favourite restaurant of Nick's in the Fulham Road. He dodges off to ring Marion and tell her he'll be late in.

THE REVIEWER What did you think of Greystoke?

"Well, it was funky, it had the beat! No, it was brilliant, it really got your imagination going. No actually that's not true 'cos it was so descriptive, so real.

Do you think the people dressed as apes were convincing?

"You mean in the audience? It didn't bother me!

Seriously, it was wonderful. I couldn't tell which were the real apes and which were the models.

What did you think of Christopher Lambert's performance in the title role?

'Well he won't win any awards for acting . . . But then again he might, because he was so convincing. When he was swinging through the trees or jumping off high walls and stuff, you just believed it.

"And I liked the way he wasn't a macho sort of Tarzan. He wasn't fighting tigers and stuff like that; he didn't come over to England and break someone's back with his bare finger." (Peruses the menu): "Hmm, the panther looks nice!

Greystoke was directed by Hugh Hudson who did Chariots Of Fire - do you think there's any similarities between the films?


'I used to get turned away a lot, though. I think they thought it was a bit suspicious when I got wheeled up in my pram . . .

I've always been a bit of an exhibitionist. Or in the aisle!



Why have you changed from having a very smart image to a very casual one?

"There's no preconceived notion behind it. You just get tired looking at yourself, looking at the way your hair is, you need a change.

"It all depends on how you feel. If you feel scruffy, then you don't want to wear double breasted suits. We didn't plan it, we just changed."

Why do your videos seem simpler now?

"We went through a stage of making epic videos, we had Spitfires and everything, but you get tired of making Cecil B. De Mille affairs every time.

"We switched into doing simpler, more basic promos and we hoped that people would find them just as interesting. We're musicians, not actors—we look at them merely as fun." Are you using guitars more nowadays?

"We are in the sense that everything in our sound has been simplified a lot, which has brought the guitar out a lot more.

"But we've always had guitar in our songs before – 'All Stood Still', for example – but then we've had so much synth on top of it that it's tended to obscure everything." Do you ever worry about not having a hit?

"In a way I do, because Ultravox aren't aiming their music to a particular audience anymore. We're not a teenybop band, we're not an MOR band, we make our music for ourselves."

"We do think, though, that we've established ourselves so that we don't have to worry too much. We've always sold more albums anyway."

What do you think of synth music now?

"I'm fed up with it. I'm tired of pop bands adding synths just as an extra gimmick to a pretty basic formula. There seems to be no inventiveness around at the moment.

"I think that the music that Kraftwerk were making ten years ago is better than most today."





How many pages are filled in your passport?

'I'm on my second passport now! Up until about six or seven years ago I don't think I'd ever been out of the country, but I've filled up half of my current 96-page one in about a year and a half's travelling.

"It's not quite as glamorous as it sounds, though. When you're on tour then half your time is spent sitting in the back of a car.

Who are the best band in the world?

'Best band? Um. . . Sid Lawrence Orchestra. . .I dunno. I stopped having best bands and best singers when I was about 16 years old.

As you get more involved in the business then you stop having heroes. Records are much more important than a single band.

How do you feel about your large teenage audience?

The actual 'teen' audience is very hard to deal with, as they are very fickle, but they're only a part of our audience anyway. There are dangers if you've got a totally teenage following because you'll never appeal to older fans, but that was never really the case with us.

What do you think of the 'metal' bands like SPK and Neubauten?

'I think it's ridiculous when someone calls himself an artist and then goes and drills up

What do you think of Top Of The Pops?

"It's no better or worse than any other of the music programmes. It's been so important because of its format, it plays the top twenty. It can't lose.

"If it wasn't there there'd be something equally dire.



What's the worst thing you've read about yourself?

Someone printed something that made out that I had some bizarre sort of social disease. I sued them and made them retract it.

Have you ever felt like giving it all up?

Yeah, I think everybody has at some stage. You can get a little depressed at times and think, 'Why don't I go and drive a bus?' - but you soon realise how lucky you are."

What are your sexual politics?

When I went to Japan I thought it was great that men were so dominant and that women catered to their every need. But that wore off after two days and I started thinking how weird it all was.

'In Britain I think it's gone a bit too far, when you've got these really butch women who won't speak to men. There are no easy answers here.'

What's it like being a sex symbol?

"I don't think you should ask me that. I'm 30 years old now and I'm not sure I can compete with all these 18-year-olds about. certainly don't pamper to it.

What do you look for in a friend?

Someone who is honest. Someone who is open. And someone who makes me laugh. I like laughing.

Do you want to change

people's lives? 'I think we do, but we don't set out to do

that. The amount of letters we get where someone's been depressed, they put on a record that uplifts them and it's one of ours.

"We do change people's lives in the sense that the person that put our record on might not now jump out of a window.

To what extent do you feel responsible to your fans? You can't really. It's hard to get involved for

a person that you've never met.

"You can't feel responsible if someone who's a bit of a nutter decides to slash their wrists while listening to your records. It's impossible.

Why do you work so hard? "I basically enjoy it! I've got a lot of

ambitions and in order to fulfill them I've got to spend 99 per cent of my time working at them.'

In arguments are you a shouter or a sulker?


'Both. I'm a bit of a mouth when I feel I'm justified in something, I'll be a real pain. Sulking's alright sometimes but I think shouting's more effective. I get more done when I shout.

What's it like when you meet vour fans?

"Very pleasant. They're very intelligent







criminal world is highly amoral but likeable enough. Double billed with 'Warning', a song that tells you that herpes can damage your health. Nice.

MICRODISNEY Dolly (Rough Trade)

There are better things than this on Microdisney's intriguing 'Everybody Is Fantastic'. The boys from Cork have a neat line in unfashionable tea room pop but their lack of strong vocal presence threatens to leave them suspended in mid air for now. Critics will like them but will John Public?


BOB MARLEY AND THE WAILERS Waiting In Vain (Island)

the man's energy nor his ability to write singalong chants that mix reggae and calypso styles with straightahead rock.


The LP's title suggests that Eddy has gone out on a limb. In fact, he's offering an astute blend of a formula that's yet to falter.

This time around The E Street Band are back, the sound is epically commercial and Bruce still paints all his characters into a corner.


