BPI crackdown nets £108,000 from three illegal importers

IN A heavy crackdown on parallel from importing or dealing in records imports, three import and wholesale firms have agreed to pay the BPI a total of £108,000 in damages and costs for dealing in cheap foreign-made LPs which had been imported illegally from none-EEC sources.

And director general of the BPI John Deacon warned: "We will not tolerate these records being brought into the country illegally and will take action against anyone else we find dealing in them.

The three companies are Stage One of Haslemere, Surrey, Bullet Records of Rugeley, Staffordshire and Rose Records of North London.

Last Wednesday in the High Court Stage One agreed to pay £75,000 damages and costs and also submitted to permanent injunctions restraining it

manufactured outside the EEC.

Stage One had been visited by BPI solicitors the previous week, and approximately 10,000 albums, manufactured in Portugal, Spain, Canada, Sweden, Switzerland and New Zealand were found on the premises. Madness, Stevie Wonder and Bob Marley were among artists whose product Stage One was handling.

Stage One has applied for BPI membership. This is to be considered at a forthcoming BPI council meeting.

The Stage One action followed a visit by BPI solicitors to Bullet Records at the end of last month when more than 31,000 LPs weighing seven and a half tons were removed from the firm's premises.

I firmly believe that IMS will be doing something very useful for the British music business on an international level and it is a shame that the record industry has not responded in a big way.'

The show, which runs between March 13 – 18 is to be opened by Adam Ant and several headline bands - including 10cc - will be playing evening concerts to be broadcast via a satellite link-up to America Don Kirshner Rock Show.

been made in the Phillipines, Canada, Spain and Portugal. Among the albums were current chart titles by Abba, Blondie, Meatloaf and Shakin' Stevens, along with Italian-made Bob Dylan and Beatles bootlegs.

Bullet subsequently agreed in the High Court to pay costs and damages of £25,000 and submitted to permanent injunctions restraining it from importing or dealing in none-EEC imports.

On February 10 a further Anton Pillar order was executed at Rose Records. Proprietor John David Butcher agreed to pay £8,000 damages and submit to similar injunctions.

Butcher admitted to dealing in Spanish product since last July and the BPI believes that around 40,000 albums mainly Motown product - had been brought in.

In addition to the parallel import action, Stage One director Terence Shand agreed to pay £2,500 damages and costs in respect of an outstanding Dutch counterfeit action.

Now the BPI is planning to slam the door on importers of foreign-made deletions and cut-outs to stop such records being sold in British shops as current catalogue items.

John Deacon added: "The BPI council is extremely concerned about parallel imports and with the success of these actions and the Polydor victory in the European Court we have proved we can stop these records coming into the country.

"However, I would like to make it clear that anyone who is in any doubt should contact the BPI who will be only too pleased to advise him.

Four substantial actions are continuing against another British importer.



BHASKAR MENON, chairman and chief executive of the EMI Music Group worldwide, has resigned from the main board of Thorn EMI. However, there. will be no change in his executive status. A Los Angeles resident, Menon con-tinues as a member of the Group Management Committee and as senior resident executive in North America. He becomes an Associate Director and will attend board meetings should they. coincide with his London visits.

A statement released last week explained that due to his "extensive travel itinerary", Menon did not feel able to attend sufficient monthly board meet-

A flurry of big stars on unusual labels

MAJOR STARS such as David Bowie, Adam & The Ants, Shakin' Stevens and Kraftwerk have forthcoming releases on ünfamiliar labels.

Adam and the original Ants are featured in two releases for companies other than CBS. EG have released 'Deutscher Girls' (EGO 5) from the Jubilee soundtrack by the band and Do It release an EP on February 26, through Virgin.

The Do It release includes versions of 'Cartrouble/Kick/You're So Physical/ Friends' (DUN (IT) 20) with the 12inch containing all four tracks and the 7-inch just the latter three. The release will contain an insert giving a biography of the material recorded by the group for the label and name the musicians involved

David Bowie's next release on March 2 is for his label RCA, an EP of songs from his TV play 'Baal' which features Beal's Hymn/Ballad Of The Adventurers/Dirty Song, all Brecht compositions.

Later in March this will be followed by an MCA release of 'Putting Out Fire' from the soundtrack of Cat People which will be released by MCA later in the year. This single is produced by Giorgio Moroder.

Shakin' Stevens has been subject of. several reissued recordings and the latest is 'Frantic' an EP on Magnum Force (MFEP7), through PRT.

