Well, by some strange coincidence there's a group in the charts at the moment calling themselves the Rubettes. But they don't sound anything like our Sugar Baby Loves. don't sound

anything like our Sugar E For a start they write and produce their own material which that other group never did. And these new Rubettes have got a social conscience. None of that super-ficial icing music for them, their hit takes one of society's biggest taboos by the horns. 'Under One Roof, in case you didn't al-ready know, is about homosexuality. It's a plea for tolerance

It's a plea for tolerance and it doesn't matter whether you're straight, gay, red, white or blue.

#### Mature

"Now they are all try-ing to break away be-cause it's a case of 'are you going to mean any-thing or not'," he says with passion. John a cknowledges that the Rubettes stand a good chance of making it on their own because they do have songwriting tal-ent within the group. But there's still one hurdle for them to get over - live concerts. They haven't played in Britain for some time and don't intend to for a while yet.
