He has released something in the region of 50 singles of which only about 15 have been under his own name.

The second and 'Sugar Sugar by by Arine's Shen of course there are the records that have established Mr King as a 'real' solo artist. Things like Everyone's Gone To The Moon' and recently his version of 'Una Paloma

You might wonder why it is that Jonathan doesn't release everything under his own name. The answer's

"In 1971 he had 10 hit singles in the British chart," says a former promotions guy at King's UK record label. "It would be impossible to put out all those records under one name

out all those records under the name because there are loo many." He's right that would make almost one single a month and after a while people would get fed up with the chart being dominated by Jonathan King records.

records. So Jonathan, ever the wise boy, decided to invent different names for himself and it's sent to work. In fact apart from the heyday of the Bealles when they were dominating the chart, Mr King has probably had more records in the Top Fifty at one time than any other artist. But is artistic the right word to use about such a clever opportunist as this