All rights to Kraftwerk's material originally released by Vertigo have reverted to the act, although a version of the single 'Autobahn' is available through Wynd-Up which purchased Phonogram's Classic Cuts material. Phonogram has just one mid-price collection available, but the group's current label EMI plants to release an album Autobahn in March.

There are no plans for EMI to reissue the single at present because it is expecting new material soon.

'Obscene' 45 seized in police raid

OBSCENE PUBLICATIONS officers of Scotland Yard have seized 12,000 copies of the Anti-Nowhere League single 'Streets Of London' following complaints from the public about the language used on the 'B' side 'So What'. A report has been submitted to the

Director of Public Prosecutions who is deciding whether to prosecute.

Officers raided 1 Munro Terrace, W1-office of the group's manager John Curd, Faulty Products, Rough Trade, Pinnacle and MVS Record Pressing in a simultaneous raid on Friday (February 12) and took away all copies of the record and related papers.

Faulty Products claim that 50,000 copies of the record, which had spent five weeks in the national chart, were pressed leaving 38,000 in general circulation.

A&M sets new mid-price line

A&M RECORDS is the latest company to launch a mid-price back catalogue series.

The company has scheduled an initial batch of 15 albums carrying a dealer price of £1.82 and a suggested retail tag of £2.99. All are previously best-selling LPs that are now deleted and appear with their original artwork, although there will be a special inner bag featuring the whole series. The releases are backed by an in-store campaign.

Among the first titles are Herb Alpert and the Tijuana Brass Greatest Hits, Joan Armatrading's Back To The Night, Squeeze by Squeeze and Live And Learn from Elkie Brooks. A&M plans regular supplements to the new line

See For Miles with Charly

COLIN MILES, former EMI label manager, has formed his own label See For Miles which will be marketed by Charly. The initial emphasis will be on historical compilations but he hopes to develop the label into a talent seeker.

Having worked in promotion, product management and a&r for the Harvest label, Miles was responsible for the Harvest Heritage and NUT labels which exploit EMI's back catalogue.

When he left EMI in the autumn Miles formed his own independent licensing company, immediately making it his business to gain rights to EMI material.

This Friday sees the release of the ten albums on the See For Miles/Charly label. They are full-price collections "The demand for UK new music is featuring George Martin, Shane Fenton, The Pretty Things, The Fourmost, Manfred Mann, Peter & Gordon, Billy J Kramer, Cliff Bennett & The Rebel Rousers, Simon Duprée & The Big Sound and the John Barry Seven. Four are original compilations while the other six have been previously available on EMI.

EMI's £200,000 Valbum

EMI RECORDS has collected twenty top tracks for a TV-compilation album featuring Diana Ross, Olivia Newton-John, The Stranglers, Kraftwerk, Kate Bush, Cliff Richard, Sheena Easton, Duran Duran and Kim Wilde.

Twenty With A Bullet (EMTV 32) is released on Friday, February 26, and is being supported by an initial fortnight's £200,000 TV campaign with 30-second commercials in the top three regions, London, Central and Granada, from March 3. It has a dealer price of £3.59.

The campaign also includes full point-off-sale back-up with card mounted centre-pièces and four colour posters.

Two current Top 10 singles are included, 'The Model' by Kraftwerk and 'Golden Brown' by The Stranglers, while the line-up includes 'Love Makes The World Go Round' by The Jets, 'Why Do Fools Fall In Love' by Diana Ross,

More warnings from MCPS

THE MCPS has circulated notices to importers warning them not to handle copies of Dare (SP 64892) manufactured by A&M in the USA, copies of the same album (VS1134) made in Canada by Polydor, Orchestral Manoeuvres in the Dark's Architecture & Morality (VL2231) from the same source, and Ry Cooder's The Border (CBSR 6105) manufactured by Backstreet Records in America. The British publishers of the material have not granted an import licence for the records, and importers are warned that dealing with the titles could result in legal action and an injunction to prevent further dealing in the albums.

LONDON-BASED exporter Lasgo has The statement added that Menon's launched the first international distributors association, to be known as the Music Industry Distributors' International Association (MIDIA).

Now CBS seek court ruling against Rachel

CBS RECORDS has begun a court action in the Southern District Court in New York against Rachel Music formerly known as Leosong Music - of London.

