possibly the first time in his life, Craig McLachlan is feeling a mite toey. You see, it's only days until his first single hits ainwaves. And, for someone who was a lassician long before he became the television face we know today, that means a heck of a lot. "Yeah, I am nervous," he admits, before adding with typical Henry Ramsay enthusiasm, 'but I've just heard again the first four singles we've done and they're mighty! But you're right. I am nervous, particularly being (adopts mocking snoot-voice) an actor of the small screen...particularly coming from that show. Ha ha!

"You know the sort of flak that one can cop. But fortunately so far, it's been pretty good. The band has been playing live for a long time, getting out there and mixing it with the people, and I haven't been copping too much flak. If I can keep

some sort of credibility attack happening, it should all be OK."

Craig McLachlan and Check One-Two is a major venture and the guys are clearly out to make it B-I-G. How many other debut acts would be confident enough to say they've got "the first four singles" ready and waiting to ingrain themselves on our memory banks?! "They've all come up real good," emphasises Craig again. "There's 'Almost Felt Like Crying and 'Amanda'. which are love song-ish, 'Rock The Rock'...and I won't disclose the other one because it's a bit of a secret!"

A-ha. Exactly what sort of music is it, then? Not too many *Smash Hits* readers would have heard it "I should hope not!! Ha ha. Unless those naughty devils have been zipping into licensed premises (i.e. pubs), because that's really all we've been playing. These are furiously busy and exciting times for Craig. He's in his final weeks on-screen with Neighbours and has been ploughing his way through a jam-packed filming schedule. Plus, he, Dave and Mark have been holed up in a Melbourne recording studio putting the final touches to their masterpiece. On the day that Smash Hits spoke to them, for instance, the boys had just come off a marathon 17-hour recording stretch. Seventeen hours! Why, that's 34 episodes of Neighbours!

Or Home and Away, which swings the subject around nicely to Craig's burgeoning television career. As you would have no doubt read by now, he recently signed a not-very minor contract with the Australian Television Network, part of which involves working on Home and Away in episodes that will be on-screen early in the New Year.

As for what else it covers? Well, Craig is more than happy to clear up a few of the many rumours. "Well," he states in admittedly

guarded tones, "I can confirm that, yes, I have signed a deal with Mr Skase (the network's owner). Um, I think it's only fair that I call him Mr Skase instead of Christopher. Bit of respect there. Ha hal As well as Home and Away, I can confirm the stories about a few mini-series and stuff...that wasn't just

"Then I left school and got myself together a couple of bands on the central coast of NSW - where we all come from - for a few years. I ran into Craig and Mark up there when they were looking for a new drummer, so I played with them for 12 months or so."

That was in mid-1986, when fate intervened and packed Craig off to Melbourne to join Neighbours. Dave stayed in NSW and went his own way for close on three years drumming for bands in clubs at night and

working during the day.

"I did lighting for seven years all up, stage lighting. And rigging and a bit of designing here and there. So I've got some pretty good ideas in mind when we get out and do some big gigs," claims Dave, although he rather spoils his argument in the same breath by mentioning that one of his inspirations was hoary 70s rock "lot" Led Zeppelin - not the most innovative of souls...in any respect!

Never mind. How does our Dave think he'll cope when he's rich and famous, and

"Hahaha. I think I could handle it! I've been in this industry for nine years and spent it allbroke and in debt, so J think I've done my apprenticeship. It's about my turn!"

Every year we'd play intensely for about three to four months and pick up all the work over the holiday season in the pubs."

The rest of the time, Mark, who's quite a fan of Boom Crash Opera and Wa Wa Nee ("two totally underrated bands"), could be found working in "finance or sales or engineering. Nothing too exciting, actually."



Marc Andrews tagged along to get some "spoken words" from the quartet and Bevin Rijkaart played the "happy snapper"!!!

There's a certain feeling of expectancy in the air tonight. readers. And that's because this particular evening is the one that David, Michael, Andrew and Darryl -Indecent Obsession, to the uninitiated - have chosen to play new material from their "Spoken Words" album and prove the cynics and the so-called "doubting thomases" (whoever they might be!!!) wrong

Apart from the Indecents, Collette is due to give a body-numbing display of disco cycling shorts in

Suddenly there are shrieks... everyones' heads turn to see what all the commotion is about. And, true to form, Collette has appeared in a pair of white cycling shorts and a very loud green top! She looks like a million deutschmarks and, as if appearing from some hidden corner, there's a huge rush of people requiring our girl's autograph. As per usual, she graciously assents and things settle down again for a while.

But the place isn't free of excitement for too long. Ten minutes



later, there is some serious screaming going on. Hurrah! Indecent Obsession have finally arrived

Right on cue, there's that instantaneous swarm of autographhunters and well-wishers, all of which our four lads handle admirably even if they do seem a little dazed by the surroundings! Alison Drower from *MTV* requests an interview with the lads - so they slink through the crowd, heavy on denim and sleek haircuts, and position themselves upstairs where there's actually a bit of room to retreat, and no loud thumping music which one has to be shout over to be heard!

because they're all the same height as me!'


