With his lyricist Hal David, Bacharach signed Dionne to Florence Greenberg's Scepter Records and she soon became the hottest girl singer in soul music, thanks to Don't Make Me Over, Anyone Who Had A Heart, Walk On By, and a string of other hits featuring superb Bacharach / David songs and orchestrations and Dionne's immensely ap-pealing, plaintive voice.

But as Aretha Franklin and Diana Ross arose to usurp her position as black music's leading lady, Dionne was also hit by the declining stan-dards of the material which Bacharach and David gave her as they seemingly were intent on changing her into a strictly cabaret artist.