The American company is seeking to declare that Rachel Music has no further right to deal in certain records by artists including The Shirelles, B.J. Thomas, The Platters, Dionne Warwick, Gene Pitney and George Jones.

CBS is the successor in interest to Springboard International and gave notice terminating the rights of Rachel mination.

The action seeks a judgement declaring that Rachel's rights are terminated, an injunction against its continued dealings in the previously licensed recordings, and an order directing Rachel to account to CBS and to pay royalties due under the licence deal.

Christmas stocking snags

WITH THE benefits of hindsight, I would like to talk about the aspects of Christmas which were an unmitigated disaster.

Of course, the weather didn't help, neither did the general effects of the recession, but the industry itself must be held responsible for many of the shortfalls in potential trading aspirations.

The basic problem, to start with, was that dealers just did not know what to stock or in what depth. TV was blitzed by many itsy-bitsy campaigns, some mis-timed and often unnoticed. Suppliers were quite unable to cope with the fluctuations of demand. Of the dozens of TV albums, only K-Tel's Chart Hits 81, the CBS Abba album and EMI's Queen's Greatest Hits were consistently astute dealer to identify what the cusavailable at source and from tomer meant by "that record I saw on availability. wholesalers.

However EMI suddenly re-promoted Cliff Richard's Love Songs collection without telling anybody. Though the TV advertisement went right through the Christmas sales week, stock was exhausted everywhere, it seems, by the confusion introduced because of the included items that most of us would Tuesday!

"I've been into 60s music since the 60s ended," he says "From 1970 things went downhill — big venues, supergroups. Besides, America is not as dominated by sudden trends and fashions as the UK.

"There's now a whole spectrum of styles around. Bands can dip in and create something new, rather than operate in the strict revival sense. The Stray Cats are a great rockabilly band, but you didn't hear music like theirs in the 50s."

What about the common criticism that American music, especially West Coast, is bland and unimaginative? "I know people here think US music is staid," he replies, "much of it is - but there's still a lot that isn't. The US psychedelic movement is very different. It's a grass roots thing, slightly different turn to page 9

in every town, rather than the serious trend it is in London."

An indie label in the USA has even more problems than its English counterpart. "Media exposure is limited to the club circuit and college radio - to which nobody listens. There are around 5,000 of these, each with an average 10 to 12 mile broadcast radius. The best is KROQ in Los Angeles, where they play new records which can be heard over a wide area. But again it's not easy to get on the air.'

Bomp seemed to overcome the problem of publicity quite effectively with the recent release of Josie Cotton's 'Johnny Are You Queer?'. When When KROQ played the disc, America's powerful 'moral majority' picketed the station en masse. Shortly after their arrival, LA's local gay groups turned up to counter-demonstrate. When, for some unknown reason, a neo-Nazi organisation also put in an appearance, the scene became dramatic enough to be reported on networked TV news bulletins, ensuring maximum coverage for 'Johnny'

"Really we couldn't have hoped for a better reaction," admits Greg. "We've got to break down barriers. All the hip American kids only listen to English groups at the moment. You get clubs where that's all that is played.'

'Johnny Are You Queer?' also happens to be Bomp International's first release in the UK. Reactions have not been quite as extreme here. Radio-1 and most local independent stations have shown a strong disinclination to play it, but our lack of an equivalent aggressive moral majority seems to indicate that no one was offended enough to draw useful attention to the record.

Bomp's next single will be 'A Million Miles Away' from The Plimsouls, which, Shaw assures the world, has "nothing remotely offensive about it".

MARC BOLAN & T REX: Across The Airwaves (Cube ICS 1004) Prod: Unlisted

A compilation of Bolan's mystical acoustic songs with their Tolkien influences plus some of his later, overtly commercial electric music, all taken from a batch of BBC sessions circa 1969-71. It is rather better than just another re-packaging exercise and much care has been taken in putting together detailed and informative sleeve notes. It begins with the lightweight music of his partnership with Steve Took and moves on to the commercial breakthrough with 'Ride A White Swan', 'Hot Love', 'Summertime-Blues', 'Jeepster'. A previously unreleased track, 'Sailors Of The Highway' is included. Obviously of great interest to the many who still admire Bolan's music.