The lads dissolve into laughter but Ms.Drower is determined to continue with her "probing" questions. She then asks them, "Are you being marketed?" (Darryl: "The drummer from Rush!"). Indecent Obsession take all this "wind-up" in their stride and come across as happy-go-lucky sorts who are more than well-equipped to handle the toughest of interrogations, despite being so new to the what some cynics refer to as "the game"!

The interview finishes with "Ali" accepting a challenge to watch the band live and see if her perception changes somewhat! Once the TV lights and cameras have been turned off, our boys are spirited away to a freshly-carpeted room (with little else but a couple of chairs and a few helium balloons!) for a little peace and quiet before taking the stage.

"Did you know that I'm getting engaged on Saturday?" whittles Andrew, strumming an acoustic guitar that has settled in his lap. Unfortunately, apart from this utterance he will reveal little else

about his "betrothed"

Meanwhile Darryl is having a great time sucking out some of the air from the balloons and talking in a highpitched squeal. Andrew, the seriousminded member of the band (if such a thing is possible!), is content to read the latest issue of Smash Hits. David, however, is eager to tell all about the "gig" that the band played a few nights before at

Melbourne's Metro nightclub. "It was fantastic. There were about 2.000 people there and it was just the best show. It was a special under-18s show. We had a great time.

What David doesn't mention however, is that 100 members of the audience were treated for heat exhaustion, due to the overflowing amount of hysteria surrounding the band. And although the guys love all the attention, they're started to realise that even the sparkling "world" of stardom has its slight limitations.

"We've had fan trouble this week," "Dicko" sighs. "Our fans have just been following us around from the studio and stuff like that. It can be a bit of a pain, sometimes.

At this point in time Collette takes the stage for her four-number highenergy performance (complete with two hunky dancers in glittery tops and black cycling shorts!). Thus it's time for Indecent Obsession to get themselves into "stage mode" and time for your "scribe" to hurry off to watch the show in all its live glory! Ta-ta!

THE SHOW

When Indecent Obsession take the stage, they blow away any preconceptions you may have had that this is merely a "pretty-boy" pop band who have been plucked from nowhere and plonked into a studio without ever having "paid their dues".

How wrong you would be! Beginning their set with the powerexplosion of "Tell Me Something", Indecent Obsession are every bit as good as their records - if not a teensy bit better! There's hardly a breath taken between songs as the boys plough through "Never Really Loved You", "Can't Somebody" ("This is F-U-N-K," David announces. The tune is also notable for featuring the vocals of Mickski!!!) and "Nowhere To Hide" ("This is a good one!!"). Oddly enough it is "Take Me Higher" - the b-side of "Say Goodbye" - which the crowd really turns onto.


"This is the one that got us our record contract," ushers in "Never Gonna

Stop" which had been slated to be the second single, but was later replaced with "Tell Me Something"

The hot numbers continue to manifest themselves, with the audience a sea of fervent Indecent Obsession admirers and many new converts too, by the hearty response increasing with each

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JENNY MORIS LEVEL SELEVEL

...she got to be loved, she want to be needed! Yes, indeedy! Marc "Unloveable" Andrews asks the questions and Jenny "Lovely" Morris gives the "shivering" replies! Read on, why dontcha!?!!

What's the story behind "She Has To Be Loved"?

"Um, well I'm a terrible person to ask questions like that to, because I really hate dissecting songs and lyrics and stuff. The song's inspired by someone I know but it's sort of become an ode to women in general now. Why did I call it 'She Has To Be Loved' and not 'She Got To Be Loved'? Because I thought it looked better and because I wrote it so I can call it what the hell I want to call it. Hahahahaha!"

Tell us a bit about the video for the song!

Well the video was directed by Nick Egan and they're basically his ideas. He's done about four or five videos for me - and he's planning to do the next one for me. I really like working with him because he's really sensitive to my cause. Which is probably the same reason that I like working with Andrew (Farriss) musically, because he knows what I want and knows how to bring the best out Nick's really good, a very intune with fashion person; he's based in England and he has a very international thing about him which is one thing that I really like. Another thing is that he's a graphic designer first and foremost and he's got a great eye and a great sense of fashion and he does interesting things that excite me. He makes it really interesting to do projects with.

Does the prospect of international stardom frighten you or excite you?

I don't really think about that side of it. I just think about things more closely to home by that I mean, more like the actual music and getting it marketed. If that happens becoming a star overseas - I'll just take it in my stride. I'm quite comfortable with it here and I feel us Kiwis have our

feet firmly planted on the ground in most respects. I think I'll be pretty much that way overseas as well."

What did you think of the Max Q album?

"I think it's fantastic. I think Michael's singing is incredibly sexy and good and I think he's a much better singer now than he was two or three years ago. I think he's come of age as a singer. Have I as well? Yeah, I've definitely become a better singer. I think it's more to do with experience - in my case it was actually physiological. Since I had Huey (her child) I've seem to have a much broader range."