Best of the rest

FIREHOUSE FIVE PLUS TWO: Good Time Jazz (MfP 50533) Prod: Not Listed

In the long gone days when it appeared that Britain had become the home of trad jazz, the Firehouse Five, a group of enthusiasts from the Walt Disney Studios, proved that white Dixieland music had not died completely in America. These days the traddies, and they are still around, are almost totally starved of the music they love. These robust and occasionally corny recreations of 20 jazz standards should keep venerable toes tapping quite happily.

CARL PERKINS: The Sun Years (Sun Box 101)

A three-album box set which features all the rockabilly star's big hits plus



Carl's earlier country material and several out-takes of the hits. The set comes complete with a very good booklet by Colin Escott which features good biographical information and an excellent interview with the artist. Limited appeal but well put together and a worthy tribute to one of rock 'n' roll's pioneers.

ERIC CLAPTON FEATURED WITH JOHN MAYALL'S BLUESBREAK-ERS: Steppin' Out (Decca TAB 21) Prod: Mike Vernon

A worthy re-issue from the Decca vaults, this album probably contains eight of the most influential cuts ever laid down in a British studio - namely the bulk of John Mayall's Bluesbreakers set. Also included is a number called 'Lonely Years' which producer Vernon reckons is the closest he ever got to a Chicago sound, and a couple of numbers recorded with dear old Champion Jack Dupree. Clapton never again produced the total commitment to the blues and real emotion that can be heard on 'Key To Love', Double Crossin' Time' and the sublime 'Have You Heard' ('Presence of

the Lord' and 'Layla' fall into a different genre completely). Sales possibilities. cannot be computed but then neither can some of the far-reaching effects of the playing contained herein.

THE CHURCH: The Church (Carrere. CAL 130) Prod: Chris Gilbey/Bob Clearmountain

One of the few band of the new wave of psychedelia that sound at all psychedelic on record, The Church hark back to the heady days of the late 60s without smacking too much of artifice. Most of the material is written by producer Chris Gilbey who obviously has definite ideas about leading songs with 12-string guitar riffs and plenty of big beat. The result is slightly faceless and very English, but good, strong pop that could take off given the airplay

VARIOUS ARTISTS: Golden Hits Of 1958 (MfP 50551)

First in a series of restrospectives titled Savile's Time Travels (endorsed by the famed Jimmy) this is aimed at raising money for Stoke Mandeville Spinal Unit. For the most part it is a compilation of ageless classics, among them 'Great Balls Of Fire', 'Move It', 'Summertime Blues', 'Oh Boy', and 'At The Hop'. Songs by Alma Cogan, Laurie London, Kalin Twins, Michael Holliday and Pat Boone provide not always comfortable contrasts.

23 SKIDOO: Seven Songs (Fetish) FM 2008) Prod: Tony/Terry/David An eight track, 30 minute long mint album from the adventurous 23 Skidoo. The music is innovative and vivid, steering a course between A Certain Ratio and Rip Rig & Panic in its use of rock instruments, jazz melodies and aboriginal rhythms. It's a set destined for indie success and should find favour among the many fans attracted to this hard working band.

THE RAM'S HORN label from Holland crops up on the UK import scene with variable frequency, but usually with something interesting to offer. The latest Ram's Horn 12-incher, the first for several months, features recent hitmakers Skyy (New York Skyy, of course, when they're on a UK label), with the familiar title 'Call Me' but as is par for the course for Ram's Horn, it's a remixed version of the album cut. Moreover, the coupling is the 'Let's Celebrate' hit, but either heavily remixed from the very basics, or otherwise a total re-recording of the song. The disc is proving sufficiently interesting and different from the standard releases to be creating quite a buzz already in several areas.

The Barry McCloud Organisation has announced a deal which will bring disco product from the American Posse label to the UK, via the newlyformed Cricket label. This will include the current bubbler 'Get Up And Dance' by Mynk, which should form the first release in a week or so, but other items by Glory and Ritz are also scheduled imminently. The new-label is pushing its name by extending the Cricket theme to the catalogue prefixes of the records as well - LBW for 7-inch, HOWZAT on 12-inch, and RUNOUT for albums.

New import albums represent quite a strong bunch. From Holland, and again on Ram's Horn, comes Instant Funk's Look So Fine, a release which seems to have beaten the American original onto the market. From the States comes Roy Ayers with Feeling Good (Polydor); Mystic Merlin's Full Moon (Capitol); Pure And Natural from T-Connection (Capitol); Coffee's Second Cup (De-Lite); and Millie Jackson with another triple X-rated set Live And Outrageous (Spring).

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

More stimulation for us in video, say **Godley & Creme**

INTERVIEWING DYNAMIC duo Godley & Creme is rather like serving sour with a sieve. In exasperation the Creme recently won the soup with a sieve. In exasperation the journalist is forced to ask whether there 'Video Business' Top Direcis anything they don't do, just to save tors award for video making. time.

Recording artists, producers, studio owners, inventors, directors, authors, illustrators, and 24-hour livewires - all making music videos. this makes up Godlev & Creme, an inseparable duo who rose to fame as half of the enormously successful 10CC.

Kevin Godley and Lol Creme wre born in Manchester, shortly after the war, and have been friends since their days in short trousers. Professionally their partnership has entered its 23rd year without any sign of flagging.

Today they are known as one of the most creative video director teams in the business and deserved winners of the Video Business directors award för best promotional video for a major recording company.

The award was won for 'Mind Of A Toy' recorded by Visage, an act which exists in name only. With the usual avenues of promotion, such as touring, effectively ruled out it was vital that there is more stimulation for less input,' video gave Visage a strong image, and this Godley & Creme provided.

Video is seen as a major step on the road to the duo's eventual aim - directing a feature film - and, although the great percentage of Godley & Creme's career has been spent in music, it is the realisation of an early hope.

"We are frustrated film makers. When we were young we had access to sound equipment and not film, but we always used music to present visual ideas down to album titles like The Original Soundtrack. It has always been our ambition to make a film, it seemed much more exciting than recording,' commented Creme.

The duo began making videos when the opportunity arose to produce one to promote their own Polydor single 'An Englishman In New York' in November 1979. It was no coincidence that the record had little success in the UK where the video was rarely seen but reached Number One, or close, everywhere else in the world where the video was acclaimed.

IT WAS at Polydor that Steve Strange of Visage saw the Godley & Creme video and invited them to direct a video for the breakthrough single 'Fade To Grey'. The pair have not looked back since.

Videos followed for Toyah 'I Want To Be Free' and 'Thunder In The Mountains', Duran Duran 'Girls On Film' Status Quo 'Something 'Bout You Baby', Joan Armatrading 'Weakness In Me' and 'When I Get It Right', their own 'Wedding Bells' and 'Wide Boy' and of course the award winning 'Mind Of A Toy' by Visage.

Recently the partnership was emploved by Paul McCartney's MPL Communications to put together a video for the three tracks McCartney wrote for the current Ringo Starr album Stop And Smell The Roses. The work featured acting roles for Starr and his actress wife Barbara Bach and is not only a combination of three promotional videos but a mini-feature in its own right.

For Godley & Creme the opportunity to build visual works around recorded music could not have come at a better time. "The new medium of video came along and presented the opportunity to combine the two. Now we really like doing videos because they are so fast and immediate. Compared to recording said Godley.

In addition he and Creme are branching out into commercials. Having provided music for commercials in the past the duo was pleased to be asked to record both the audio and visual for the new Wrangler television advertisement and one for the Alliance Building Society is planned. In 1979 they won a Gold Medal from the Design and Art Directors Association for the music for Benson & Hedges 'desert' cinema commercial.

As far as their eventual aim of directing feature films is concerned

Godley & Creme are moving steadily in the right direction. "We are still gaining experience of the craft and in film terms the next step is to do a short. We have no shortage of ideas and are talking to several people about them," said Creme.

UNLIKE MANY creative people who move from one sphere into another they seem intent on keeping all their various projects on the go at once. In recording terms the duo has not been as successful since leaving 10CC as they are today. Wedding Bells' and 'Under Your Thumb' gave them a strong return to the charts at Christmas and the latest album Ismism is their best selling to date.

The duo has a good reputation as record producers and they still like to work with other artists when time permits. Recently they have produced a single with promising chart newcomers Blue Rondo A La Turk and they also have a track on the latest Jona Lewie album.


In between all this activity they find



time to record snatches of their own material for a new album to be released this year. They are also inventors - their 'Gizmotron' turns a guitar sound into a string section - and are constantly working on revolutionary ideas.

Last year saw publication of their book The Fun Starts Here complete with illustrations - both were art students and their artistic skills have produced what is perhaps their most ambitious, project to date - designing a symbol for the Olympic movement to replace the five linked circles.

Whether or not Godley & Creme will be able to continue all areas of their multi-faceted career when they arrive in Hollywood in the not too distant future remains to be seen.






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
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