What's ahead for you in the next six months?

"I guess I'll finish touring nere (in Australia) and promoting cos the album's doing so well it sort of makes it necessary to keep playing, because there's a demand out there for me. After that, we're going to go overseas and do it all again."

Who would you like to do a duet with?

I'd love to do a duet with Prince, Peter Gabriel or Sting. Why Prince? Because he's so incredibly talented at writing songs and producing it. It's the same with all of them. Would I like to write a soundtrack like Batman? Yeah, I haven't actually written a whole soundtrack, but I've written soundtrack material for various things and it's really enjoyable. It's the sort of thing I'd like to do between albums. I last did some about two or three years ago. I did some stuff on an ABC-TV series called Dancing

What ambitions do you have?

"I'd like to have acting lessons. If I turned out to be any good at that then I'd like to do some acting. I have actually done some acting in the past, but nothing like what I'd like to get

into now. I'd also like to do some more travelling. I've done a lot of travelling but I haven't been to Africa and I haven't been to the Amazon and I'd like to go to Antarctica before it melts away. Why Antarctica? I think it would be like nothing I've ever seen before; the enormity of it and the pristine conditions and the wildlife. I think it would form a whole new awareness of the world and where you live."

What sets your teeth on edge?

One thing that is setting my teeth on edge is the whole issue of the environment and the way that a lot of people with high profiles are getting behind various causes. The thing that gets me is that it's getting to the stage where certain charities aren't hip to be behind any more because everyone else is behind them and, to me, that loses the whole idea and the whole reason of getting behind an issue. Especially with environmental issues, it just seems to me that it's becoming too much of a fad or a fashion and we're losing the real reasons behind it. It's a little sad that people are losing sight of the fact that we're doing it for a reason and not publicity."

Is love the answer to all the world's problems?

"No I don't think love is the total answer to the world's problems at all. I think that would be a little too easy. I think the biggest remedy is realising the problem and I think people are starting to do that now. I think that now they should act on their instincts and the worst thing they can do is be complacent. An active involvement is the way - not just for a few people but for everyone."

What's your greatest joy in life? "I have a couple. I don't just

"I have a couple. I don't just have one. My family obviously that's a great joy. But music is a great joy. The feeling of producing music and being able to sing. Sometimes you're there singing and you feel so good and you feel really pleased that you can do it. And writing and producing music - that's a great joy too."

What are your best qualities?

"One of my best qualities is that I'm a firm believer in getting out and going out and getting it wherever it is."

Have you got any bad habits? "I've got a lot of bad habits -

"I've got a lot of bad habits none that I want to impart to you. Hahaha! Are they disgusting? They're not really disgusting, but they're really bad habits. I've got a really bad habit of giving journalists a bad time. Why not?! They give us a bad time!"

Would you ever put

out a rap record?
I like rap and I was thinking of putting a little bit of rap on my record. But I tend to think that rap belongs to a certain genre, and I'd feel like a bit of a faker myself if I did it. I think someone like Neneh Cherry gets away with it because she's living it and she's got the background. I really live and breath my music, I feel it really deeply. And there have been songs that I've done where I've been acting, if you know what I mean. But you tend to put your heart and soul behind a song everytime you sing it.

Do you want to live forever?

"I shouldn't think so - especially if I was the only one doing it. I wouldn't mind popping off when I'm about 90. Actually I wouldn't mind remaining the age I am at the moment - since I hit my thirties, life has been pretty wonderful. Must be just luck I guess! It's more than just the birth of my son, it's more a culmination of all those trials and tribulations and how you handle various crises and situations and cope much better. Am I content at the moment? Oh yes, very!"

It's sad to see Oz greats such as Wa Wa Nee fall into pop's abyss after their second IP failed to do any real business on the old hit parade. It seems that their fatal mistake was changing their style of music; from dancey pop rnythms to a more rock 'n' roll sound. After all, he is a follower of the work of Kylie Minogue...not to mention a great fan of the girl herself! "I love Kylie," he says. "I think she's great. I s for Michael's private life, well...it's exactly that. But, according to recent reports, his current girlfriend is called Johnnie. She's a former model from America who Michael







Dear Darren.

I would like to know whether or not a songwriter who does not sing or play any instrument on the recording of his/her song, is entitled to any of the royalties from the song. N. McCov. Grafton, NSW.

They certainly are. The writer is entitled to a part of what are called mechanical royalties. On average - and this varies from country to country - from each copy of a single or album that is sold, around 7.25% of the money goes to the publishers of the song i.e. the people who hold the rights to reproduce the song in sheet music form or in lyric form. That money is then split between publisher and songwriter. So, a songwriter would probably receive about 3.6% of a song's royalties. In a song that sold a million copies, for example, that would work out at almost \$105,000! Incidentally, a performer in the same situation is entitled to on average 10 - 12% of the royalties - although the big stars get a larger percentage. Michael Jackson, for one, is reputed to be on a 30% royalty deal!


